Ocala Group Up In Arms Over Bombing

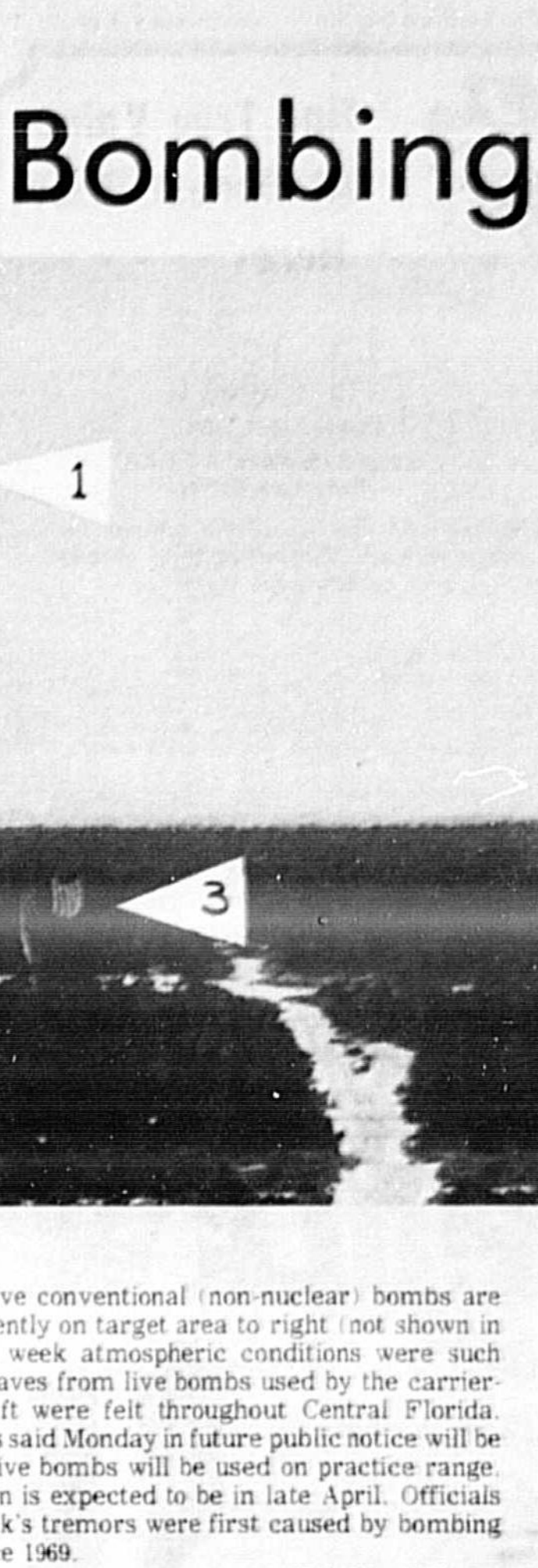
OCALA, Fla. (AP)—The Florida Audubon Society has taken its protest against Navy bombing in the Ocala National Forest to President Nixon's Council on Environmental Quality.

"A national forest is no place for a bombing range," declared Martin R. Northrup, assistant executive director of the Audubon Society, which claims 25,000 members in Florida.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP)—A fleet of airboats will take to the St. Johns River next week, spraying the chemical 2-4-D in "Operation Clean Sweep" against the colorful but troublesome water hyacinths.

It will be a major methodical operation to sweep the area and make a big impact," said Col. Emmette E. Lee Jr., district chief of Army Engineers in Florida as he announced the program Tuesday.

Environmentalists tried to get an injunction against the use of 2-4-D in the river last year but failed. They claimed it killed marine life and trees as well as hyacinths.

Lee declared the Corps of Engineers has no evidence that 2-4-D is directly harmful to marine life.

He admitted that when the floating hyacinths die and sink, the plants take oxygen from the water as they decompose. Without enough oxygen in the water fish can suffocate.

Nixon Defends Budget Cuts On Radio Today

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Nixon defended his budget cuts today as the way to make the family dollar go further and predicted that food prices, while continuing to rise for several months, should come down in the second half of the year.

Defending his decision to trim the number of social programs virtually been ended is totally wrong. We still have federal control. We are still enforcing them firmly. All that is changed is our method of enforcing them."

Nixon, noting that wholesale food prices went up sharply in recent months, said that figures for retail prices for food in January and February will "inevitably show sharp increases. In fact, we will probably see increases in food prices for some months to come."

But Nixon said his administration's effort to expand food supplies "will have a powerful effect in the second half of the year. They will bring relief to the American housewife without damaging the prosperity of our farmers."

Defending his decision to abandon most mandatory wage and price controls, Nixon said, "The idea that controls have other county commissioners are exploring ways to consolidate certain services."
