U. S. Rep. William V. Chappell as of today had not

requested the House of Representatives ethics committee to investigate charges by the Tampa Tribune that he had illegally caused payment of federal payroll funds, the Associated Press reported this morning from Washington. Chappell was quoted by AP yesterday that he would request the House committee to probe the charges made by his former secretary, Patricia Renfroe, that her salary had been increased for April and May in order that she should (and did, pay the sum of \$594 to Jean McBurney, reportedly a speech writer for Chappell.

AP today quoted a House ethics committee spokesman that the group has not been officially apprised of the situation, that it has not met since the article appeared in the newspapers and that Chappell has not approached the committee with a formal request to investigate. The Tampa Tribune, in its initial report last Wednesday, said it had submitted affidavits and other information with the U. S. Department of Justice for investigation into whether Chappell had committed violation of federal laws. AP today quoted a Justice Department attache that the information has been received and that study of the charges

is just beginning. "After all," the spokesman said, "it has been only a week and these things take time." The neophyte Congressman, in office only six months, has denied any intention of wrongdoing and "that if there had been a violation it was not with intent" but through lack of communication with his staff.




