# FLORIDA IN BRIEF

### Launch At Cape Tonight To Help Military Network

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (UPI) — An Atlas Centaur rocket, a 4,200-pound space craft designed to complete a global military satellite communications network, is poised to launch tonight, weather permitting.

The launch of the Fleet Satellite Communications, or FLTSATCOM, space craft is scheduled for 10:11 p.m. It is to be fired to a permanent station above the western Pacific Ocean.

The cost of tonight's launch, the fourth in the series, is pegged at \$68 million. The overall cost of the FLTSATCOM program, including communications terminals and stations, is close to \$2.5 billion.

### Haitians A Health Hazard

MIAMI (UPI) — Haitian "boat people" arriving at a record rate are straining federal capacities to process them into the country — to the point, an official says, that many impatient refugees are escaping into the community before medical tests for tuberculosis and other diseases are finished.

"A potentially explosive situation exists because in so overcrowded and people want to get out," the Rev. Gerard Jean-Juste, director of the Haitian Refugee Center Inc., said Wednesday.

"The Haitians get their medical checkup but they don't wait for the results — they escape because they are so impatient," Jean-Juste said.

New tents were erected at the processing camp on Krome Avenue on the outskirts of the Everglades this week to expand its capacity to more than 1,300 — but officials said it was full.

### Kalia III Mystery Remains

NASSAU, Bahamas (UPI) — Investigators have released a report on the mystery of the sailboat Kalia III — but most questions remain unanswered about the vacation voyage of a Fort Myers couple that ended with the blood-spattered boat adrift off a remote island, its dinghy bearing a body that later disappeared.

"This is the first case of its kind to have occurred," the report says. "It is suspected that the incident is drug-related but there is no hard evidence that it is."

The five-page report, issued by the Bahamas Cabinet Office this week, offers no clue as to what may have happened to William and Patricia Kammerer of Fort Myers.

## Utah Awaits White Racist Held In Tampa

TAMPA, Fla. (UPI) — A white racist, sought in the sniper shootings of civil rights leader Vernon Jordan and other blacks across the nation, was held in a one-man cell under heavy guard today pending a court decision on his transfer to Utah.

Joseph Paul Franklin, 30, was ordered held under \$1 million bond in the Hillsborough County Jail Wednesday by U.S. Magistrate Paul Crane Jr., who scheduled a removal hearing for next Wednesday.

Franklin is charged in Salt Lake City with violating the civil rights of two black joggers shot to death last August — he told reporters. "They needed someone to pin it on. I'm totally innocent."

Franklin, arrested Tuesday at a Lakeland, Fla., blood bank, had been the object of a nationwide manhunt since his escape last month through a window in a Kentucky jail.

U.S. Attorney Gary Betz argued for a \$1 million bond — twice that recommended by federal authorities in Utah.

Franklin also is a suspect in three bank robberies — two in Tennessee and one in Atlanta. He is wanted for escape and larceny in Kentucky, defrauding an insurer in Utah and for using fraudulent identification to obtain firearms in Kentucky.

James Whitmore, appointed as a public defender for Franklin, called the \$1 million bond unreasonable since "we're only dealing with suspects."

After the 10-minute hearing, Franklin was returned to the county jail. Betz said he had no fear about Franklin's safety or a possible escape.

"I have the utmost confidence in the local authorities," Betz said. "We've requested appropriate steps be taken." He refused, however, to discuss security measures.

The FBI said Franklin had written President Carter a threatening letter in 1976 and was concerned he was in Lakeland, where Carter is to campaign Friday.

### Graham: No Sales Tax In December Session

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) — The only tax the Legislature will be asked to pass in a special session is called in December is the state gasoline tax, Gov. Bob Graham says.

He disputes a Republican claim that Democrats are considering upping rates by \$1 billion a year, including a penny raise in the sales tax.

The sales tax increase is not even a strong possibility for the 1981 session, Graham told reporters Wednesday.

It is always an option in case of a dramatic drop in state revenue, he said, but Florida has a \$50 million surplus and the revenue picture has brightened since a slump in July and August.

The gas tax increase, he said, is essential to provide money for public transit, to accelerate completion of the interstate highway system and make other road improvements.

## Stitchin' Time Cozy Knits Pamper Feet This Winter

If you've kept the knitting needles working lately, you may already have a supply of sweaters, vests, hats and mittens for cold weather. But what about your feet? If you're the one who gets "cold feet," keep them toasty warm and protected in cozy "popcorn" pearl knit slippers.

Worked in the stockinette stitch, each slipper is accented with eight pearls, four on each side. These may be purchased in the needlecrafts department at a variety store. You will need 3 1/2 ounces of 4-ply hand-darning yarn by Coats & Clark, Inc., and one pair of (18-inch-long) needles (9 1/2 inches and large 10 1/2 inches). If you turn your talents to knitting now, you'll have slippers that will last through many cold winters.

Of course, working the slippers is only part of a good winter "protection plan." Your feet take a lot of wear and tear, especially if you do a lot of walking. It's a wonderful luxury to have a professional pedicure, but it's important to take care of your feet on a daily basis, too. Soak your feet in warm water and bath oil to soften calloused heels, then lather on the moisture lotion. Your feet will be soft and relaxed, and you'll feel better all over. Then slip into the "popcorn and pearls" and you're set!

Dear Judy Love: Sometimes I can't find the brand of yarn you've suggested in a particular pattern. I find it inconvenient to travel to several stores looking for yarn. Any suggestions? — T. B., Grand Rapids, Mich.

Dear T. B.: Yarn stores and department stores can special order yarn for you. If there is not a yarn or department store close to you, try a variety store. Although the suggested yarn may not be available, the store may have something similar. However, if you substitute yarn, it is essential you make a stitch gauge before starting your article. The fabric content may make a difference. In fact, a stitch gauge on this is always necessary for correctly sized work. Happy knitting, Judy Love.

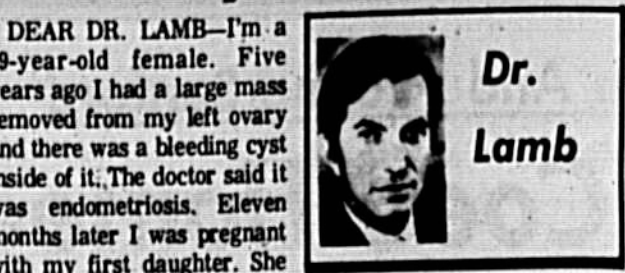

Woman Hysterical Over Hysterectomy

DEAR DR. LAMB—I'm a 28-year-old female. Five years ago I had a large mass removed from my left ovary and there was a bleeding cyst inside of it. The doctor said it was endometriosis. Eleven months later I was pregnant with my first daughter. She was delivered by Cesarean section because of a breech position. A year later I began having severe pain on the left side and lower back. When I was to deliver my second daughter, again by surgery, my husband and I decided we couldn't take any more surgery and that our two children were enough. I had a hysterectomy at the time of the Cesarean section because of the uterus, ovaries and the tubes. Currently I'm taking Ogen daily.

release sex hormones which, in turn, develops the endometrium whether it's lining the uterus or elsewhere. The pituitary gland, the master hormone gland that's underneath the brain and it's located right where the optic nerves from each eye meet. If it enlarges it can cause pressure on the optic nerves and affect vision. Usually if the ovaries are removed, the endometrial tissue enlargement and degeneration cycle that causes pain will disappear. I'm sending you the Health Letter number 14-12, Hysterectomy, Cytotoxic and Electrodes, which will give you a lot more information about hysterectomies. Other readers who want the issue usually lower your sexual interest? Do most women going through early menopause have emotional problems severe enough to seek psychiatric help?

DEAR READER—To begin with, the issue that lines the uterus is called the endometrium. When any of this tissue is displaced to other parts of the body, and commonly it's found in the ovary, it's called endometriosis.

As explained in The Health Letter I'm sending you, many women do not have interest in sex after a hysterectomy. Depression sometimes occurs after surgery even if it doesn't involve female sexuality. If you're having what you interpret as excessive swings in your mood, it may be related to your life style. If it's more than the normal up and down that we experience then you might need professional counseling...

He had no interest in bidding a grand slam, but wanted to gamble the hand out at six. Hence he took direct action and bid the notrump slam. South counted 10 tricks outside the heart suit. Not one to waste time South won the spade lead in dummy, tried and lost heart finesse and spread his hand for the small slam. Like most slam hands the contract could and should be reached by any partnership, yet when it was played in a regional master pairs those who bid six notrump received 9 or 10 match points out of a 12-point top. Volcanic Ash A Lung Hazard, Says New Study

ST. LOUIS (UPI) — The volcanic ash scattered by the eruptions of Mount St. Helens increases the chances of chronic lung disease and asthma for people living in Washington and Oregon, especially farmers, a new study says. Dr. N. Karle Motet of the University of Washington discussed the findings Wednesday at the annual joint meeting of the College of American Pathologists and the American Society of Clinical Pathologists. Motet said autopsies of nine people killed in the volcano's initial eruption May 18 showed the deads were caused by burns, but inhalation of volcanic ash was a secondary factor. He said he found the victims' lungs contained silicon and aluminum dust, compounds associated with asthma and silicosis. Silicosis is a disease in which scarred tissue in the lungs causes serious scarring of the lungs. Motet said the risk of contracting silicosis during the next 10 years was "not very high" for residents of the two states, but said there was a good chance they may suffer asthmatic problems. Motet said the studies requested to him in care of the Washington pathologists, determined for the first time what contaminants can get into the lungs of people exposed to volcanic eruptions. Motet said residents in Washington and Oregon near the volcano, where the volcanic ash fallout was the greatest, face the highest risk of contracting silicosis or asthma.

Smith recently considered the insurance coverage on the property, and had been complaining to city officials that someone was doing things to his home as threatening to burn it down, Butler said.
