drugs and other antiblotics used to treat dalry cows. The levels of contamination were very
low - nowhere near enough to pose an low - nowhere near enough to pose an
urgent danger to publle health - but the Frexd and Drug Administration immedlately
launched lis own test survey.
At the time, the FDA's forthright response parnic among consumers. And it certainly marked a big improvement over what many
crittes have condemned as past attempts by crltics have condemned as past attempts by
the agency's admintstrators to lgnore corvcerns over sulfa contamination that have
been ralsed by milk producers as well as consumer groups.
By February, the FDA investigators were
l:ack with the results. testfylng to Congress that their sampling in 14 clltes nationwlde had inding sulfa drugs...or other potentially, dangerous drugs." But now, under prodding from a government operation subcommittee in the House of Representatives. the FDA has issued a new press release in which it
modifies those findings a wee bit: Instead of finding no residues. the agency now concedes
that it found antibiotics in 83 percent of the that it found
milk tested.
FDA officials explain the discrepancy by saying that they didn't find any of thuse
containinants at levels above what the federal overnment considers dangerous for human
 Nuder. Hor the wall street ohornal, nor any or
the other interest groups who have been urging stricter controls on these contami-
hants for years. have ever suggested that people are likely to die or get slek from
drink milk.
But there is a problem that many medical
screntists auree the tUA nevis is addeces setentists agree the FDA needs io address.
Repeated exposure to low levels of these amilitotics may builld up an Immunity among
milk drinkers that would make them harder milk drinkers that would make them harder To treat in case they later came down with a
serinems infection from some other cause. At
least one of the sulfa dugs involved has been
idenulfe inderntfled as a potential carcinogen. And what
inamy in the dairy Industry feel is most mimportanm is that the only way that that particular drug could be getting lmo the mllk
supply is through misuse by some dailry ownersior thetrvetertnarians.
The thdustry wants to crack down on those
baid actors. The FDA by undercuting ts own crecllisility in this way. Isn't helping.
