



## State Gas Stations Found Hiking Costs

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) — A spot check of Florida gas stations has uncovered wholesale violations of the President Nixon's Phase IV price freeze, the Internal Revenue Service says. "The IRS, which is in charge of enforcing the 60-day freeze, said 300 stations had

been checked since Friday and 200 of them were found to have hiked prices. Jack L. Evans, head of the price stabilization program in Florida, said all 200 stations had agreed to roll back prices. He said the price cuts would amount to one and two-cents per gallon.

"We don't think these were intentional violations since many people may not have had time to fully comprehend what was required under the new regulations," Evans said. "But when we feel people have had time to hear about the price freeze the Cost of Living Council will want us to be stricter."

Under the law, persons found in violation of the Under the law, persons found in violation of the freeze can be fined up to \$5,000. President Nixon last week ordered prices frozen for 60 days at an amount not to exceed the highest




The state Pollution Control Board, meeting in Tallahassee Tuesday, approved guidelines which could provide \$1.8 million in interim funding for design and partial construction of the Altamonte Springs 7.5 million gallon per day regional sewage treatment plant. City Engineer William Palm

said today under a program sponsored by Gov. Reubin skew the state is providing oans to cities for interim funding on federally approved and financed projects. The plant previously received approval of a \$3.2 million grant from the U.S. Environmental Palm explained the \$1.8

million will be used to pay for engineering design to increase the capability of the plant from its present 1.2 million gallons faily to the ultimate 7.5 million and for certain stages of conenstruction another application will be filed with the state for additional interim funding. These loans will be grant usually received in part ollowing completion of 50 per cent of the project with the balance at project end.



### GOP Quiet About This 'Special' One

Noting anniversaries is a popular custom in Washington but one has rolled around this year which many politicians, particularly Republicans, aren't saying much about.

This year is the 20th anniversary of the last time the GOP held control in the House and

The year 1952 was a political New Year's Eve for Republicans, all wrapped in one big bag. The party elected a president, Dwight D. Eisenhower, for the first time since depression days. And, also to the surprise of even the most steadfast of loyalists, it seated a majority in both houses of Congress.

Republicans didn't relish the Senate victory too much since the party only claimed control by

They were to lose the majority two years It was in the House that many Republicans

sensed a turning of the political tide. In the landslide Eisenhower sweep over Democrat Adlai Stevenson, the GOP made a net House gain of 22 seats for a new total of 221. That was three more than needed to gain control of a House dominated in philosophy by New Deal and Fair Deal Democrats.

The House elections brought a new breed of congressmen-elect to Washington. Virtually all inexperienced in the ways of post-World War II politics, they quickly became identified as the "Class of '52," a different genre of elected official expected to put a new brand of style on Capitol Hill

The House gained more in numbers that year but it was somewhat overshadowed by the personalities who were elected to the Senate. Most talked about of the newcomers in the

upper house was 35-year-old John F. Kennedy of

Massachusetts, who had defeated popular Republican Henry Cabot Lodge. Joining Kennedy as freshmen senators were Barry Goldwater of Without A Paddle We feel a kinship of frustration with the



Senator Fulbright's fascination with the still-unripe fruits of detente should not divert Congress from its responsibility to adopt a foreign aid program based on the realities of a world still dependent on America for its security and the realization of its hopes for the future.



So marriage-minded has American society been traditionally that it comes as somewhat of a surprise to learn that one out of every three adult Americans is single - a total of Of this number, 22 million have never been married. An almost equal number, 21 million, have been married but

through divorce or widowhood are again single. To delve into the statistics further, of the 43 million single adults, 25 million are women: 14 million (of both sexes) are in the 18-24 age bracket; 14 million are in the 25-54 age bracket and 15 million are over 55. Shifts in the population structure, and the social changes they bring, don't happen overnight, though it often seems

that way. The fact is that for the past decade the singles' growth rate has been more than double that of the general Between 1960 and 1970, the adult population grew by 16 per cent but the single group (those never married) grew 39 per cent. At the same time, the widowed and divorced group

grew 34 per cent. The absolute number of divorces increased by a whopping 82 per cent. Behind the figures is a trend toward later marriage or no marriage or nonpermanent marriage which finds more and more Americans living more and more of their adult lifetimes in the single state.

All of which is leading to some of the most startling social changes our society has ever known, as witnessed by the growth of apartment complexes, and at least one country Singles now even have their own magazine, appropriately

## The Corporate Baseball Image

NEW YORK - (NEA) - Maybe it's only in sports, partic ularly baseball, that you think you can go home again.

Tradition is compelling, if not shackling. It tethers a man to his childhood. Or so we think. For example, Yankee fans for the last 40 years, men who were boys in soup lines and who followed Ruth and Gehrig, are still Yankee fans. To some, the Yankees are still the Yankees. That is, they have maintained a constant collective personality.

This was recently suggested in a panel show on radio at Yale University, involving Red Smith, the distinguished New ork Times sports columnist: Norman Podhoretz, editor of commentary magazine, and Thomas G. Bergin, football historian for Yale Alumni Magazine. (The June issue of Intellectual Digest has printed the discussion.) Smith said: Teams do take on a collective personality w; and curiously - although the player personel changes, the

management and the ownership change, the coaching staff changes - still the personality of that team is constant Podhoretz: "It's a living example of what we mean when we talk about tradition. The collective identity simply overides any changes in individual personnel.

Finesse teams like the White Sox are now power teams. Even teams with the same ball park, the same owner, the same surroundings over the years can change. The Cubs are a prime example. Once you could count on their losing the way you could count on a knee-buckling stench from the stockyards. Now the Cubs are winning, and the stockyards, like the



I also have papered wastebaskets, cleansing tissue boxes and even small chests of drawers so they become a real part of a room's decor. #### • Loaf Recipes

A meat loaf is far too often a stereotyped entree which creates no anticipation among partakers. There are, however, many kinds of meat loaves other than one made with ground beef flavored with onions. There are loaves made with all types of meats, seafood and poultry. And the season-

ings which accent the loaves are myriad. Samples of meat loaves which are different are Pizza Beef Loaf and Cheesy Turkey Loaf, for which recipes are given today.

> CHEESY TURKEY LOAF 2 pounds of ground turkey 4 cup chopped green pep-2 beaten eggs

1 cup soft bread crumbs (114 slices bread) Dash pepper 1/2 cup chopped onion 1 8-ounce can tomato sauce 4 ounces diced process American cheese (1 cup) 1 teaspoon salt 14 teaspoon dried thyme, crushed

Cook onion and green pepper in boiling water till tender; drain. Stir in tomato sauce, eggs, cheese, bread crumbs, salt, pepper, and thyme, Add ground meat, mixing well. Shape into loaf in baking dish. Bake in 350 degree oven for 11/2 hours. Yield: 8 to 10 servings.

PIZZA BEEF LOAF 2 pounds ground beef 4 cup cracker crumbs 1 medium-sized onion 1 can (15 ounces) tomato 2 teaspoons salt

1/2 teaspoon sage teaspoon oregano 14 teaspoon garlic powder 14 teaspoon pepper 2 ounces mozzarella cheese 4 stuffed green olives, sliced 14 teaspoon oregano

Combine ground beef, egg cracker crumbs and onion. Mix tomato sauce, salt, sage, 1/2 teaspoon oregano, garlic powder and pepper. Add twothirds seasoned tomato sauce to beef (reserving one-third for topping) and mix lightly but thoroughly. Place mixture in 9 x 5-inch pan, pressing to form a loaf. Spread reserved seasoned tomato sauce over top of loaf, and bake in a slow oven (325 degrees F.) 1 hour, 30 minutes. Sprinkle with cheese and ¼ teaspoon oregano and arrange sliced olives on top of loaf. Bake 5 minutes. Let stand 10 minutes before slicing. 6 to 8 servings.





Low cholesterol, low satuated fat foods can be palatable and delicious with the ings. Here are a few season ing suggestions:

1. Use a bouillon cube and imitation bacon bits or hickory seasoning instead of using salt pork or bacon to season beans or greens.

2. Fat-free meat stock or roth can also be used for seasoning vegetables, making soups or gravies. Chill the stock or broth and take off hardened fat. Canned consomme or bouillon may be used in the same way.
