

This committee worked hard and long. They met regularly to discuss the various questions before them. One in particular made lengthy studies of various questions and even went to the extremes of calling in near-experts to help him. He dug into files, he questioned, he talked to citizens, in fact he spent all of his time delving deeply into the subject that was foremost before the county commissioners. One that needed to be solved.

And what happened? When he attempted to present his report to the members of the committee, when he attempted to speak out for those things that he, a duly appointed member of the committee, thought to be right, he was denied, along with two other members who shared his views, the right to peak out and present his atudies.

Just because he wanted to criticize the present assessment methods he was denied the right to speak out. So he, and the two ether members of the committee who agreed h him, presented a minority report to the seople.
