

# City offers assistance for condo project

Redevelopment agency OKs \$140K in aid, while contribution secures title to property

Sanford's first proposed residential project, Lake Mary, has been given the go-ahead by city officials. Each year, the city's Redevelopment Agency, CRA, is authorized to provide up to \$100,000 in assistance for the development of property. The project, located on vacant property west of City Hall, is being developed by Lake Mary and is expected to be completed in 1985.

This is exactly the type of project Sanford needs to develop, and CRA board member Bob Carroll said he has already invested more than \$1 million in the area. "You've got a developer who put his money where his mouth is. When you do that, I don't have a problem with the CRA providing some incentive. The project is expected to have a value of \$12.5 million and generate about \$130,000 in annual tax revenue for the city," said Carroll.

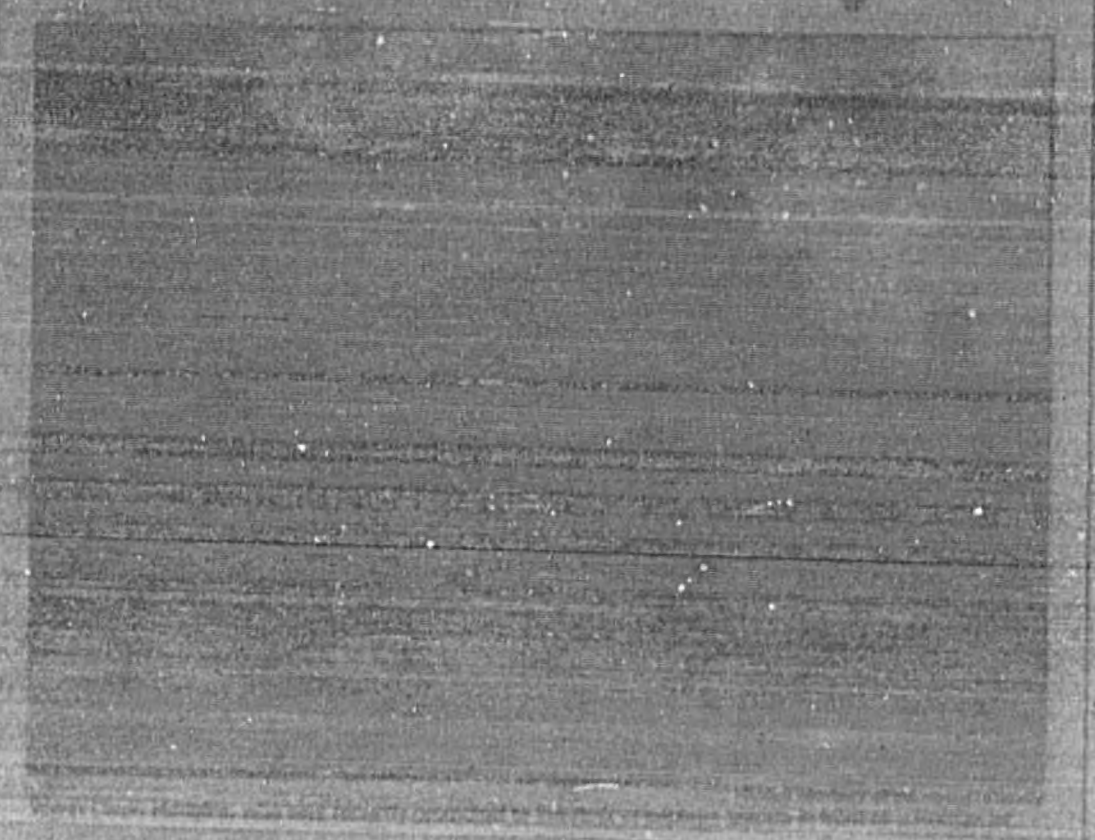

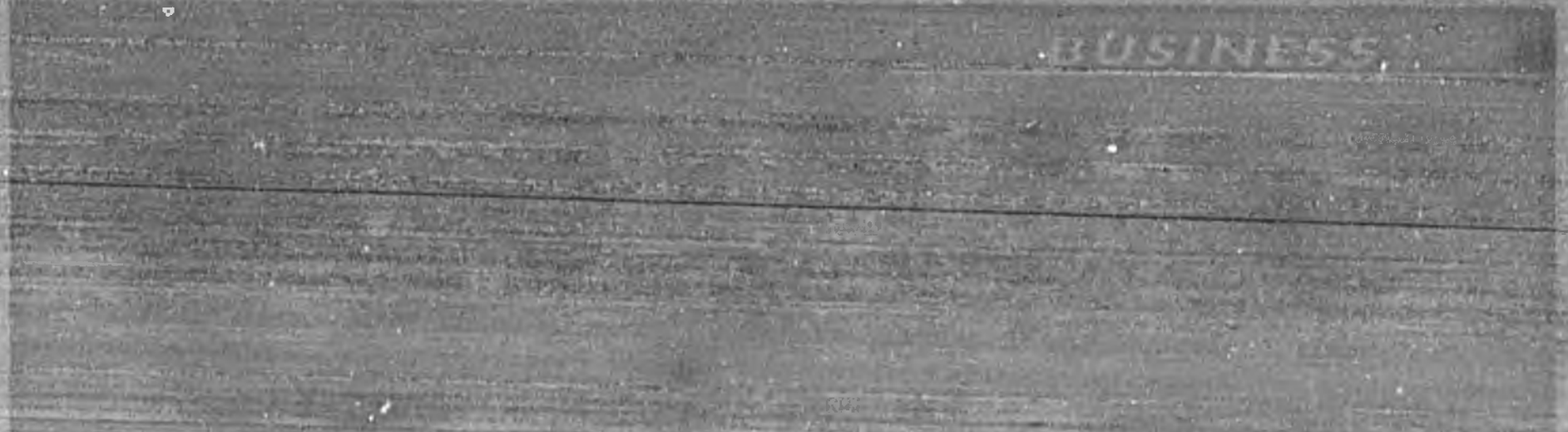
