





Sixteen Fires Are Burning Out Of Control

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS Sixteen fires burned out of control on 93,000 acres of land today in the West's "explosive" range and forest fire

Losses have been estimated at

several million dollars. Information officer Dick Klade of the Interagency Fire Center in Boise, Idaho, said the crisis was shifting to Northern California and firefighters were being flown south from the upper

tier of Pacific Northwest states. Klade said 156,735 acres have been blackened by the fires. Affected land included major big game reserves in Montana and northern Idaho, timber in Oregon and Northern California and range lands in Oregon and Montana.

The fire center gave this breakdown by states of major fires out of control,

the acreage they affect and total acreage burned:

-California: four fires out of control on 26,000 acres with 42,-950 acres

-Nevada: one on 3,000 acres; 3,150

-Montana: eight on 57,000 acres 59,350 burned.

-Idaho: two on 5,000 acres: 32,285

-Oregon: one on 2,200 acres: 17,650 —Washington: none; 1,200 burned.

-Wyoming: none; 150 burned. John Russell, a fire center spokesman, said no deaths have been reported among firefighters. However, a U.S. Forestry Service spokesman said one man was killed in an auto accident when he fell asleep at the wheel after working long hours ferrying firefighters.

Officials said forests in southeastern Washington, northeastern Oregon and parts of northern Idaho were extremely vulnerable because of dead trees due to a tussock moth infestation.

And the center said lightning storms in southern Idaho, northern Utah and western Montana are starting new

Although the Oregon fire situation eased Sunday, control of a 8,000-acre fire near LaGrande was not expected until Tuesday. The fire destroyed nine buildings Thursday near the eastern Oregon town of 10,000.

Firefighters in Oregon areas have been hampered by yellowjackets and wasps angered at being driven from their nests by the fires.

Blot On America's Conscience

MIA Status Must Be Established Clearly

To thousands of American families the heart of the Vietnam cease-fire agreement, signed in Paris last January, was Article 8. It provided for the return of American prisoners of war and an accoutning of the men missing in action. Today, six months later, the POWs are home, but the fate of 1,300 of our men, missing in the jungles of Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia, is unknown.

The explanation is far easier to find than to accept. Most of the men were declared missing after plane crashes, 95 per cent of which were indisputed or Communist-held territory. North Vietnamese have consistently blocked all efforts of MIA investigating teams to operate despite the provisions of Article 8 of the cease-fire document. The first investigation of a crash did not take place until three months after the Paris agreement. Since then only six investigations have been conducted, although there were 1,100 known U.S. plane crashes in Vietnam during the

This is a clear violation of the Paris agreement which pledged all parties to cooperation in obtaining information about U.S. men missing in action. North Vietnam and the United States of America reaffirmed the pledge in a supplementary ceasefire agreement last

Given our experience with Communists in other parts of the world, the behavior of the North Vietnamese should have come as no surprise, particularly since North Vietnam also resisted the fulfillment of its January pledge to release American prisoners of war and to provide lists of their names. We knew from Berlin, Cuba and other confrontations with Communists, including Vietnam itself, that American military muscle, backed by the indignation of the American people, is the only language that they understand. It was this language, we must recall, that forced the North

U.S. Is Withdrawing From Asia

WASHINGTON-A further drawdown of American military power from Asia will be an inevitable consequence of the congressionally imposed ban on the bombing of Communist forces in Cambodia

The air war in support of the pro-U.S. regime in Phnom Penh, headed by Premier Lon Nol, had been mounted by giant B-52s and tactical jet fighter-bombers based in nearby Thailand. Of the approximately 45,000 U.S. military personnel in that country, 37,000 are in the Air Force. Now, according to Pentagon sources, discussions bet-

ween U.S. and Thai officials are under way concerning the future (smaller) American force to be maintained in Also being discussed is the matter of base maintenance so that, when those designated American air squadrons

Nixon's Watergate Still no response on Gray's warning

One way to view President Nixon's latest comments about Watergate is to accept at face value his assertions that he had no prior knowledge of the matter, took no part in and knew nothing of the cover-up, and neither authorized nor encouraged any illegal 'campaign tactics.'

Yet to take in the President's message in this fashion, the listening American citizen must necessarily brush aside some very serious questions which Mr. Nixon still leaves

The most critical of these surrounds his conversation on July 6, 1972 - just 19 days after the Watergate break-in with L. Patrick Gray, then acting director of the FBI. The President has told us anew that on that date he instructed Gray "to press forward vigorously with his own investigation" into Watergate. This and his subsequent appointment of Gray to be full FBI director suggests strong

But Gray has testified under oath before the Ervin Senate Watergate committee that on the aforementioned July 6 he warned Mr. Nixon that certain White House aides were rving to "mortally wound" the President by interfering with both the FRI and the chief overseas security agency, the

Gray said the President made no specific response to his

warning then. Nor has he done so in any public utterance since. In his newest speech and an accompanying 2,000-word brief, there is no reference to Gray's warning. Now, the picture the President freshly paints of himself is of a man continuously concerned not only in a "thorough and aggressive investigation" of the Watergate break-in, but of

he prospect that anyone in either his re-election committee or his White House entourage was involved. He says he was repeatedly reassured by all those he asked that "no persons" other than the seven men indicted in the

Watergate break-in were involved. Most specifically and most sweeping in its effect, the President says that on Sept. 12, 1972, Attorney General Richard Kleindienst told him, the full Cabinet, senior White louse staff members and certain legislative leaders that no 'higher-ups" in the White House or the campaign committee

Mr. Nixon says also that he had his personal counsel, John Dean, monitoring FBI and Justice Department inquiries, and that on Sept. 15 Dean told him there was "no reason" to believe that any others but the indicted seven were guilty of Watergate involvement

The President says flatly he trusted the agencies conducting the investigation and believed the reports he was getting - and so did not believe contrary newspaper accounts.

Nevertheless, without any imputation of guilt directed at Mr. Nixon himself, the listening citizen may be legitimately puzzled today - after numerous presidential statements as to why he never asked L. Patrick Gray who he had in mind when, on July 6, 1972, he said White House aides were attempting to hurt him mortally



Nevertheless, any number of questions or allegations or suspicions remain. Although in a companion written statement Mr. Nixon noted, for example, the testimony of former acting FBI Director L. Patrick Gray that he warned the President as early as the summer of 1972 that some of his aides were attempting to "mortally wound" him, it still is not clear how such a massive undertaking as the Watergate break-in and cover-up, involving so many people and such large sums of money, could have been carried out simply by overzealous lower-echelon White House employes and without the President having a glimmering of what was

"This season, things promise to get worse before they get better," Lake Brantley Head Football Coach Bill Duty said, looking at the thinning ranks of a football team in only its second year of existance.

"It's B-A-D," he spelled out, reporting that almost half of his returning letterman from last year have not turned up at the pre-season practices, and the coach doesn't know where they are.

"They weren't interested anymore," Duty said when asked about possible reasons for the apparent massdefection of his expected returning gridders. "They were more interested in girls, motorcycles and cars."

Lake Brantley, a second-year school, played last season with only freshmen and sophomores, and this year will add a junior class, but problems still seem insurmountable for the athletic department's coaching

The grid team, which went 4-5 last season and had a few moments when a "good break" might have spelled a winning inaugural campaign, is still in the throes of

The newly-created school near Forest City is in the middle of the county's fastest-growing area - and that's almost dead-center of the nation's fastest growing area but the numbers mean little to Duty.

"Only 19 of our 36 lettermen reported for training," and while Duty called a lot of it, "quitting," in such an area summer is the time when most families either move





Some thought it an undisguised bribe by baseball. In 1921, the American Bar Association passed a resolution of "unqualified condemnation" of Landis, saying his action was 'derogatory to the dignity of the bench.

Whatever Landis did in those days, though, was justified in the interests of regaining integrity for "the national game."

Such unchallenged and arbitrary rule has been sought by commissioners in other sports. And they often have used it - when it did not pertain to THEIR employers, the owners. Even Judge Landis lauded instead of castigated Charles Comiskey, owner of the Black-White Sox, when he admitted to as much "guilty knowledge" of the World Series fix as some of the players Landis blackballed for life.)

One of the most notorious recent cases of arbitrary decision-making by a commissioner was in the case of Connie Hawkins, the basketball player who for years was barred from the National Basketball Association for a crime he denied doing and for which he was never convicted. Commissioner Walter Kennedy admitted that he took only hearsay evidence and never looked into the case. Hawkins, a poor, semi-literate black, was finally allowed to play in the NBA when his case against the league was settled out of court.

The double standard is evident here. When the owners of the Kansas City-Omaha Royals of the NBA were convicted in 1972 by a federal court for conspiracy to conceal ownership in a Las Vegas gambling casino, Walter Kennedy said he'd wait to take an action until after the decision of the Appeals Court. This may have been the correct legal move but it was hardly consistent with his early Hawkins decision.




