WASHINGTON, Nov. 29. —(AP) — Some congressional leaders expressed the opinion today that the administration may not ask for new taxes next session even if the Supreme Court declares the AAA unconstitutional. The administration indicated some time ago that new taxes would be sought if the AAA were declared unconstitutional, and that treasury estimates will be prepared to suggest ways for raising the \$500,000,000 estimated needed to pay farmers under existing production control contracts.
