

# Parents wary after murder

#### By Liane Edixon Herald Writer

SANFORD — Parents contacted in Seminole County are fearful for their children after the molestation and murder of 9-year-old Jessica Lunsford, who lived

with her father and grandparents in Citrus County.

"Each time you hear about that stuff, it saddens you," Cassandra Hillery of Sanford said in an interview Monday.

Hillery who lives in a neighborhood where many of the surrounding houses are filled with her nieces, nephews, and grandnieces and nephews, said her husband checks the Seminole County Sheriff's Office Web site for sex offenders and sexual predators in their area.

"My husband goes online and we keep a check on it," Hillery said.

In the city of Sanford, Lake Mary and Longwood, there are close to 200 sex offenders registered and five sexual predators registered with the Sheriff's Office. On the Sheriff's Web site, readers can search by zip code to see if any sex offenders or predators live nearby.

A local physician with knowledge of child abuse cases said he was aware of the Sheriff's Web site and although he checks it, he believes there should be a better system in place.

word that strikes fear into many people, but in Sanford there is a new facility that aims to give the best possible care to cancer sufferers.

The Central Florida Cancer Care Center moved into a brand new 12,000-square-foot facility on State Road 46 in June last year and treats about 40 patients daily from mostly Seminole and south Volusia counties. Its new location, housing the latest technology, was chosen for its proximity to the Central Florida Regional Hospital.

The three doctors at the practice: D. Wayne Joiner, Steven G. Lester, and John D. Looper are all board certified radiation oncologists, committed to "state of the art" care.

The center's Web site explains that in addition to

giving the best treatment, they will take the time to "educate our patients and provide them with information that allows them to understand their illness and treatment options so you can make informed decisions regarding your cancer treatment."

The care the physicians refer to is possible because the Cancer Care Center is equipped with some highly advanced technology.

Amongst the machines at the center are those required

for one of the most advanced forms of radiation treatment; Intensity Modulated Radiation Therapy, or IMRT.

Other equipment includes a Varian linear accelerator, electronic portal imaging, electron medical record, and quality control software.

In the future the center will also house a PET scanner, which detects metabolic activity. The physicians will use it alongside the CAT scan for even more accurate treat-

### care director named in Seminole County

LAKE MARY — Most Seminole County residents do not feel a personal stake in protecting the community's children and that has to change, according to the new executive director of Community Based Care of Seminole.

Glen Casel has replaced Ron Zychowski to lead the county's non-profit family services organization. Zychowski recently resigned after about a year. He will head a community based care organization in his hometown of Daytona Beach.

"Ultimately, 1 want county residents to feel connected to the children we serve," Casel said in

an interview at his Lake Mary office. "They share in our burdens and our successes."

First people must get to know the CBC office, he said. That is his initial goal.

CBC of Seminole was formed by the Children's Home Society of Florida, Human Services Associates Inc., Seminole Community Health Center Inc., and Family Care Services of Central Florida Inc.

It is part of the statewide mandate to transition child welfare services from the Department of Child and Family Services to private organizations.

# SCC completes master plans

SANFORD — Seminole Community College completed a comprehensive master plan update March 18 for the Sanford/Lake Mary campus.

C.T. Hsu and Associates are the architects who designed the project, which calls for master planning the 270-acre property SCC currently sits on. The project included an analysis of existing facilities and infrastructure, location of future facilities and the development of campus guidelines.

"I definitely feel this is a much needed master plan. It will definitely help Seminole Community College to guide its future growth," said C.T. Hsu of C.T. Hsu and Associates.

Creating the master plan was a yearlong process, a news release said, which included obtaining input from the city of Sanford, the city of Lake Mary and Seminole County. The surrounding communities were also asked for their input in the process. Interviews, questionnaires, workshops and design assessions researched the physical, environmental, aes-

dinates the range of services available in the county for abused and neglected children here.

To demonstrate the scope of abuse and

talked about the need to rebuild trust with the community.

Casel also

He is well aware that the Department of Families and Children has experienced severe criticism, but he is an outspoken advocate of the community based model.

"If all we do is move the bull's eye from the state to us, then we've failed," he said. "The issues won't be settled overnight, but if you've felt helpless in the past, now you can be part of the solution."

The organization has to build a professional trust with the public, Casel said. With time the focus can shift away from the caregivers.

"We have to turn the attention toward the bad people who do bad things to children," he said.

The community concept will introduce better business practices and be more flexible than the state model, Casel said. And the community ownership and partnership is key.

"Most people have not had a lot of ownership in the problems of abuse and neglect," Casel said. "We need to own it and be responsible for it. These are our children."

CBC in Seminole County has gotten off to a slow start with its first director staying barely a year. Casel said he is home.

"I'm not moving," the new executive director said, adding that the location in Seminole County was important to him. He has lived here with his wife and children for 15 years.

Casel had served as vice president of operations, finance and information reporting for the Children's Home Society of Florida. Part of his responsibilities there included support for several community based care organizations.

Experience with the Florida Department of Families and Children, known as the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services before that, has given him that state perspective as well.

With the state he served as Central Florida district manager. His responsibilities included child welfare, drug abuse and mental health programs as well as adult protective services.

"Glen brings a dynamic range of experience, skill and vision to Community Based Care of Seminole," said Diane DeMark, president of the CBCS board of directors. "We're looking forward to a long and productive future under Glen's leadership."

How can people take ownership for the care of young people in Seminole County? Casel pointed to volunteerism.

The county always needs foster parents and guardian adlitems to help children in the court system. There is always the traditional board members and of course contributions.

"It's important that people in Florida learn about CBC as an initiative," Casel said. "The general public hasn't been actively involved in a state-run system, the way it hopefully can be involved in a community-based one."

Fourteen people work in the CBC of Seminole office, he said. and it's not large by design. CBC is the liaison between state funding and the organizations already in place to help children. "We don't want to replace

(local child advocacy organization)," he said.

"Hopefully we will stay smalland stay focused. We have to build that credibility. This is not going to be the end of abuse, but we can do better."

retired commander from the Aurora Illinois Police Department, presented the daylong seminar.

His main point was that police departments hire the best of the best, but sometimes department policies or just daily temptations crack the foundation of integrity that all officers must have.

The concepts discussed could apply to any professional organization, Nila said in an interview, but with law enforcement, the cost can be devastating.

He told participants about the rivalry between the New York Police Department and New York Fire the Department. There had been a history of actual fights on the scene, mostly over control.

He has read the Covey books and wants to use the seminar to be the kind of person to inspire other officers and to be open to learning from them.


This is the first such seminar that wasn't about a typical law enforcement skill such as handcuffing, said Casselberry Police Chief John Pavlis.



### Airport awards millions in six new contracts

"It's close to my heart," said the physician from Lake Mary; who asked that his name not be used.

For most parents, grandparents and any other person who have children close to them, stories of sexual predators and sexoffenders hits home, whether they or someone they know have been a victim of sex offenses or not, the physician agreed.

A woman living in Longwood has a grandchild who visits and a nephew who lives with her. She also asked not to use her name, but said that child molesters and other sex offenders should have harsher punishments and law enforcement should come up with a better system of keeping track and registering violators.

"You never know who your neighbor is," the Longwood womah said.

Hillery, who said she is constantly keeping a watch of all the children in the neighborhood, still gets nervous when people drive through whom she doesn't recognize.

"They call me nosy, but I'm just concerned," Hillery said.

The Public Safety Information Act of 1997 required mandatory community notification and registration requirements for sexual predators who committed their act on or after Oct. 1, 1993. In October 1997, the Act was broadened to include sex offenders who have been released from any sanction of the court or from the care, custody and control of the Florida Department of Corrections. Law enforcement is not mandated to notify people and the community about sex offenders living in the neighborhood, but police chiefs and sheriff's can release crimiusing a small space,' Samovsky said.

If the Legislature approves their submission, they will begin expanding classroom size and expanding the library services, Sarnovsky said.

"We're excited about cooperating with the cities and county," the Vice President of Administration and Business said.

Another aspect of the master plan is the traffic flow on campus, which they found was significant, and efforts to improve the roadways will start in the fall at the same time the automotive facility construction starts.



gy. This enables the doctors to plan exactly where a patient's radiation treatment needs to concentrate. The cancer is then treated with the least possible. damage to the surrounding tissue.

Both the planning and treatment is carried out at the center, usually on an outpatient basis, eliminating the need for patients to go to the hospital for daily treatment.

Registered nurse Kathleen Rusche said she appreciated the convenience of the location and the level of care she received at the center. She was diagnosed with rectal cancer in July 2004 after a routine gynaecological check up. She had no symptoms and did not feel at all unwell at the time. She began her treatments at the new center in August.

"The whole staff was very professional and so caring --everyone from the reception staff, the technicians and all of the doctors. They really know


what they are doing," she said.

Rusche, who has a background in oncology nursing, said: "It is very overwhelming, even as a nurse, being on the end of radiation therapy." But was full of praise at how friendly and supportive everyone at the center was and how good the doctors were at explaining each stage of the treatment.

Happily, Rusche was declared cancer-free in December and is grateful for both the early detection of the cancer and the subsequent quality care she received.



Nimish developed an algorithm that enabled quantum computers to process several functions at the same time --providing a much more efficient way for these high-powered research computers to process information.

This process made these computers exponentially faster than regular computers and much better suited to studying natural phenomena like biological self-replication, according to a news release from the science center

"Ultimately, Nimish's 'Best in Fair' achievement could aid scientists in the further development of self-replicating nanobots - tiny robots often used in the medical field to treat a wide range of diseases," the release said. His efforts also brought acclaim to his teacher Jeane Swaynos. Nimish's win nabbed his teacher \$1,000 to use for a science education project.



### UCF's late comeback not enough against Connecticut

Senior Gary Johnson scored a career-high 29 points and UCF mounted a furious second half rally, but it was not enough as the Golden Knights fell to Connecticut, 77-71, in first round action at the NCAA Tournament on Friday afternoon at the DCU Center. The 15th-seed Golden Knights conclude their season at 24-9 and second-seeded Connecticut (23-7) moves on to face NC State in the second round of the Syracuse Regional.

Johnson sank seven threepointers, one shy of a school record, and added six rebounds and five assists.

The Huskies, the defending national champions, led by as many as 19 in the second half, but UCF refused to go down. Johnson sparked the late rally with three free throws to cut the lead to 63-49 with 10:36 to play.

When junior Justin Rose excited the crowd with a dunk over Josh Boone, the Golden Knights trailed by 11 with less than nine minutes on the clock.

A pair of foul shots from junior Will Bakanowsky got UCF within six at the 3:36 mark, but Connecticut responded, getting baskets inside from Boone and Charlie Villanueva to make the score 72-62.

Bakanowsky matched a career-best with 15 points and added a team-high seven boards and three steals. He nailed three triples as UCF made 11-of-28 from behindthe-arc.

The Golden Knights stayed close early and trailed by six after Johnson hit a trey seven minutes into the game. Under the 10-minute mark, the Huskies started to pull away. Baskets in the paint by Boone, **Rudy Gay and Hilton** Armstrong handed

Connecticut a 27-16 advantage Villanueva hit a long three at the buzzer to give the Huskies a 47-31 lead at halftime.

A layup from senior Kingsley Edwards cut the deficit to five points with 23 seconds to go in the contest, but UCF was forced to foul and Marcus Williams made three of four down the stretch to secure the victory for Connecticut.

Edwards finished with 10 points, five assists and three steals for the Golden Knights. Rose chipped in with nine points off the bench.

**Connecticut** shot 50 percent from the field, led by a 9-of-13 effort from Villanueva. He finished with 22 points and seven boards. Gay totaled 17 points while Denham Brown and Boone finished with 11 and 10, respectively.


#### **STETSON WOMEN FALL TO** LSU IN FIRST ROUND **OF NCAA TOURNAMENT**


