Supreme Court Decisions

A few days ago Senator George Norris, Republican of Nebraska, introduced in the Senate a resolution calling for a constitutional amendment prohibiting the Supreme Court from ruling Congressional acts unconstitutional, except by more than a two-thirds majority. Hitherto, a number of laws have been invalidated by the Court in 5 to 4 decisions. Senator Norris' proposal would require at least a 7 to 3 decision to annul Congressional legislation.

In view of this proposal it should be interesting to see what Chief Justice Hughes thinks about it, not necessarily what he thinks now, but what he thought in 1923, when he was not a member of the Supreme Court but when as merely a practicing attorney, he was delivering a series of lectures at Columbia University on the Supreme Court, a member of which he had already been from 1910 to 1916, and with which he was as familiar as any living man not actually a member of the Court.

"It is often said, when a decision of the Court is by a vote of five to four, that one judge determines the result," Mr. Hughes declared. 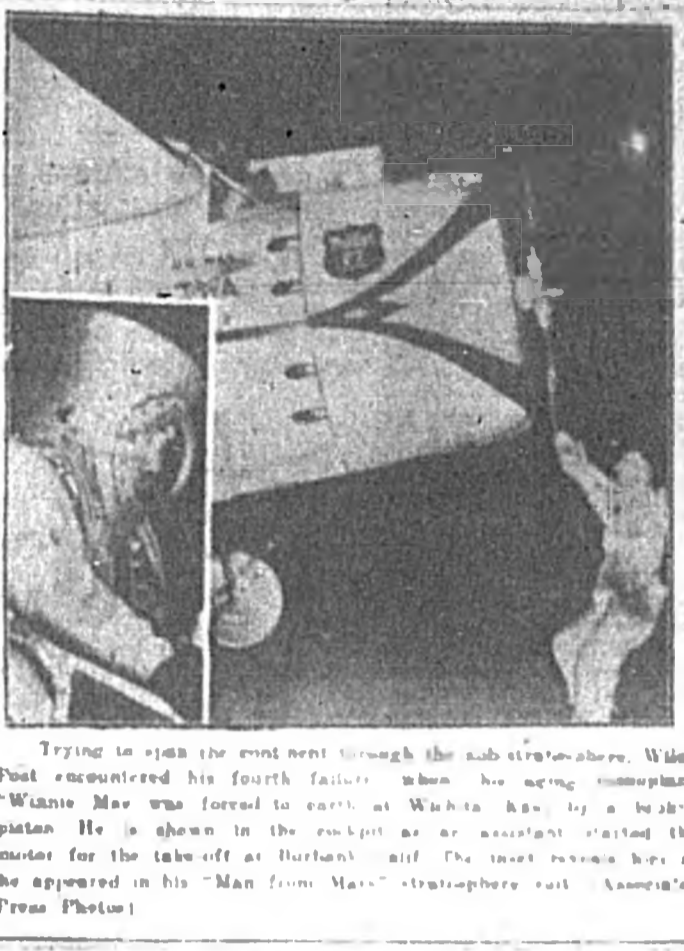
