

Identification of drainage problems in Seminole County ultimately will lead to savings n dollars for taxpayers, according to Chief County Planner Jerry Langston. Langston and a second planner, Ralph Stone, will present facts about drainage

problems as they relate to the countywide comprehensive plan being prepared by the Board of County Commission's Drainage is the focus of the 7 p.m. meeting Wednesday at the courthouse in Sanford. It is the third such session held by

county planners who must have the final comprehensive plan ready by October of 1977. Stone said planners develop maps showing areas with drainage problems. These facts are then plugged




In some areas of the county notably in Altamonte Springs development has caused drainage problems resulting in severe flooding during the rainy season.

## Lockheed Pay-Offs Disclosure

### **Brings Demands For Code**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Disclosure of payoffs to foreign officials by Lockheed Aircraft Corp. is bringing demands in Congress for an international code of business ethics that would outlaw the practice. "It's not just an American problem," said Sen. Charles

H. Percy, R-Ill., at the conclusion Friday of Lockheed hearings by the Senate subcommittee on multinational

"I hope now there will be movement in Congress, in private business, and in the OECD community (Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development) for an effective multilateral code of conduct for corporations." The Senate made a start this week in adopting an amendment to a pending foreign military aid bill requiring contractors to report gifts, fees and commissions paid or offered in connection with U.S. weapons

#### **Elections Board Closes**

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) - The frail compromise that built California's farm labor elections law, Gov. Edmund Brown Jr.'s most celebrated achievement, has

The Agricultural Labor Relations Board ran out of money Friday and closed its four regional offices after presiding over five months of relative peace in the state's

More than 400 secret-ballot elections, the first for California's farm workers, have been held under the law. Disputes, though sometimes heated, have not been violent as the previous decade of union-grower conflict often was.

# Ford Campaigns Personally

MANCHESTER, N.H. (AP) - President Ford began taking it personally Saturday. After a campaign by proxy and organization, Ford was to seek New Hampshire presidential primary votes for himself on a two-day mission to the state where he faces

his first challenge from Ronald Reagan. With it, Ford's Republican allies hope to give a major lift to what has been a troubled campaign effort. The President, his wife and daughter Susan were flying into Manchester for the weekend of campaigning. The emphasis clearly was on an effort to present Ford the President, not the campaigning politician.

# Ten Face Smuggling Charges

RALEIGH (AP)-Ten men are facing indictments on charges of smuggling 22 tons of marijuana from Colombia into the fishing village of Mesic on the North Carolina A federal grand jury returned the indictments in

The drugs were seized by sederal and state law enforcement officers at a seafood processing plant in Pamlico County Jan.11. Officers said it was the largest drug shipment ever seized in North Carolina. The value was estimated at over \$30 million.

BOSTON (AP) - Nancy Kissinger, wife of the secretary of state, was scheduled to undergo surgery here for a stomach ulcer. Dr. W. Gerald Auste, chief of surgery at Massachusetts

Genera Hospital, and Dr. George Nardi said they concurred with the findings of Washington doctors after studying X-rays and examining Mrs. Kissinger. The doctors said the operative plan will depend on the findings at the time of surgery but will almost certainly consist of removing the distal portion of the stomach that which empties into the small intestine. Mrs. Kissinger, 41, has had a recurring gastric ulcer for about nine years, hospital officials said.

#### Riot Squad To Patrol Escambia High School

PENSACOLA (AP) - A riot squad of 50 officers will patrol the halls when Escambia High School re-opens Monday for the first time since fierce racial fighting over the school's nickname, police say, The battered school closed its doors Friday as authorities prepared disciplinary action against about 40 students suspected of triggering Thursday's four-hour

County schools spokesman Jack Bridges said suspension and expulsion hearings will begin next week. Meanwhile, workers began repairing about \$5,000 worth of damages to the school. Authorities reported that rampaging students smashed 97 windows and destroyed clocks, water coolers, floor tiles, cafeteria furniture and other school property.

#### **Two Parties Lose Voters**

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Democratic and Republican parties lost voters while the number of persons registered as independents or with other parties increased, according to the latest registration polls. Figures released Friday by the Elections Division from registration when books closed Jan. 24 showed that the total number of voters dropped 68,617 in 16 months to

Registered Democrats declined 45,916 and Republicans dropped 7,561 while independents and other parties increased 5,245 over the lists when books were closed in September 1974 for the November general election.

# **Odds Shorter** For Detente

When U.S. and Soviet nogotiators resumed their Strategic Arms Limitation Talks in Geneva they set a target date of May for reaching a new agreement to restrict nuclear weapons. They may not meet the deadline.

SALT, indeed the entire broader subject of detente itself, has undergone considerable reevaluation in the United States since the euphoric days of 1972 when the current cycle of coexistence with the Soviet Union began. At that time both the United States and the Soviet Union said in part that "efforts to obtain unilateral advantages at the expense of the other, direct or indirect, are inconsistent" with superpower detente.

Soviet behavior in the last three years has swept away most of our delusions about the possibility of reducing tensions in areas where we have direct or indirect confrontations with Russia. By word and deed Moscow has informed us in no uncertain terms that it will continue to support "just wars of national liberation" - meaning its clients in Portugal, the Middle East, Angola, Sahara and elsewhere.

Removal of two of the foundation blocks of detente by the Soviet Union has created even greater suspicion in the United States about the intentions of the Soviet Union in the third area -

the control of arms, particularly strategic arms. Americans were understandably nervous about SALT I because it permits the Soviet Union to have more and bigger nuclear weapons than the United States eventually. The Soviet offer for SALT II would continue that curve.

Moscow proposes that strategic nuclear missiles now be limited to 2,100 or 2,200 instead of the 2,400 agreed upon by President Ford and Leonid Brezhnev at Vladivostok 14 months ago. Cruise missiles - highly accurate drone aircraft - also would not be counted individually, but their range would be limited to 1,500 miles on

bombers and 360 miles on submarines or ships In toto the Soviet Union has yielded nothing. Counting its Backfire bombers, some of which already are deployed, it would still have some 2,400 strategic weapons. A Backfire equipped with a Soviet cruise missile with a 1,500-mile range would most certainly pose a danger to the United States even if it could not be refueled in the air.

In turn the American cruise missile, which is our next generation of Colt .45 peacemaker, would be hobbled even before it is off the drawing boards. A 360-mile range for an ocean-launched cruise missile would not reach any major targets in the Soviet Union. Conversely, a Soviet sea cruise missile with a 360-mile range could wreak havoc in the United States.

It is not likely that Congress would approve such a bargain, nor should it. The Soviet Union has made it clear by inviting Secretary of State Kissinger to Moscow to talk about SALT that it places a high value on concluding another

That opens the door to a hard nosed, realistic counter offer by the United States - one that protects our interests.
