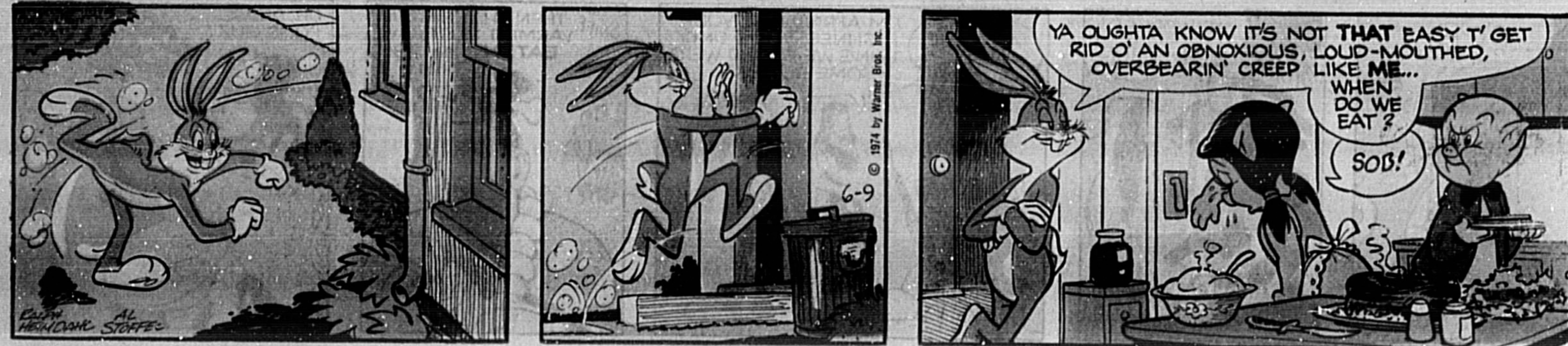

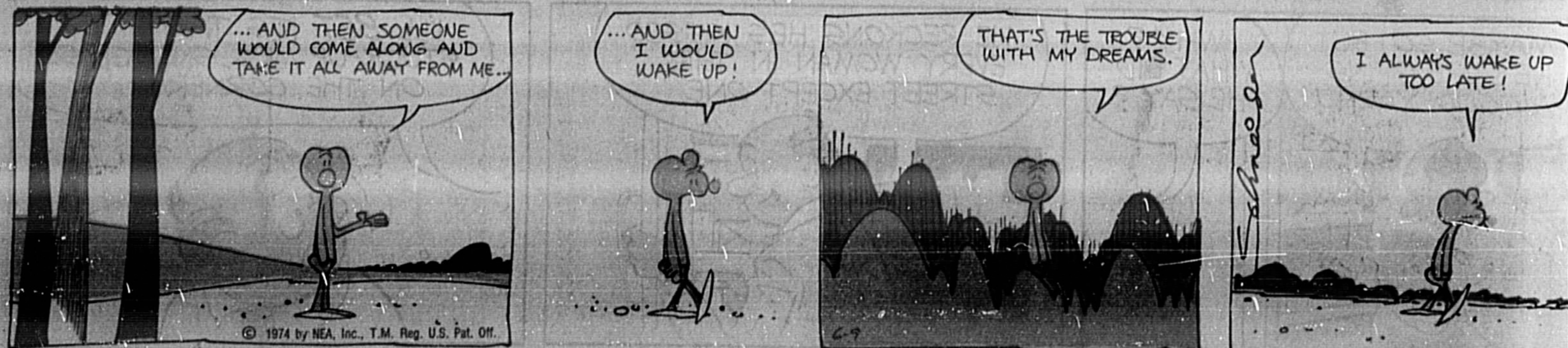
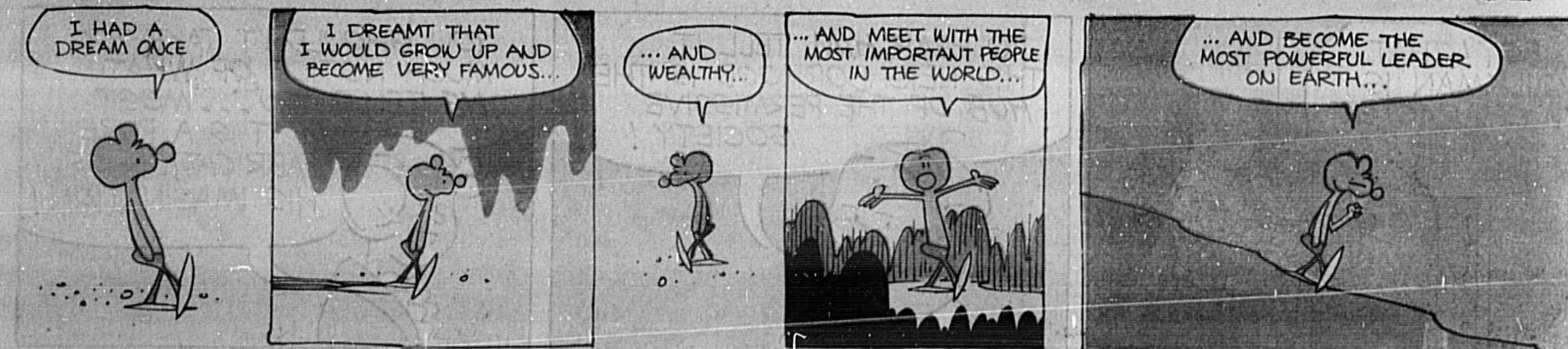

Nixon Views Trip As Helping Self, Country

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon begins an overseas journey today hoping to achieve twin goals of strengthening the new U.S. role in the Middle East and convincing the American people that world peace requires his continuation in office.

After spending some time in Austria to adjust to the time zone changes, Nixon arrives in Egypt Wednesday for the first stop in what is expected to be a warmly welcomed tour of five Middle East nations.

Diplomats in the Middle East and Washington and many American officials see the trip as official confirmation that the United States is a friend of Egypt and Syria, two nations that had been entirely dependent on the Soviet Union for military and political support. Nixon's visits therefore are expected to be a further push to Moscow's declining influence in the Middle East.

Nixon Had Early 'Gate' Warning

NEW YORK (AP) — Time magazine says ex-White House aide Charles W. Colson told Watergate investigators he warned President Nixon about the Watergate cover-up two months before Nixon says he found out about it. Quoting "knowledgeable people close to Colson," the magazine said in its latest issue that Colson has told the investigators he talked of the cover-up with the President in January and February of 1973.

Nixon has said he learned on March 21, 1973, of attempts to cover up the break-in from former White House counsel John W. Dean III. Colson pleaded guilty last week to obstruction of justice in connection with the burglary of the Los Angeles office of Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist. According to Time, in January Colson "told the President: 'Something is going on here that is very wrong. There's got to be a serious investigation.'"

Jesse Jones Sentenced To 90 Days

Accused kidnaper Jesse James Jones, recently acquitted of charges he helped abduct Sanford businessman George Jackson and hold him for \$30,000 ransom, now faces a 90-day sentence for assault against a fellow prisoner. Jones, 23, pleaded to reduced charges after a witness to the Sanford jail incident gave conflicting stories, prosecutors said.

Circuit Court Judge A.J. Hosenmann Jr., sentenced Jones to 90 days, but gave him credit for 60 days spent awaiting the outcome of the kidnap trial.

Also present in court on a technical matter today was Jones' alleged accomplice in the kidnap, Frank Lee Wheeler Jr., 24, now serving three years for a parole violation.

The pair was acquitted last month by a Tampa jury in the Feb. 28 abduction of Jackson from his Southern Shortening company office. Ernest Jerome Davis, 19, a former Jackson employee, pleaded guilty to the kidnap and testified in Wheeler and Jones' trial. No sentencing date will be set until completion of a presentence investigation by the parole and probation commission.

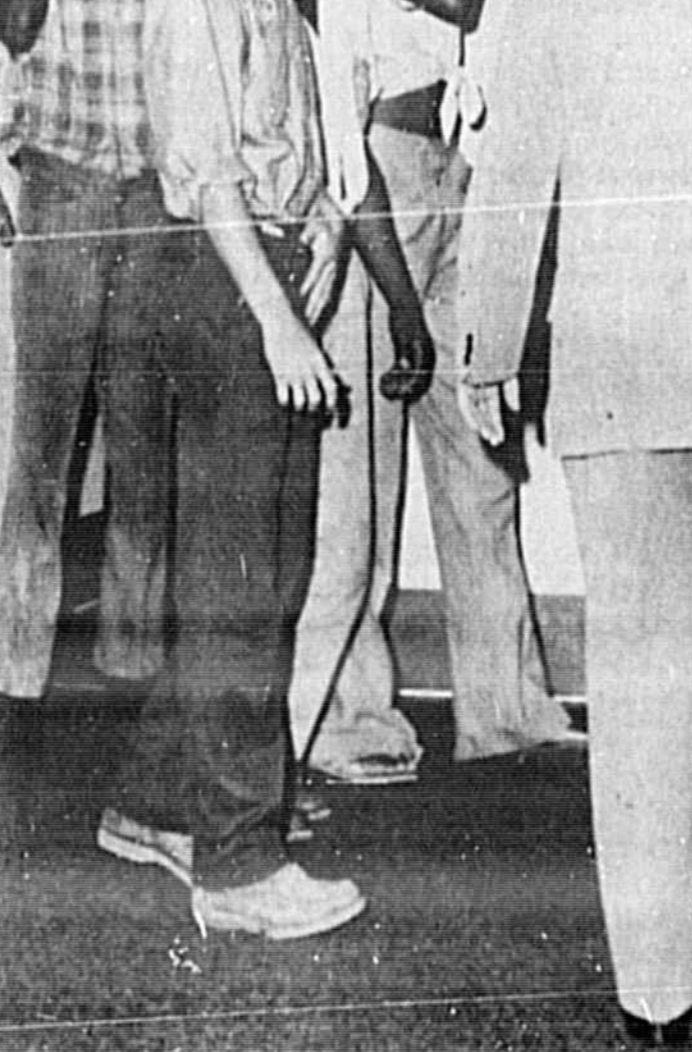

Strong 'Twister Type' Winds Torment County, Country

Twister type winds hit Casselberry Sunday afternoon during a thunderstorm which dumped 1.92 inches of rain and fell on a car parked in the driveway of P.H. Burlison, 608 Gregory Dr. and firemen extinguished a fire thought to have been started by lightning in a bay behind mobile homes on Hill Top Road. A screened-in pool-patio at the Marvin McClain home at 131 N. Triplett Dr. was damaged by heavy winds, which also blew down a billboard on U.S. 17-92, and numerous trees and limbs in the downtown area of Casselberry.

Albino Toad Excites Scientists

WARREN, Mich. (AP)— Research scientists at the University of Michigan Amphibian Facility are excited by a backyard find. Charlie, who has transparent skin, was found last week by 4-year-old Joey Strain in a backyard near his home. The Amphibian Facility wants to study the rare animal and breed it for research. Albino toads or frogs are "a one in a million" occurrence, said a facility scientist. Dr. George W. Nace, a zoology professor, says the transparent skin on albino frogs and toads makes it possible to observe their bodily functions. "Frogs have many features like those of man," he said. "We study them to try to learn how the genes control the development process."
