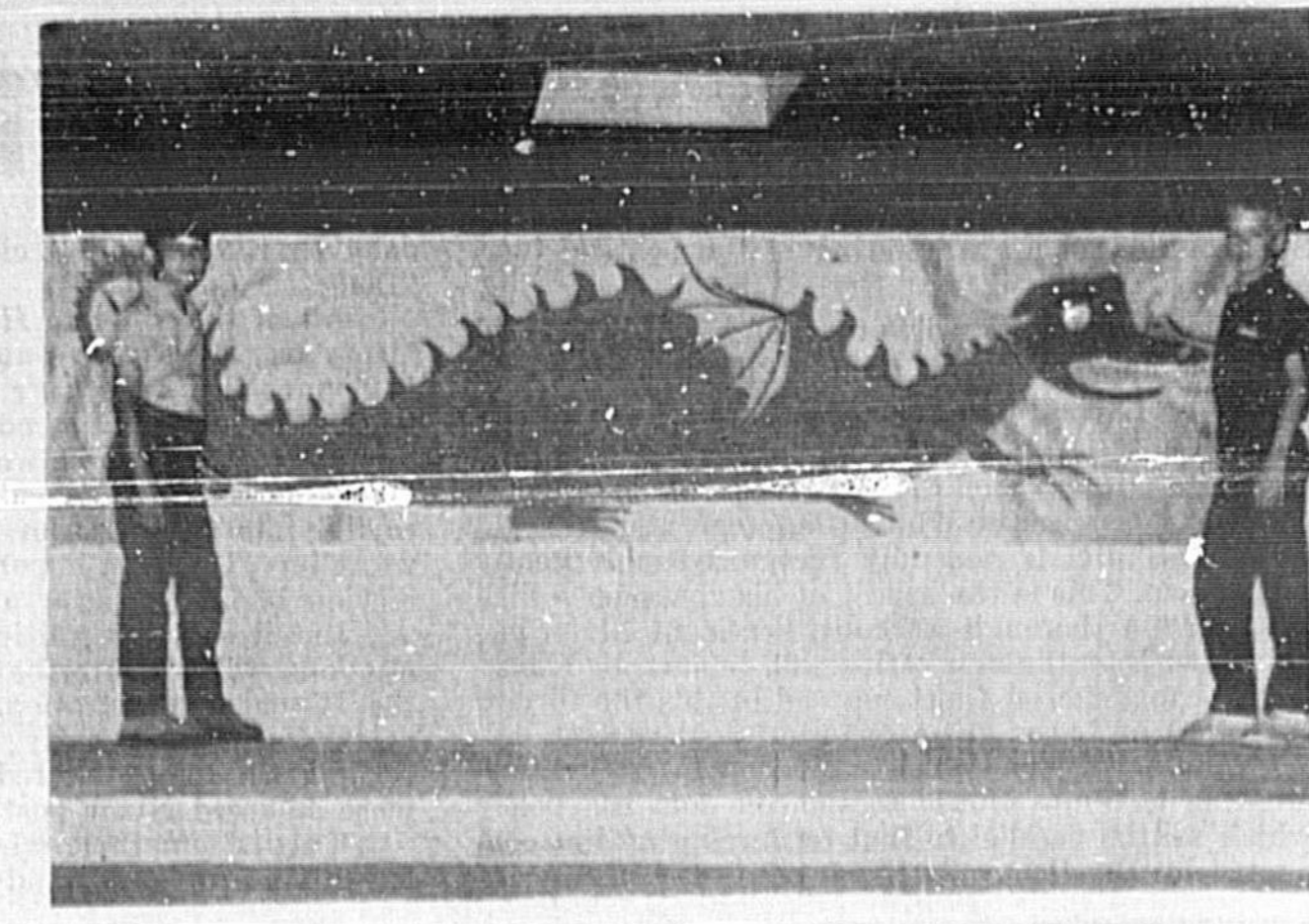

Wall Street Chatter

NEW YORK (UPI) — "Now that blue Mondays are back again," in retrospect it can be seen that the "violent" Memorial Day rally "was too deceptive," the Dines Letter believes. The letter suggests that if the April-May decline is viewed as "a desirable break" below the 1966 lows, then the rally was simply a break-out pushback which had little chance of getting much above 700. It says the market now is testing the May 28 bottom and if the bottom is penetrated, Wall Street will see "a continuation of the killer wave of selling."

International Statistical Bureau's long-range predictions for the second half of the year include "a moderate upturn" in the economy, disposable income showing "an increase greater than most important indicators" the cost of money becoming "slightly easier," and stocks and bonds making "a better showing" than they have made so far this year.

Hickel Differs With Nixon-Again

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of the Interior Walter J. Hickel still holds environmental problems and conservation of natural resources can be controlled by a single federal agency.

A presidential panel has recommended creating an independent "Environmental Protection Administration" and a new "Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration" in the Commerce Department. Some sources say Nixon has declined to go ahead with that plan.

Hickel indicated in an interview, however, the decision may still be open. "They're not creating a new agency under Commerce that I think is best," Hickel said. "These are just proposals. We have discussed for a long time the idea of creating an enforcement agency, which is continued, and that's basically what we're talking about in this one agency," referring to the proposed Environmental Protection Administration.

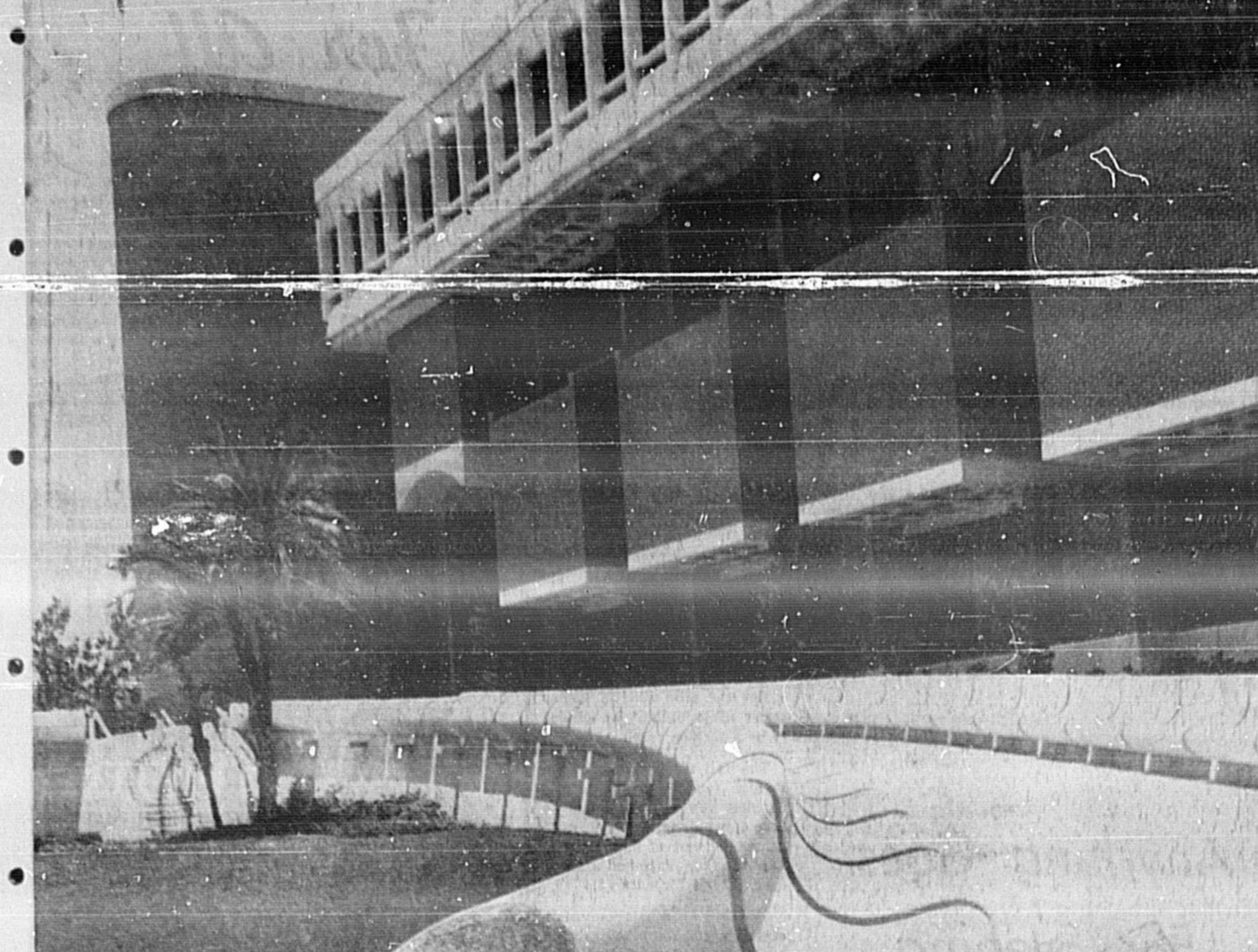

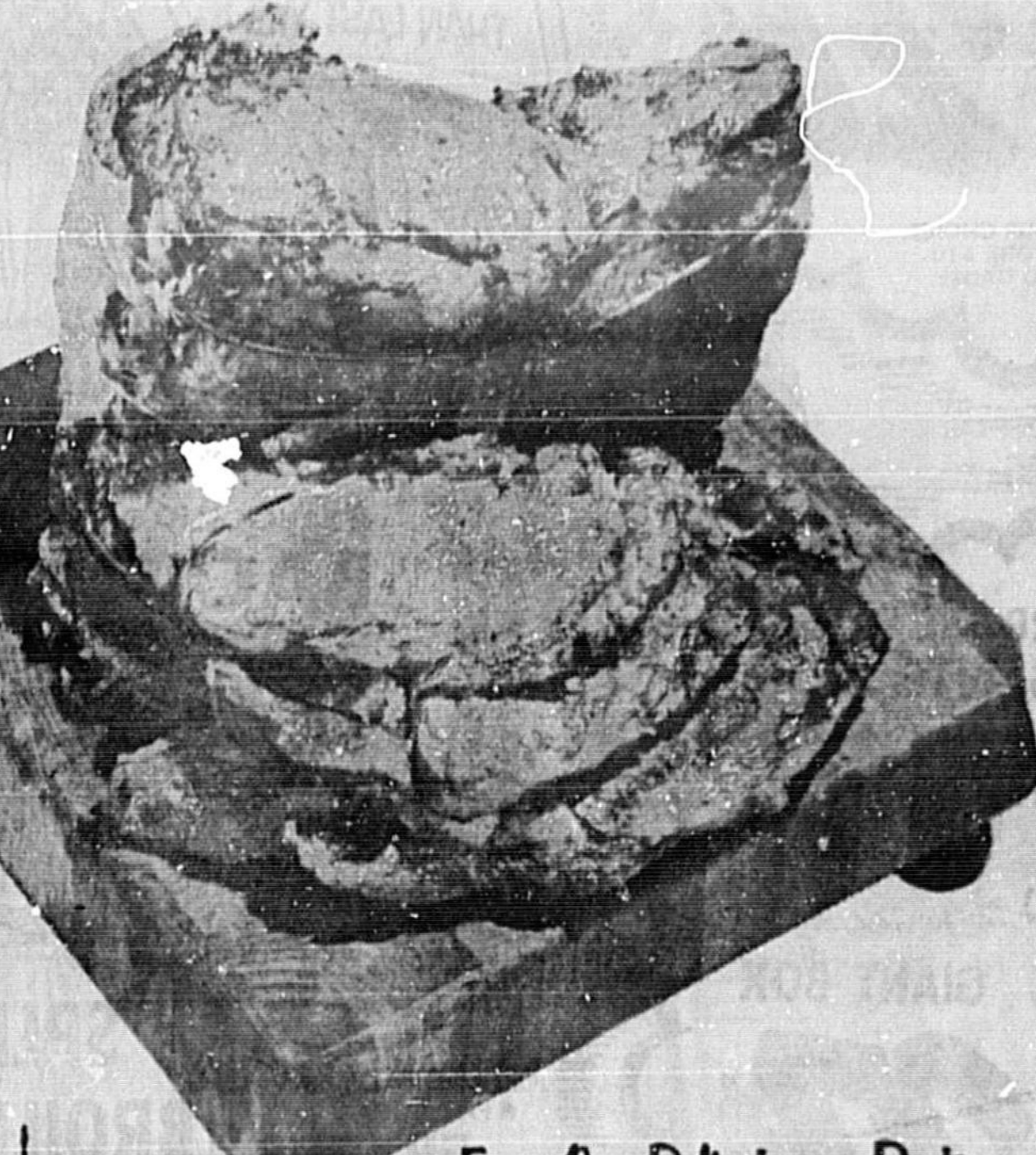

THE FAMILY LAWYER

Suppose that a man walks into the police station one day and announces that he has committed a murder. He says he hid the body in the woods, but can't remember where. If no corroborating evidence can be found, may the man nevertheless be sent to jail for homicide?

No, because the case against him lacks a "corpus delicti." And without that, generally speaking, there can be no conviction for a crime. A confession might be either erroneous or involuntary, or might even be induced by some psychological motive other than a desire to tell the truth.

The phrase "corpus delicti" is often mistakenly thought to mean a dead body, perhaps because "corpus" sounds like "corpse." Actually, it just means "the body of the crime"—the physical evidence that a crime has been committed.

It may indeed be a body, but it may also be a burned-down house, or an altered check, or a black eye. Before punishing someone, the law wants to be reasonably sure that a crime really did occur.

It is true that in homicide cases, the most common corpus delicti is the victim's body. However, a murder conviction is possible even if no body is ever found. Take this case:

On the second night of an ocean voyage, a member of the crew vanished from the ship. Another seaman charged later with murder, defended himself on the ground that the missing man's body was never found—hence, there was no corpus delicti.

However, the prosecutor countered with the following points:

- 1) that the defendant had been alone on the deck with the missing man just before he disappeared;
- 2) that the deck bore fresh bloodstains;
- 3) that a bloodstained knife had been found in the defendant's possession; and
- 4) that the missing man should be presumed dead, because there had been no other vessel nearby that could possibly have picked him up.

The court thereupon ruled that, even with no body, there was still a corpus delicti—that is, a body of evidence indicating that the "dastardly deed" had been done. Result: the defendant was found guilty of murder.

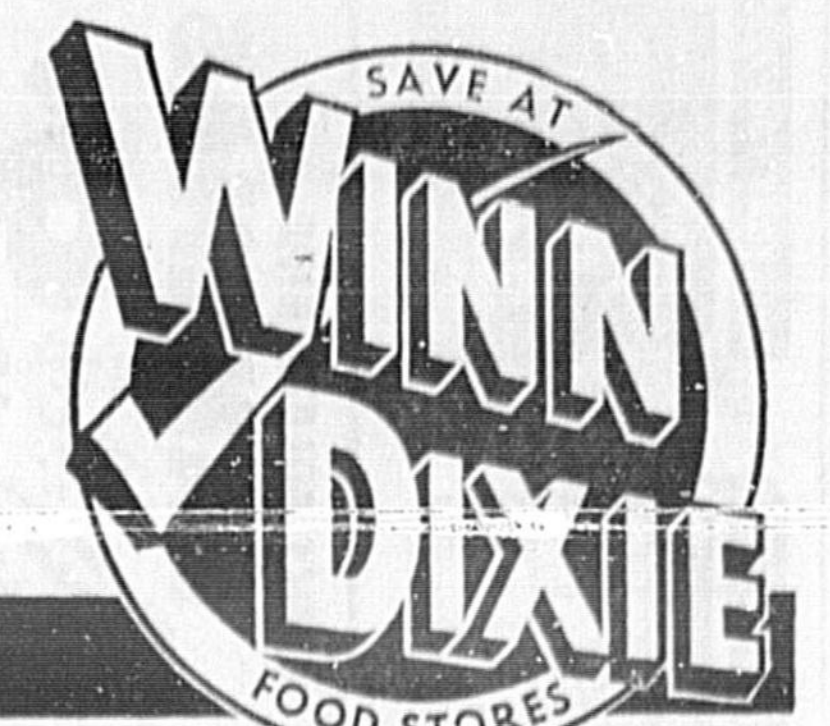

Calorie Counters Recipes

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Fresh-roasted turkey, baked onions swimming in white sauce, Date pudding with mocha topping.

Sound a bell — calorie counters will follow an unconventional diet?

Not at all. Recipes for such delights have been gathered into a booklet circulated by the Los Angeles County Heart Association.

Among the major contributors were Spryette Alan and Marilyn Bergman, who won the 1968 Academy Award for best song with their "The Windmills of Your Mind."

"Mainly we concentrated on cutting down on heavy cream—whipping cream," Mrs. Bergman said. "We used a low-fat substituting yogurt for our cream. We also reduced the quantity of eggs."

"I personally went on a campaign to find desserts that looked rich and inviting, yet were low in cholesterol."

The recipes may be used for entertaining, as the Bergmans have done, or for family meals. Take the baked onions and white sauce for example:

BAKED ONIONS
 Cook 1 pound unpeeled onions in boiling water for 15 minutes. Drain and cool slightly. Combine with 1 cup white wine, bake in 350-degree oven till tender. Ten minutes before end of cooking sprinkle onions with bread crumbs or a few toasted slivered almonds on the onions.

WHITE SAUCE
 1/4 small onion, finely chopped; 2 lbs. flour; 2 lbs. non-fat dried milk; 1 1/2 cups non-fat milk (liquid); salt, white pepper and nutmeg.

Beat margarine in a saucepan; saute onion until limp and clear. Stir in flour and cook slowly until golden. Combine dried and skim milk; gradually add to saucepan, stirring constantly until sauce is smooth and the season with salt, white pepper and nutmeg to taste. Cook slowly for 10 minutes to be sure flour is cooked.

Or you might want to try the date pudding and mocha topping:

DATE PUDDING
 1 cup sugar; 1 1/2 lbs. orange juice; 3 lbs. flour; 1 tsp. double action baking powder; 2 lbs. oatmeal; 1 cup chopped dates; 4 egg whites; 1/2 cup walnuts; 1/2 tsp. salt.

Combine all ingredients. Lastly, fold in well beaten egg whites into a lightly oiled 9-inch spring form. Bake in moderate oven (325 degrees) 45-50 minutes. Serve cold with mocha topping. Serves 6.

MOCHA TOPPING
 1 lbs. unflavored gelatin (1 envelope); 2 lbs. walnuts; 1/2 cup non-fat dried milk; 1/2 cup skim milk; 1/4 tsp. vanilla; 2 tsp. sugar; 1/4 tsp. lemon juice; 1 tsp. instant coffee.

Soften gelatin in water. Mix dried and skimmed milk in top of double boiler; heat until milk is scalded. Add softened gelatin and stir until dissolved. Add vanilla, sugar, lemon juice and instant coffee. When sugar is dissolved, remove from heat and cool until syrupy. Beat mixture to consistency of whipped cream; chill. Prepare a short time before serving; it will lose volume on standing too long.

The bird, of course, is roasted on a rack with all visible fat trimmed off, and the dressing is cooked separately in a casserole so that it doesn't absorb the bird's fat as it cooks off.

Heart Association dietitians haven't tried to estimate specific calorie-cholesterol benefits of each recipe. Says one: "You would need specific other recipes for comparison. But what these recipes do is reduce total fat. When you do that, you reduce calories, cholesterol and saturated fat. And these recipes add polyunsaturates, which help reduce blood cholesterol."

Partially it was a heart campaign television show hosted by screen actress Ruth Warwick and partially an awareness of events in their daily lives that drew the Bergmans into the fight against heart disease.

"The American Heart Association has been pointing away for years," Mrs. Bergman said, "and I think we're just beginning to listen. Suddenly you realize it's not your grandmother or 'old people' who are victims of heart disease, but contemporaries of yours."

Altamonte's City Council Approves Sewer Charges

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS — City Council approved upon first reading a resolution which establishes sewer connection charges in the municipality.

The resolution stipulates that single family residences which do not have existing sewer collection lines available to their property shall pay a connection charge of \$125. The same category having existing sewer lines will be charged \$25. Multiple family dwellings will be charged \$125 for each unit apartment. This ordinance establishes a uniform schedule for the monthly city water bill. Rates were established for single family residences at 75 per cent of the monthly water bill, with a maximum of \$4.50. Multiple family, commercial and industrial establishments will be charged 100 per cent of the monthly city water bill, with no maximum.

Commissioners Appeared Incongruous

Seminole County Commissioners appeared incongruous in rezoning action taken upon two separate parcels of land on SR 46. The request was for rezoning from A-1 to C-2.

On the first parcel R. Schwarm told the commission that he wished the change in order to sell the property to Robert Kennedy who plans to erect a building in which farm equipment will be sold and serviced. Schwarm said that the change was recommended by the Planning and Zoning Board, and that there was no opposition from adjacent property owners.

Chamber And SIC Pledge Cooperation

Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce's "Blue Ribbon" industrial committee and the Sanford Industrial Commission were apparently arrived at this morning following a special meeting by Chamber President George Touhy, who emphasized that he felt both the SIC and the "Blue Ribbon" board were both to improve the industrial status of Sanford and vicinity.
