## Cobb And Speaker May Play For St. Louis And Boston Next Season, Thinks Walsh

NEW YORK, Jan. 28.—Ty Cobb and this speaker, duly absolved in connection with charges that they had been parties to hocus pocus on the ball field, may appear in the St. Louis and Boston outfields respectively this season, according to a report that reached Edward G. Barrow, business manager of the New York Yankees, today.

Barrow added that, rather than see them get away from the American league, the Yankees themselves would be pleased to take either or both of the stars.

That Cobb and Speaker will be permitted from that league seems to be about as probable as the tale, circulated some days ago, that baseball planned to placate Landis by hiring George Warton Pepper for \$100,000 a year and placing him under the judge, who has worked seven years to achieve a piffing \$65,000.

The Cobb-for-Speaker trade between Detroit and Cleveland is another perfectly good story that has failed to stand the test of time but Barrow's prediction is that competition for the pair will be red hot among the remaining six clubs in the league.

For what reason, my guess on Cobb is that he might eventually wind up in Philadelphia. The Tigers are crying out loud for infielders and pitchers and Connie Mack has both. However, the Browns have a talking point in Robertson, Giard and one or two others and perhaps Barrow's information is on the plumb-bob level.

Speaker, they say, is in far greater than Cobb and unless the Cleveland club gives him an unconditional release, it is not likely that Tris will be landed except at the expense of players on the flat foot.

Navin's action in waiving all restrictions is all the more generous in view of the fact that the Tigers are crying out loud for infielders and Connie Mack could have satisfied the want. However, the general understanding is that the placing of Cobb and Speaker will be done for the betterment of the league as a whole and that their appearance in St. Louis and Boston would strengthen the two weak clubs. Barrow's information, therefore, may be on the plumb-bob level.

"Cobb and Dan Howley have been friends for years," Edward observed. "That makes the idea look sound. The same thing goes for Speaker in Boston. It is the town where he first got his reputation and Bill Carrigan is the man."

The point, however, is that Cobb and Speaker will not be permitted to pick their sports. Speaker in Boston probably would be highly acceptable to all parties concerned with the possible exception of Cleveland. The Red Sox haven't much to offer in return. The

## BRISTLING BATTLES OF BARE FIST DAYS

(MY LIFE STORY) by Jack McAuliffe

I suppose if I were a fancy writer I could draw word pictures that would fire the blood and thrill the heart of every mother's son of you. Romance, you might call it. Romance and color—but to me it was LIFE.

Rings pitched stealthily in the dead of night. Rich idlers, sons of the aristocracy of early New York and New England, dodging the brass buttons and blue coats of the law to see me fight.

Bloody battles that lasted 20, 30, 40 and 50 rounds! Men, real heroes of steel, jabbing, blocking, covering, lashing out with sudden spurts, backing away cagily. Fights on dirty black barges under the summer stars. Hurried flights and all the thrills that make this game the greatest in the world.

I wish I could do justice to this story of my life and to the original Jack Dempsey and all the great muscular gods of the ring, but if I slip a bit now and then and my grammar isn't so good, please remember I'm doing the best I can, for my heart is in every single word of it.

I first saw the light of day in one of the prettiest towns in the world—Cork, Ireland, March 24, 1886. I came to America in 1871. Settled at Bangor, Maine, where my father ran a cooper shop. Later we moved to Cambridge, Mass., and I started selling papers. In 1879 we moved to the famous "Fourteenth Ward" of Brooklyn and all the hardy, lusty little Micks from all Ireland, it seemed, lived there.

I was timid at first but a few sound smacks on the jaw got me

going and I became quite a scrappier. In those days it didn't mean much to be a good fighter. You had to be the whole works or stay in the rear. Well, I finally whipped everybody in our block but good old Paddy Garrity.

He was one of the best fighters I ever saw. Naturally good. My size, age and weight.

My fight with him was the first real big fight of my life. It is still vivid in my mind. We met one night under the corner lamp on North Second street.

My, how our pudgy little fists flew. We battled on and on, and so evenly were we matched till finally the cops broke it up. We met again the next night—and the next—and the next. Each time the fight became bitterer. After each ferocious encounter the cops ran us bowlegged. We kept that up every night, a gruelling pace, for FIVE NIGHTS!

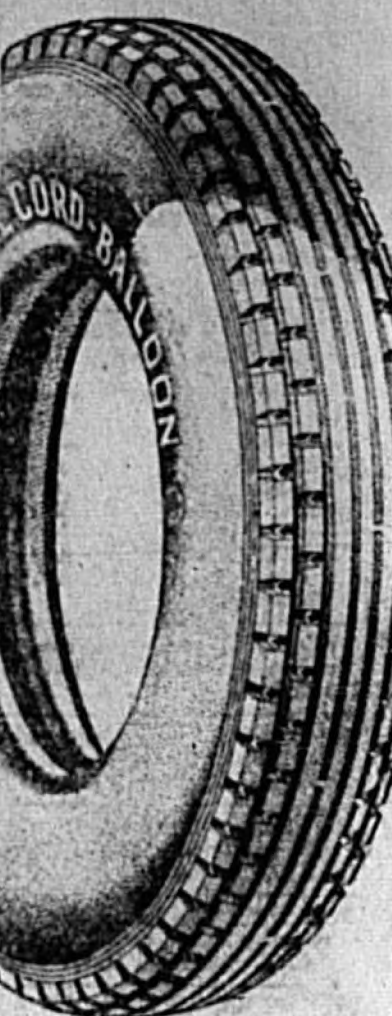
