Iwo Casualties Now Reported At 12,864 As Futile Banzai Attacks Take Toll

Hopeless counter - attacks and Filipino Guerrillas added new thousands to the Japanese dead on Iwo Island and the Philippines as the increasing tempto of the American air onslaught forced Japan to close its primary schools on Formosa and organize Tokyo students into fire brigades.

Ten Superfortresses raided Tokyo on the heels of the big raid Sunday. Reorganized resistance stiffened on Iwo but the Japanese dead mounted to 12.864. Thousands of other Japanese were killed by Philipine guerrillas on northeastern Luzon.

General MacArthur reported the young Yanks have seized two more Philippine islands-Ticao. and Burina-off the southern tip of Luzon. Severe Japanese losses also were reported from Burma as the British closed in on Mrn-dalay. 
