



Aide's Iran Remarks

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Administration officials said they believe the hostage crisis is approaching its climax and they're worried a statement by a top presidential assistant suggesting Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini has terminal cancer could delay further the release of the 52 Americans.

White House and State Department officials were incredulous and openly furious at remarks by Frank Moore, presidential assistant for congressional relations, in an interview given to the Shreveport (La.) Journal during a campaign stop.

In the interview, Moore is quoted as saying Khomeini has cancer of the colon, "and he's not going to last

According to the interview, Moore said Khomeini would be replaced by a coalition of Iranian military men, some of them now in exile.

Poles Huddle With Soviets

WARSAW, Poland (UPI) — Soviet leaders summoned Polish Communist Party chief Stanislaw Kania and Premier Jozef Pinkowski to the Kremlin for emergency talks today on the eve of a showdown between the government and independent labor unions threatening new strikes.

In Moscow, a brief announcement by the official Tass news agency said Kania and Pinkowski were to arrive "on a friendly working visit."

An Eastern bloc diplomatic source said the surprise session would be devoted to plotting a response to demands by the Solidarnosc Solidarity worker coalition the government reverse a court decision limiting its right to strike.



Dear Seminole County Voter,



"He is a suspect in the shooting of Mr. Vernon Jordan in Fort Wayne, Ind., and is wanted for questioning about the shootings of black citizens in Johnstown, Pa.; Cincinnati, Ohio; Indianapolis, Ind.; and Oklahoma City, Okla," Betz told the

Franklin also is a suspect in three bank robberies - two in Tennessee and one in Atlanta. He is wanted for escape and larceny in Kentucky, defrauding an innkeeper in Utah and for using fraudulent identification to obtain firearms in Kentucky. James Whittemore, appointed as a public defender for Franklin, called the \$1 million bond unreasonable since "we're only dealing with suspicions.' After the 10-minute hearing, Franklin was returned to the county jail. Betz said he had no fear about Franklin's safety or

a possible escape.

"I have the utmost confidence in the local authorities," Betz. said. "We've requested appropriate steps be taken." He refused, however, to discuss security measures. The FBI said Franklin had written President Carter a threatening letter in 1976 and were concerned he was in Lakeland, where Carter is to campaign Friday.
