Service Decision

The House of Representatives ignored compelling evidence to the contrary when it decided there was no need to require the peacetime registration of young men as part of a standby selective service system.

Instead, 259 members of the House took the easy way out by rejecting registration and urging the president to study the issue.

It is important to remember that the question before the House was not whether to scrap the all-volunteer military and reimpose the draft.

However, much the opponents of peacetime registration choose to see it as the first step in renouncing the all-volunteer military, the case won't wash.

The need for registration, however, is clear cut. Largely as a result of the absence of the draft, the nation's reserve military strength has declined drastically since 1973.

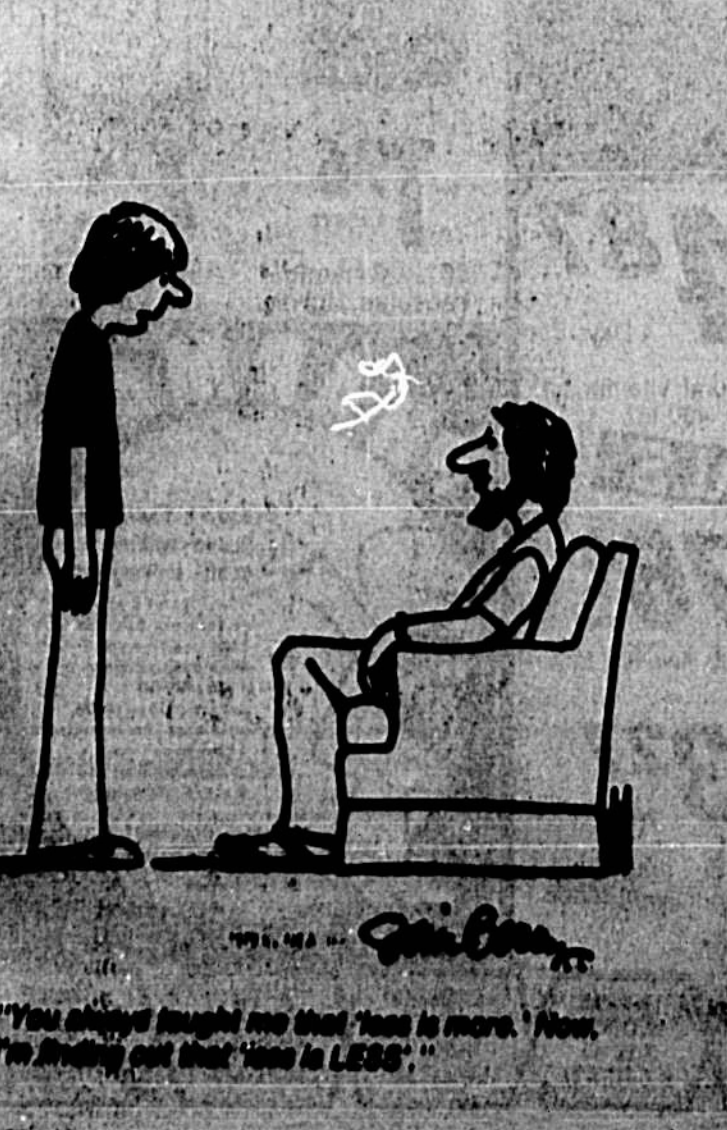

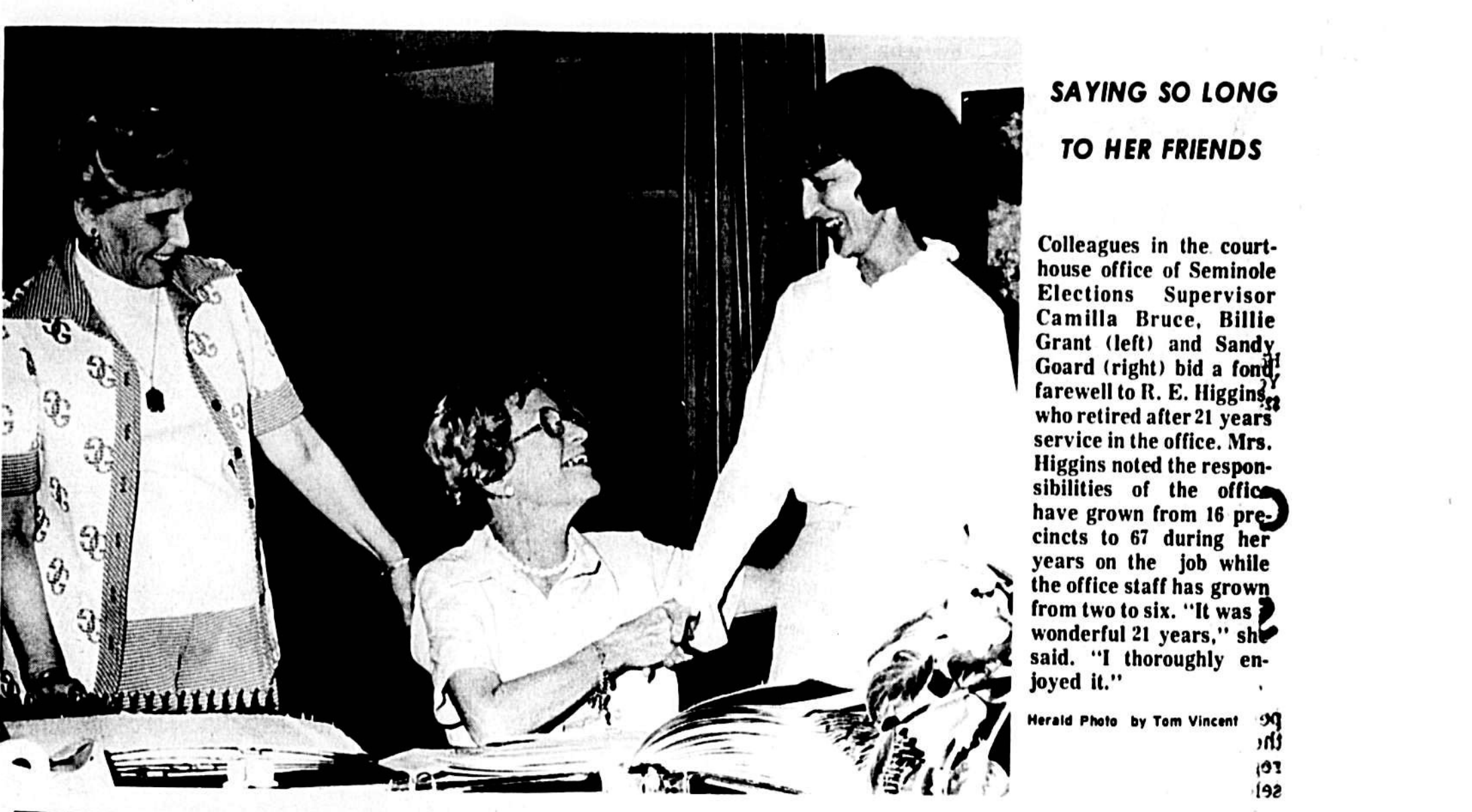

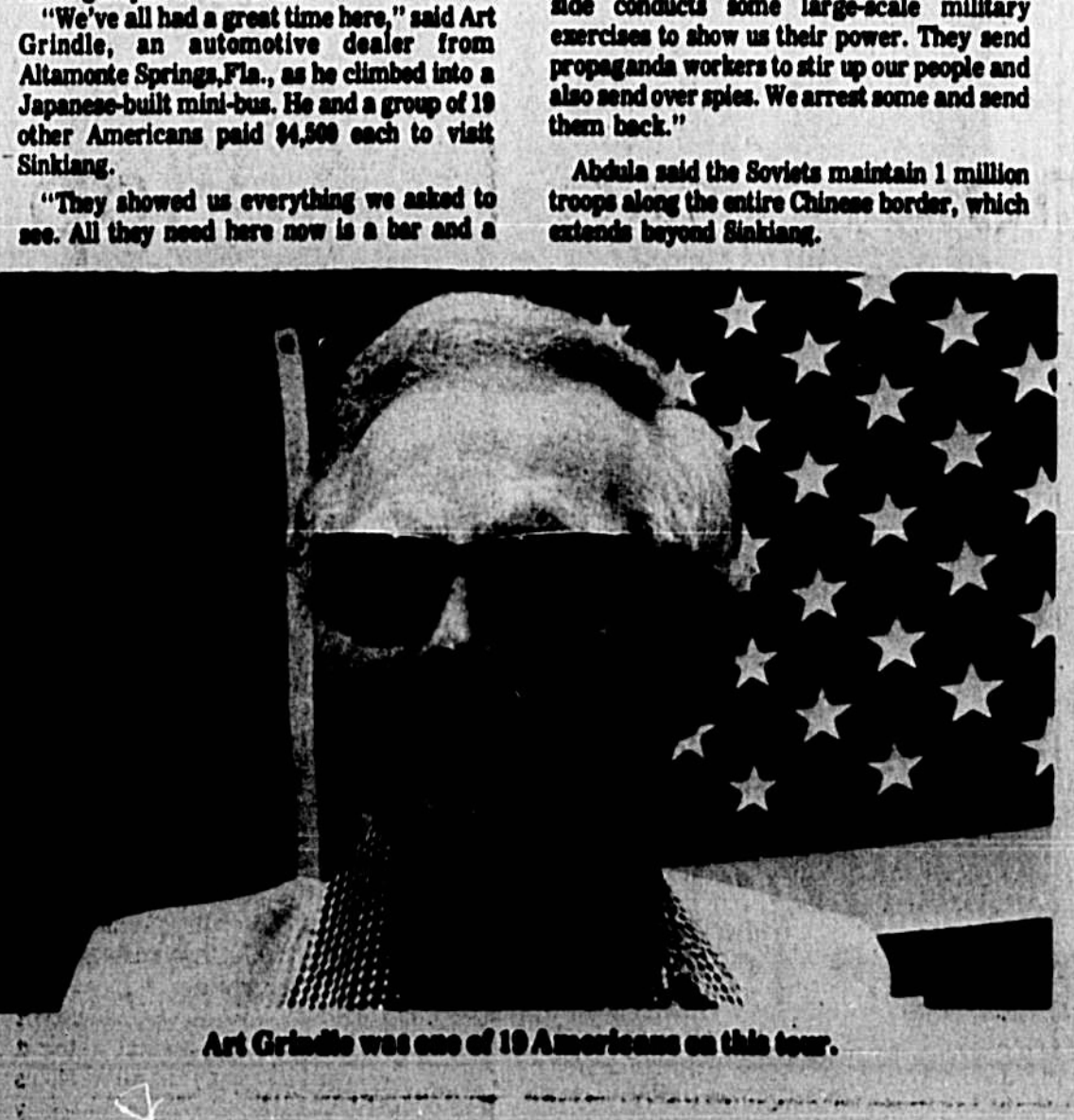

Year 2000: All Facts In Your Head

NEW YORK (UPI) — Forget that mini-calculator you've been packing around in your briefcase — it's just a toy. If Geoffrey Calvert is right, by the year 2000 you'll be carrying it in your head and you'll know all there is to know about everything.

Futurist Calvert, in a report titled "Shaping the Next Three Decades," predicts conversion of the average person into a genuine cyborg, with "micro-processors," combined with memory banks, implanted in the skull and interfaced directly with the brain.

That, he says, would make "all the stored knowledge of humanity accessible to every person."

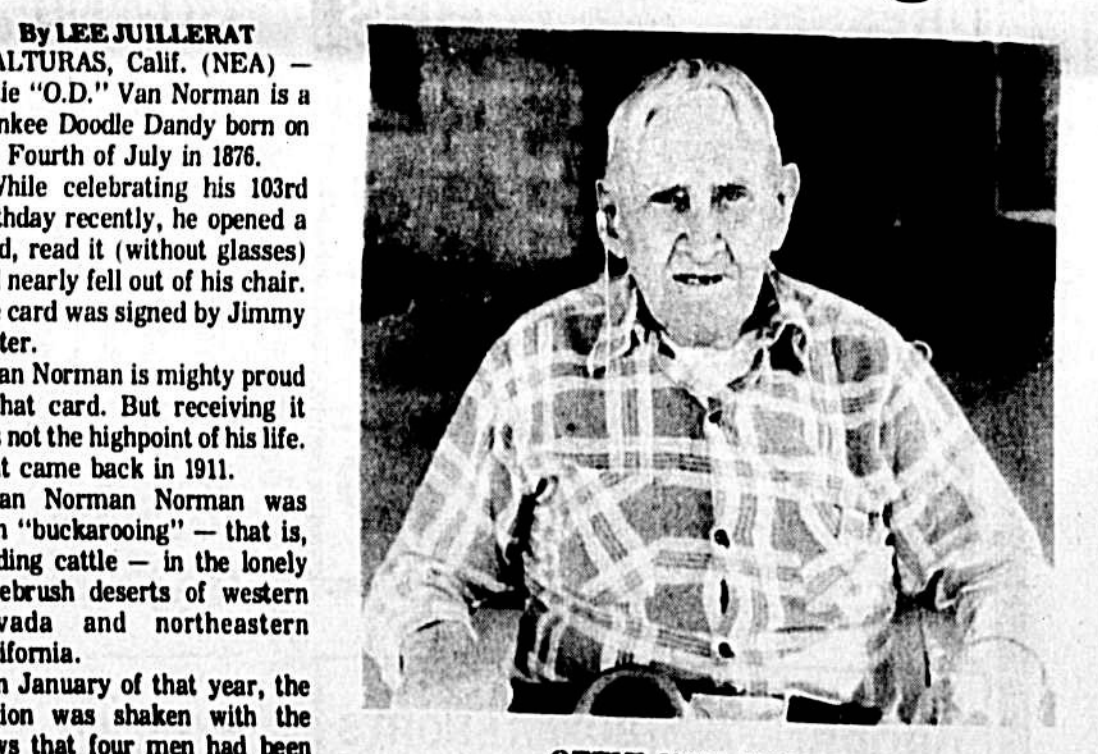

bullet whizzing past my head. "I asked George Holmes if he'd been hit and he said no. He asked me if I'd been hit and I said no.

"We fell off our horse in a pile of snow — We cleaned 'em up, the whole works of 'em, in a little bit."

When it all ended, Van Norman was among the celebrated. Just how much that helped is not known, but he was married in Englewood the next year. He returned to his job, where he worked for 33 years before moving on.

The events before and after Van Norman's joining the posse have been lost over the years.

During the last five years, Van Norman has been in and out of bed and in the convalescent home.

many who left work to join the party that searched for and found the dead men. He was also one of the 21 men who look up rifles and galloped off in search of the Indians nearly a month later in the posse that became known as the "Eagleville Boys."

And Van Norman was there when the posse caught up with the straggling band of Indians led by one "Shoshone Mike" and launched a three-hour stand that left all of the Indians dead except for a squaw and two youngsters.

"I drew a pretty good bead on one and he paled up right there," recalled Van Norman. "I was a pretty good shot at that time."

Now in retirement at a convalescent home, Van Norman almost automatically recites fragments of the episode:

"I was with the posse and followed them all the way to the east of Rabbit Creek. We ran into those old Indians just before noon — old Shoshone Mike and the rest of them.

"When we ran into them, we had an injun and he told them to throw up their hands and we wouldn't hurt them.

"But that old Shoshone Mike, he said, 'No, we're going to die right here. We ain't going to stop for nothing.'"

While the battle raged, Van Norman and George Holmes, another posse member, chased a breakaway group down a gully.

"When we got right up there close to them, they look six shots at us. I could feel them

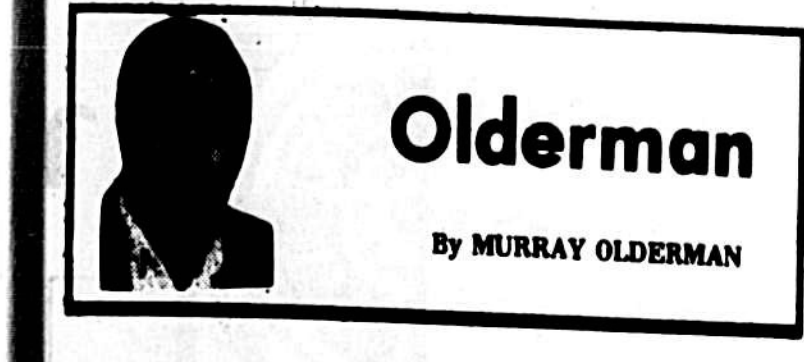

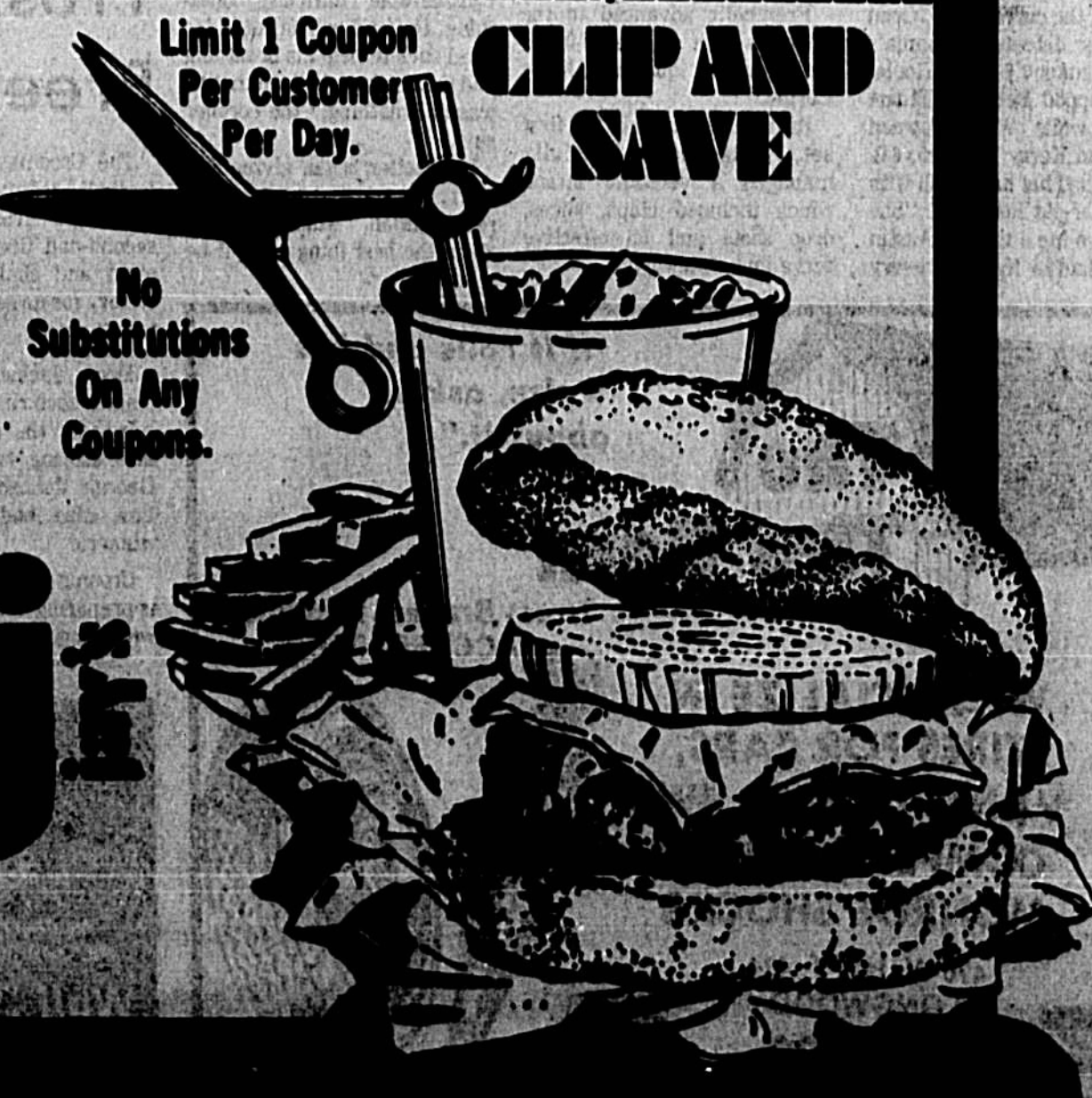

Greeks 'Astronomic
Beacons' In 200 A.D.

As early as 200 A.D., Greeks were "astronomic beacons" according to one of Demetria Dellenger's favorite cookbooks.

"I usually cook American," she admitted, "but for special occasions and for friends I cook Greek.
"I love baking for the holidays, especially Easter. It's a big thing, the biggest holiday. We would have a feast," she said, remembering the way her family used to celebrate.

1 jar grape leaves
1/2 pound ground beef
2 bunches scallions, chopped
1 tablespoon fresh dill
1/2 cup olive oil
1 lemon
salt and pepper
Soak grape leaves with hot water and drain. In a skillet saute onions and parsley in 2 tablespoons olive oil; add ground beef, rice and dill and cook until beef is brown. Drain fat, salt and pepper to taste and let cool. Place 1 teaspoon of mixture in center of each leaf. Fold end of leaf over to cover mixture; fold up sides of leaf and roll until a cylinder about 2 inches long is formed. Arrange the rolled leaves in layers and sprinkle each layer with lemon juice and 2 tablespoons olive oil. Pour 2 cups water and the remaining oil over the top layer and place a plate on top to weight them down. Simmer over a low heat for 40 - 50 minutes. Remove and cool before serving. Arrange stuffed leaves on a platter garnished with lemon wedges and accompanied by a bowl of chilled yogurt.

Real Possibility: Test Tube Baby

DEAR DR. LAMB - My husband and I have a question. I'm 25 years old and have had a hysterectomy. I was five months pregnant and had a miscarriage. They took me to surgery and found that the afterbirth had grown around the outside of the uterus. I guess the baby had attached itself half in the tube and half in the uterus. It was just a freak accident. I still have my ovaries and tubes and they just took out the uterus. Now my question is, has there been anything like a uterus transplant? They transplant hearts and other parts of the body so I was wondering if this has been done.

I'm perfectly healthy in all other respects and my husband and I were looking forward to having children.

DEAR READER - You must be describing an ectopic pregnancy, meaning that the fertilized egg was located outside the main body of the uterus. Providing the circulation to your ovaries was maintained, in spite of the surgery you should continue to have normal hormonal function, even though you don't have a uterus.

No, uterus transplants have not been done and I seriously doubt they ever will be, at least on a practical basis. Remember there's a lot of trouble in avoiding rejection of transplanted organs. 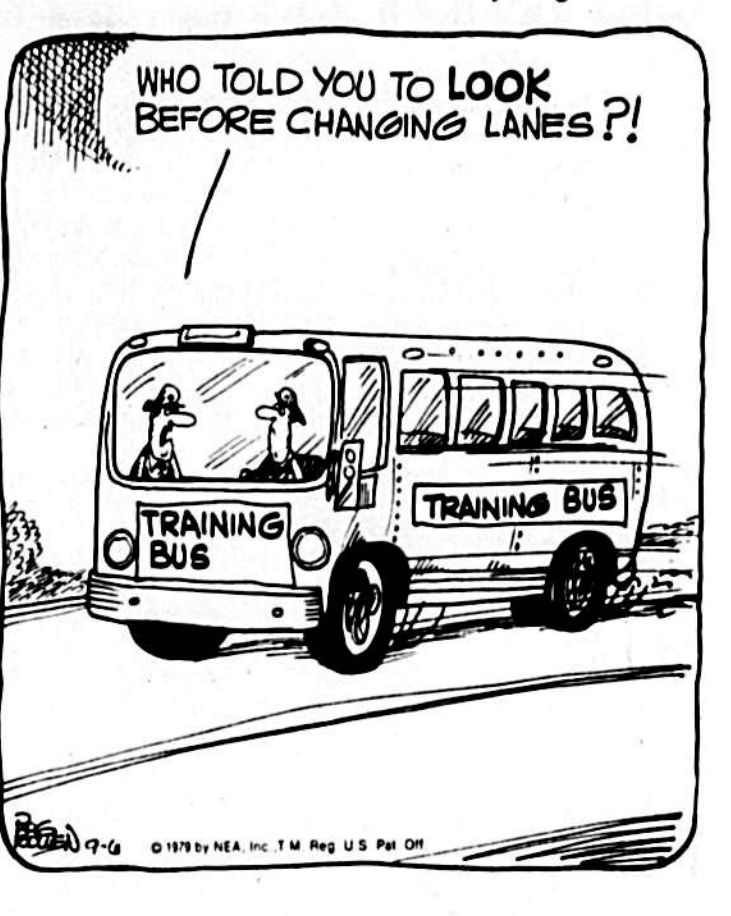
