NEWS COMES from China not pleasant or reassuring. Many Americans killed, the British Consul and a British missionary are shot.

ONE JAPANESE MARINE was shot dead yesterday, while Japanese troops were searching European and American foreigners, and that death may have results.

MOSCOW REJOICES wildly in Chinese talk of a world revolution and foresees 140,000,000 Russian communists joining with 400,000,000 Chinese communists to "make the whole world a commune."

IN AMERICA, CHINESE seem to have caught the excitement of the flowery kingdom. Wars between the Hip Sing and On Loong gentlemen broke loose yesterday in six cities, with six killed and two shot.

Give To The Y. M. C. A.
