

Jets Blast AA Sites Near Hanoi

SAIGON (UPI)—U. S. Air Force jets struck close to Hanoi in a series of raids today, according to the Communist capital, a U. S. spokesman said today.

They dropped in low over the city and used a radar-guided missile and a rocket engine to destroy the AA sites and aircraft. The jets also hit several AA sites in the vicinity of Hanoi, a U. S. spokesman said today.

All the planes returned safely.

The planes launched one of the surface-to-air (SAM) missiles from a second take-off in a few minutes to bring down the aircraft that led to the second hit.

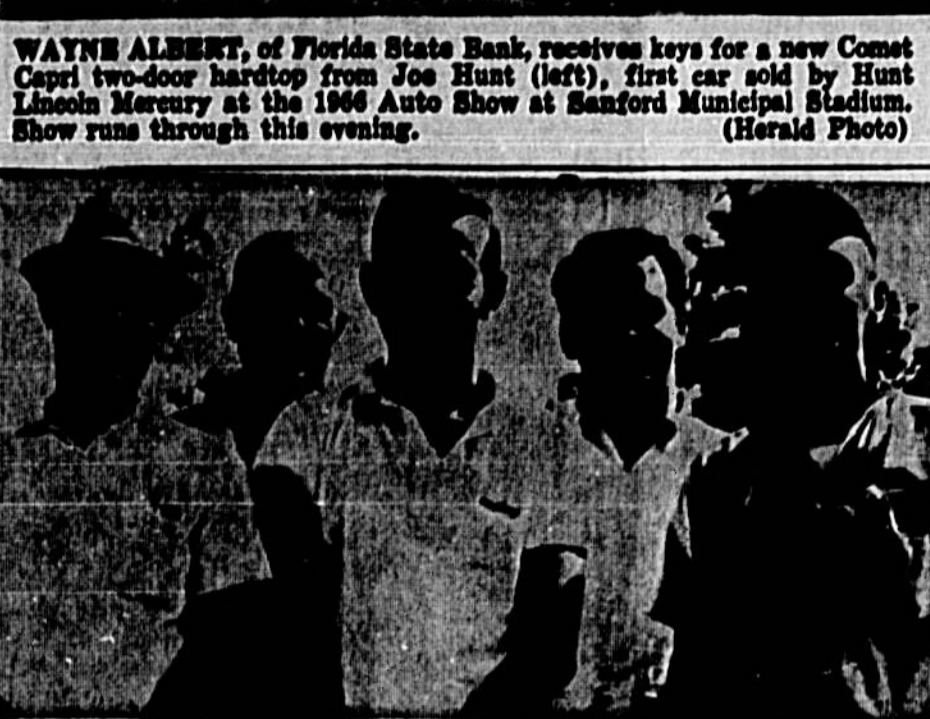

Johnson To End Easter Vacation

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (UPI)—President Johnson returns to Washington this week, possibly today, to conclude a 15-day work-and-play sojourn in Texas and Arkansas. Johnson will arrive in Washington at 6:00 p. m. today.

The Chief Executive was returning for the post-Easter re-opening of Congress and to catch up on paperwork. Priority matters, including a bill to amend the Federal Reserve Act, will be dealt with on the first day of the session.

Johnson was in an easy-going smiling mood Sunday when he drove a brown station wagon the 15 miles from his ranch to Johnson City to attend a 11 a. m. service at First Christian Church.

He is a member of the congregation and recently presided at the church's Easter service, which was broadcast on the radio.

Johnson's departure plans, as usual, were uncertain or at least unannounced.

After church Sunday the President and First Lady dropped by Johnson's boyhood home, now a tourist mecca, for a cup of coffee and a chat with local friends and visitors.

Three Tornadoes Hit Texas And Oklahoma

A vast storm system which raked the Southwest with violent thunderstorms and at least three tornadoes, spread high winds, rain and snow over much of the country today.

Britain Should Page Pied Piper

LONDON (UPI)—The British government is declaring war on invading hordes of "super rats" but studs it is hard pressed to find adequate weapons.

The minister of agriculture said the rats are breeding at a rate of four to five in one near the Welsh border and utilizing his plan for a war on the proliferating rodents.

The minister said recent movements indicated a full-scale rat invasion of the industrial Midlands may be in the offing.

A ministry spokesman said the rats were immune to Warfarin, an international chemical ministry said it would clear a three-mile-wide belt around the affected area in Shropshire and Montgomeryshire.

Inside the barrier the super rats will be hunted down by expert trappers and white scientists try to develop an effective poison.

Sanford Joins National Observance Of Library Week

National Library Week, April 17 to 23, will spotlight library service needs in Florida, State Chairman Warren Pierce of St. Petersburg announced today.

"The immediate goal for National Library Week is to inform all Florida citizens about the current status and needs of all the state's libraries," Pierce said.

He outlined other goals adopted by the Florida Library Association which citizens of the state will be informed about during the April week. These include local library service available to every resident within fifteen minutes of his residence, a larger library source within an hour's drive and a resource center within a day's round trip of his home.

"Every public and academic library in Florida should have a book collection which meets or exceeds the standards set by the American Library Association," Pierce said.

In Sanford, Mrs. Sarah Harrison, head librarian, announced that a display of new books will be set up in the lobby of the Florida State Bank, during National Library Week.

"We are working on a program to establish a central county-wide library system, using the Sanford library as the focal point, so that we may become eligible for state and federal appropriations," said Mrs. Harrison.

"We have been working with county officials on plans for obtaining funding from the county in order to be able to take advantage of state and federal aid. Meeting with county officials recently was Miss Elizabeth Cole, state library consultant from Tallahassee," she added.

Mrs. Harrison went on to explain that the establishment of the city library as a central county library would require an increase of five or six persons for the local office as well as field personnel in the outlying community libraries in Osteen, Lake Mary, Altamonte Springs, Longwood and Geos. Today, according to FLA statistics, only seven of Florida's 120 libraries have a book collection of over 100,000. One of every five citizens has no public library service. Statewide, libraries have less than one book per capita while minimum standards call for at least two. Three pointed out. Personnel, both professional librarians and clerical staff are inadequate. According to FLA figures, only 42 libraries in Florida have sufficient staff to meet minimum standards and these are predominantly non-professional workers.

Tax supported libraries provide \$1.54 per capita while the national average is \$2.00 and the minimum standards set by the American Library Association is \$3.50, statistics show.

A minimum of two thousand trained librarians are needed in Florida today to provide adequate service, Pierce said.
