

Viet Cong Blast Into U. S. Military Hq. With Grenades, Bombs

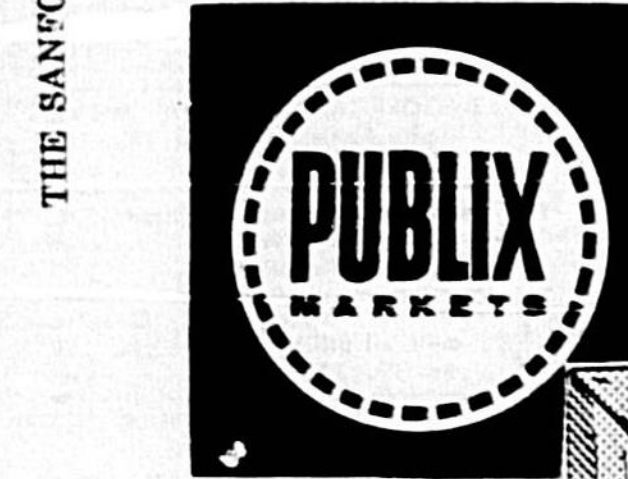

SAIGON (AP) — Viet Cong forces today launched their first ground attack in a week, blasting their way into a U.S. military headquarters with grenades and dynamite bombs.

The attack 120 miles northeast of Saigon killed six Americans and wounded 18. U.S. headquarters said "damage to material within the camp was moderate," but field reports said three or four armored personnel carriers were blown up and destroyed and at least one was damaged.

The only known enemy casualties were two soldiers wounded inside the district headquarters, a spokesman said.

U.S. headquarters said it was the first enemy initiated attack in which five or more Americans were killed since June 26. But a spokesman said "I don't read anything into it. It's an isolated attack in an area that has been usually quiet. The enemy killed one Vietnamese child and another civilian and wounded 36 government soldiers and 27 civilians."

U.S. headquarters reported an Air Force F100 fighter-bomber and an Army OH6 light observation helicopter were shot down by enemy gunners over the weekend. One American was wounded. It raised to 2,830 the number of American helicopters and to 2,576 the number of forward aircraft lost in the war.

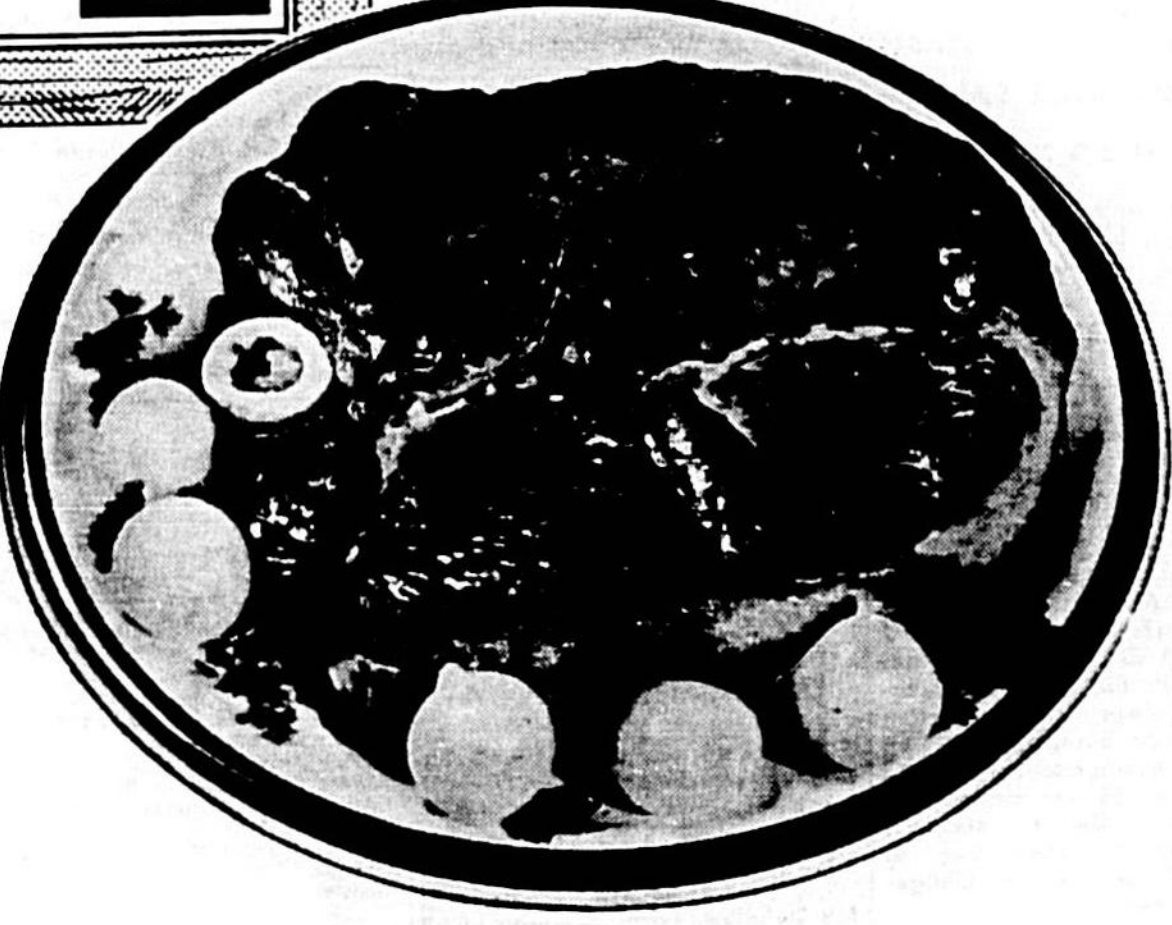

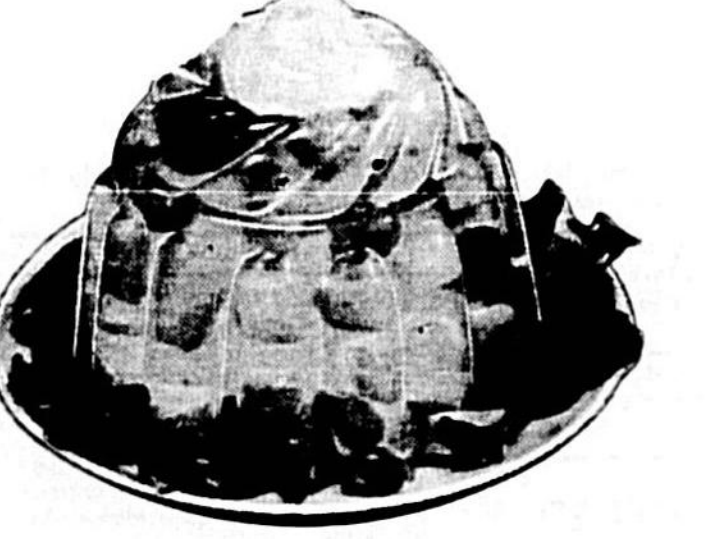

City Gets Warning On Airport Costs

Sanford City Manager W. E. Knowles, in a budget message to city commissioners, has asked that the act creating the Airport Authority not be approved and requests the city to allow the airport manager to administer the airport operation as a city function with control being held by the City Commission.

"I doubt if the commission realizes the extent of the airport bill," Knowles said. "Once enacted the Authority becomes an independent agency the same as the hospital, school board or port is to the county, he said."

There was no budgetary control, under the law by the City Commission and amounts to a blank check arrangement, he reported.

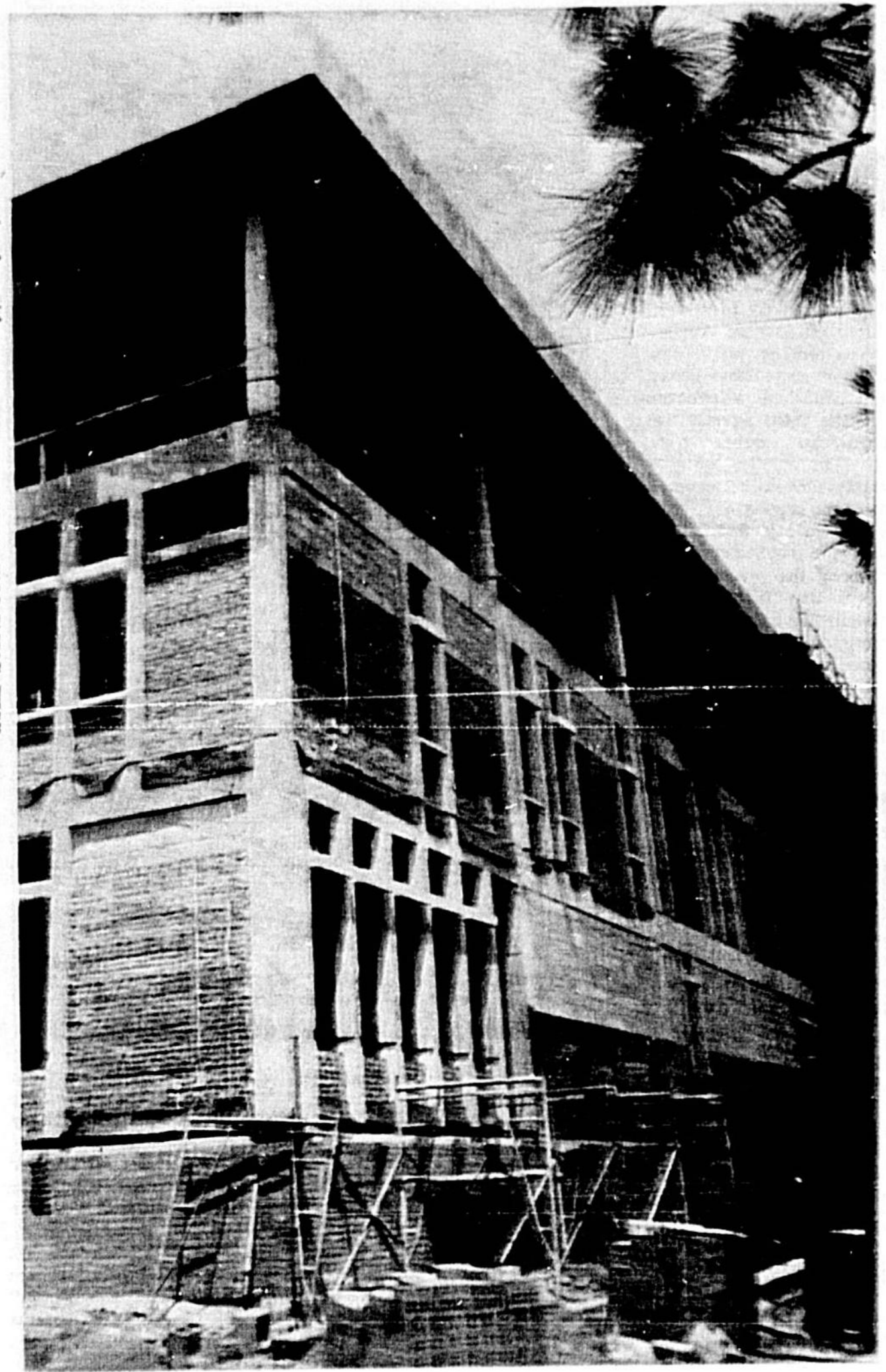
Jan. 1 Deadline Set Court Seeks Space

Will Cut Cost Of Government

State Soon To Police Its Business

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — A. R. "Al" Brautigam became the sixth Republican in Gov. Claude Kirk's administration to be elevated to one of the top jobs in governmental reorganization when he was named executive director of the Business Regulation Department.

Brautigam, 47, former head of the State Beverage Department, was selected Monday for the \$23,000-a-year post after Kirk completed naming the department's five-member governing board by picking attorney Thomas D. Wood, 37, of Miami.

Roderic P. Doyle of Pensacola, a member of the old Turnpike Authority, who was named earlier as chairman of the board, said the selection of Brautigam was unanimous.

He said the Tallahassee Republican was the logical choice for the administrative post because of his experience with the Beverage Department and as former head of the Hotel and Restaurant Commission.

Both of the agencies were placed in the new department which also includes the functions of the old Racing Commission and the Land Sales Board, also disbanded by reorganization.

Doyle scheduled the first meeting of the board for the newly regulatory agency here July 24. He said Brautigam will prepare a complete operating outline of the department.

"I want to know where we can begin to save money, where we can eliminate duplication, how we can reduce administrative overhead," said Doyle, in a statement issued through the governor's office.

Convict Rules Tightened

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Prisoners who get time off for good behavior will, like parolees, come under the watchful eye of the Florida Probation and Parole Commission from now on, says a state official.

Rob Russell, chairman of the commission, said Monday the supervision will help "break the criminal cycle of the repeaters, cow men and the professional criminals, who collectively account for the most significant factors in the soaring crime rate."

These hard core offenders now will find that their freedom depends upon their good behavior and their ability to abide by the rules, Russell said.

The first eight prisoners were placed in the new department supervision for all convict parolees more than 30 days before the end of their sentence.

The program will provide parole supervision until the end of the original sentence whether the prisoners is selected for parole or released early because of "gain time."

The prison return rate will obviously be higher for the new group than for parolees because the program will be dealing with

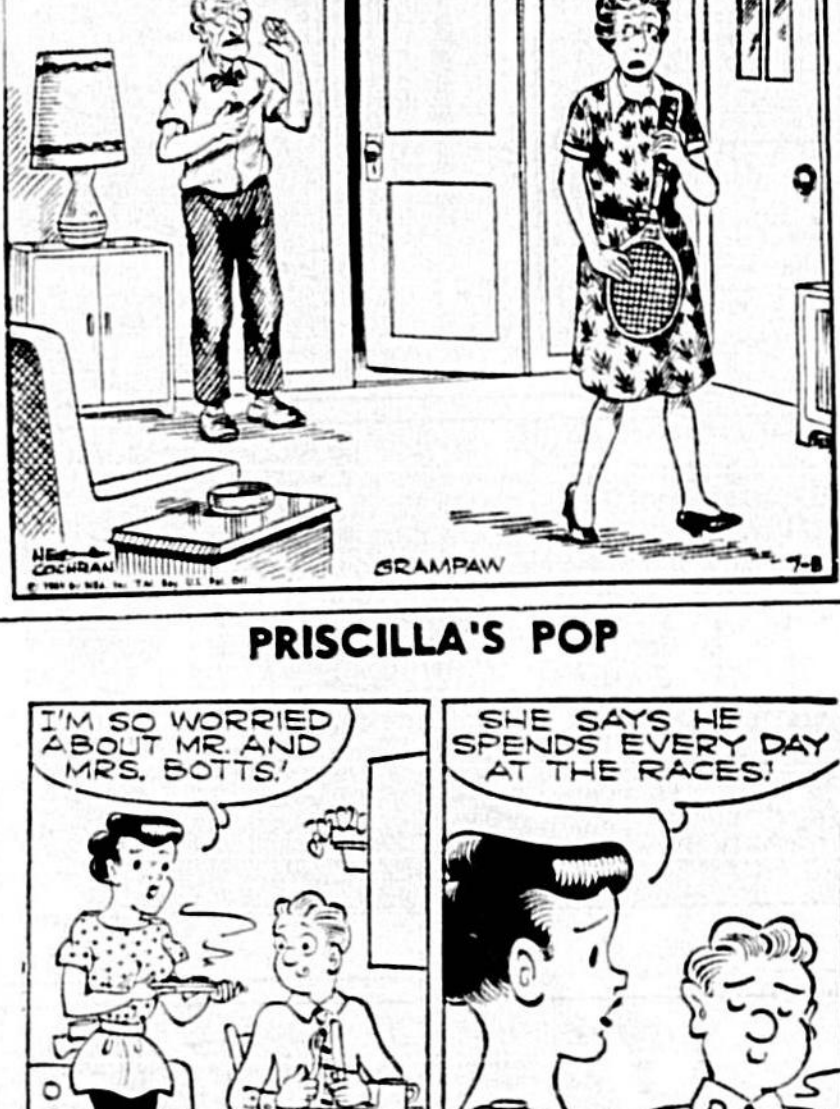

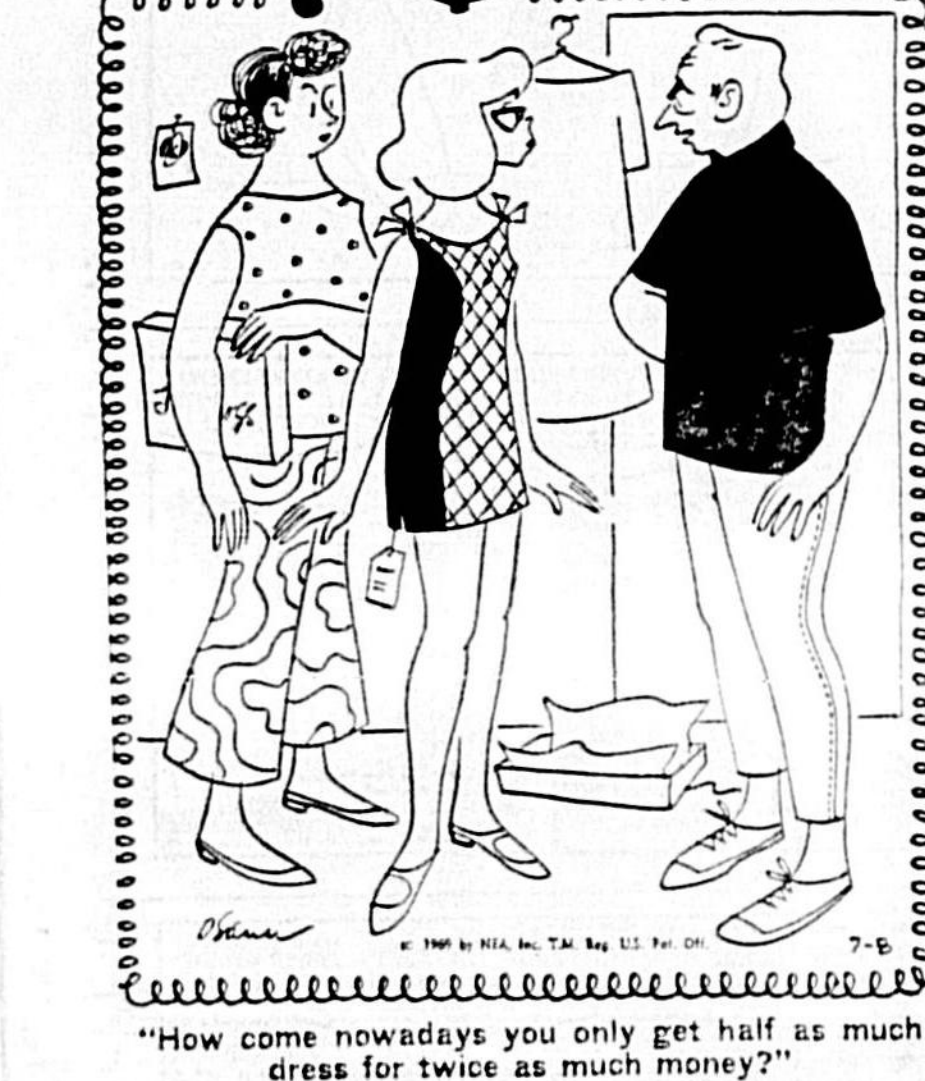
