Issue May Hit Council

Winter Springs Woman Says Employee 'Rude'

The Winter Springs City Council will decide what action, if any, should be taken on a written complaint filed at city hall by Mrs. Marjorie Malich of 123 Campbellwood against Public Works Director Ray Bradshaw.

That was the opinion offered by Councilman-Dupuy Mayor John Daniels, who is in charge of both finances and personnel for the city.

Mrs. Malich's complaint alleges that Bradshaw was rude and insolent when she complained to him about the way a city crew under his control was cleaning up trash and garbage. Bradshaw denied the allegation.

"I will be asking the city clerk to place Mrs. Malich's complaint on the agenda for action by the council at the April 16th meeting," said Councilman Laurence Poleris.

"By that time Mr. Bradshaw should have at least time to prepare his statement. I think the particular issue should not be dragged on and on."

**Resort Tax Unlikely
In Seminole County**

Seminole County probably will not institute a resort tax on hotel and motel rooms in the near future, according to the county commissioner who reserved the matter after

public last fall of a law allowing county governments to collect up to a two percent sales tax on hotel and motel rooms.

"The law must be approved by referendum."

"I can't see that we can do anything with it given the restrictions placed on it currently," Commissioner Robert French said.

The law specifically mentions that the tax revenue "shall be used" to acquire, construct or expand a county government, education, economic development, and recreation.

The money can also be used to promote tourism. The revenue from the tax can also be used to support or expand an existing agency or through a chamber of commerce.

French was interested in providing the tax as a method of supporting the Central Florida Regional Authority in Alton, Fla.

At present there are no plans to allow for the tax revenue to be used for such.

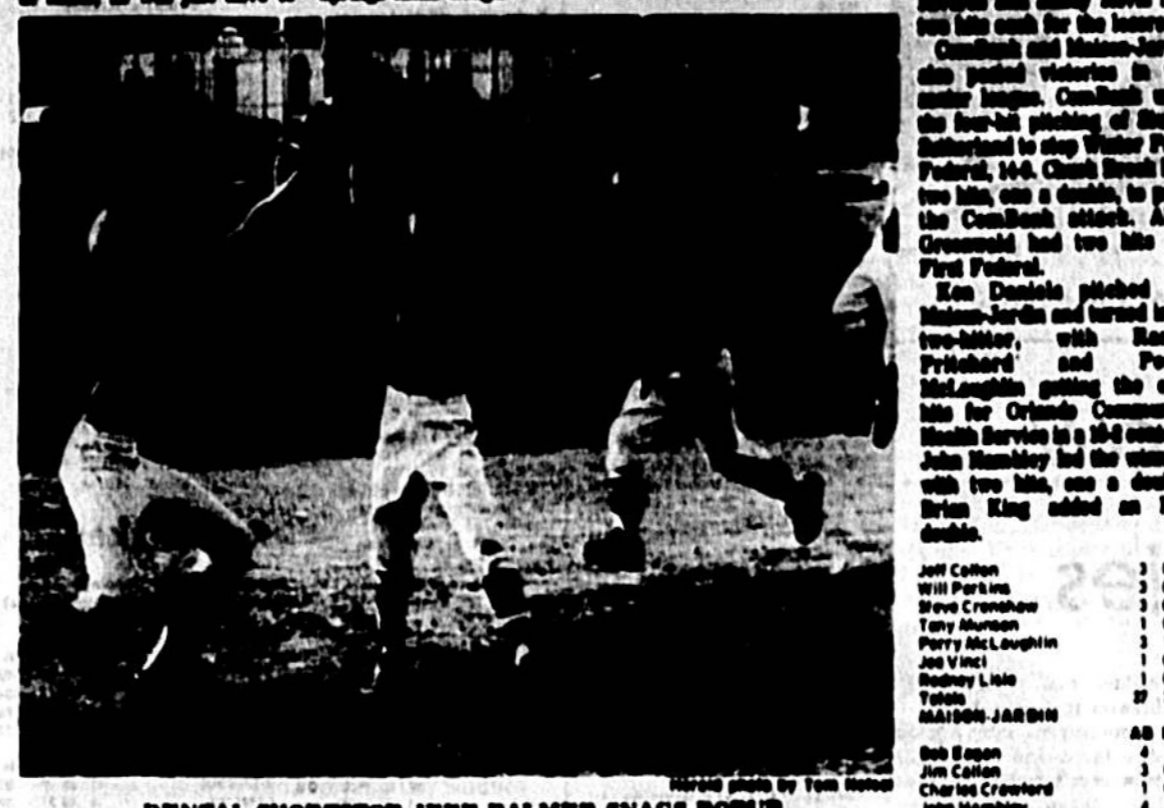

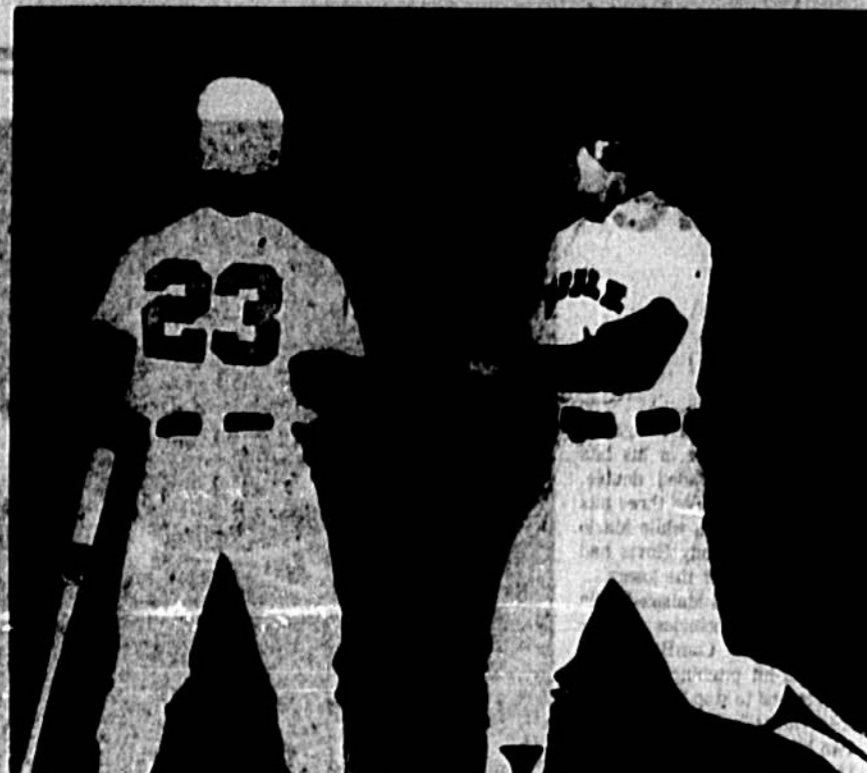

Government Orders Hiring Of Females

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Labor Department Friday ordered federal builders who receive federal money to hire thousands of new female construction workers by next year. A new regulation sets goals for female "hiring" at 1.1 percent by May 1979, 3 percent by May 1980 and 4.5 percent by May 1981.

The major step we have taken today will bring about greater uniformity in the construction compliance program. The regulations thereupon mean women will be sought for construction jobs in the next year and even more in the years to come.

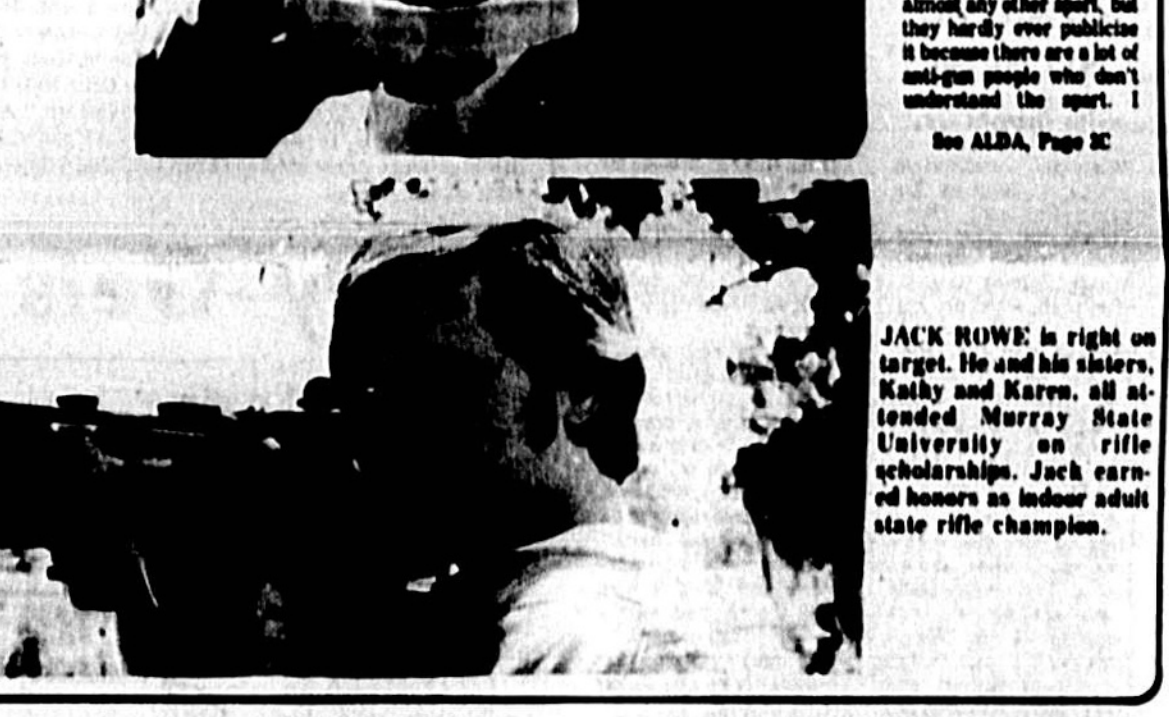

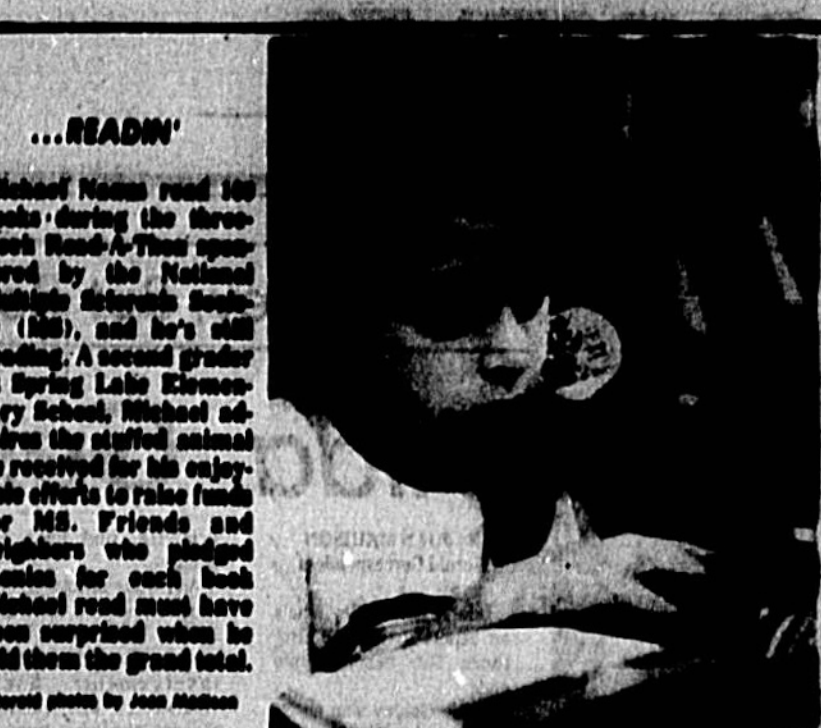

More than 800 Seminole Counties who ride the Orange-Seminole-Osceola Transportation Authority's Altamonte Springs bus daily were without service today. They probably will not receive service again until their bus drivers' strike is resolved, according to an Authority official.

The Seminole County route is in the second group of the company's two-part priority schedule for restoring bus service, according to Robert Lorch, general manager of the Authority.

"We're hoping we can restore service as soon as possible with the drivers who respond to our final offer," Lorch said today. As of this morning none of the drivers on the Altamonte Springs route had responded to the authority's call to work, according to Lorch. However, there were no pickets along that route.

"They don't have any pickets along the line," commented Lorch. "They are picketing here at the authority office."

There have been no reports of violence, "and we don't expect any," said Lorch.

The service stopped at 12:01 a.m. Sunday, according to Lorch, when bus drivers and mechanics belonging to the Amalgamated Transit Union Local 1260 effectively began their strike.

The union voted to strike Friday after the authority rejected a union move to seek binding arbitration. Under the union plan, a federal mediator would have been brought in to help resolve labor-management differences.

The Authority's final offer to the union called for an additional holiday; increased insurance benefits; cost of living raises and a 10-cent-per-hour pay raise this year with an additional eight-cent-per-hour pay hike next April.

Union officials have been calling for higher pay hikes and more overtime pay.

The Authority will hold its regularly scheduled monthly meeting Wednesday, according to Lorch. However, no change in the authority's thinking is anticipated.

"It will be just a regular monthly meeting," said Lorch. "We'll bring them (Authority board members) up to date on the status of things at that time, but as far as we're concerned we've been instructed to stand pat on our offer and we intend to do just that."

Talks between the Authority and representatives of the union are at a standstill.

"We hope meetings are completed," said Lorch. "However, we are ready to meet with them anytime and anywhere."

TAMPA (UPI) — An emergency crew stopped an overflowing gas leak from an overgrown tank truck early today, ending a cloud of deadly gas that forced the evacuation of several hundred residents in suburban Clear Lake City.

No one was reported injured by the escaping gas, but the tank truck driver was killed and two other motorists were hurt in the three-way accident.

Emergency workers plugged the leaking tank at 6:30 a.m. and a gas leak from the ammonia tank — owned by the W.R. Grace Chemical Co. — from a ditch and placed it on another trailer rig for transport out of the area.

Joseph Travolta 24 of Tampa, was killed when a van ran a stop sign and plowed into the tanker truck he was driving at 10:30 p.m. 1077 Sunday in Clear Lake City, the Florida Highway Patrol said.

The driver of the van was identified as 29-year-old Albert Burgegnin, a professional writer known as "The Mad Mad Mad."

Burgegnin was badly injured in the crash that ruptured the tanker section of the larger rig from the tanker, carrying the ammonia tank, the FHP said.

A valve on the ammonia tank was damaged when it rolled over a ditch and plowed into the side of the tanker truck. The valve of the tank gas threatened the area, forcing the evacuation of several hundred homes from Clear Lake City.

The unidentified driver of another vehicle that hit Burgegnin was not seriously injured, the FHP said.
