



Ex-Shah Of Iran III... Cancer Is Suspected

NEW YORK (UPI) — The exiled shah of Iran flew from Mexico examinations" at the New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center, a spokesman for the deposed monarch said today. A hospital spokesman said the shah was admitted to the Manhattan hospital at 11 p.m. EDT and was listed in "serious condition." He said the shah was put to bed on arrival at the nospital and would undergo diagnostic tests later today.

Reza Pahlavi arrived at LaGuardia Airport in a chartered jet about 10:30 p.m. EDT. Accompanied by a woman believed to be his wife, Empress Farah, about a dozen aides and two Doberman pinschers, the shah got into a limousine that was part of a 12-car motorcade and

The spokesman said the shah will under go blood and urine tests, X-rays, "everything the hospital lab can test will be."

was directing care for the shah "at the request of the family." State Department spokesman David Passage in Washington said the shah was "quite" ill and workers at LaGuardia airport said he "looked weak" and walked in a slow shuffle to a waiting Mercedes at the airport.

"I'm under the clear impression," Passage said, "that there's been a significant deterioration in the former shah's health in recent days ..." The Iranian government has information the exiled shah is suffering from terminal cancer, the Foreign Ministry said today. A shah aide promptly denied the claim.

Ibrabim Mokalla, official spokesman of the ministry, told UPI: "We have information that he (the shah) is suffering from ter-

There was no immediate confirmation from other sources and a spokesman for the shah in New York denied the report. "I can make a safe guess that they have gotten the information from an unreliable source," she said.

The shah's light-colored plane, a two-engine Grumman Gulf Stream jet chartered from Aviones B.C., an executive charter airline out of Mexico City, landed in the western section of LaGuardia Airport under cover of darkness. Herald Sports Editor Softball player Patty Negata struck out today before U.S. District Court Judge George Young in her attempts to obtain a preliminary injunction that would allow her to play in Seminole County Parks and

Recreation's male softball league. Negata's attorneys, Willie May and Fred O'Neal, who last week obtained a 10-day restraining order from a Tampa judge that allowed Negata to play temporarily argued that Negata was deprived the right to participate despite the fact that Seminole County offers separate but equal softball leagues for men and women.

Assistant Seminole County Attorney Robert McMillan contended that the county Parks and Recreation Department was operating within all legal guidelines because it offered men's, women's and a coed league at the beginning of the season. No coed league was formed, however, due to lack of interest.

Dayan Won't Start Party

To Oppose Israeli Regime

JERUSALEM (UPI) - Moshe Dayan today quit a weakened Israeli government struggling to cope with a setback to its policy of Jewish settlement and facing five no-confidence motions in Parliament. The former foreign minister, who underwent surgery in

June for removal of an intestinal cancer, said he did not plan a political comeback although he retained his "I don't intend to join any party or to establish any party," Dayan told a news conference. "I personally don't think I will be a member of any Cabinet" in future

Dayan, 64, met with reporters as his surprise resignation submitted Sunday took effect. He retained his Parliament seat as an independent. But he pledged to vote with the government against the no-confidence motions to come up later in the day.

Longwood Police Can See Robber Senators Ask Cambodian Aid

BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI) - A special U.S. presidential task force said today it will fly to the Cambodian capital of Penom Penh to propose a "land bridge" for trucking 30,000 tons of food and other aid each month to famine-wracked Cambodia.

The group is expected to leave Thailand Wednesday and the massive international relief project could begin three days after approval is received from authorities in the Cambodian capital, said Sen. James Sasser, D-Tenn., one of three senators on the mission for President Carter. The senators and assistant Secretary of State Richard Holbrooks told reporters they received approval of the plan from Hanoi's secretary of state for foreign affairs, Nguyen Co Thatch, during a meeting at the Vietnamese embassy in Bangkok Tuesday.

Morocco Gets U.S. Arms

WASHINGTON (UPI) - In the first American involvement in northern Africa's desert war. Morocco will receive U.S. "defensive" arms, including missile-

A senior U.S. official said Monday the decision to sell Morocco OV-10 ground attack planes, and "Cobra" gunship helicopters equipped with TOW anti-tank missiles, was made "in the context of a negotiated solution."

The official explained King Hassan of Morocco, who requested the U.S. arms, will not get all he asked — nor will it be enough, in the judgment of U.S. military experts, to give him a military victory over the Poliserio

Cuba Refugees In Limbo

KEY WEST, Fla. (UPI) — Because they hijacked a barge at guspoint to escape from Cuba, 22 refugees, including a 3-month-old baby, may have created an international embarrasument for the United States instead of the freedom welcome they hoped to find.

The three families of refugees, towed into Key West by a shrimp bost Monday, were being held under guard today at a Coast Guard station until authorities in Washington decide what to do with them.



Longwood Couple Drown In Family Pool NATION

Shortly after midnight Saturday Longwood police were called to disturbance at the home of an elderly couple. Police left, presumably after quieting down the situation, about 12:30 a.m. About an hour later, the elderly couple drowned in their pool, and, according to police, their deaths may have resulted

from excessive drinking.

Dead are Gwyn C. Beshears, 60, and his wife, Alda, 54, of 368 E. Evergreen Ave. Their nude bodies were found by two family members lying face down in the family pool about 2:39 p.m.
Saturday, according to Longwood Police Sergeant Frank Taylor.
Sgt. Taylor said police were first called to the Beshears residence by Mrs. Beshears around midnight Saturday. He said she reported the couple had been arguing and wanted police to

Police reported they found the couple had been drinking when they responded to the disturbance call, according to Taylor. Police left about 12:30 a.m., and nothing was heard again until later that afternoon, according to Sgt. Taylor. He said a step-brother and sone-in-law went of the couple's home Saturday afternoon after Beshears failed to answer the telephone. When the relatives went to the couple's residence, they found the TV on, and looked in the pool area, discovering both bodies in the pool.

Sgt. Taylor said efforts to revive the Beshears proved futile. An autonsy Monday disclosed both had died of drowning, and police said there was no evidence of foul play.

Black-Jewish Reconciliation

As is often the case with friends who patch up their differences, the reconciliation between the black and Jewish communities in this country could lead to bonds between them even closer than those that have existed traditionally.

Friendship must sometimes be placed in jeopardy before it is properly cherished.

Although there were some subterranean and largely ignored tensions between the two groups the open rift did not come until U.N. Ambassador Andrew Young was forced out of office last August for unauthorized discussions with the Palestine Liberation Organization and for his being less than honest about this with the administration.

At the time, it served President Carter's purpose to let black Americans, who felt betrayed, believed Ambassador Young had been sacrificed because of Israeli and Jewish pressure. During the ensuing uproar, some black leaders led by the Rev. Jesse Jackson, who heads People United To Save Humanity (PUSH), and the Rev. Joseph Lowery of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, raised a hue and cry against Israel and rushed to the Middle East to embrace the PLO terrorists. Wisely, Israel's leaders and the American Jewish community assumed an aloof, Olympian

posture against these provocations in the hope that responsible blacks would provide an appropriate antidote. And that's what happened. To their great credit black leaders have done two things: The have repudiated Jackson's voice of vengeance and they have made positive moves

toward a reconciliation with their old Jewish friends, who have been quick to respond. Vernon Jordan Jr., president of the influ National Urban League, openly denounced the Jackson mission: "Black-Jewish relations should not be endangered by ill-considered flirtations with terrorist groups devoted to the ex-termination of Israel," he said. And Bayard Rustin, president of the A. Philip Randolph Institute, has led a distinguished black delegation to Israel to reassure the Israelis that there is no "mass movement in the United States to support

Manwhile, Benjamin Hooks, executive director of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, warned against black overtures to the PLO and moved his organization to the forefront in addressing tensions between blacks and Jews that the Young resignation had served as

The emerging reality is that American blacks and Jews have come to realize anew how they share more goals and common interests than animosities. The ventilation of suppressed differences has been therapeutic because it has nelped to redress real or imagined wrongs by both

Another significant thing the Andrew Young episode and its aftermath have produced is positive proof of a more mature society now in this country. Sensationalist radical leaders can still make headlines but they no longer command the respect or results which crowned their disruptions during







While there is no epidemic alert in Seminole County, County Health Director Jorge DeJu said today the virus has been detected in one of 16 test chickens spotted at four locations in the county. Dr. DeJu emphasized that a medical alert is called only when SLE is found in 40 percent or more of the test:

They are our early warning system and have proven to be quite effective," said Ms. Harbolt. SLE is transmitted by the Culex Nigripalpus mosquito,

which gets the virus by biting infected wild birds. St. Louis encephalitis is the least virulent of the six varieties of the illness. It has a fatality rate of 5 to 10 percent, compared to Japanese and Equine Encephaliti that have fatality rates up to 60 percent, said Ms. Harbolt. The symptons of the St. Louis strain, which generally causes an inflamation of the brain, are disorientation, trembling, chills, fever, headaches and drowsiness. Th

Lack Of Candidates Today Prime Interest Rate Hurts Market; Stocks Open Low

Early NYSE volume amounted to about 1,000,000 shares. The mariet has been crumbling since the Federal Reserve decided earlier this month to try to control the nation's money rapply by requiring banks to keep more money in reserve.

This has sent interest rates to their highest levels ever and there is no end in sight. Many of the nation's major banks Tuesday raised their prime lending rate to top corporate customers a half point to 15 percent.

Banks also have raised the rate they charge brokers for loans to between 15 and 16% percent. This has made it extremely difficult for brokerage customers to buy stocks on credit.

"The Fed wants banks to make direct selective cutbacks in their loans, especially in loans made for non-productive purposes such as speculation in the commodities markets or for corporate acquisitions," said David M. Jones, economist for Aubrey G. Lanston & Co.

The prime rate has no immediate effect on regulated consumer loans, with the exception of mortgage loans in some areas.
