1,000 Show Up

WASHINGTON (AP) - More than 1,000 persons who claim President Nixon is being treated unfairly are going directly to Capitol Hill to try to stop the impeachment proceedings. Members of the Committee for Fairness to the Presidency planned to meet with individual House and Senate members today to present their case in support of the President. At a luncheon Sunday, Nixon told the group, "With your support I shall do nothing that will weaken this office. You came from the heart of America and you have touched our hearts." Appearing with his wife and two daughters, Nixon reiterated that he would not leave office until January 1977.

Retarded Persons

LOS ANGELES (AP) - The Rev. Courtney E. Peterson, a 41-year-old Protestant chaplain with three theological degrees, says "retardation is a measure of cognitive awareness. But many retarded persons have feelings and emotional sensitivity as great as those with normal awareness. Our approach is to appeal to the parts of a person that are not retarded." The Rev. Mr. Peterson's parishioners, and those of his clergymen colleagues, are mentally retarded residents at Pacific State Hospital in suburban Pomona.

Gas Explosion

MOORESVILLE, Va. (AP) - A natural gas pipeline exploded near here late Sunday, rocking the countryside near this rural Virginia town and shooting flames hundreds of feet into the air before being extinguished, of-

Company officials said the line apparently ruptured and leaking gas ignited, illuminating the sky with a yellow-orange glow that could be seen 50 miles away over the mountains in Strasburg and Front Royal. There are approximately 140 homes within a one-mile

TRENTON, N.J. (AP)-New Jersey's court ad ministrator says he will look into a Florida judge's implication that an alleged baby-snatching was justified because New Jersey's courts are too slow in deciding

The administrator, Judge Arthur Simpson, says he will send for a copy of a six-page opinion by Florida State Court Judge John Santoro, who ruled in a custody case that also had been before a Morris County court.

In Jacksonville last Wednesday, Santoro reversed an order by Judge Kenneth C. MacKenzie in Morristown, Santoro awarded custody of 2-year-old Gregory Borri to his mother, Mrs. Elaine Sivenson of Jacksonville. On May 20, MacKenzie granted permanent custody of the child to the father, Bruce Borri of Riverdale, N.J.

Foreign Currency

MILAN, Italy (AP) - Five armed men drove into the courtyard of Milan's main post office in a stolen mail van early today, forced five employes to lie down on the floor and escaped with a bag full of foreign currency estimated to be worth several hundred thousand dollars.

Police said the bag contained cash being shipped by foreign banks to Italian banks. It was the second such raid on the post office in four months. A similar amount was taken the first time.

Soviet Planes

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Soviet Union apparently has given Syria its first squadron of advanced MIG23 jet fighters, according to U.S. intelligence reports. Sources said 16 crated MIG23 "Floggers" reportedly were sent to Syria recently aboard Russian merchant ships.

Fugitive Leader

DUBLIN, Ireland (AP) - David O'Connell, a fugitive leader of the Irish Republican Army, gave the funeral oration Sunday at the grave of hunger striker Michael Gaughan, but police made no attempt to arrest him before the 17,000 mourners. Meanwhile, the Earl and Countess of Donoughmore were released in Dublin by kidnapers who had held them for four days. The earl said he thought the kidnapers were members of the IRA, and the countess said they were told they were being freed because five IRA prisoners in England had ended their hunger strikes.

Strongest Party

HANNOVER, Germany (AP) - The conservative Christian Democrats displaced Chancellor Helmut Schmidt's Social Democrats Sunday as the strongest party in the state of Lower Saxony. But Schmidt's socialists retained control of the state government by a one vote majority in the state legislature because of gains by their partners in the national coalition government. The election was the Social Democrats' first test with the veters since Schmidt replaced Chancellor Willy Brandt on May 17. The outcome was considered likely to enhance the new chancellor's prestige since polls before he took over indicated the socialists were headed for a shattering

President Refuses Subpoena Deadline

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Nixon refused again today to honor any more House impeachment inquiry subpoenas, writing to House Judiciary Committee chairman Peter W Rodino Jr. that he will do nothing which would "render the executive branch henceforth and forevermore subservient to the legislative branch."

Nixon's six-page letter to Rodino was in response to the Judiciary Committee's subpoena for tapes of 45 conversations related to the Watergate

The same thing happened to a federal land-use bill, which the President had described as his "number one environmental priority" in his State of the Union message last January. Rep. Morris Udall, D-Ariz., working closely with the Interior Department, drew up a bill to accomplish the President's objective.

But conservatives were afraid the bill would allow the federal overnment, for the sake of the environment, to infringe on private ownership. House Republican leader John Rhodes and Rep. Sam Steiger, R-Ariz., arranged a private visit with the President and urged him to abandon the Udall bill.

Although the bill simply codified his own proposals, Nixon 7 accepted the suggestion of the two powerful conservatives. Steiger helpfully provided a weakened substitute bill, which the President quickly endorsed.

This killed the Udall bill. It was a victim, snorted Udall, of 'Watergate politics." Agreed a staff member privy to the backstage maneuvering: "This was clearly a case of Nixon trying to shore up his conservative support." The President has also shifted his stand against other con-


