

Sanford Migrant

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — The federal government has vetoed a proposed training school for migrants operated by private industry at the old Sanford Naval Air Station, a state official said today. Don Meiklejohn, director of the Division of Commercial Development

said the state is "starting a new ball game" in an effort to revive the migrant training program. He said he didn't know whether it would be at Sanford, if put into operation.

"I would think that if it makes sense for it to be at Sanford, yes," he said. "I suppose Sanford is Meiklejohn said Gov. Claude Kirk received a letter from Robert Finch, secretary of health, education







is a booming business. Last week in Chicago, the authorities broke up one of the biggest swindles of all time. Using credit cards, a 32-member ring managed to rake in more than \$10 million before they were apprehended and indicted for mail fraud. Many of the cards used in this epic swindle were stolen from mailboxes of people who had received the cards, unsolicited, without prior notice.

The Chicago episode should be ample warning not only to individuals who are careless with credit cards—women leave them lying around in purses in all sorts of places—but to eager-beaver business enterprises who mail out the cards in scattergun fashion.-Montgomery (Ala.) Alabama Journal.

curity number. . . . The Pentagon has announced that henceforth Army and tir Porce recruits will be identified by Social Security instead of serial numbers. The change will promote efficiency and save money, but somehow the sound doesn't ring right, and won't probably, until a top sergeant beliews it across a drill field.

The serial number was the civilian's introduction to the service, and possibly marked a deeper sense of division from his old life than did the GI haircut. Numbers are plentiful now, but the service serial number was the earliest identification for most persons with the dehumanizing society of computers. It signified that the bearer was no longer a cogomen, but a cog in a vast machine.

As old soldiers leave the ranks, so will serial numbers fade, said the Pentagon, But not soon. 
