I suspect we often cheat our youth, both financially and spiritually. No matter what the advertisements say, no amount of mouthwash will change a jerk into Mr. Clean. When we mis-pse drugs or alcohol we are witnessing to our youth that our own rules are fakery and emmy. We badly mislead them if we ever let this new generation think they can survive in the world without knowledge, mature reason, and self-discipline. No matter what some may say, one has to be able to keep his mind and body under control if he is to live successfully, and he cannot ever allow himself to be trapped into a attuation when violence is the only way out.

For all of this, our young people will survive. Time itself will see that they are exposed to the good things as well as the bad things of living to the point where they will be as sophisticsted, as mature, and maybe even as cynical as all

And this last is a shame. Jesus commented once that the way to be admitted to the Kingdom of God was by the trusting and faithful way of accepting Truth which is charactertistic of youth. Youth knows no impossibility. Youth recognizes beauty and truth in stark ciarity. It is a shame that we elders could not arrange it somehow so we all could actually arrive at middle age without losing the sense of wonder of youth, without having the sense of beauty dulled by the ugliness about us, without compromising truth in order to make a


