BIG EDITION OF SEMINOLE COUN-BIG MEETING WILL BE HELD

\*At a special meeting of the Commercial club held this afternoon the question of securing a permanent state highway north and south through Seminole county crowing the St. Johns river ar Monroe ferry was taken up and given a most thorough discussion. There is a direct route already laid out leading from Tamps on through Plant City Lakeland Kissimmee Orlando Sanford DeLand Cresent City Palatka Green Cove Springs into Jacksonville. 
