

1,500 Persons Visit Sanatorium For Tuberculosis

More than 1,500 persons visited the State Tuberculosis Sanatorium at Orlando in one year, it is disclosed by the institution's annual report just published. The visitors signing the visitors' book, 15,033 were white and 1,000 were colored. A large number of persons failed to write the visitors' book, according to Dr. R. D. Thompson, superintendent and medical director.

"Visitors," stated Dr. Thompson, "are always welcome. The more visitors, the more information we are able to disseminate about the cure of tuberculosis, and the more people know that tuberculosis is curable, is preventable and transmissible."

It is not permissible to let anyone come in the sanatorium at any hour. They must be accompanied by a relative or others in the ward and on the same hall who need to rest. Visitors are not permitted to visit with friends and other relatives more than one hour.

New Defense Tax Put Strain On U. S. Mint

PHILADELPHIA, July 4.—(AP)—The national defense tax has taxed the U. S. mint here to the limit— it's out of pennies. Superintendent Dressel said today that "we've shipped out millions of 'em, and if the demand keeps up, we'll have to throw all our resources on pennies, 24 hours a day."

The new tax, effective July 1, added to the production price of about 40 items and most of the increases went from one to a few cents.

Bankers throughout the nation anticipated the need and stocked up.

On June 24 the mint had had 254,126,536 pennies on hand. Today Dressel said about the only one-cent coins still around were in the pockets of employees.

"They've got the banks—not the employees," he declared, "and the banks are piling up all the time."

The mint has a penny capacity of 1,400,000 for an eight-hour shift, which means that soon it will be turning out more than 4,000,000 pennies a day when the three shifts are started.

"And this probably will have to be kept up until the demand levels off," Dressel added.

Both the Denver and San Francisco mints also make pennies, and officials here presumed they too were faced with the same problem.
