G.O.P. Charges Truman Talk To Be Political

Nation Awaits President's Decision On Meat Situation In Broadcast Tonight

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14. (AP)—Hours in advance of his scheduled radio talk tonight on the meat shortage, President Truman was confronted today with a charge that the speech is going to be political.

The charge came from Republican National Chairman Carroll Reece who demanded that the four major radio networks provide the G.O.P. with an equal amount of time to answer Mr. Truman and present the Republican view on the meat situation.

Meanwhile, there is no official indication of what decision Mr. Truman will announce in his speech at 10:00 P. M. (Eastern Standard Time), on what steps, if any, the administration plans to take in an effort to end the meat shortage.

The latest information from Capitol Hill indicated that Mr. Truman has made his decision but it is a closely kept White House secret. Aided by cabinet members, the President put the finishing touches on his address today.

President Truman also let it be known today that there are no atomic bombs outside of the United States. The President's declaration was made through assistant White House press secretary Eben Ayers. Ayers told a news conference today that there are no atomic bombs outside the country with or without detonators. He added:

"The only ones ever outside of this country were those used in the Bikini test and those dropped on Japan."

The White House comment came in the wake of a statement by a radio commentator Drew Pearson last night that there are A-bombs outside the United States.

Mrs. Crawford Named To Young Democrats Post

Elected Vice President Of Fifth Congressional Group

Mrs. Virginia Jenkins Crawford, daughter of Jim D. Jenkins, was elected vice president of the Fifth Congressional District on the State Cabinet of the Young Democratic Clubs of Florida at their first post-war convention held in Orlando, Saturday.

Lions To Ask City To Make Palmetto, Magnolia And Oak Through Streets

Sanford Lions Friday voted to request the City Commission, tonight to designate all north and south streets between Oak Avenue and Sanford Avenues inclusive as through streets in order that accidents may be averted.

This action followed a talk by Fred Bell, chairman of the Lion's safety committee, who said that he had conferred on this matter with Police Chief Roy G. Williams, who had declared favored this move. This would make Oak, Magnolia and Palmetto Avenues through streets and cross streets, either than Thirteenth and Ninth Streets, would be stop streets at the crossings.

Lions also approved Harry Robson's suggestion that the City repaint slow or stop signs placed near schools, which signs can now hardly be read, and that police be requested to enforce the law.

ORLANDO, Oct. 14. (AP)—Florida's Young Democrats at their first post-war convention, gave a firm endorsement to United States foreign policy and named Senator Spencer L. Holland as their national Democratic leader for the next term.

A resolution commending the United States' delegation to the Paris Peace Conference for its splendid work and criticizing its detractors, was adopted by the Young Democrats. The resolution instructed Florida Congressmen and senators to give their full support and cooperation to the American conference. Without mentioning any names, the resolution said the nation's welfare has been imperiled by unrepresentative criticism by certain persons and groups in the United States of the delegates in Paris.

In his address, Senator Holland said the Democratic party has nothing to apologize for. He went on to say: "There has never been a time in history—in period of equal time—when so many things have been done to benefit the people of the nation and the world."

Former Governor John W. Martin, of Jacksonville, called upon the Young Democrats to forget the policies of "Karl Marx, Stalin, Lenin, and the rest of the tribe." He assumed the leadership of a movement to return the Democratic Party to power.

Dr. F. S. Jamison Is Main Speaker At Rotary Meet

Stresses Importance Of Growing Crops Other Than Celery

Declaring that the Sanford area would continue to produce celery for many years to come, Dr. F. S. Jamison, head of the Vegetable Research Division of the Experimental Station at the University of Florida, nevertheless warned Sanford growers of the importance of finding more efficient means of production, when he addressed the Rotary Club at its regular weekly meeting today.

Mr. Jamison, who was introduced by C. H. Dawson, a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania and a resident of this state for the past 12 years, said that before the war 7,000 or 8,000 acres of celery was considered a big crop, but that last year 14,000 acres were planted and 13,000 harvested. He mentioned increasing competition from the Everglades section where 60 to 100 acre farms are not unusual as compared with 15 to 20 in the Sanford section, as well as new competition from western states where in Arizona alone 1,000 acres were planted in celery last year.

Other crops which might profitably be grown here he listed as corn, potatoes and snap beans, and said that experiments now being conducted in peas and onions might soon make these profitable. Acreage planted in Florida in 1945 has increased from 10,000 in 1925 to 100,000 at present, due, he said, to improvements in quality. 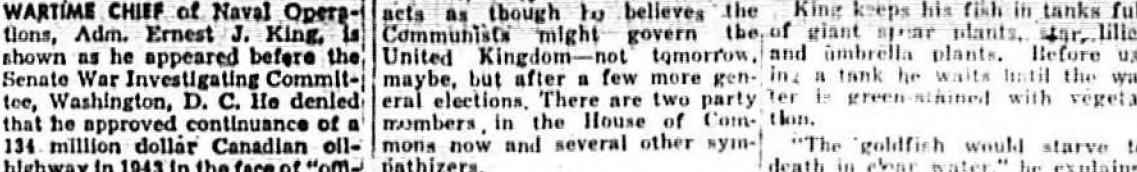
