Recognition For China

Ardent friends of Nationalist China are beginning to resign themselves to the prospect of United States recognition for the Communist government of China as an inevitable conclusion to our part in the fray. Probably recognition is inevitable. But it is neither necessary nor wise that it be granted in the immediate future, even should the Nationalist government utterly collapse and disappear.

The British act of recognition has been a strong influence on American thinking. But the British had some rea son for precipitate netter, in the need 44 privide a basis for protection of their territorial interests at Hong Kong. We have less reason for haste.

There are, in-fact, ansad-reasons for delay, even beyond the time when the Nationalist government may cease to have any real being. We should wait for the Communist government of China to demonstrate a sufficient desire to United States recognition to be willing and ready to set up celitions on a dignified and, it not a friendly, at least a courteous basis. We should require that the Communists prove that they have real control over the areas of China they claim as theirs, to the extent of being able to assure that it would not be prodent for proper reception of American officials and to prevent indig. such matters of life and death to nities to or abuse of American nationals.

In short, we should not hasten to recognize a new government of China and trust that it will then begin to behave like a government. We should wait for it to show responsibility and a desire for proper international relations.


