## Industrial Park Near Sanford

## County Delays Vote On SEEDCO Project

Seminole County commissioners Tuesday delayed until Nov. 6 any decision on whether or not to rezone 55 acres of land west of Sanford in order to allow the Seminole Employment Economic Development Corporation (SEEDCO) to develop an industrial The decision to delay came after commissioners were informed

by letter that architectural drawings and soil test results which were to be presented by SEEDCO representatives will not be ready for at least two weeks. The proposed project, which includes a plastics plant and other

businesses said to have the potential of creating 900 new jobs, has come under heavy criticism from neighborhood residents and property owners. Eighteen persons appeared at the courthouse Tuesday to offer their objections to the proposal.

"The track record of SEEDCO is so lousy and rotten I can't see why anyone would want them to undertake a project in their city M&R Manufacturing. or county. They shouldn't have a license to rob the taxpayers," said objector Vance Taylor.

While Taylor's comments were greeted with applause from the other protesting citizens, most of the objections raised dealt with drainage and traffic problems that may arise if the project is completed at its proposed site bordered by Jewett Lane on the north and Bevier Road on the east.

A petition bearing 13 signatures of nearby residents was presented to the commissioners by Brenda Ellsworth. The petition stated objection to the project because of inadequate roads and low water pressure in the area. A similar petition

## Should Library Stay Put?

Members of eight Sanford civic organizations made it clear to County Commissioner Bill Kirchhoff this morning in no uncertain terms they want the North Seminole county branch library retained at its current site at the former post office building on First Street. Representatives of the Beautification and Civic

Improvement Committee of the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce, the Sanford Senior Citizens Club, the Sanford Business Association, the Junior Womans Club and Senior Women's Club, Kiwanis and Rotary, SISTERS (Sanford's Interested Sarahs To Encourage Rejuvenation) toured the facility and offered suggestions to the commissioner for expanding it. Among the suggestions was that a cooperative

arrangement be initiated with the Sanford city government to use the city-owned lot west of the building for expansion purposes under a lease agreement. City Commissioner Eddie Keith, speaking on behalf of the commission, said that board would "make any

agreement to keep the library where it is." The county is currently leasing the library facility from the city for \$1 annually. But the lease agreement is due to expire in 1960, Kirchhoff said. The city acquired the old post office building from the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA). Under the

contract with GSA, the building must be maintained as a library until 1983 or its ownership will revert back to the federal government. Leading a guided tour of the building, Kirchhoff, an amateur historian, said the structure was built in 1917 as a post office during the "Red Scare" when people were afraid the Bolsheviks were going to take over the government. In addition, he said during those days a

considerable amount of money passed through the post

office. Kirchhoff said the building was constructed not

only to withstand enemy attack but also to withstand the

efforts of robbers.

Although the building has 5,000 square feet, Kirchhoff said, there is only 2,500 to 3,000 square feet of actual

The commissioner, whose district includes the city of Sanford, said he personally has maintained the library should remain a cohesive part of the downtown section of the city. To a question of whether county funds can be spent to update the building, Kirchhoff said the county, under state law, cannot bind the taxpayers for longer periods of time than two years. Mrs. Ruth Swinney, a downtown businesswoman,

pointed out the county could use a similar amount of money to expand the downtown library as it spends to rent library facilities in the south end. "The people in the south end of the county have their library; there is Seminole Community College library midway and this library near Bram Towers," said Jack

Horner, director of the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce. "We are interested in this facility." Kirchhoff said there is a "crying need" to have a library in the area west of Interstate 4 in South Seminole and one in the Oviedo area. He said at a future time another library will be needed in the Lake Mary area. "The argument is that if the library is moved to a more central

location in the city, it can better serve." Kirchhoff said. "Billy Kirchhoff is fighting to keep the library here," Keith said, defending the county commissioner. "If all books in circulation would come in to this library," Kirchhoff said, "there would not be enough

### Gromyko Blunt And Firm

### On Troops In Cuba

UNITED NATIONS (UPI) - U.S. officials today are gloomy, but not in despair, about the prospect of an early settlement of the confrontation with Moscow over the presence of Soviet troops in Cuba.

An unusually blunt and firm speech to the United Nations Tuesday by Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko was described as "no surprise" by American officials. But the fact Gromyko took the controversy to the public forum is regarded by these officials as a form of

Gromyko, in calling the U.S. charges of a Soviet combat brigade in Cuba "falsehoods" and "propaganda," appeared to set the stage for a general increase of tensions. Other parts of the Gromyko speech are now being analyzed to see if it signaled a return to an intensification in U.S.-Soviet tensions.

The Soviet foreign minister said the troops were training and not combat units.

### Bokassa Called Cannibal

BANGUI, Central African Republic (UPI) - Ousted Emperor Jean Bedel Bokassa dined on the flesh of the citizens he had put to death and slept on a \$13 million solid

The new president of the African nations told a news conference Tuesday Bokassa, now in exile in the Ivory Coast, was a cannibal.

President David Dacko, who is Bokassa's cousin confirmed earlier reports that three bodies, each with parts missing and supposedly eaten, have been found in refrigerators at one of the deposed dictator's villas. Another body was found nearby in a hastily dug grave.

## Man Attacked While Sleeping In Home

A Seminole County Sheriff's deputy believes Nunchaku, a karate weapon, was used by an assailant who attacked a Sanford man sleeping on a couch in his home, according to records. Robert Taylor, 19, 3416 S. Sanford Ave., near Sanford, told deputies he woke up at about 3:30 p.m. Tuesday after he heard some noise. Taylor said he looked up from the couch and saw someone looking down at him. Taylor reported that he then felt a sharp pain in the back of his head before he passed out. According to the report, Taylor woke up some time later and found he was bleeding from the back of his head. His left eye was

hurting, too. Because of the nature of the wounds, the deputy believes that the weapon was Nunchaku, a weapon composed of two sticks with a rope. Taylor was admitted Tuesday to Seminole Memorial Hospital where he was treated for a concussion, a large cut on the back of

### Green Light On Tellico Dam Defended By Carter

WASHINGTON (UPI) - President Carter says he decided to allow completion of the Tellico Dam and risk extinction of " tiny fish to help preserve a major environmental law and keep Congress' attention on more important issues.

Just before the deadline Tuesday night, Carter announced he had signed an appropriations bill containing a rider allowing completion of the dam on the Little Tennessee River - apparently ending a five-year battle that split his administration and pitted environmentalists against developers.

Environmentalists argued that in addition to destroying the habitat of the snail darter - a finger-sized fish discovered to be living only in that river - the dam would needlessly flood rich farm lands and would bury important American archeological objects beneath the artificial lake.

## Congress Evades

## Service Decision

The House of Representatives ignored compelling evidence to the contrary when it decided there was no need to require the peacetime registration of young men as part of a standby selective service system.

Instead, 259 members of the House took the easy way out by rejecting registration and urging the president to study the issue — a shopworn Washington dodge that effectively defers the whole question of mobilization requirements and related military manpower problems until 1981, long after most House members will have survived next year's election.

It is important to remember that the question before the House was not whether to scrap the allvolunteer military and reimpose the draft. Rather. the House was to decide whether to require young men to register with selective service in the absence of the draft. Peacetime registration would do no more, or less, than facilitate a rapid callup in the event of war or an extreme national emergency proclaimed by the president.

However, much the opponents of peacetime registration choose to see it as the first step in renouncing the all-volunteer military, the case won't wash. A better argument can be made that peacetime registration is essential to continuation of the all-volunteer military. In any case, a peacetime draft is a separate question and ought to remain so while the healthy national debate over it

The need for registration, however, is clear cut. Largely as a result of the absence of the draft, the nation's reserve military strength has declined drastically since 1973. And because the reserves are so badly under strength, the essential ability to provide rapid and adequate reinforcement of active duty forces in an emergency has been seriously eroded. All the more reason then for a standby selective service system capable of locating and inducting large numbers of men in a can stay the couriers where weather can't. But

Does the United States possess such a capability? Absolutely not. The all-but-moribund selective service system employs exactly 98 persons. No records have been maintained on potential draftees since 1973. In a crisis, the selective service system would have to start from scratch. Last year's mobilization exercise by the Pentagon proved that it would take three months to a year to assemble the necessary records, induct recruits, train them, and get them to the front. This despite the Pentagon's stated requirement for large numbers of replacements within 60 days of a mobilization

In short, the 1978 exercise spotlighted a critical weakness in this country's ability to resist largescale aggression, in Western Europe for example without resort to nuclear weapons

Regrettably, the House chose to ignore these compelling considerations. Even more unfortunate is President Carter's refusal to accept the proof provided by his own Defense Department. Mr. Carter has waffled on peacetime found the vacillation of the commander in chief ample justification for their own squeamishness. But none of this will change the facts. And the

facts are that this country's ability to mobilize manpower in the face of war or extreme emergency is woefully lacking.

Usually there is nothing less exciting to read than a report on educational statistics. In fact, if there were some way we could get education reports into capsule form we would have a safe and effective sleeping pill.

But such reports, however dull, can tell us

interesting things if we know how to look at them. Take a recent report called "The Condition of Education: 1979 Edition." This is the annual report of the National Center for Educational Statistics. Phi Delta Kappan magazine recently reviewed it. Consider some of its intriguing and sometimes puzzling findings: First, public confidence in the people who run he nation's education system has fallen to its owest point in six years. Only 28 percent have "a great deal of confidence" in educational leaders and 15 percent have "hardly any confidence." While the report doesn't say it, it seems clear that parents and taxpayers aren't convinced that a decade or more of federal government aid to education has helped Johnny to learn. Maybe it is only a coincidence that the decade when federal aid and regulations were increasing in education, public confidence was declining, but I think there is a connection and that the govern-

## China: The Western World Is Just Seeing A Little Bit Of It

By ALBERT E, KAFF

URUMCHI, China (UPI) - Modern buses follow the centuries-old Silk Road across China's deserts to oases where the Venetian traveler Marco Polo rested 700 years ago. Here in Sinkiang, China's far northwest frontier, shouting Kazakh horsemen play a fierce tug-of-war with sheep carcasses, and Moslem women knot carpets in ancient geometric designs.

Farmers live in mud brick houses and grow grain and fruit, watered by melting snows from the Tien Shan (Heavenly Mountains) range in underground canals designed seven Annual rainfall averages only about two

inches in the south and eight inches in the north with rapid evaporation. Herdsmen invite American and European travelers to sit with them for lunch on mud floors of their felt tents, the same conical yurts of Genghis Khan and his 13th century

China opened remote Sinkiang to foreign tourists only last year, but only a few visitors come this far.

About 1,000 travelers are expected to visit

the Sinkiang Uighur Autonomous Region this year, flying the length of China from Shanghai and Peking to the capital city of Urumchi, a Mongolian name meaning Beautiful Grassland. China is struggling to build tourism to earn foreign exchange for modernization and

expects to receive about 100,000 foreign visitors this year plus 300,000 overseas

The 11 minorities are Kazakhs (nomadic herdsmen), Kirghiz, Sibo, Tadzhiks, Russians, Uzbeks, Tatars, Daur, Hui (Chinese Moslems), Mongols and Manchus (the last

rulers of Imperial China). The tourist bus passes donkey carts and caravans of twohump camels and drives for one hour through a bleak gravel desert streching in every direction beyond the horizon to reach Turfan oasis, 300 feet below

Travelers rest in a whitewashed, mud-wall guest house on iron beds with thin mattresses, no running water and slits in a concrete floor for toilets. But arbors heavy with ripening grapes shade the courtyards in a region where summer temperatures climb to 120 F and plunge to 40 below zero in winter. Fortunately, the Russian-built Kunlan guest house, Urumchi's main hotel, is fitted with Western bathrooms and plumbing. Since all China operates on Peking time,

On the mud floor, guests sat cross-legged on colorful rugs and soiled sheepskins. A white cloth spread on the ground was piled high with balsac, a sourmilk bread deep-fried in oil, and hert, a rock-hard cheese. Visitors dipped their hands into platters heaped with steaming boiled mutton.

In another yurt, Ding Ga Shih, mother of three children, talked in the Kazakh language, which was translated into Chinese

"I was born in this yurt, but now there is a hospital 15 kilometers (nine miles) from here and our women go there to have their babies," she said.

To slow population growth in China, the world's most populous nation with at least 960 million people, the government encourages ethnic Chinese to wait to marry until their mid-20s and limit children to two. But Moslems and other minorities appear to be free of such restrictions.

"Some minorities do not practice birth control, and they will grow in number while the Hans are told that one child is fine and two are enough," a Sinkiang government official

While his guests sipped salted tea mixed with hot cow's milk, a Kazakh herdsman said his family owned one horse, one milk cow and three sheep besides helping tend 80,000 head of livestock owned by the commune of 7,600 people from 1,200 households.

He said a herdsman can earn a sum the equivalent of \$300 to \$400 a year plus income from his private animals. Later in the day, a cold rain still falling,

across grassy mountainside pastures and a tug-of-war. One horseman grasped the front legs of a beheaded, gutted sheep and another horseman locked onto the rear legs. Shouting and grunting, they dug their heels into the flanks of their horses, each struggling to pull the sheep from the grip of the other rider. The winner in each duel was challenged by another rider until all were eliminated but one. The final winner galloped off with a

In the people's commune operated by Uighurs, Amur Niasi, father of four children. told visitors in his mud brick house that his annual income is cash equal to \$200, plus rice, wheat and vegetables from the commune. From the commune, Amur bought the three-room house in which his family lives. He paid the equivalent of \$160 over three years for the house and said he is free to give



## Carter Trying To Spark CETA

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The Carter administration is trying to rehabilitate CETA, a federal job program which has built a "Peck's Bad Boy" reputation for keeping bad company during its brief life.

The multi-billion dollar program, which involves 4.5 million Americans, often has been linked in headlines with fraud and political patronage abuses. Now the government is trying to redirect CETA (pronounced SEE-TA) to give more help to the hard-core unemployed and involve private industry.

Many of the complaints since the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act was enacted five years ago to provide an "umbrella" agency for federal manpower training efforts center around the public service employment feature - providing jobs in local government with federal funds to offset high unemployment.

Some local governments used the CETA money to fill jobs that otherwise would have been funded by local taxes, or to supplement the salary of middle class, career state and local government employees. In some cases, there was was evidence of out and out political patronage in the filling of CETA jobs.

The Labor Department is out to change that. Under new rules, people hired for CETA public service jobs must be both out of work and poor, rather than just one or the other. CETA workers will be limited to 78 weeks employment in a five year period, a switch from past policy that has seen some "temporary" jobs become per-

The department already has received about 50,000 requests - 10,000 from New York City alone - for temporary waivers of the time limitation so that workers The Labor Department has been liberal in granting the

outlays for fiscal year 1976 during the Ford ad-Although the total number of individuals involved in CETA at any time during the year has remained nearly constant - 3,965,500 in 1976 compared to 4,217,400 estimated for 1980 — the average number of people involved for a full year periods has increased from 1 million

The administration is making a concerted effort to place more "structurally unemployed" — the so-called "hard core" jobless - into "the new CETA." In a speech to the National Urban League in Chicago in July, Labor Secretary Ray Marshall said CETA was making a major contribution to easing unemployment

among black youths, calling it "one of the great success stories of this administration." A department spokeswoman said the number of lowincome persons served by CETA in 1976 was 2.7 million, or 63 percent of all those involved. In 1980, it is supposed to increase to 4 million, or 97 percent of the total.

Marshall has spent much of his time in office trying to convince the media and private industry that government employment and training programs should be shifted from the public to private sector. The key is a \$400 million program to establish private industry councils comprised of business, labor and

private citizens to develop their plans to train and hire memployed in local areas. These "PICs" are supposed to get industries interested in using CETA funds and tax breaks for providing work to the jubices. Under the tax credit program, an employer can receive credit for up to \$3,000 in wages per qualified

employe during the first year, and up to \$1,500 for the More than 300 PICs have already been established and there are plans for 400 in all. Marshall anticipates 200,000 new training opportunities from the private sector effort

The all-time Texas high school ground-gainer remains Kenneth Hall of Sugarland, Texas, known as "The Sugarland Express." From 1960 to 1963, he gained 11,232 yards. That's over two miles more than Heisman Trophy winner Sims gained at Hooks, Texas, where rushed for 7,738 yards. Overstreet, from Big Sandy, picked up 7,652 yards as a prepster. Hall later played at Texas A&M and had short hitches as a pro with the Chicago Cardinals and Houston Oilers. But he never made much impact after high school. Q. Exactly what kind of money do the television networks pay to televise professional football? I've heard that all the pro teams

In round figures, each of the 28 teams in the NFL will collect \$5 million for TV rights this season (they get a couple of hundred thousand more the next two years), That amo of \$140 million from the three networks. At one time, they could meet their operating budget with such booty. But now the Oakland Raiders, for instance, have a player salary payroll of \$4 million alone. The average team budget is about \$8 million. Don't cry for 'em — they also figure to take in \$6 million at the gate, leaving a round profit before taxes of \$3 million.

Centers do have to wear numerals in the 50s. But Fitzgerald, a nine-year veteran, gets a special dispensation because he played before the mandate went into effect. And guards and tackles are considered interchangeable, so they can be 60s or 70s.

Q. Has any major league pitcher ever thrown 27 strikeouts in a row — the perfect no-hitter? — Jim Dickinson, Reynoldsville,

No. The record for most strikeouts in a nine-inning game is 19, shared by Steve Carlton, Tom Seaver and Nolan Ryan. And none of those efforts were even no-hitters. In Don Larsen's "perfect" game for the Yankees over the Dodgers in the 1956 World Series, he fanned only seven batters.

Q. Has any woman played in professional football or baseball with men? — Junior Wilcoxon, Brownwood, Tex. Not that I'm aware of. ## Two Condo Owners Are Sued By Builder For Filing Complaints

By GEOFFREY POUNDS Herald Staff Writer

The owners of two Winter Springs condominiums find themselves facing \$500,000 lawsuits as a result of their efforts to expose what they claim are negligent practices by a Casselberry

George Kaplan said repeated requests to have the developer of his Baytree Village condominium, Frank Silvestri, make repairs on a leaky roof proved fruitless. Kaplan, who purchased the unit last December, sent a complaint about the matter to the Florida Department of Business Regulation.

Silvestri says Kaplan's complaint amounts to a "malicious attack" and he is asking in a civil suit filed this week in circuit court for \$500,000 in punitive damages.

When Scott and Christine Wyse did not receive repairs to their condominium in Baytree Village, they wrote to the Homebuilders Association of Mid-Florida. The result: a \$500,000 suit by Silvestri against them. Silvestri says their letter made false allegations and had "the direct and indirect effect of causing others to refrain from doing business (with Silvestri)."

"It's the way he operates. You try and get him to make the repairs and he doesn't. You get a song and dance, but nothing gets done. If you press it, he sues you," said Mrs. Wyse. Silvestri, whose business address is listed as 1033 Semoran Blvd., Casselberry, is out of town and could not be reached for

Mrs. Wyse said she and her husband moved into their confree maintenance, but they have received no maintenance. She said there are flea infestations, problems with ants, unpaved In addition to the 62 units in Baytree Village, Silvestri was the

cause leaking and rotted dry wall. She said there have been eight building problems in their homes.

In their letter to the Homebuilders Association, the Wyses requested an investigation into Silvestri's code of ethics "in order to prevent any further persons in becoming victims of the totally disorganized and haphazard methods it appears this developer has shown in the construction of the buildings of Baytree Village." The condominiums, which originally were priced in the upper

\$30,000 range, now "stand out like some substandard, low-income housing project," according to the Wyses' letter. Silvestri's suit alleges the Wyses conspired to cause others to believe he is "an unworthy and dishonest developer." The allegation stems from another letter, witnessed by the Wyses but signed by R.J. Soldinger, which was sent to the Division of Florida Land Sales and Condominiums. The letter charges Silvestri with numerous violations of state codes.

Silvestri's suit against Kaplan alleges Kaplan has made statements to others suggesting there is "shoddy workmanship" and there have been payoffs to cityofficials in the construction of

"He's suing me for the truth," said Kaplan. "I never said he was paying off city officials. I said once I wondered how some of these units got by the building inspectors."
