So do children. If they're going to pick a fight with Mom or Dad, that's where they stage it in a public place, such as a supermarket or in the church foyer. They are smart enough to know that they are

enforced. If it's a certainty that your strong-willed son or daughter will notice those safe zones and behave offensively and disrespectfully when there.

There is something within the thought that almost forces him to "test it a little" in situations where the resolve of adults is in question.

Therefore, I recommend that you lay out the ground rules before you enter those public domains, making it clear that the same rules will apply. Then if the misbehavior, respond as you would have done at home. Her public behavior will improve dramatically.

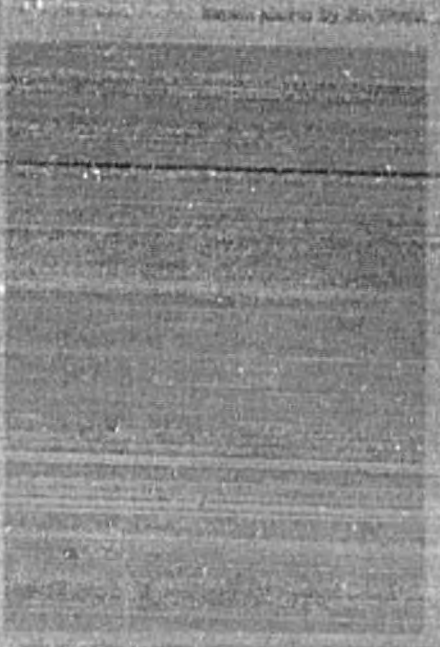

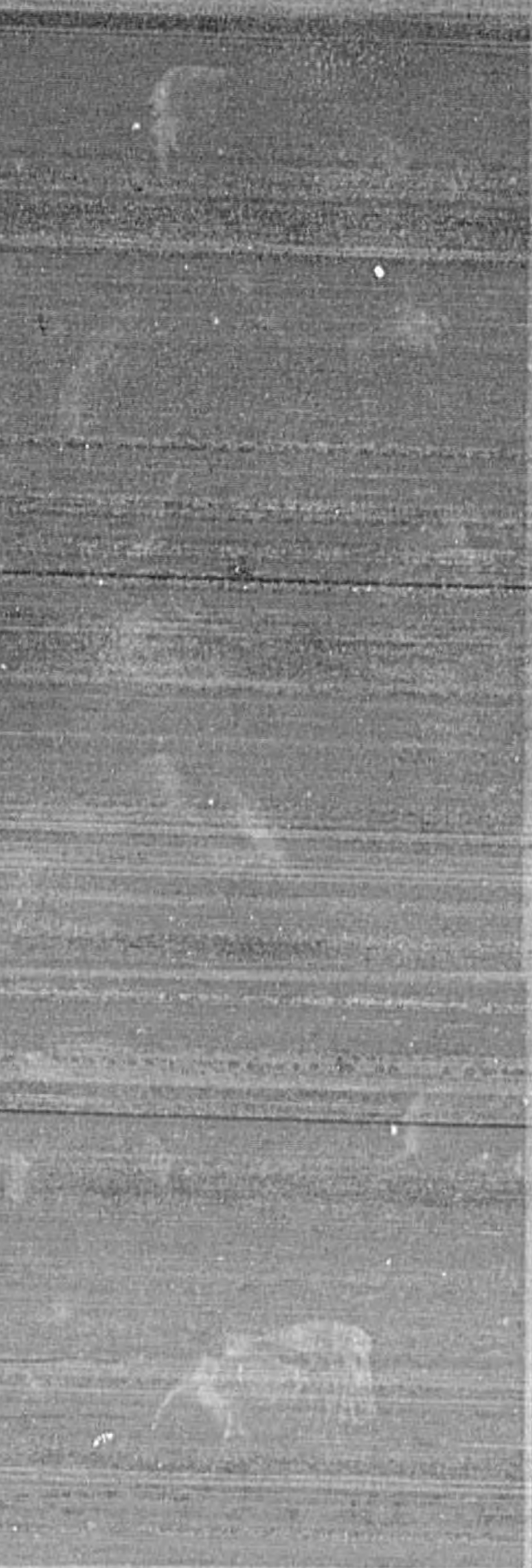
