# Bill Carter Again Seeks House Seat

County Democrat visited The Herald newsroom this morning and offered the following statement about his candidacy for Florida's House of Representatives. Here is Carter's prepared statement:

Bill Carter, Orange County Democrat, announced today that he will make a second bid for No. 41, now held by David Lindsay, the self-styled Republican conservative who voted for the legislative pay raise after winning the 300 race in Seminole County by 350 votes. Carter believes his greatest asset is "the ability to listen to the wishes of the people." He believes that federalism, that individual and community rights can be legislated but social rights cannot, that the tax burden on real estate should be reduced, that the free enterprise system should be reinforced by a secondary system to help those who help themselves, that church and state should be separated, but God and govern-

# Bill Fulford Seeks House Re-election

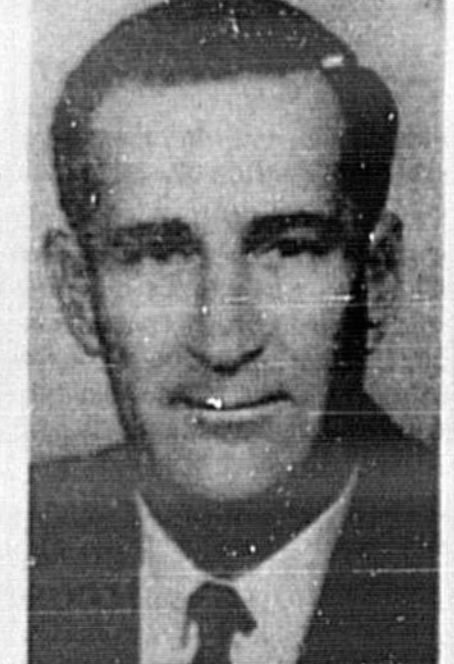
State Representative Bill Fulford announced that he will seek re-election to the House of Representatives, District 46, Orange-Seminole Counties.

Fulford, one of the new legislators who voted and worked against the legislative pay raise and also voted to uphold the Governor's veto, pointed to the achievements in aquatic weed control legislation during the past two sessions. The aquatic weed import law which he introduced and passed in the '69 session and the aquatic weed research and control law which he introduced in the House became law June 25, 1970.

"This law, for the first time, places the responsibility of research and control of aquatic weeds in one state agency," said Fulford. "Hopefully we will now have a concerted statewide effort in finding a solution to the aquatic weed problem that has plagued our lakes and destroyed our lakes for fishing, swimming and boating. These individuals have taken time through developing in Orange County and depreciated the value of the lakefront property."

Fulford, long known for his efforts in conservation in Florida, also sponsored and handled, in the House, the algal bloom prevention package to prevent the extraction of the Florida alligator. In addition he co-sponsored three important bills that became law that will prohibit the indiscriminate dredging and filling of sub-subsided lands and require biological reports to be made prior to any sale or dredging and fill permits.

As Chairman of the House Subcommittee on Air and Water Pollution, his Committee helped enact into law six bills strengthening water pollution laws and a constitutional amendment to enable local gov-

# South Seminole Mansion Robbed

A South Seminole mansion was robbed over several thousand dollars worth of furs and jewels in a Thursday afternoon burglary, according to Seminole County Sheriff John Polk.

Sheriff Polk said the Spring Valley Estates home of Ralph Kennedy, an Orlando food company executive, was entered and family jewelry and furs amounting to several thousand dollars were removed.

The home, located on Live Oak Lane, is considered a luxury showcase and had been robbed of household items last February. County Investigator George Abney reported the entry was made by a side window and said the entire house was ransacked, which indicated more than one person was involved.

The robbery occurred sometime between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. and was discovered by Mrs. Kennedy upon arriving home. She immediately called sheriff's officers who launched an intensive investigation.

In other county reports, the home of Mrs. Edna Norman at 504 Wylie Avenue was entered and a \$400 plus value tape recorder-stereo unit was taken. Sheriff Polk also reported that Thomas N. Wiloughby, wanted in connection with the burning of a truck owned by the company which employed him, had voluntarily turned himself over to authorities and was placed in lieu of \$10,000 bonds for destruction of private property and grand larceny charges in the county jail.

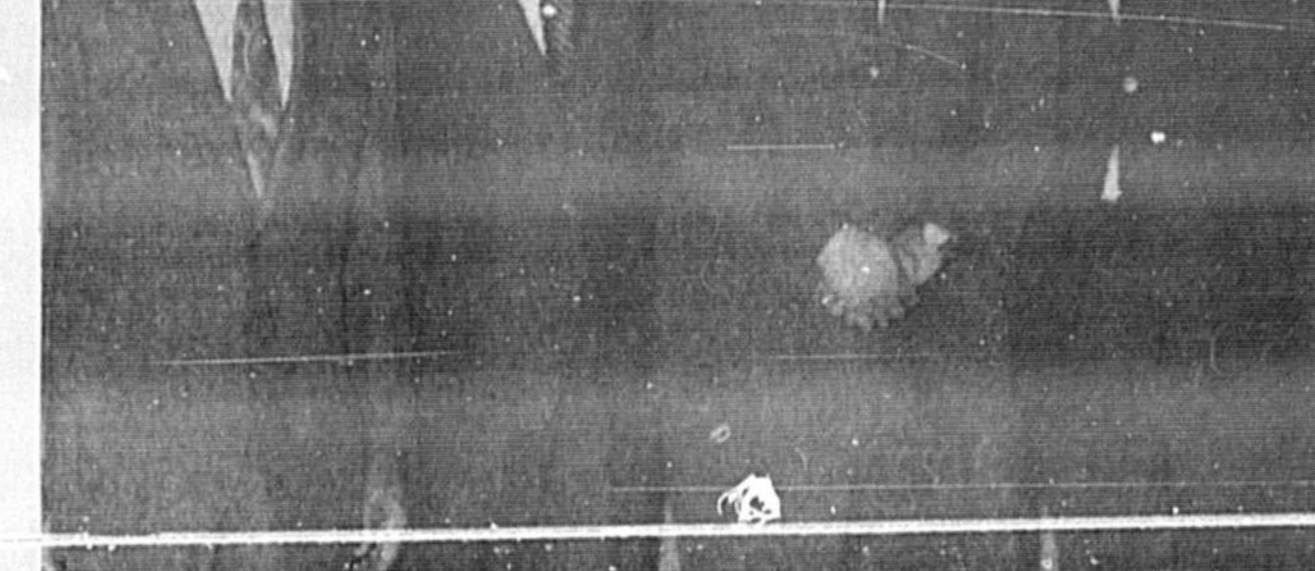

## General's Chopper Found In Vietnam

SAIGON (UPI) — U.S. planes and infantrymen, battered by torrential monsoon rains, struggled today to reach the wreckage of the downed helicopter of Maj. Gen. George W. Casey on a hillside near the Cambodian border.

Military sources said Casey was presumed dead, the sixth American general killed in Vietnam.

The U.S. Command in Saigon refused to give more than the most general details of the rescue operation because of the possibility Casey and six others aboard might have survived the crash Tuesday morning.

Aircraft observers who spotted the wreckage in rainy twilight Thursday on the jungle hillside saw no bodies near it, but it was considered possible the men had escaped into the woods.

Casey, 43, of North Scituate, Mass., a West Point graduate, commanded the 1st Air Cavalry Division, one of the U.S. Army's finest units. His helicopter was shot down Tuesday.

The general was a qualified pilot and it is believed he was at the controls when the crash occurred. One other pilot was aboard.

Casey was believed headed for a military hospital in Tay Ninh City, 5 miles northwest of Saigon, in the turbine-powered UH1 Huey.

South Vietnamese 7th Infantry Division troops reported finding the bodies of 23 Communist soldiers killed earlier by air strikes 45 miles south-southwest of Saigon.

All Israeli planes were safe, he added.

## Israelis Batter Soviet Aircraft

TEL AVIV (AP) — Israeli warplanes shot down three Egyptian fighter-bombers in dog fights over the Suez Canal today, the military command announced.

The Egyptian planes were Soviet-made MIG21s, a spokesman said.

They had attempted to intercept Israeli warplanes which began raiding Egyptian targets on the northern sector of the waterway a few hours earlier, he reported.

The aircraft were fired by cannon and rocket fire, he added.

This brought to 105 the number of Egyptian planes Israel has claimed shooting down since the 1967 Middle East war.

These were first reported air battles since Israel last Monday made public its claim that the Russians had set up SAM surface-to-air missiles in the canal zone.

The planes were downed at 11:30 a.m. and Israeli bombing missions were still going on 90 minutes later, the spokesman said.

## Executive Airlines Investigate Area

The possibility of connecting Sanford Airport with Executive Airlines, a Sarasota headquartered commuter air service with outlets in 11 Florida cities and Atlanta, was discussed yesterday at a luncheon meeting with W. Frank Wilkinson, airline southern regional vice president, and Sanford businessmen and chamber of commerce officials.

Wilkinson arrived here shortly before noon and was met by a group of city officials at the Sanford Airport, who accompanied Wilkinson on a tour of the airport facilities, before retiring to Holiday Inn to eat and talk.

The airline official expressed Executive's willingness to locate here if certain criteria were met. This included, chief among others, the availability of financing to satisfy other information from travel groups and aviation-minded agencies concerning directions of way.

Wilkinson said his firm previously served Daytona Beach with nine flights per day and envisioned about the same amount for Sanford. "We could not make the Daytona Beach operation click, and don't know what went wrong," the airline official advised.

Main requirements for receiving local air service seemed to hinge on generating 600 to 800 passengers a month from Sanford's former Navy base, now being operated as a municipal airport.

Wilkinson said the future of Orlando's Herndon Field, which has been mentioned for a planing in the next few years, would have nothing immediately to do with the Sanford situation and indicated that if nothing was done to increase the Sanford Airport's use until Herndon is closed, then that will be too late to try and shift some of the Orange County air activity to Sanford.

David Kelley, who noted the meeting as Sanford Industrial Commission director, said he would get needed information to Wilkinson, who later told The Herald he should be able to make a decision in about 30 days.

Douglas Stenstrom, school attorney, introduced the letter from U. S. Justice Department Assistant Attorney General Jerry Leonard.

Stenstrom said the Leonard letter indicated the county would be given a last chance to submit an acceptable plan or be sued in court by the Justice Department along with 13 other Florida counties.

Superintendent John Angel said he had been informed by an aide in State Education Commissioner Floyd Christian's office that Seminole County would be sued in five days unless there was an indication the county would consider an acceptable desegregation plan.

Stenstrom said Seminole could avoid being sued and keep its federal funds if the board would indicate a willingness to negotiate with the Justice Department.

At this point it was decided to invite the State Education Department to visit the county to inspect the desegregation plan, which Evans said was working.

Presumably the State Department would forward the information to the Justice Department, and that body could also inspect the system if it so desires.

An Associated Press Dispatch today disclosed that eight of the 14 state counties were sued by the Justice Department in a Thursday action.

These include: Hendry, Saint Lucie, Gadsden, Gulf, Jackson, Jefferson, Lafayette and Wakulla counties.

The six counties still subject to suits include, besides Seminole, Baker, Bradford, Flagler, Pasco, and St. Johns.

A meeting to discuss the Justice Department's new remedy to speed integration by acting through the various state education departments will be held July 16 at Tallahassee between board attorneys of the involved counties and Gov. Claude Kirk.

Also, county school boards and administrative officials are to meet July 16-17 at Tampa with Miami Integration Service officials in a desegregation discussion.

That Vihlen had "much to digest on the commission."

Some contention arose over a replacement for chairman of the Insurance Advisory Committee, who resigned July 15 and for Harold Kastner whose term expires on July 20.

It was stated that several times the governor had not made appointments from the list submitted from the county commission, and that because of this any individuals were reluctant to say they would be amendable to accept appointments.

Drummond took exception to this remark with the statement that Gov. Kirk had followed the board's recommendation in appointment of M. L. Raborn, a Democrat and George Harden, Republican. However, the board had no recommendations for the port authority, and placed the matter on the agenda for action on July 14.

The expiration of the waiver of the sovereign immunity law on July 1 relative to the county's insurance came under consideration of the board. Drummond has cited that there would be a considerable savings to taxpayers in returntable premiums, and it was decided to contact the chairman of the Insurance Advisory Committee to request recommendations on continuation and the basis of fundable premiums in the event the insurance is cancelled by the county. Drummond stated that it was possible that under the umbrella policy there would be a flat premium with no refund. It was mentioned that the county must determine the continuance of the insurance to place in the budget for the coming year.

Drummond cited that if the insurance was unnecessary the \$15,000 cost of the policy could be better utilized in the county's road program.

## Vihlen Asks Strip Study

Recently appointed County Commissioner Sid Vihlen, Jr. has taken a stand on the proposed use of Osceola Airfield as a central sanitary landfill. This morning he issued to The Herald the following statement concerning his views on the matter.

"There seems to be wide interpretation that the entire Board of County Commissioners is pushing for the use of Osceola Airfield as the county's central sanitary landfill. As a new member on the Board, I wish to state very clearly that I cannot go along with this location until expert and professional studies prove the water table and nearby St. Johns River will not be damaged by pollution and that land use studies indicate this to be the logical area for a central landfill, considering surrounding land development potentials and uses.

"I completely agree with Seminole County Planning and Zoning Board member Robert Dabon, when he indicated that there has not been sufficient information from the county and state relative to test borings and water table and must act to expand its present area dump system and replace nearly \$100,000 in worn-out equipment or move into this new concept of a central landfill with picking land stations. Time is quickly running out.

"I do wish to go on record as firmly backing the central landfill concept with pick-up stations strategically located in the county. This move will save taxpayers tens of thousands of dollars and will rid the area dump concept, which is outdated and far less sanitary than area pick-up stations with one central landfill.

"The county is backed against a wall at present and must act to expand its present area dump system and replace nearly \$100,000 in worn-out equipment or move into this new concept of a central landfill with picking land stations. Time is quickly running out.

## Commission Scrutinizes Bear Lake Fire Budget

A \$55,456 budget submitted to the Seminole County Commission for funding in 1971 for the Forest City Bear Lake Fire District was scrutinized in today's budget hearings.

The district, which covers 25 square miles, is endeavoring to include \$10,000 in the budget for "plant funds" — site acquisition for an auxiliary plant. Also included is a \$20,000 item that would include salaries for three full-time firemen.

William Itles, fire commission chairman, is endeavoring to see that he "feels the community will support a good fire department," and noted the expense incurred was the relatively young fire department existing for a period of growth.

"We are just building our equipment," he said.

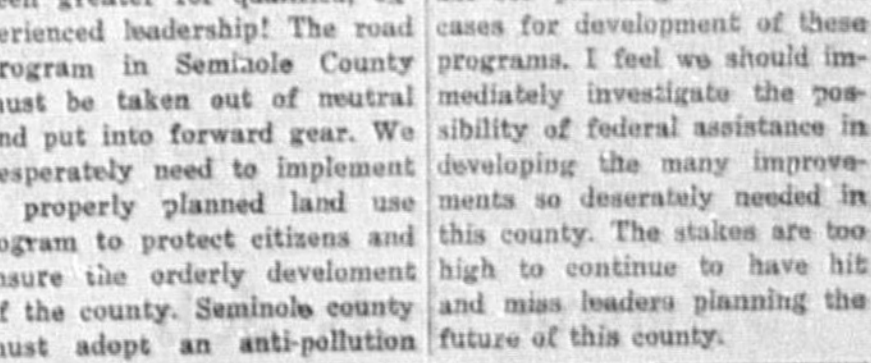
When citing the need for the three full-time firemen Ted Nunzio, the chairman of the fire district noted that it was important for the public to see that the fire department is open at all times, despite the fact that the department will answer calls at any time.

Chairman of the County Commission, John Almsnaker, quipped dryly in return: "They'll see it when they get the tax bill!"

In justification of the second site Nunzio noted that some portions of the district are too distant from the station for quick response to calls. He noted the uneven growth pattern of the area, precluding the alternate of merely providing the present station. A move in either direction will add even more distance to one of the growing areas.

Nunzio also mentioned the heavy traffic in Forest City which hampers the prompt arrival of the fire trucks to their destinations.

Other large items in the budget included \$12,000 for trucks, which the commissioners seemed to agree upon as necessary.

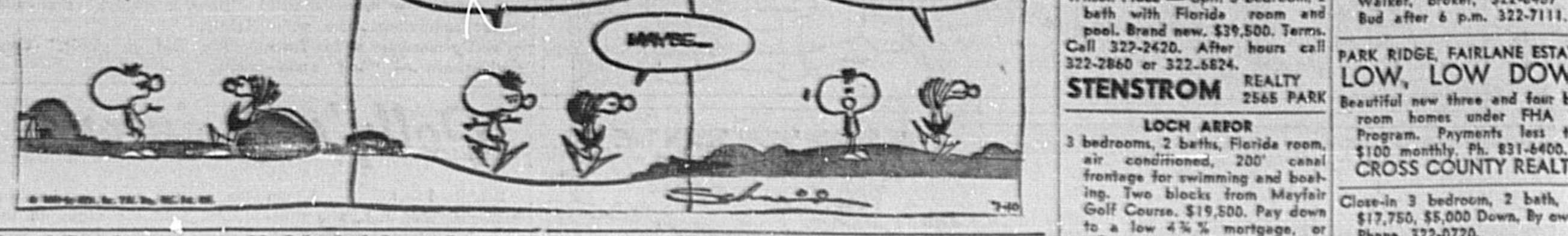

# Seminole Schools Told: Integrate... And Now!

 The United States of America is moving swiftly against the Seminole County schools to strip away all vestiges of freedom of choice school placement plans and enforce a strict hard-line plan utilizing zoning and pairing of schools. He continued that no state or county reports are presently available upon the site. (County Sanitarian Val Robins had earlier stated that although test borings had been made at the site that he was not aware of the results, and that while preliminary approval had been granted by the site, no final approval had been given.) In opposition, A. H. Peterson, Sr. told the board that he had been advised that engineers considered that the site would encompass months of study and would have to be in operation 2-4 years before a determination could accurately be made in regard to the pollution aspect.

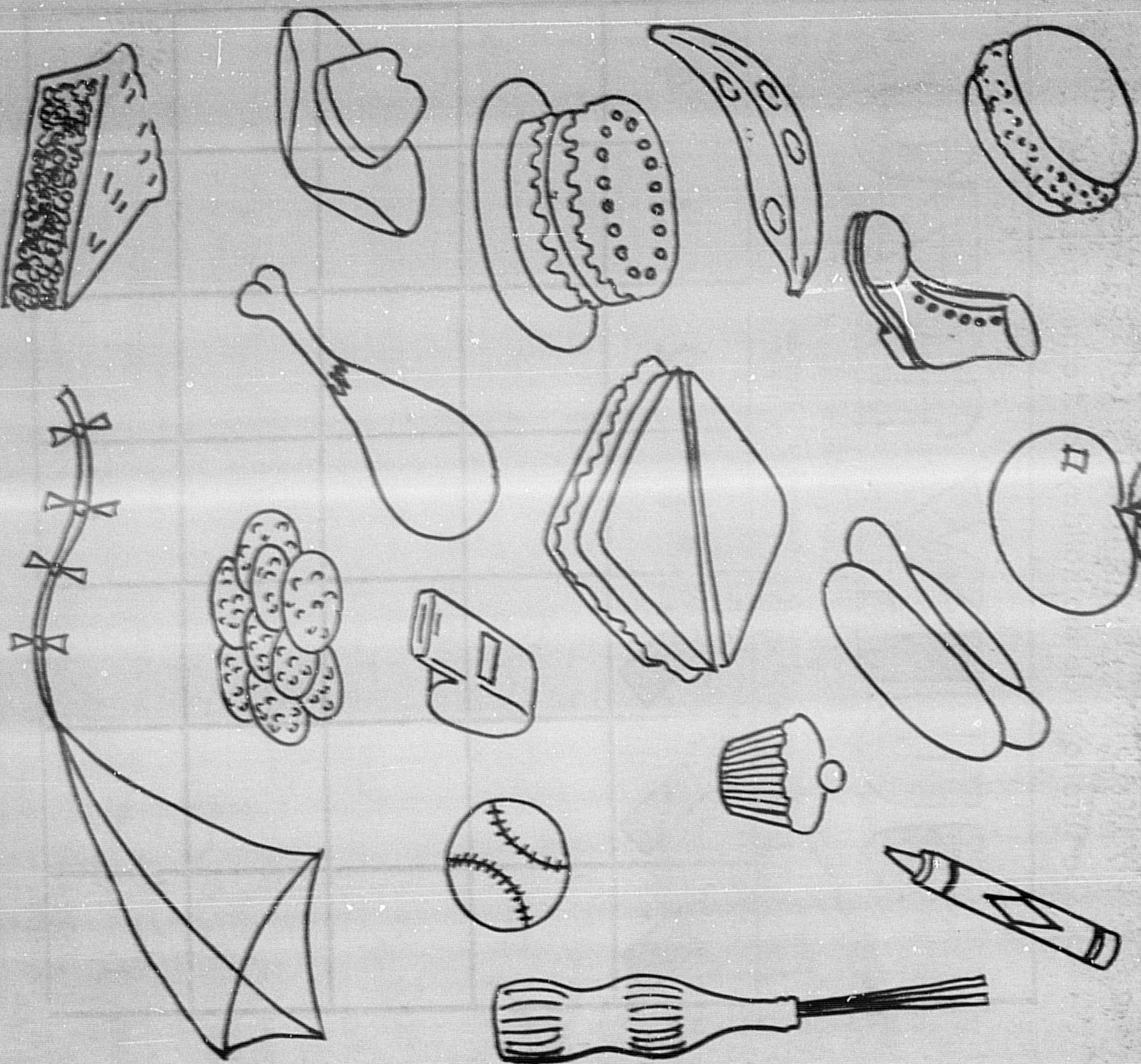
