



After selecting your prospective parent bloom remove the stamens with their powdery pollen and discard them to prevent self-pollenizayour chosen male parent and dust the pollen on the three-parted stigma of the bloom on which you wish to obtain seed. The pollen must be at the powdery the stigme . should , ba aticky and therefore ready to receive the pollen. THE KOVAGS HAVE LIVED in this monatrous, echoing 18thfloor vault for more than a year now. The building is called El Dorado and we may note in passing that it is where Marjorio Morningstar lived, in the book of the same name.

"There is fierce rivalry," Miss Martin said with a straight face, "between Imogene Coca and Miss Adams to play S'arjorie in the movies. 
