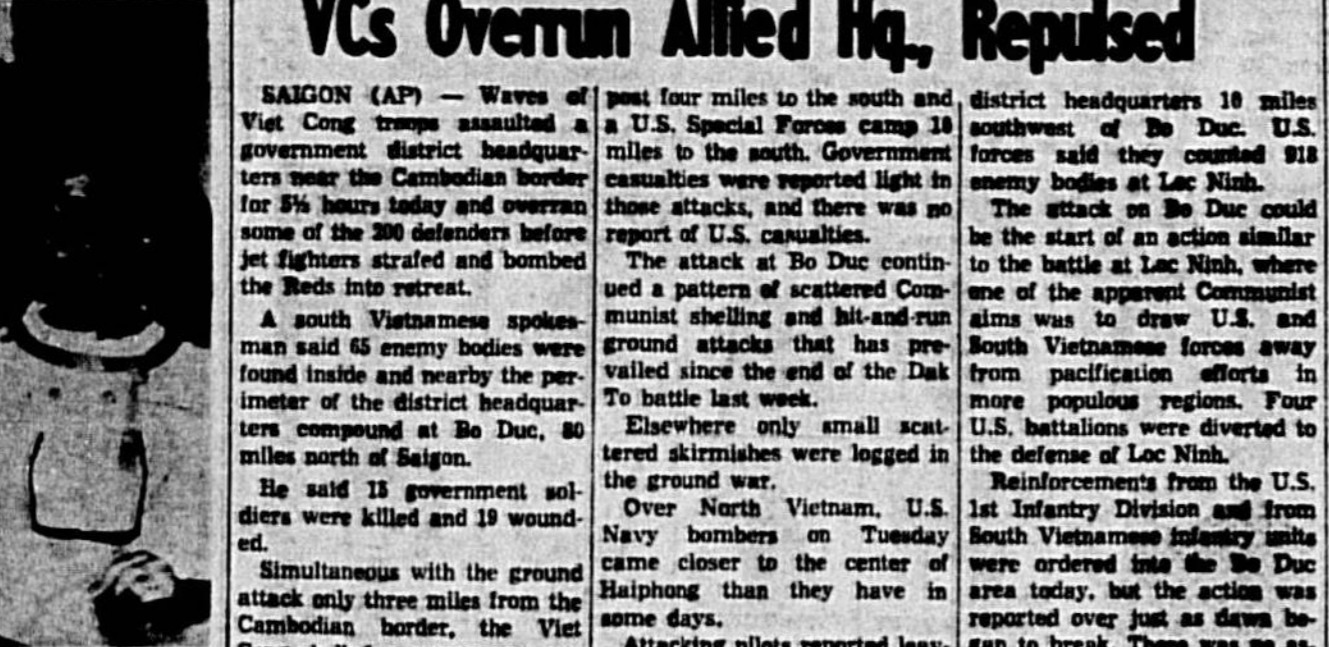

Now that there's a nip in the air, you've probably noticed that your family seems to be hungrier. Turn to bottle-cooking and fill them full of simple, superb steaks. Best of all, these old timers, served with crusty french bread, green salad, and easy desserts, make hearty but easy meals.

Chunks of beef, broiled in a little fat, then simmered with whole-kernel canned corn, kidney beans and seasoned with chili powder is a lively one. Another triumph is sliced lamb liver cooked with bits of onion, onion, a can of sliced tomatoes, a package of frozen green peas and celery. Simmer for about an hour in a Dutch oven or heavy covered pot.

Beefsteak is topped to a man's taste. Cut 2 pounds of lean boneless veal shoulder into 1 inch cubes, brown, combine with an envelope of cream of tartar soup mix, 2 cups of water, bring to a boil, stir, then simmer 1 1/2 hours.

Sit in 2 cups of sliced celery, simmer 18 minutes longer. Meanwhile, stir 2 tablespoons of sugar and 1/2 teaspoon of salt into a can of sweetcorn, simmer 15 minutes to blend flavors. Spoon hot cooked potatoes around the edge of a soup plate. Spoon sweetcorn in rows next to potatoes, spoon veal mixture in center. Sprinkle with paprika.

For dessert, try making a cup of yogurt with a cup of mandarin - any brand. Spoon into shallow glasses, grate orange rind on top, chill for a bit. Or, make a compote, bring to a boil a cup each of sugar and water, the grated rind of a big orange, and a tablespoon of bourbon. While still warm, pour over 2 big peaches pitted and sliced in four quarters, 1 cup of mandarin grapes. Chill several hours... very pretty served in glass bowls.

Think about these for the day you get out that Christmas hat and settle down with pen in hand. They each while you work, and they'll work wonders for the table.

**Lamprey Killing Great Lakes Fish**

SAULT STE. MARIE, Ont. (AP) — The sea lamprey's origin is the sea; its shape is eel-like; its object is to kill as many lake trout and whitefish as it can and sucking out blood and body juices.

Until the 19th Century, Niagara Falls prevented the lamprey from advancing into Lake Erie from its natural habitat, the North Atlantic.

But with the building of the Welland Canal the door was opened to the upper Great Lakes where large trout and whitefish roamed in abundance. It did take the lamprey more than a century to devastate from its normal pattern. But by 1921 lamprey had successfully navigated Lake Ontario, the Welland Canal and into Lake Erie.

Convinced West Shallow, warm Lake St. Clair presented another natural barrier to the lamprey, which is accustomed to cold water. But

15 years after the invasion of Lake Erie, the lamprey, which grows to a length of three feet in the sea but only about two feet in fresh water, had moved on to Lake Huron. A decade later it was at work in Lake Michigan.

With each female lamprey laying about 60,000 eggs, of which 90 per cent are said to hatch, it was easy work for the invader to kill the whitefish and trout, both of which prefer the rocky shoals favored by the hungry eels.

By 1947 lake trout catches in Lake Huron had been reduced to virtually nil from 3,400,000 pounds in 1937. In Lake Michigan, the catch was down to 500 pounds in 1951 from 4,600,000 in 1948.

By 1945 the lamprey was established in Lake Superior. In the early 1950s, when it seriously threatened the last stronghold of the trout and whitefish, man decided to intervene in the battle.
