



President Truman's appointment of Ed Stettinius as American member of the Security Council was in our opinion a hap-ny one. He had done a good job while he was Secretary of State but we did not believe he was particularly suited to that kind of work and many people rereason why this susupicion should follow him into his new position.

The Tampa Tribune reports a move to oppose by the ballot the obstinacy and injustice of North Florida state senators in blocking reappointionment. Next year six statewide officers will be up for re-election. They include a United States senator, three justices of the Supreme Court, and two members of the Railroad Commission. With the exception of the Senator, Andrews of Orlando, and one of the Supreme Court justices, al are North Florida men. All othem could easily be defeated by a determined South Florida vote.

One has some difficulty in understanding why anyone would be opposed to the fair employment practices act which is dealgned to prevent ratial discrimination in employment. Yet some very intelligent senators are opposed to it probably on the grounds, not that they do not believe in fair practices, but that they realise you can't make people fair by legislatile action. No many objected to prohibition in theory, but in practice almost everyone had to admit it was a failure. Unfortunately, too many have not learned much from the tragic experience.

The Legislature still struggles along getting nowhere on reapportionment, costing the people of Florida \$3,000 s. day, and the egislators themselves no telling tow much more. North Florida tontrols the Senate; South Florida to House. Any bill the House asses, the Senate kills and vice area. Sometimes we think South legida should try to get together with certain North Florida ections. To Finish The Job.

Under the caption "Let's Finish the Job!" a Pittsburgh newspaper advertisement reads:

"Is the war spirit of Germany shattered as badly as its var machine?

We now hear the whine of the murdering bully, askng for the mercy which he has neither shown nor under-

"The German nation, including the people, have been born and bred in the dominion of brute force. It is the only language they understand. Talk to them in their own tongue. Soft measures at this time are on a par with admin-istering, at the request of the patient, a light soothing syrup to cure a malady which is curable only by a major operation."

Americans whose feelings this expresses will perhaps be surprised to find it was printed 27 years ago, in 1918. It serves notice that suspicion of a soft peace isn't new. It prevailed after the First World War, but was too soon forgotten.

Perhaps the lesson of this is that nations faced with the obligations of victory over a cruel foe can not rely on emotion alone. In addition, they must have deep, rational understanding. They must build their philosophy and shape their action, both punitive and curative, on accurate know-tedge of the "Boche" of 1918, as well as the "Nazi" of

To finish the lob of insuring a stable peace, it isn't enough for the United Nations to feel. They must think, and know, and then persist until the very germ of Nazism has been killed forever.

Belgium's Problem

The Belgian pot is boiling again. Confusion which naturally followed freedom from Nazi domination has subsided under the capable leadership of Socialist Premier Achille van Acker. But the intention of King Leopold to resume the throng now occupied by his brother, Prince Regent Charles, has stirred it up again.

Most Belgians still feel that, in surrendering to the Germans after just 18 days, Leopold betrayed them and ost his right to rule. They are threatening a general strike upon his return. Van Acker and his cabinet have resigned. pending formation of a new cabinet. This will be difficult, for three parties, Communists, Socialists and Liberals, have refused to join any government created by Leopold. He will be left with the Catholics, who have a minority in Parliament and could do nothing. The only course would be to dissolve the present Parliament and call a national election, in itself a problem because of the chaos left by

King Leopold himself is convinced, however, that he followed the only possible course, and is so determined to present his case to the people that no threats of violence can stop him. It is to be hoped that a solution can be found without plunging the country into greater difficulties than it is headed "Purposes" and with the world.

Stubborness Of Craft


