Air Fights Rage Over Fierce Tank Battles In Libyan Struggle

Outcome Of Enemy Drive Against British Is Doubtful; Nazi Unit Repulsed

(By Associated Press) Violent tank battles are raging at Tobruk's outer defenses today with the outcome of German Field Marshal Rommel's drive on the British north African stronghold remaining doubtful. Mussolini added Italian troops are participating. Fierce aerial fighting is taking place over the desert battle.

A German armored force has been repulsed after sapping around British positions as far as Sidi Rezegh, 80 miles inside of the British defensive system in the Libyan desert.

Late reports from the front said that Rommel "never had a chance" with his two-pronged advance toward the El Adem, a group of tanks near Bir Hacheim, 35 miles farther south. Hours before he launched his attack, they said, "the sky was filled with RAF fighters and bombers which strafed and bombed enemy columns, airfields and supply lines."

As a result, the Axis forces were reported "punch drunk" before they were well started and, since British Gen. Sir Claude Auchinleck had anticipated the direction of the main assault around El Adem and placed a crack armored division there, they were stalled in their tank attacks.

The RAF also had credibility in the shooting down of Axis planes, shooting down 120 Axis aircraft during the day on the ground in continual raids on enemy bases.

The battlefields were 88 miles apart and there was no continuous line between them. The usual confusion attending armored clashes on the desert prevailed.

The British battled one of Col. Gen. Erwin Rommel's tank columns at El Adem, 18 miles south of Tobruk and 40 miles inside the Libyan Desert, and another near Bir Hacheim, 35 miles farther west in the desert. In both sectors British lines were intact, and although Axis armored forces may have penetrated the intervening no-man's land, military observers said that there had been any breakthrough.

The Axis units repulsed persistently trying to infiltrate the British flanks in the Bir Hacheim area, but had not had appreciable success, although the fighting was increasing in intensity.

Nationwide Rationing Of Gas Is Opposed

(WASHINGTON, May 29.—AP) A group of Senators mostly from oil-producing areas, began an all-out campaign of opposition to nationwide gas rationing. Hearings opened before any action was taken.

Meanwhile, the House Agricultural Committee received charges that "gasoline shortages are being caused by their own mismanagement." The willful members of New York and the big companies controlled by their government believe that they can easily ration gasoline.

3 Jap Subs Are Believed Sunk Off Australia

Sneak Attack Is Made On Sidney Harbor; Chinese Start Big Assault On Enemy

(By Associated Press)
In Sydney it was reported today that three Jap subs are believed sunk in the result of a sneak attack on Sydney harbor.

In Chungking, the Chinese are striking at Nanking up the Yangtze river about 175 miles, occupying some Jap position.

Allied bombers started large fires and wrecked docks and airfields at enemy lodgments in Milnur, eastern New Guinea, and the Solomon Islands today.

The Japs landed fresh forces on Yuhuan Island off Chekiang shore and claimed they have reopened another front against Chungking forces with an offensive in the Kwangtung province.

The Chinese campaign against heavy fighting is in progress in the southern province of Kwantung, where the Japanese claimed the launching of an offensive north of Canton. The Chinese reported further successes around Ichang.

Generalissimo Chiang Kai Shek's troops in central China have launched a large scale attack against the Japanese in Anhwei province about 200 miles west of Shanghai. The Chinese high command announced yesterday, and aided by strong garrison forces, already are hammering at the gates of two of the province's largest cities.

The Japanese, meanwhile, landed forces in the town of Kapsen, Yuhuan Island, northeast of Wenchow bay in Chekiang province, and attacked the defenders under cover of a naval bombardment. Fighting is still in progress there.


