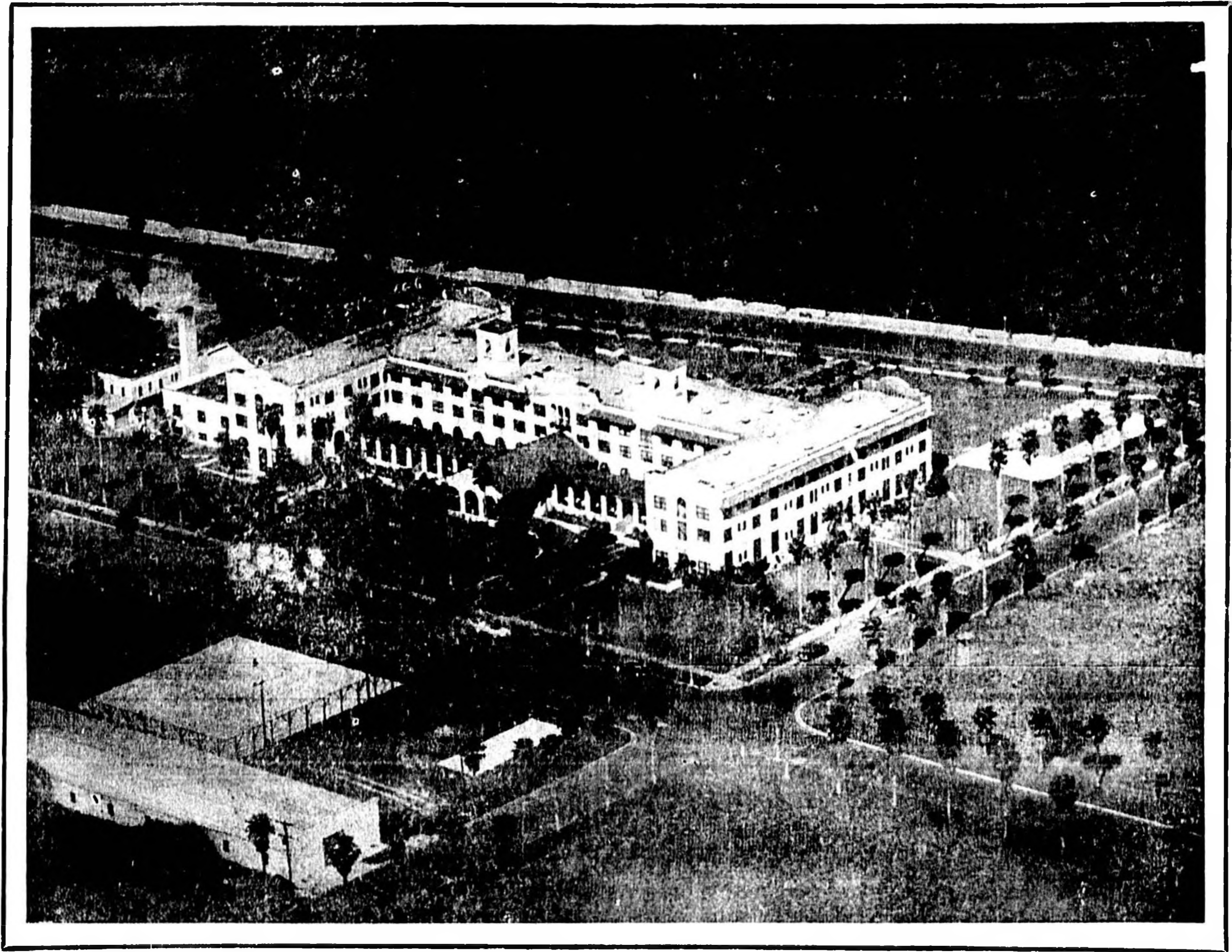

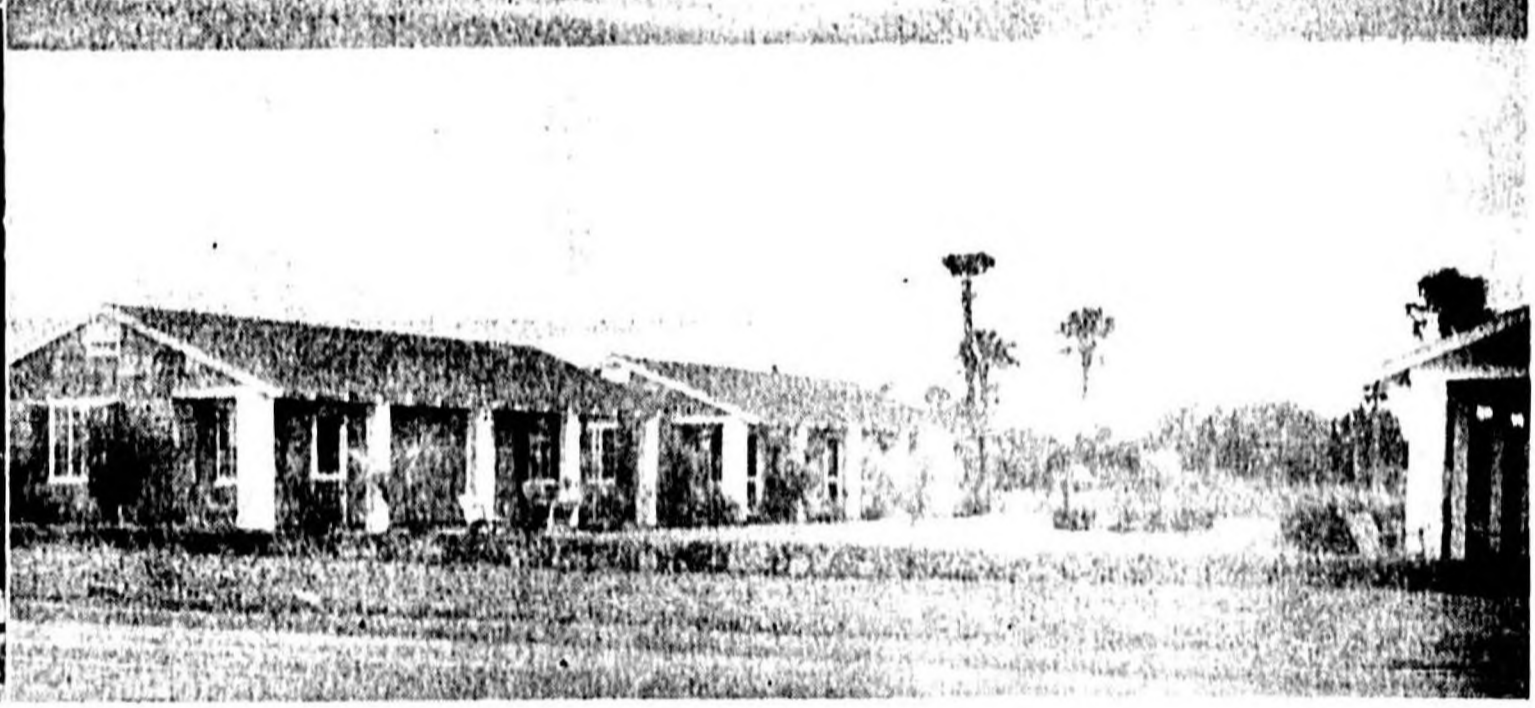

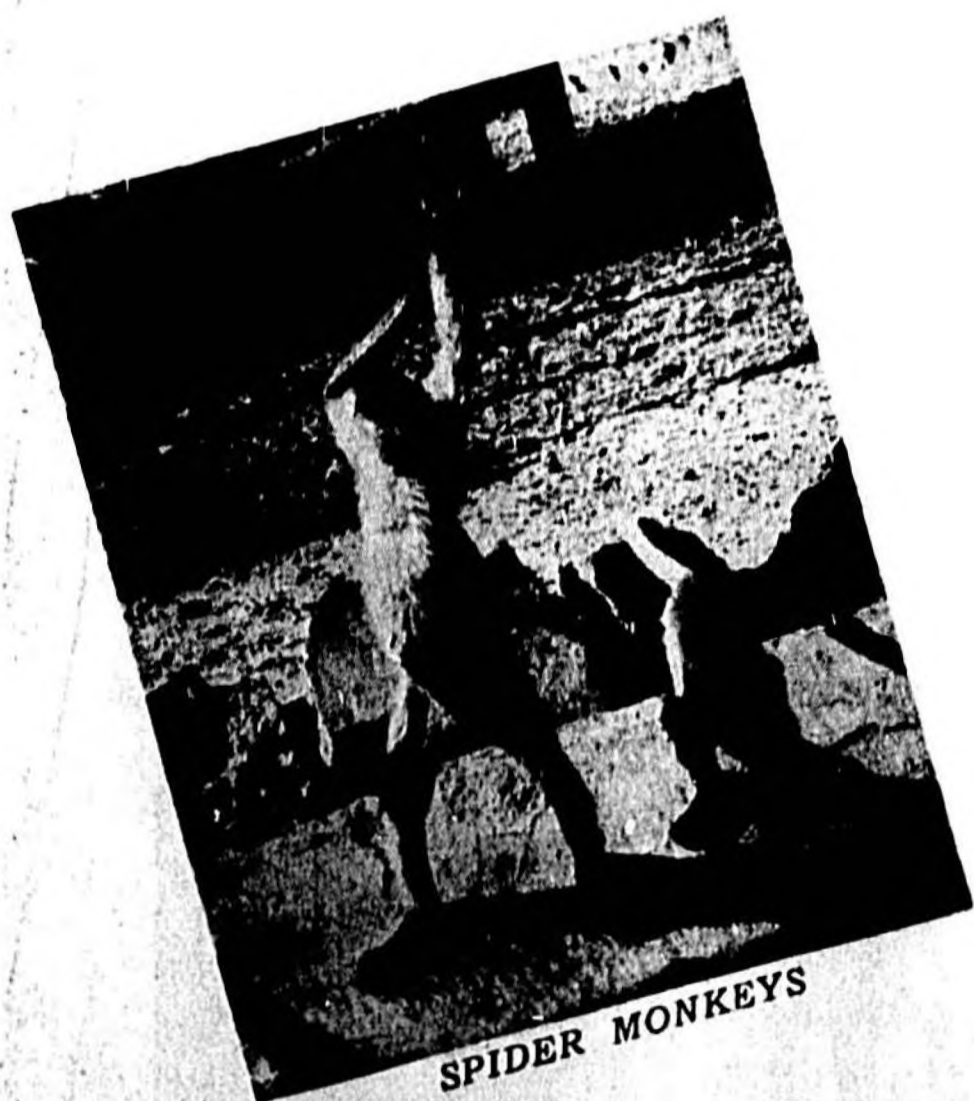

GROWTH OF MOTEL industry in Sanford and Seminole County has been rapid since the close of World War II. Today, motorists will find almost a score of motels within the Sanford area along highway 17. The representative courts are shown above. At the upper left is Macdonell Motor Court on the Orlando Highway. It is owned and operated by Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Macdonell, who point out that the court has an AAA recommendation. Fourteen rooms are available to tourists. The court was constructed immediately after the end of the war. Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Michels, who came here from Saratoga Springs, N. Y., and purchase of the court which they now operate during December, are managers of Michels Lodge on the Orlando Highway. Shown in the center left picture. Their four cottages are set well back from the highway. The bottom left picture shows the Armistage Cabin Court, which was built in 1940 and is the oldest in the city. It is located at 2500 Park Avenue. Open the year around, it has 12 rental units and is managed by Joe Meister and Charles Lamb. In the upper right picture is shown the Bennett Cabin Court on the Orlando highway. Mr. and Mrs. Larry Bennett operate the motel, which was built during 1936. There are six rental units. The Bennetts purchased the property in February 1934. The Fountain Lodge, newest in the city, is shown in the middle right photograph. Mrs. Philip Wenz owns the property and building, while Robert Wenz, a former pianist with the Paul Whiteman Orchestra, is the manager. There are 16 rooms available. The only motel located north of the city within Seminole County is the Colonial Tourist Court managed by Carl S. Myers. Built five years ago, the court has five rental units available for occupancy.

**Early Settlers Here  
Raised Indigo Plants**

Way back in 1767, some 1500 persons from Italy, Greece, Minorca, and Smyrna settled in a district which embraced territory as far east as New Smyrna. They planted indigo and sugar cane along with olive and other Mediterranean fruit trees. The indigo plants covered 2,500 acres and were responsible for a \$2,000,000 yield.

The agricultural venture continued as a successful one until some years later when a chemical process of dyeing destroyed the indigo for those times.

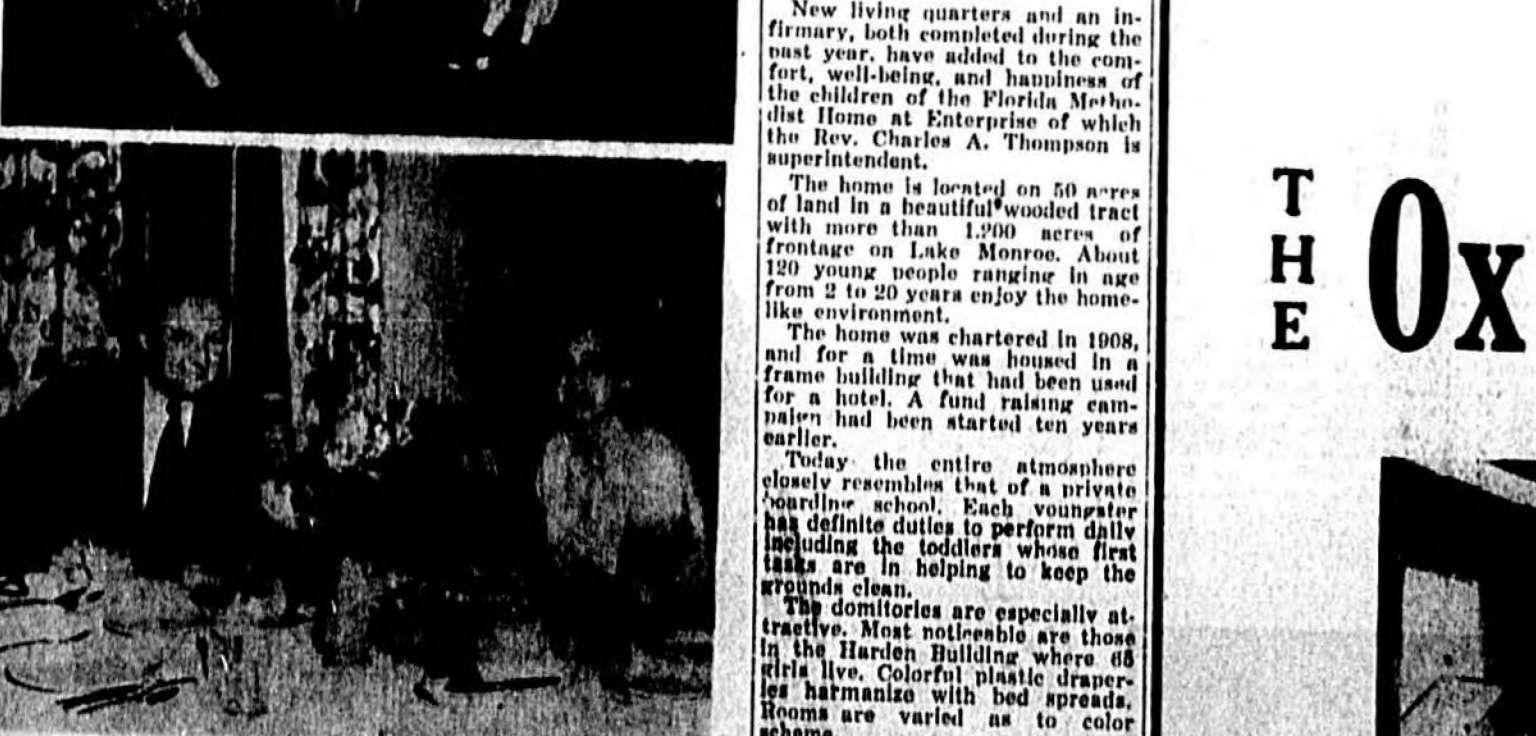

**A HOMELIKE ATMOSPHERE** prevails throughout the Florida Methodist Home at Enterprise where the Rev. Charles A. Thompson, superintendent, and Mrs. Thompson have added to the comfort, well-being, and happiness of the children of the Florida Methodist Home at Enterprise of which the Rev. Charles A. Thompson is superintendent.

The home is located on 50 acres with more than 1,500 acres of frontage on Lake Monroe. About 120 young people ranging in age from 2 to 20 years enjoy the homelike environment.

The home was chartered in 1908, and for a time was housed in a frame building that had been used for a hotel. A fund raising campaign had started ten years earlier.

Today the entire atmosphere closely resembles that of a private boarding school. Each youngster has definite duties to perform daily including the toddlers whose first tasks are in helping to keep the grounds clean.

The dormitories are especially attractive. Most noticeable are those in the Harden Building where 68 girls live. Colorful, plastic draperies harmonize with bed spreads. Rooms are painted as to color scheme.

Mrs. Thompson, wife of the superintendent, was responsible for the decorating of the rooms which closely resemble those of rooms in private schools for girls.

The entire recreation room on the second floor of the building is a beautiful and well-equipped room of a similar age along with the playground. Children have many opportunities for amusement of all types. The colorfully decorated and furnished living portions of the home extend to the dining room with its brightly colored plastic curtains and modern steel tables. The youngsters take turns at being waiters.

Even the kitchen has a modern-looking appearance with equipment which is completely renovated. In 1940 the kitchen was completely renovated. It had 120 square feet of floor space, a gas range with large oven, a deep freeze unit, and cold storage chest.

Children are busy from the time they get up in the morning until bedtime with a healthy and active life of work and play. The younger

**"Cracker" Kirchhoff Operating

Arthur Kirchhoff, mentioned in several newspapers of the month recently as "Cracker Kirchhoff," has for a number of years been one of Sanford's and Florida's most ardent leaders. The mightiest of his might, he might expect Kirchhoff to be there to operate through the Chamber of Commerce.

However, a brief chat with this straight-forward gentleman will give any such speculation. His enthusiasm is unconditionally his own, and any benefits that the Chamber of Commerce might derive is but a free by-product of his exuberant nature of our subterranean virtues. Where things of a civic nature are buzzing, you may expect Kirchhoff to be there to contribute his share to the getting on.

Several months ago, the Herald published an article about Mr. Kirchhoff in which it related his sending a giant post card in the Postmaster's Convention in Little Rock, Ark. Subsequent to that Arthur Kirchhoff is a man possessing several unusual and varied talents. **Seminole County  
Created In 1913**

April 29, 1913 was a memorable day for Sanford citizens for it was on that date that the State Legislature passed a bill creating Seminole County with Sanford as the county seat. The following day Sanford citizens had taken their oaths as official citizens to the new county.

The celebration that followed in Sanford was a grand affair. The city was decorated with bunting and flags. A special machine was built for cutting their picture which took the form of a large letter 'S'. The celebration was closed by a banquet at the Hotel Sanford.

**Midget City Is  
Big Attraction On  
Orlando Highway**

Complete to the minutest detail, "Midget City" is located on the Orlando highway between the former residence of O. T. Frank, who has been a resident of this attraction draws many tourists who find it a source of admiration and amusement.

Midget City is an Ohio for 13 years before moving it to Seminole County seven years ago. Upwards of 100 persons in a single day have visited the free attraction which provides a treat not easily duplicated elsewhere.

From the level countryside the display gradually ascends into miniature mountain range through which trains send their way over trestles and longer they cross lakes and rivers on either side of their courses.

In Glades Brier

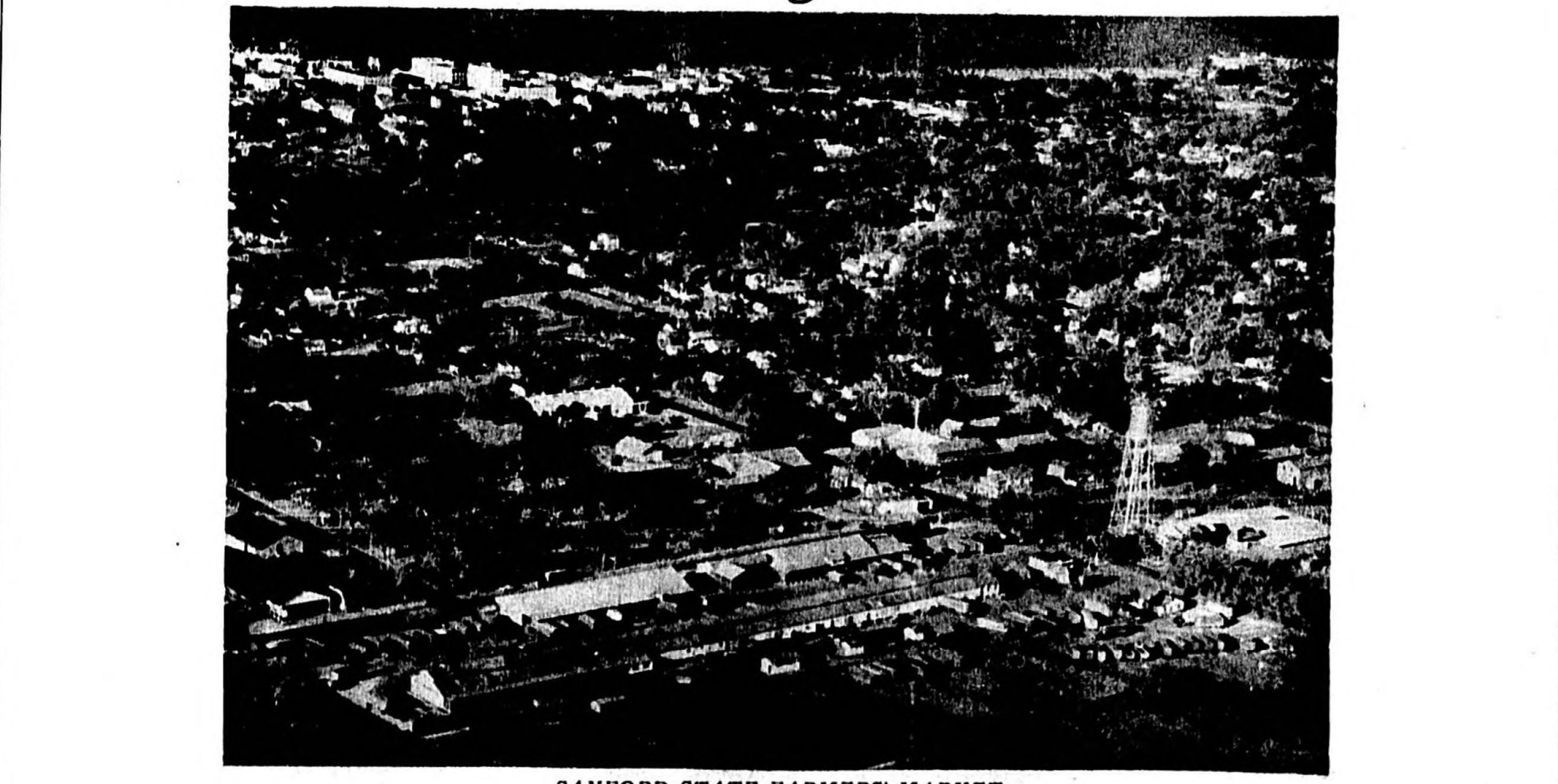
