Driver's license office to leave Sanford

State department selects Winter Springs site as new location for license office

SANFORD — Seminole County residents will no longer drive to the county seat to renew their driver's license.

Officials with the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) decided to relocate the drivers' license office to Winter Springs from its cramped location near the

Orlando International Airport.

Robert Sanchez, public information administrator with the department, said a final decision to move the office to 290 East State Road 434 — about 1.5 miles east of Winter Springs Golf Club — was made in late November.

The DHSMV leased its current space on East Airport Boulevard from the airport. That contract has expired and the agency is on a month-to-month lease said Diane Crews, the airport's vice president of administration.

The state had narrowed its search to four sites, three in

Sanford and the one in Winter Springs. The other locations included:

- Three different spaces in Sanford Plaza on U.S. Highway 17/92 just north of the State Road 417 (the GreeneWay).

- GreeneWay Plaza just south of the GreeneWay at the

southeast corner of the intersection of 17/92 and Airport Boulevard.

- The Seminole Towne Center Mall.

Sanchez said the decision to locate in Winter Springs was based on several factors. Although cost was a factor, the final decision was not solely "bottom-line" oriented.

"You need plenty of parking, and the office space has

Fire causes major damage at 17-92 motel

Fire department units from Longwood, Casselberry, Winter Springs and Seminole County all converged at Lake Fairy Motel, 1190 S. U.S. Highway 17-92, Sunday morning to a two-alarm blaze.

Despite their quick response, it may have been the first responding Longwood police officer's bravery that saved the life of a motel guest.

"He (the officer) was the first of anybody on the scene, and a passerby saw what was going on and stopped to help," said Longwood Police Chief Tommy Jackson.

Together, the two reportedly helped carry a large bodied hotel guest down a flight of stairs.

The fire broke out at about 3 a.m. and injured three people, including the officer who suffered smoke inhalation. One motel guest was transported to the hospital, but the injury was not believed to be serious.

Fire fighters worked for about two hours as the fire was controlled to about three rooms on the second floor of the motel.

However, there was considerable smoke and water damage throughout the motel.

The cause of the fire is thought to be from a cigarette that one of the motel occupants had dropped. Because the motel is decades old, it does not have built in sprinkler systems. The investigation has been forwarded to the state fire marshal's office.



SANFORD — Two families received early holiday gifts last week when the city of Sanford christened the new fire station No. 32 on Airport Boulevard.

Replacing the old station on U.S. Highway 17-92 near Lake Mary Boulevard, the new facility has more than twice the space and houses four paramedics/firefighters and one supervisor.

To honor the support former city commissioner A.A. "Mac" McClanahan showed to the city fire department, the new station bears his name. Station No. 32 is the only one in the city to be named after an individual.

A Naval veteran of three wars,

McClanahan held public office off and on since 1971. During four decades, he served the city as commissioner for a total of 16 years.

He committed suicide in April 2000 as his health rapidly declined, but McClanahan will be remembered for much more than his untimely death.

A giver of hope, a staunch military man and a true lover of the city of Sanford, "Mac" may be best known for the dedication to his family — similar to his fellow city commissioner and good friend, Whitley Eckstein.

"I knew Mac very, very well. In honor of Mac, I've brought my family with me today," he said, pointing to the lot of Eckstein's

Our food is much better. We had a nice meal last night that the 2nd Cavalry cooks prepared. We still like to make a stew in a pot outside over our fire pit. There must be some kind of psychology to this, like, maybe

we've lived such a Spartan life for so long in such a primitive warrior way, that we feel the urge to return to our primeval roots and cook over a fire pit. I feel that somewhere deep down inside me my Neanderthal past is coming to the surface. Might better think twice before taking me out to a restaurant when, and if, I ever get back to the states, I might grunt and eat with my hands.

We have been on numerous raiding parties, during

Ramadan and have confiscated a ton of weapons. What you may not know is that Iraqis can legally possess an AK-47 for self-defense. That means there are a lot of AK-47s all over this place. I think we should have prohibited any kind of weapons until getting this place secured and turned over to the Iraqis and let them decide on gun ownership. But to allow this many weapons while we are still in a war just don't make good sense. Of course those who make these decisions are not on the ground in Iraq getting shot at.

Controlling weapons would still not take care of the big problem of millions

Sanford's adult arcade ordinance may not be for all

LONGWOOD — A recent decision by city of Sanford leaders to regulate adult arcades is an option other governments in the county may not take.

Two cities in Seminole County — Sanford and Longwood — have received permit requests for adult arcades that offer coupons, gift certificates and other prizes for winning on its games that resemble video slot machines. Although the cities of Lake Mary and Casselberry, and

Seminole County, have not received permits, they too have sought initial protection from the adult arcades by passing temporary moratoriums.

Sanford was the first local government to act when officials last week proceeded with a permanent ordinance that restricts adult arcades to industrial areas of the city — primarily near the air and lake ports. The regulations also prohibit the consump-

tion of alcohol in the establishments and restricts hours of operation from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m.

"We looked around the state and the city of Davie had a pretty good ordinance," said Andrew Van Gaale, Sanford deputy city manager, about the city's approach to regulating the casino-like establishments.

Despite Sanford's early take on adult arcades, other area governments are looking to move in the direction of outlawing the gaming establishments all together.

Longwood is drafting an ordinance that defines the adult arcade games as gambling machines, which are prohibited by state law. Seminole County is also considering that route, according to Don Fisher, county planning and development director.

"It's a lot easier to keep something out than it is to get it out once it is in," said

Scammer tries to cash in at local bank

SANFORD — Quick thinking by Sales and Service Manager Sonji Silva at the BankFirst branch office on State Road 46 helped the bank avert a substantial loss.

Silva learned that an individual who is thought to be part of a check fraud ring operating in the Central Florida area had opened an account at the bank recently. He then waited about three months to allow the account to "season," which Silva explained is the process of trying to win the confidence of the staff and lull them into a false sense of security.

Then, in a flurry of activity lasting only a few days, the individual deposited several checks in quick succession, all drawn on closed accounts from other area institutions, and quickly made the rounds of other branch offices and ATM's to withdraw as much cash as possible before the checks were returned "account closed."

"Once we learned of the fraud," Silva said, "we contacted the perpetrator and

arranged to have him come to our office on a pretext. We then called the police, and they were able to apprehend the suspect while he was at the bank."

A search of the suspects' car by police turned up starter check kits from other financial institutions, indicating that the perpetrator was getting ready to pull the same scam at other banks and businesses.

"This guy was a real pro," Silva said. "He had the timing down, and even had his story for police all ready to go when they arrived. He told them that he had no idea that the checks would be returned 'account closed' and on the strength of that, the police said they had to let him go because they could not prove 'intent.'"

Silva says that she doubts very much that this was his "first time" and that she thinks that a simple investigation will reveal that he has struck successfully before.

"The key thing is to put this guy out of business," Silva said. "A ring like this

Seminole County Sheriff's Office, Lake Mary crack down on drunk drivers

Last Friday, Nov. 28, the Lake Mary Police Department in conjunction with the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, hosted the City County State Traffic Unit (CCSTU), driving under the influence saturation patrol.

More than 45 officers from all of the Seminole County law enforcement agencies, the Florida Highway Patrol and the Florida Department of Transportation, participated in this operation. The operation focused on arresting impaired drivers and ticketing those who do not buckle up and ran from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m.

Law enforcement officers concentrated their efforts in the area between Markham Woods Road and Sanford Avenue, and State Road 434 to the Volusia County line.

Nine arrests were made for driving under the influence. There were more than 100 citations issued for various traffic infractions, including of 51 citations for speeding, four for driving with a suspended license and one for failure to use a safety belt.

The low number of safety belt tickets is pleasing to law enforcement as more motorists are choosing to buckle up. The extensive "Buckle Up Florida" campaign appears to be a convincing educational tool. The percentage of Florida motorists who buckle up has risen to an all time high of 75.1 percent, according to authorities.

Seminole County Fire Department issues holiday fire safety tips

It can start with a tree and an electrical short in a holiday light strand, or a misplaced candle, and it can turn a home into a raging inferno.

This time of year is marked with Christmas trees, holiday lights and ornamental candles, unfortunately it is also notorious for an increase in house fires.

As Christmas tree businesses pop up all over Central Florida, residents should start searching for that special tree with a few hints in mind.

Trees with brown shedding needles should be rejected. When the trunk of the tree is bounced on the ground, a shower of falling needles shows that the tree is dry.

When bringing a tree home, families should cut about an inch off the end of the trunk. This will remove the dried end and allow the tree to absorb water. Christmas trees that are not kept moist can be totally consumed by fire in less than 15 seconds.

Holiday lights can also be a threat. Families should always turn off Christmas tree lights and other decorations when going to bed or leaving the home. Use only lights that have been tested for safety. To identify these lights, check for the UL label. Check each set of lights for broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires or loose connections.

The third largest cause of fires during the holiday season is candles. Candles can be spectacular to watch, but devastating if used carelessly. Always monitor candles that are lit, especially around pets and children.



Change is good for hospital's open-heart surgery patients

SANFORD — A new procedure for open-heart surgery patients at Central Florida Regional Hospital in Sanford is enabling them to recover faster and return home a little happier.

Open-heart surgery commonly uses arteries from the chest wall and veins from the legs to bypass the heart's arteries that are blocked. In a procedure referred to as "open vein harvesting," a surgeon would make a long incision on the patient's leg.

"It left a scar from the ankle to the knee and the knee to the thigh," said Dr. George Palmer, Central Florida Regional Hospital cardiac surgeon.

A new procedure, "endoscopic vein harvesting," greatly reduces post-operation pain and tissue trauma. With only a small incision at the knee, a surgeon blows carbon dioxide in the leg and then uses a lighted scope and a miniature camera to remove the vein.

Central Florida Regional Hospital has been performing the new procedure for

about nine months now and was the first hospital in Central Florida to use the alternative vein harvesting method. The technique was initially developed about two years ago.

"It's a coming up thing at other places now, but this was the first hospital in Central Florida to be doing this," Palmer said.

Palmer estimates the Central Florida Regional Hospital has performed about 125 of the new procedures and says the patient response has been positive.

"The reason we got interested with this (endoscopic vein harvesting) wasn't

because we were having a problem with infections, but we had patients complaining about their leg scar," said Palmer, a Lake Mary resident. "It became a big deal from the patient's point of view."

The new vein harvesting technique lengthens the bypass surgery by about 30 to 40 minutes, but the benefit of the alternative procedure often outweighs the longer operation time. The most important aspect of the new procedure is it does "less to the body while still accomplishing the mission," Palmer said.

However, not all patients are ideal for the new procedure — especially those in a "crashing emergency" when the heart is rapidly dying.

Central Florida Regional Hospital is a 226-bed acute care hospital serving residents of Seminole and Volusia counties. The hospital is located in Sanford on State Road 46.

The hospital's specialized services include open-heart surgery, neurosurgery, pediatrics and women's services. For more information, call 407-302-7363.



of leftover munitions, warheads, etc. that are in unguarded ammo dumps scattered all over the place. I read where it could take years to dispose of all this unexploded ordinance. In the meantime, these unguarded dumps of unexploded warheads and ammo are shopping centers, with blue light specials, for anyone who wants to do us harm. The army EODs [explosive ordinance detachments] can only do so

much to fix this problem. Operation Iron Hammer has really helped tame down the guerrilla fighters, but has angered many innocent Iraqis who have got caught up in it. Some of them have been killed or hurt and some of their property destroyed. I feel sorry for that, but considering the big numbers of U.S. soldiers being killed, I don't think we had much choice. Otherwise we would have continued to try to survive

in a near-suicidal situation because of increased attacks on our people and convoys. In the long run, we may have made more enemies with Operation Iron Hammer, but that remains to be seen. Right now it is necessary to fight back with a demonstration of firepower or put up with increasing attacks. We were "between Iraq and a hard spot." Have I use that before? Get it? "Between a rock and a hard place." Oh well, so much for

the corn, but I thought it was funny. 20 Nov. 2003 I just got the e-mail about the care package project that The Seminole Herald is doing for the troops, especially for my Nightstalker soldiers. Hearing how so many people in Seminole county are donating things, to this project is really great. You don't know what this means for us. You would have to be here to really know the impact this has on boosting our morale. I don't care if it is a tube of toothpaste, a paperback book, or a case of moon pies, believe me when I say we can and will use it, and if there is too much then we'll share with our fellow soldiers who need

something. But first it is going to be ours! Already my squad is riding high just knowing that these things will be coming our way, and we'll get to open those boxes. We'll probably fight over who gets to open the boxes. We really appreciate this. This is our definition of supporting the troops. So many people just talk about supporting the troops because it is politically correct to do so, but this Seminole Herald project and the people who have donated things is what supporting the troops is really about because it has to do with hearts and kindness and not politics. My dad said he went to down to The Herald and Dan

Ping showed him a room with big boxes of stuff already filled-up ready for shipping to us, all from Sanford businesses and people. doesn't just hit us, they run around and hit a lot of area merchants as well. We're a small business too, and this sort of thing hurts all of us in the community. Silva says that the bank is conducting its own investigation by contacting area financial institutions.

"This guy should be in jail, and we think we can build the case to put him there," Silva said. She says she understands the limitations placed on police, and the low profile a crime like this has given all the other things that law enforcement has to do. "It isn't just us though," Silva said. "By the time a ring like this finishes and moves on, they may have taken

To slip the gaming establishments past the state gambling statue, owners of the adult arcades had installed stop bars in the video slot machines that allowed a "skillful" player to stop the revolving frames when they saw fit. Local Seminole County officials argued that with 30 frames revolving per second, the games were more luck than skill. Investigators in Volusia County also agreed as they raided the establishments, confiscated the

machines and arrested arcade owners. Another route, taken by the city of Casselberry, in fighting the adult arcades is to petition state delegates to close the loophole in the state law. Mayor Bruce Provost recently drafted a letter, at the board's direction, to State Sen. Lee Constantine (R-Altamonte Springs) and state representatives David Meador (R-Lake Mary) and David Simmons (R-Longwood). "We've asked them to take appropriate modifications so as to regulate the adult arcade business so there would be no confusion over that," said Frank Clifton, city manager. "We're still looking to see if the state will modify the state statue to clearly outlaw it."

in attendance.

"The fire department meant an awful lot to Mac. I made the motion to have the department named after Mac because wherever Mac is today I knew it would mean a lot to him."

According to relatives and friends, McClanahan always knew what was going on in the city as he carried fire department radios with him everywhere.

When the department need-

ed extra supplies or additional manpower, McClanahan was always their champion on the city commission. But he wasn't the only one as Eckstein also fought to improve the city public services.

To honor Eckstein for his dedication, the Sanford Fire Department named him an honorary firefighter.

"I will accept this as an honor to your husband," he said to McClanahan's widow, Candy.

It was a day of reflection and thanks to two of Sanford's great leaders. Despite his absence, some remembered McClanahan's many contributions to the community.

He was known for advocating programs to give bicycles, clothes, toys, food and support to the needy.

For years, with the help of the fire department and the Kiwanis Club, McClanahan would collect old bicycles each holiday season.

The tradition started when he

was a Navy recruiter, but it really began when he was child, said Candy McClanahan. He was saving for a bicycle during the Depression and when he had saved enough money, he lost his savings on the way to the bicycle shop.

Almost to make sure no child would have to endure his same pain, a group of Kiwanis Club members, firefighters, McClanahan and others would fix the old donated bikes and give them away to underprivileged Sanford children. Before

he passed, the program had swelled so large that more than a 100 bikes were being donated each Christmas.

"He loved the Navy, he loved Sanford and he loved Whitey," she said. "They were good friends."

to be able to accommodate our security needs," Sanchez said. "You also need easy access into and out of the area. Remember, you've got 16- and 17-year-old kids taking their driving test, so the access shouldn't be overly complicated."

Sanchez said Ray Rhodes, a property leasing specialist for the department, anticipates the move occurring in about six months.

In recent years, the drivers' license office has suffered from lack of space, both inside its building and in the parking lot. Those applying for a license or renewing their current one had to park in the grass rights-of-way along East Airport Boulevard and then wait outside in a line that often wrapped around the building. Sanchez said the move to Winter Springs will provide the department with 5,000 square feet of space and ample parking.

In addition to the new

space, the office will house new equipment to produce licenses. Sanchez said the state-of-the-art equipment is faster and will provide three levels of security for sensitive information. The new licenses are part of a 5-year contract the state approved with Digimarc. Based in Tualatin, Ore., Digimarc provides more than 60 million government-issued photo identification documents, including driver licenses, per year for 33 U.S. states and 24 countries.

The most noticeable difference on the new licenses will be the information layout, Sanchez said. Drivers 21 years and older will have licenses in the standard horizontal layout, while those younger than 21 will have a license with a vertical layout.

Each of the department's 155 offices will install the updated equipment, with Seminole County being one of the first to adopt the new process.

"It just makes sense to put the new equipment when the move is made, rather than to move the old stuff and then replace it in the near future," Sanchez said.

While the Winter Springs office is a further drive for Sanford and Lake Mary residents, Sanchez noted that most motorists can renew their license without ever leaving their home. The department's Web site (www.hsmv.state.fl.us) offers an "Express Lane" where residents can renew their license online. Sanchez said the department also offers renewals by phone and through the mail.

"Many people may not know that you don't have to renew your license in the county where you live," Sanchez added. "If you live in Seminole County but work in Orange or Volusia counties, you can renew your license in the office closest to your work."







The UCF volleyball team will face Cincinnati (27-5) in the opening round of the 2003 NCAA Volleyball Championships in Gainesville. Raider men split in St. Pete

Are the tough times over?

The extremely young Seminole Community College men's basketball team is beginning to look like it is coming of age after the Raiders gained an impressive split at the St. Petersburg College Classic last weekend.

SCC (3-5) had struggled on both ends of the floor during a four-game losing streak and you could start to hear a murmur going through the Raider faithful.

But the talented, but young, squad, 13 freshmen on a 14 man roster, picked up a huge road win at Pasco-Hernando Community College last week and then put their best offensive performance of the season together last Friday with a 105-89 victory over the Tampa Swish in the opening round of the Classic.

SCC then shot 51.6-percent from the floor in the first half to take a 39-31 halftime lead over the hosts Titans (9-1) but then ran into shooting woes and foul trouble in the second half as SPC rallied for an 86-76 triumph. The Titans were 21-37 from the free throw line, including 17-for-25 in the second half.

The Raiders had five players score in double figures against the Swish.

Travis "TJ" Jones, SCC's leading scorer on the season, netted 21 points, his fifth 20 point game in eight starts, and also had four assists and three steals.

Vince Mosley continued his outstanding play of late, equaling Jones with 21 points and also grabbing six rebounds.

Also having big games were Rushawn Johnson (19 points, seven rebounds, three steals), Kemaine Samuels (13 points, nine rebounds), Thomas Williams (11 points, five assists), Lake Howell's Joey Forestier (eight points, five assists), Will Greene (six blocked shots), Will Graham (12 rebounds) and Nick Rollins (nine rebounds).

Against the Titans it was Jones and Mosley again leading the way, Jones scoring 22 points, grabbing five rebounds and claiming three steals, and Mosley dropping in 15 points to go along with six rebounds, three assists and three steals.

Other good performances were turned in by Graham (14 points, 10 rebounds, three steals), Samuels (nine points, six rebounds), Aaron Ball (eight points, five assists) and Greene (nine blocked shots).

The game marked the 100th career coaching win for SPC head coach Earnest Crumbley, who was an assistant under former SCC head man Bill Payne and then took over when Payne retired, and the seventh consecutive for the Titans, who were led in scoring by Ben Bridges' 26 points, 24 of which came in the second half, to go along with 10 rebounds.

The Raiders were to have closed out the home portion of their 2003 schedule on See Raiders, Page 10

Carolina an 82-43 loss in the season opener that year.

UCF earned the victory after an overpowering first half. The teams were tied at seven points a piece three minutes into the first half before the Golden Knights began to pull away slowly. Freshman Lashaunda Slade hit a three-pointer to put UCF up 14-9 at the 13:17 mark, but neither team would score for over two minutes after. The offensive dry spell ended with a jumper by freshman forward Keunta Miles at 10:54. The hosts, which beat the Lady Colonels 76-55 in Thibodaux, La. on Nov. 30 of last year, finished the first period on a 27-8 run to take a 43-17 advantage to the locker room.

The Golden Knights shot 63.3% (19 of 30) in that stanza and saw Atlantic Sun Preseason Player of the Year Takira Allen hit a perfect four of four field goal attempts. Hudson was 5-for-9 from the floor and contributed 13 points. NSU, meanwhile, shot 23.3% (7 of 30).

UCF continued to dominate in the second period opening with five unanswered points before Cristin Burdette sank a jumper off an inbound pass under the net at 17:45. Already up 28 points with 3:45 remaining to play, the Golden Knights distanced themselves even further on a 12-4 run to finish out the game.

The Golden Knights outplayed the visitors in nearly every aspect of the contest. They outrebounded Nicholls State by a 48-23 margin and boasted a 30-10 advantage defensively. They hit 59.3% of their field goal opportunities compared to a 27.3% for the Lady Colonels.

In the first contest of the afternoon No. 8 Purdue (4-1) used a 19-point effort by Shereka Wright and a 12-0 second half run to defeat Wake Forest, 76-57. It was the Demon Deacons first loss of the season as they dropped to 3-1.

On Friday, freshman Katie Gearlds came off the bench to score 16 points as the No. 8 ranked Purdue women's basketball team dealt UCF an 87-52 loss in the opening round of the Golden Knights Classic.

The Boilermakers (3-1) jumpstarted the game with eight unanswered points. They kept the Golden Knights (0-2) without a field goal until Hudson sank a three-pointer at 15:20 to cut the visitor's lead to 14-5. Purdue's advantage climbed to 22-11 at 13:09 before both squads hit a scoring drought that lasted close to three minutes. Gearlds ended the Boilermakers' dry spell at 10:22 with a fastbreak layup, and a trey by freshman LaShaunda Slade at 9:12 cut PU's lead to 12.

From that point, Purdue took advantage of their offensive opportunities to pull away and led by a first half high of 31 points at 2:58, but had to settle for a 51-21 favor at intermission.

Gearlds and fellow rookie Erin Lawless combined for a total of 30 points off the bench for Purdue. UCF got a team-high nine points from Hudson, Slade and sophomore LaShay King. In the earlier game, Wake Forest defeated Nicholls State by a score of 79-47 thanks to 12 points from each from Keila Evans and Liz Strunk.

passing for 215 yards and three touchdowns to guide #15 Miami to a 56-21 victory over UCF at the Florida Citrus Bowl. With the win, the RedHawks extended their winning streak to 11 games (11-1) and ended the year a perfect 8-0 in the MAC while UCF fell to 3-9 and 2-6 in the MAC.

Miami put the game away after just 15 minutes of play. The RedHawks outgained UCF 168-(-4) in the first quarter and outscored the Knights 21-0.

The RedHawks scored on their first two possessions as Roethlisberger tossed two 11-yard touchdown passes to R.J. Corbin and Rynne Robinson, respectively. The scoring continued for the RedHawks when John Busing intercepted Steven Moffett and returned the interception 28 yards for a touchdown. The score increased the RedHawk lead to 21-0 with 6:06 left in the first quarter.

The game was all but over after two quarters as the RedHawks led 35-0 at the break. Roethlisberger had an amazing first half, totaling 300 yards through the air. He was 23-for-28 including four touchdowns in the opening half of play.

Miami scored two additional touchdowns to pad the lead to 49-0 before UCF finally got on the scoreboard. Moffett fired his first career touchdown pass with a 30-yard touchdown pass to Darcy Johnson on a fourth down play in the third quarter to cut the lead to 49-7. The 30-yard touchdown reception was the longest touchdown catch of Johnson's career.

UCF played two quarterbacks as Moffett threw for two touchdowns while Jon Rivera finished with a career-high 292 yards including his first career touchdown pass to Da'Bar Fluellen.

STRONG SECOND HALF LEADS UCF MEN'S BASKETBALL OVER THE CITADEL

Roberto Morentin scored 19 points hitting 9-of-10 shots from the field to lead UCF (2-1) over The Citadel (2-1) 74-60 at McAllister Field House Friday evening.

UCF was able to expand a five-point halftime advantage to 14 points after opening the second half with a 9-0 run spurred by a pair of three pointers from Marcus Avant. It was the first double-digit lead of the game for UCF, one they would never relinquish and push to as many as 21 in the second half.

Rob Ross was the only other Knights player to reach double figures in scoring as he finished with 11 points, including three shots from behind the arc.

Dante Terry and Davis led the Bulldogs scoring 12 and 10 points respectively. Oviedo High School graduate Max Mombollet led The Citadel on the boards grabbing a team-high eight rebounds. As a team, the Bulldogs shot 33 percent (21-63) from the floor and just 6 of 18 from three-point range. They also connected on 12 of 15 attempts at the line.


