## Be a good neighbor

The Sanford Planning and Zoning Commission has the opportunity to make Sanford a better place Thursday night when it considers a proposal for the Groves At Sanford, a 336-unit apartment complex on Airport Boulevard. No one denies that the property owners have the right, as well as the proper zoning, to pursue their project
But rights come with responsibilities, and the Groves' developers have a duty to minimize the effects of their profect on homeowners in the Sanora subdivision. To date, they don't appear to be interested in being good neighbors. The developers and their representatives continue to insist on providing a minimal buffer zone for three-story apartments adjacent to a quite neighborhood of single-family homes.
The Planning and Zoning Commission should require the developers to increase the buffer zone to 50 feet (they want 15) and put the building setback at 100 feet. Furthermore P\&Z members should deny any three-story apartment buildings next to single-family homes. Three stories is to high, too intrusive for Krider Road residents, many who have Ulved in the neighborhood for more than a decade.
It's a reasonable compromise. In preliminary site plans, there are three buildings adjacent to single-family homes. If those are reduced to two-story buildings, it still leaves the development with about 300 units.
Of course, commissioners should prepare themselves for the inevitable battle cry of the developer. "We need mor units to make the numbers workl" Tough! If the project won't work by following the rules and being a good neigh or, the developers should find a different way to make money. Commissioners are under no obigation to grant variances solely because of financial concerns. They them selves have a duty to base their decisions on what is best for the entire community. The
A solution that both Sanora residents and the developer ould live with is achievable. Residents are open to discuscons, but so far the development team has not scheduled a meeting, though they're scrambling to put together a lastminuite dog and poriy show before Thurnday's PaZ meel-
Unless there is a change of heart by the property owhterf, the Planning and Zoning Commission must force the Groves at Sanford to be the good neighbors they don't want to be.

Members of this commission and other boands are appointed to their mole as non-compensaled volunters. They receive no training on what their duttes and responsibilities are and they are not held accountable to anyone for their decisions. They act on recommendations of paid city staff members who they traditionally hold in trust as having researched the matter, both addition the Florida Sunahine Law, although valid, restricts their ability to research or discuss a problem at hand until it is before them

The matter befone them on Jan. 17 was one of the most blatant examples of noncomplichalrman Milke Skas, who voted against this proposal, everyone else voted for the approval People who sit on these commisslons or bourds must realize they can vote thetr own convictions. They can vote against dty ataff recomunendations. They can vehethey choose. As a minin ike Planning and Zvery member of a board least eight hours of trainging before hearing an lssue. This training should include, among other factors, their duties and responsibilitides (including the Sunshine Law), some tectuical orientation to the process they are deciding on and examples of the effects of sworn in before a public gathering, such as a meeting of the Clty Commisston, to impress upon everyone the significance of their appointment. Conthered fom Prys 7C n't always been an option for motorists. Almost as old as the car ibself, the first license plates contained only numbere and were made with a porcelain firish. By the 19203, many states began to issue embossed metal plates made of tin steel or aluminum with numbers stamped tnto them, which is similar to today's production method.

In the 1980s, Florida began issuing specialty and personal ized license plates - an option to the standard plate. As long as $a$ motorist is willing to pay an additional fee, the puesible combinations of plate design and lettering are infintte.
Specialty plates range from the manatee, the most popular to the numerous universities and colleges in Plorida. There
are 51 different types of piatere not including the plate with the orange.

The list of letter and number combinations are endlese. As long as the meseage is not obwent or vulgar, under eight letters and not liready taken.
it's avaliable.
The cost of specialty plates, which are fund-ralsers for varous organizations, vary
deprending on the particular cause. Moot are around $\$ 20 \mathrm{in}$ addition to the regular registretion tax. Personalized plates cost an additional $\$ 28$ when it is ordered and $\$ 12$ extra for ench year it is beued.
Appilicitions for personalLzed license plates and a list of specialty plates can be obtained at the Seminole County Tax Collector's Óffice, located in
the Seminole County Services Building, 1101 E Ist Street, in Sanford.

As for why people pay the additional costs for a personalized plate, Casa said there is a simple reason.
If it is something you want bad errough, you will pay a litthe bit more," Cara said. "It also keeps things from getting dull."

# Anise: A curious and tolerant North American plant <br> There are two North <br> is fowers. <br> Anise is hardy and has 

American anise species - yellow anise, a north central Florida mitive, and Florida anise, which ranges from coostal Florida to Louisiana. Both belong to the genus Illidum that includes a cousin from Asia, I. anisatum, from which the andse flavoring is extracted commercially.
Given its southern origin, anise is surprisingly hardy and can tolerate winter temperatures as kw as 10 degrees.

## Yellow Anlse

Yellow anise (l. parviflonum) is known by many names including lapanese, Star and Ocala anise. Yellow anise is grown for its foliage, rather than


The word parviflonum means "small flowend." The tree can grow up to 25 feet, but usually only grows 10 to 12 feet tall and 4 to 8 feet wide. The leaves are simple, keathery, about 4 inches long, with an olive-green color and with a distunct anise aroma when crushed. The dimesized, drooping, bell-shaped, yellow fowers have a bilnt anise fragrance. They emerge in June, but tend to be hidden under new foliage.

Yellow anise is one of our most adaptable plants. It tolerates shade and sun, moist and dry soils. In full sun, it is an upright, tightly growing shrub with erect leaves ranging in color
form yellow to olive green Dense shade promotes a relaxed habit with medium to dark green leaves and kwer blossoms. Yellow anise responds to shearing and training.

## Flodid Anise

Though generally a large shrub, Florida anise (L foridanum), also known as purple anise, can become a small tree. Florida anise's native range is from the panhandle to Louisiana, but it does well tn Central Florida and tolerates cold to well below freezing. The tree grows to 10 feet tall and 6 to 8 feet whde. Florida anise has showy, deep red, starshaped flowers up to 2 inches wide that appear in hate March or early April.
There are also pink and white varieties. The flowers have 20 to

30 tepals (a word used to describe a flower that have undifferentiated calyx and corol1a) and dangle in clusters from branch tips. They also produce an unusual scent that can be detected up to 15 feet away. Large, idged, disc-shaped fruits that are decorative in their own right follow the flowers.
Florda anise can be grown in shade or full sun. Water requirements will be higher in sun.

## Care and Culture

In the wild, anlse tends to grow better in humus-rich, neutral to slighty acid soil. Theyl] also grow in clay soik. Yellow anise is somewhat more adaptable than Florida anise but if provided with adequate organk material and water to establish both will do well in sandy soik.
evolved into a virtually pest-free plant rarely sustaining insect damage, may present mite and scale problems, but none of these problems is considered serious. It is virtually discase free, but drought-streseed plants may develop leaf spots. Anise can be propagated by seeds, branch tip cultings, and root sprouts. Plant any time in central Florida. Add organic mulch to the planting hole and as a top dressing around the plant Apply 6-12-12 or 10-10-10 fertilizer in spring and early fall
