The combined company will offer its 19 million combined customers an array of corporate banking, retail banking,

asset and wealth management, capital markets and securities brokerage services and products. With total assets of \$324 billion and a market capitalization of \$45 billion, the company will be the largest financial holding company in its Southeast/East Coast region, and the fourth largest nationwide. The company will be headquartered in Charlotte, N.C., and maintain its regional headquarters for North and South Carolina banks in Winston-Salem.

Over the past few months, the Seminole County Sheriff's Department has received several reports of a male exposing him-self to female joggers and select-ed individuals.

Water districts publish tips on drought-resistant landscaping

According to the St. Johns River Water Management District, outdoor watering accounts for as much as half of the water used by many Florida households. And as lakes and various water sources continue to dry up, it's no secret that Florida is experiencing a serious drought.

To help all of us reduce the use of water, the states five water management districts have collaborated to develop a 64 page guide to help property owners design a low-maintenance, drought-resistant landscape for their homes and commercial property.

The new "Waterwise Florida Landscapes" guide is free booklet designed to teach Floridians the concept and var-

ious applications of Xeriscape landscaping, a technique that promotes water conservation by incorporating drought-resistant vegetation into landscaping designs.

The guide lists 506 plants able to survive nature's extremes, examines the effects of light, water and soil conditions, and includes a glossary of water conservation and landscape terms for the landscaping novice.





Our View The Blame Game

Mayor Brady Lessard and Commissioner Art Woodruff didn't play it. The City and the Housing Authorityare better off.

Barely a week into its new lineup, the Sanford City Commission faced a difficult task --- What to do about the Housing Authority Board? An intense investigation by the Department of Housing and Urban Development had uncovered a rat's nest of problems, many owing directly to the board's failure to provide proper oversight.

Some in the community wondered how the city's new mayor, Brady Lessard, and new commissioner, Art Woodruff, would perform in their duties, and this first crisis provided the answer. While others disagree, we believe the two men set the right tone and direction for the city to find a solution to this quagmire.

With the commission set to hear evidence about why the housing board should be removed, Lessard presented one last option to removal - let the board serve until April 30 with substantially reduced powers; appoint, with HUD's blessing, a private company to run the housing agency until an exhaustive search for a qualified permanent director is completed; and instruct that company to immediately begin fixing the agency's physical structures.

It wasn't a popular proposal because many of those gathered at the hearing, particularly the media, came to see the blood of revenge spill onto the floor. "If it bleeds, it leads," and nothing leads better than a city commission airing its dirty laundry before the television cameras. No doubt this is a newsworthy story, and there's plenty of suspects to finger in the blame game: from SHA director Timothy Hudson, the board, and commission liaison Velma Williams to city officials, the City Commission, and HUD. Problem is, assigning blame, at least for the moment, does

nothing to correct the conditions that led to the finger-pointing in the first place. What is needed, as Woodruff so eloquently put it,


is action. Action to get rid of rats, fix stoves and repair doors. Blame can be assigned later. The FBI raid last Friday will make sure of that.

It's too early to hand out kudos. There's too much that remains to be done. So far, residents are raving about the speediness in which things are being repaired, but in a way, this is the easy part. Fixing doors and windows can be accomplished rather quickly with manpower and organization. Repairing trust, rebuilding relationships and removing the "troubled agency" label from the Sanford Housing Authority will take months, if not уеагв.

That said, a tip of the hat goes to Lessard and Woodruff for taking the heat and making a decision based on their convictions, not the pressure of outside forces. At 30, Lessard is the city's youngest mayor, and many thought he would be the puppet of his prediction. Larry Dale. Anyone who still thinks that should take another look not just at what Lessard accompliated, but how he did it. Dale's take-the-bull-by-the-horns approach may have been just as successful, but the collateral damage would have resulted in bull-in-the-china-shop casualties.

City Manager Tony VanDerworp deserves a pat on the back for dotting the "i's" and crossing the "t's" to make sure the interim transition was relatively smooth. Ditto for Deputy City Manager Roger Dixon.

The City Commission as a whole deserves a nod, as well. Though the vote was split with commissioners Randy Jones and Whitey Eckstein dissenting, and Commissioner Velma Williams surprisingly low-key in her support of the agreement, commissioners were cordial, even jovial with each other after the meeting. In recent years that's been a characteristic of the Sanford City Commission. They're able to put the votes behind them and move on for the good of the city. We suspect there's some scrapes and bruises to be healed, but that too shall pass. This is by no means the final chapter of this story. Many controversies will arise. The city must ensure a responsible board is appointed and demand HUD provide proper training in procedures, policies and oversight. The city, HUD and the new board must also make the right decision in selecting a new director. It's not exactly a plumb job given the "troubled agency" status. These are tough decisions, but given the leadership shown by the city commission and city staff, we expect they'll make the right ones.

"Because I favor the Defense of Marriage Act (which gives states the right to restrict state-sanctioned weddings male/female couples) and Eminem doesn't speak about it," Schlessinger says. Gay rights groups are experienced intimida-tors. They've tried censoring me. They feverishly oppose discussion about people who have come out of same-sex relationships and slander those who manage to get through their jamming system, saying people who abandon homosexuality weren't "really" homosexual in the first place. They also deny the testimony of people who claim to have been "cured" of homosexuality by producing someone who once claimed to be "cured" but now says he was really a self-hating gay. Yet many people who have been converted to heterosexuality remain so. They are rarely heard from because most broadcasters are afraid to air their stories. Add to that the effective infiltration of the media, academia, religion and psychiatry by gay rights activists and their sympathizers and you see how this issue has been turned around in a single generation. Schlessinger says she's happy to be on her highly rated (up 15 percent, she says) radio show and will continue to write books. But those of us who care about real diversity ought to lament the loss of this countercultural voice in the vast wasteland of television where, increasingly, everyone says and believes the same thing and God help those who don't.



Mistletoes: Plant parasites

Mistletoes are parasitic plants that feed mostly from trees taking water, mineral nutrients, and probably some organic compounds from their water con-ducting vessels. The true mistletoes are only partially parasitic since they contain chlorophyll and through pholosynthesis they can produce their own organic compounds. The type of mistletoe found in Florida is the castern mistletoe that occurs in about 110

toe is the species most often used for Christmas ornament.

The plant: The eastern mistletoe have smooth-edged, leathery, green, paired opposite leaves. The stems are round and jointed. The sterns and leaves sometimes have a yellowishgreen or golden cast. The small flowers appear from October to late November and into January in Florida. Male and female flowers occur in different plants. The flowers are pollinated by insects and the fruits develop about one year after pollination. The fruits are rounded, whitish or pinkish. The seeds are spread by birds which eat the fruits and digest the pulp, but the seeds retain the sticky covering that help them to remain attached to the stems of the trees

Seeds germinate in bright light but are inhibited by darkness. Once the seed germinates it can penetrate the host plant and produce a feeding organ that grows into the bark to the water conducting tissues from where it takes water tind nutrients. The mistletoe seedling can only penetrate thin bark of twigs or small branches. Mistletoes grow well in full sunlight, especially when growing high in the

crowns of large trees. Damage: Mistletoes are not considered a serious forest problem in Florida but the plant is reported to kill water oaks and sugarberries in Texas and water oaks in Mississippi. Trees grow-

frequently than under forest con-ditions. Signs of infection by parasitic plants are more noticeable during the winter months, when the deciduous trees shed their leaves and the dark green mistletoes can be easily seen on the trees. Multiple infections can be promoted by constant bird feeding on mistletoe seeds, producing loss of vigor, die-back and often death of the trees. Symptoms of mistletoe infec-

tions include atrophy and die-back of branch ends beyond the point of infection of the parasite. Galls or swellings of the twigs may occur at the site of the infection. The parasitic association may last many years but they usually survive only a few years before being broken off or killed by freezing. When a mistletoe

stem dies, new shoots may develop from the parasite tissues inside the host. Toxicity: All the plant parts

contain toxic substances that inhibit protein synthesis in the intestines of humans. Eating a small quantity of berries from this plant will produce abdomi-nal pains and diarrhea. By eat-ing large quantities of berries or drinking tea made from the leaves of this plant, a severe irri-tation of the intestines will occur, followed by vomiting, diarrhea and cramps. It may also lower the heart rate under certain conditions. Mistletoe toxicity is rarely fatal, but commercial florists sometimes use artificial plastic berries to decorate mistletoes to avoid problems. Control: Mistletoe infections can be controlled by pruning infected branches. Branches must be cut 1 to 2 feet back of the visible infection area. Cutting only the aerial portions of the plant can induce the development of many shoots in other parts of the tree. Herblcide treatments while the host is dormant have been tried in some Northerner areas, but 🖷 there are no recommendations / on the use of chemicals to control mistletoe infections on trees.







Each year, more than 500,000 people attend Edmonton, Alberta's 10-day Fringe Festival, the largest in North America. The North American Fringe Circuit has developed into an encouraging springboard for new, creative work in the theatrical arts. It now encompasses 20 festivals. Performers from Europe, Africa and South America can make the trip to North America more economical by performing at several Fringe Festivals. The Orlando International

Fringe Festival, initiated in 1992 continues this tradition and was the first of its kind in the United States. Fringe Festival is a registered 501(c)3 non-profit corporation that is dedicated to producing a 10-day theater festival that allows artists and audiences an easily accessible forum for producing and seeing lively arts from around the world.

The Fringe Festival producers do not decide for the community what is, or what is not "good art". We believe the audience/community are capa-ble and willing to decide for

themselves what they would like to see. We provide festival and show information (via the Official Fringe Program and Web site), and then it is up to you. We believe in giving artis-tic control back to the people. For too long, a small group of people have set the cultural climate for the masses. The Fringe Festival says, "No More," this is your Fringe - shape it as you will.

The Fringe Festival returns 100 percent of ticket sales generated by an artist directly back to the artist. In 1997, the Orlando Fringe Festival was rated #1 among Fringe Festivals in the United States for ticket sales, as well as #1 for money returned to artists.

Since artists receive 100 percent of ticket sales, you may be wondering where the money comes from to produce the Fringe. This is a great question and concern.

We receive grant money from State and local government agencies such as Florida State Arts Council and United Arts of Central Florida and are sponsored in part by the Downtown **Development Board. These** funding sources equal only eight percent of our projected budget. Beyond that we are on our own.

We try to defer some of the cost of the Fringe by selling buttons, T-shirts, food and beverages. These sources of income are helpful, but do not represent the majority of revenue needed to produce the Fringe. For the remainder of our income, we rely on the support of our com-munity. As Uncle Fringe says, "We need you"!

Corporate sponsors and indi-vidual donors are the lift blood of the Fringe. Without them the Fringe would not be able to exist. Their money has gone to wonderful use as we have seen an increase in the quality and frequency of the lively arts throughout Central Florida during the last eight years of the Fringe's existence.

Sanford woman trains for military deployment

When the daughter of Sanford residents first arrived in the war ravaged country, she was told not to drink the water, eat the food or interact with the locals

Malaria, AIDS and Yellow Fever were common, as were the dead bodies littering the devastated streets and village paths. And to top it all off, she was in constant danger. One mistake could cost her her life. But Air Force Staff Sgt. Anita Martin-Jones had to use her imagination a bit because this foreign country looked a lot like the tranquil pinelands of northern New Jersey. And the locals bore a close resemblance to her fellow U.S. service members. For Martin-Jones, daughter of Willie Martin, Locust Avenue, and Jeanette Baker, Cypress Avenue, in Sanford, wartime scenarios are part of the curriculum at the Air Mobility Warfare Center's Phoenix Readiness course. Martin-Jones recently

underwent two weeks of instruction and warfare scenarios designed to prepare airmen to do their jobs while deployed to hotspots around the world.

This intense training runs airmen through the gamut, teaching students to do everything. from erecting tents to guarding convoys. and that's just for starters. They're also taught to perform their jobs in the face of danger, whether from weapons of mass destruction, host nation civil unrest, or natural disasters. This training may later prove vital because, for airmen like Martin-Jones, a security policewoman, a peacetime job can sometimes bear little resemblance to duties during war.

"As a security forces con-troller and patrolman, I direct patrols to incidents, such as domestic violence, alarm activation or flight line security breaches," said Martin-Jones, a 1982 graduate of Seminole High School. "I also monitor the 911

working in an office environ-ment to being out in the field," she continued. "Then I become a fire team leader and direct a three-person team with the mission of base defense. I also may become a squad leader and direct a 12-person team."

But Martin-Jones' everyday life at Pope Air Force Base, N.C., is a far cry from the deserts of Iraq or the riot-ridden villages of Kosovo.

"I'm not exposed to danger-ous or austere conditions on a day-to-day basis," Martin-Jones said. "That's why this training is so important. It's giv-ing me the tools I need to deploy to any contingency around the world and still do my job." With today's high-rate of mil-

When it happens, Martin-Jones' life could depend on her ability to face and overcome a variety of challenges. But whether peacekeeping in Bosnia, providing disaster relief in India or patrolling a no-fly zone in Southwest Asia, thanks to Phoenix Readiness, Martin-

Jones will be more than ready. "Phoenix Readiness is a challenge," Martin-Jones said. "We work long hours with minimal sleep, while having to face and overcome many challenging sit-uations. But it's also been a great experience. I have definitely gained confidence in myself and my ability to carry out my job and the Air Force mission no matter where I'm deployed."



FISHING FORECAST

River action continues to be good in spite of the approach of summer. Water is still in the banks, and bass are easily located in holding areas such as deep bends, steep banks, slough and creek mouths and sand bars. When you catch one bass, slow down, for more will surely be present in the area. Look for wading birds, as they will con-gregate in areas full of baitfish. Summer is almost upon us,

and <u>Sebastian Inlet</u> is beginning to feature improved snook fish-ing, as well as redfish, flounder, and trout. Large live shrimp continue to be the top offering. Fished on a bare leadhead or with a light weight, the shrimp are worked slowly with the tide across the rocky bottom. Captain Jack at Port Canaveral reports fair action with dolphin and king mackerel. Cobia are scattered, and sheepshead and flounder are hiding inside the Port. Trout and redfish are rated as fair in the Banana and Indian

rivers Ponce Inlet has steady action with sheepshead, drum, redfish, small bluefish, and jack crevalle. Live or dead shrimp is the top balt. Trout and redfish are rated from fair to good in Mosquito Lagoon.




