PITCHING STAFF WORRY OF WHITE SOX FOR SEASON

Roster Now Includes 18 Men Both Rookies and Regular Pitchers Who Will Train Worked Out in Navy Yard

CHICAGO, Jan. 14.—(AP)—Fifteen new pitchers, making a total of 18, are now on the roster of the Chicago White Sox for scrutiny by Manager Eddie Collins, who is striving to find one or two first rank hurlers to help Lyons and Blankenship.

With old Chief Bender as a pitching coach, the Sox boss has high hopes of finding the material he needs, either from the five pitchers recalled for further test, or the five new ones drawn from the minors last fall. The Sox problem centers around the mound staff.

Earl McBea, an Indian south-paw, picked from the Little Rock Southern League team, looks good to Collins, and Alphonse Thomas, purchased from Baltimore, already is considered among the regular boxmen. He won 30 and lost 11 games last year in the International league.

The Sox otherwise will take the field this season with the lineup unchanged.

Ray Schalk will open his fourteenth year behind the bat, with his major league game record approaching 1,600.

The quiet from Gatorland, as usual, can be counted on to give the local aggregation a hard battle, while the Stetson Hatters have always been one of the strongest opponents in the state, and it is expected that they will be in top form when they invade the Rollins lair on Monday.

Jim Corbett Thinks Stribling Has Good Chance For Crown

BOSTON, Jan. 14.—(AP)—James J. Corbett, the "gentleman" Jim of heavyweight championship fame, thinks William (Young) Stribling of Georgia, has a good chance to succeed to the crown that now rests on Jack Dempsey's brow.

At present he believes Gene Tunney is the best of the heavyweights but he doesn't believe Gene can beat Jack. For that matter, he does not think any of them can land the champion at present.

Corbett and Stribling met on a local stage in a friendly battle last night. Jim was here on a theatrical tour and Stribling on his wedding trip. After they had gone through a light workout Corbett told the young Georgian a few things.

"Stribling, you have the best feat of any of the new heavyweights," he said, "I think that a good feat with a left is the most essential part of a boxer's requirements. You should develop this and also punch hard with your left. You are a strong young man and have a great chance to be champion of the world which today makes young millionaires."

To Mrs. Stribling he said, "You are just the kind who will help your husband to win the world title and millions."

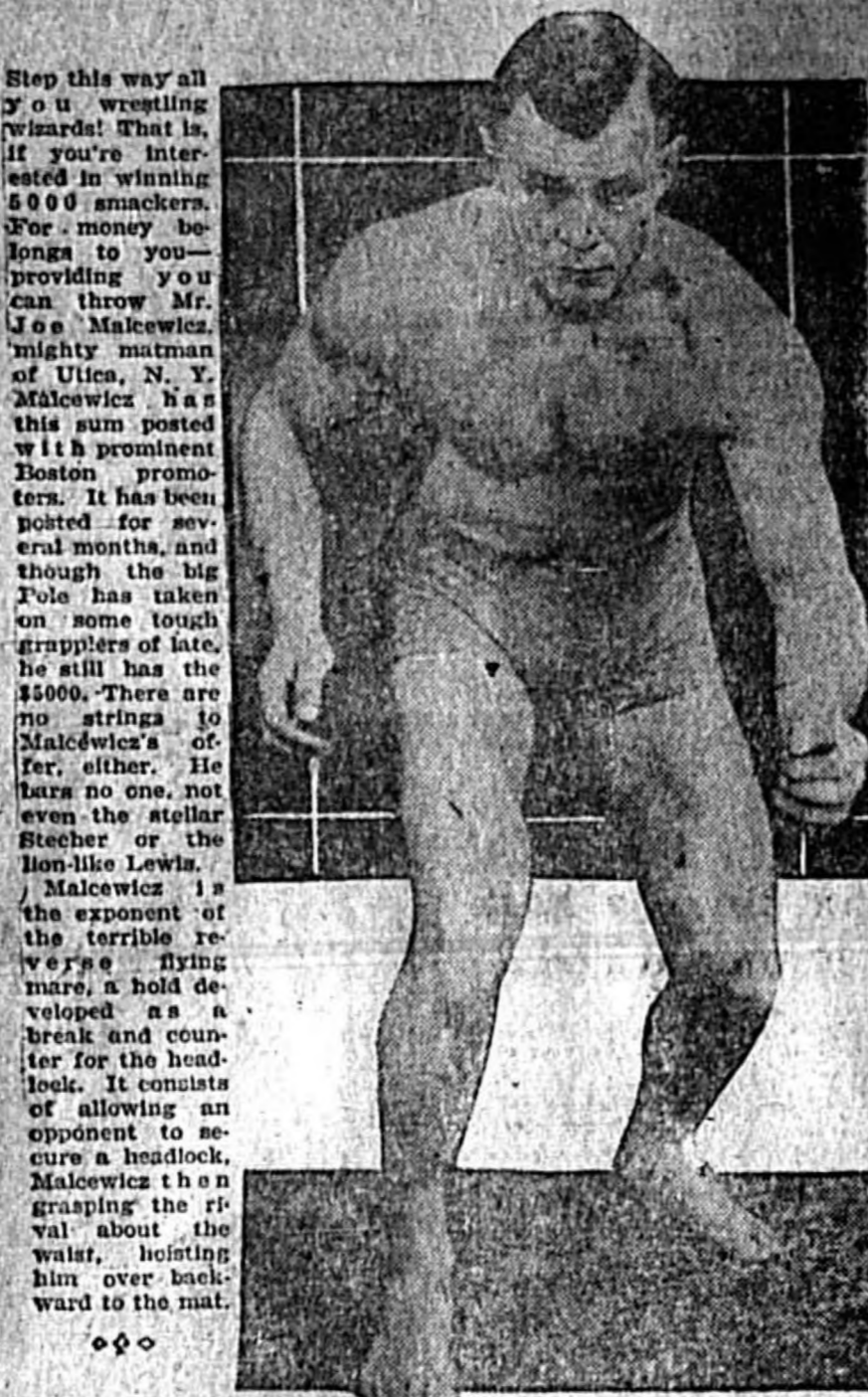

Cane Is Freed On Lynching Charge In Clarksdale, Miss.

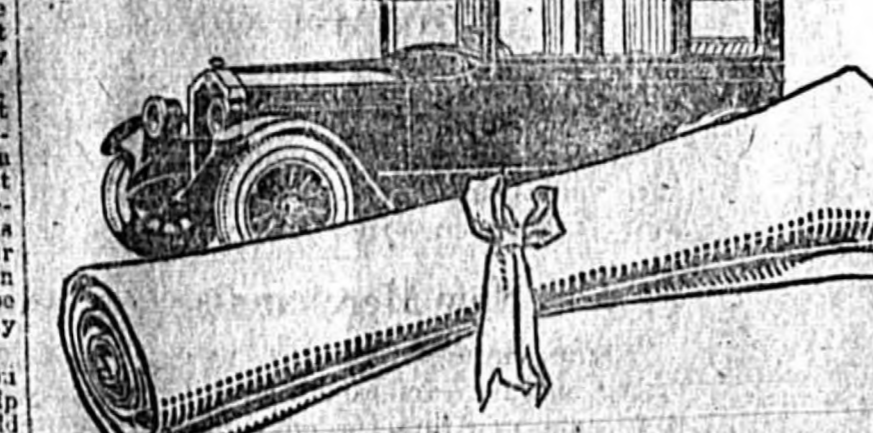
CLARKSDALE, Miss., Jan. 14.—Gold A Cane, first to go to trial of four men indicted on charges of murder as a result of the lynching of Lindsey Coleman, negro Wednesday night, was freed by a jury verdict of not guilty. The cases of the three men indicted with him were before Judge W. A. Alcorn, on motion to continue until the February term of court and charges pending against Dr. S. W. Glass, county sheriff and three of his deputies ended through nolle prosequere action.

Cane was acquitted of the charge of murder by a verdict returned this afternoon 27 hours after the close of his trial in Coahoma county circuit court.

Motions to continue the cases of the three men indicted with Cane—J. T. Traynham, Tom Nicholas and H. S. Bockley—was determined upon at a conference of the attorneys immediately after the verdict was returned in the Cane trial. Judge Alcorn took the motion under advisement until today. Nicholas, the only one of the four men indicted still in jail, was released on \$5,000 bond late yesterday.

With the disposal of the charge pending against the sheriff, that of failure to perform his duty, Dr.

Glass resumed office. Dr. Glass had temporarily been relieved from office pending completion of the investigation ordered as an aftermath of the lynching.

NEW YORK, Jan. 14.—(AP)—Youth is triumphant in the selections for the Walker cup team announced yesterday by the United States Golf Association for Little White Gum of Atlanta, and Ted Roland McKenzie of Washington, are members.

The rise of Gunn, curly-haired foe of his great friend, Bobby Jones, in the finals of the amateur championship at Oakmount, Pa. last September, is one of the most sensational in the history of golf. A mere boy, Gunn eliminated some of the veterans of the game to win the final. McKenzie, another lad, was medalist at Oakmount last year.

Another new comer to the lists, but hardly a youth, is George Von Elm, of Los Angeles, who finished second in the recent \$10,000 tournament at Los Angeles. Von Elm was beaten by Jones in the finals of the amateur meet at Marjorie Hills last year and lost to Jones last year at Oakmount in the semifinals.

Ex-Georgia Grocer Proves Successful Farmer In Florida

CANAL POINT, Jan. 14.—(AP)—T. G. Yarbrough, in that brief lease in Atlanta, decided sometime ago while on a prospecting trip through Florida that perhaps he could earn more money from the soil than from a merchandise business. Visiting Canal Point and learning that a sugar concern expected to lease some of the lands upon which it had raised sugar cane four years he formed a temporary partnership with J. J. Rigdon and the pair of them obtained ten acres. It was at East Beach.

Yarbrough and Rigdon had ill luck with their first crop, beans. They didn't get a good stand of the vegetables, they hadn't used any fertilizer, frost ran through the fields and to top it all off the holiday season came around after the first pickings and shortage of labor made it necessary to leave on the vines to become hard, a quantity that would have made 100 hampers. Then, to add to the misery some of the beans were frozen in transit to the markets. But:

After turning over to the land one fifth of the produce for use of the soil Yarbrough and Rigdon got 960 hampers of beans from the first picking, and 439 from the second. Yarbrough already has received as his share more than \$1,000, returns are yet to be received on 75 hampers of the later pickings and he and his partner have filed a claim for those frozen in transit. 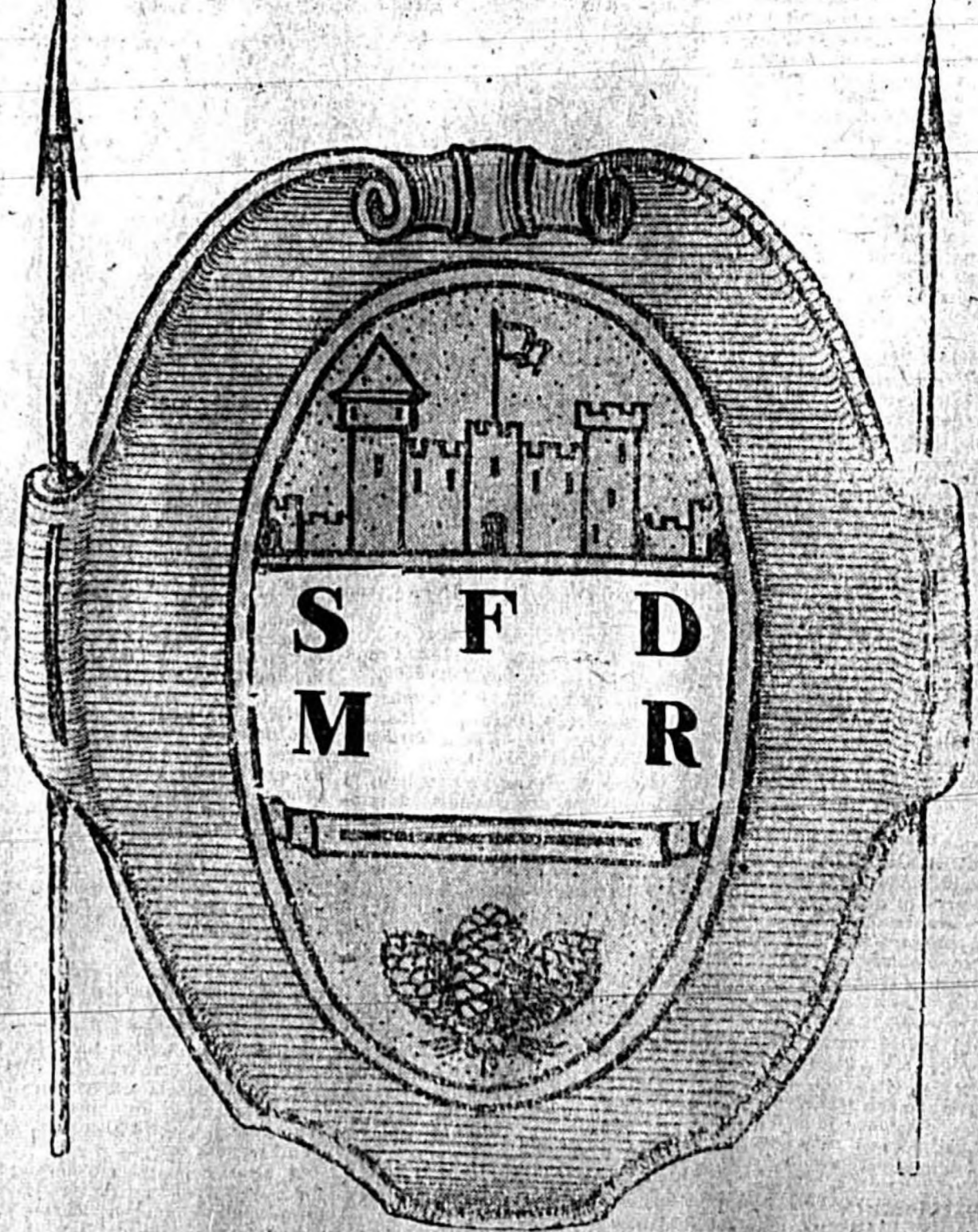

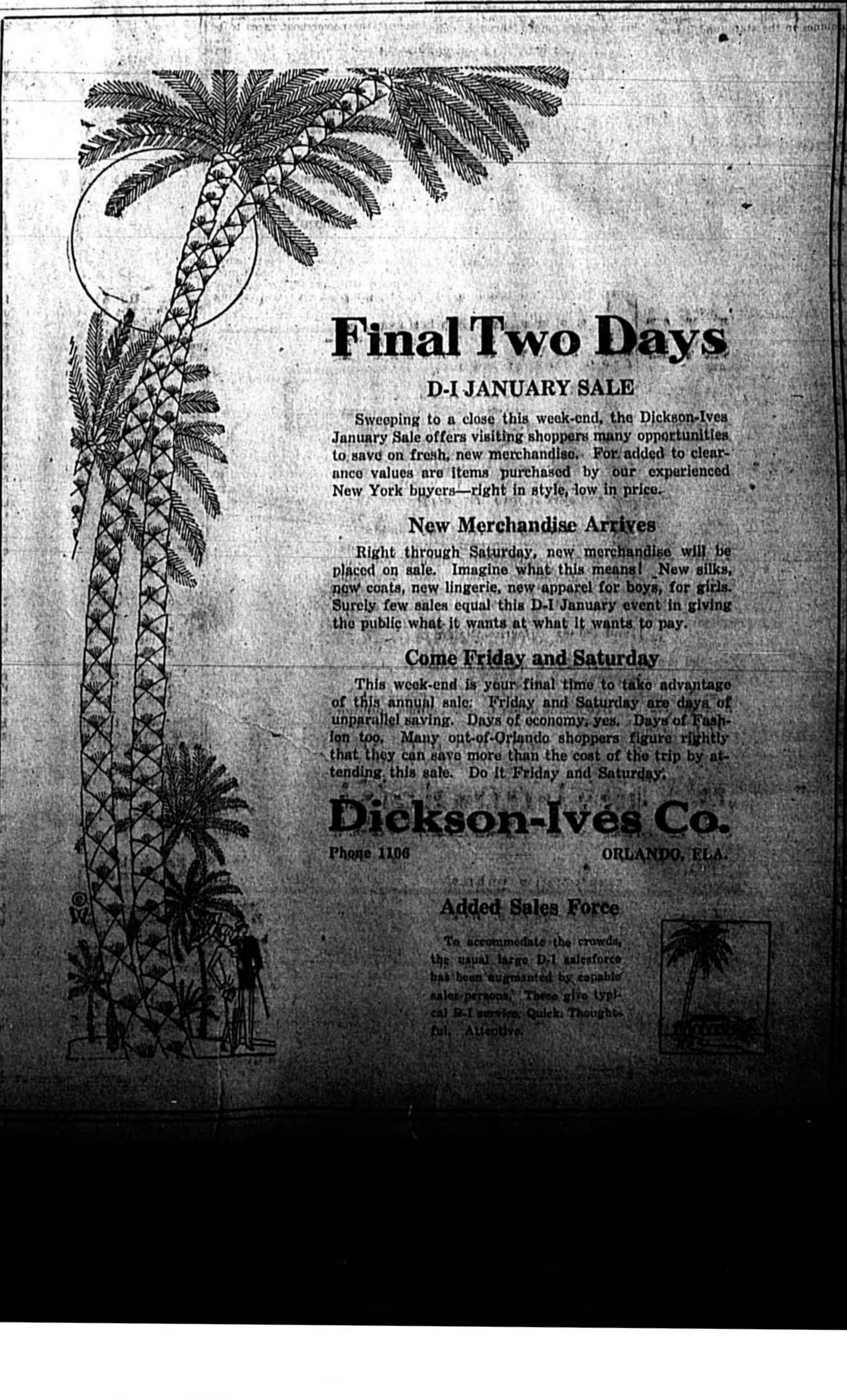

Continued Broad Production in All Lines Of Work Is Now Predicted For Present Year

ATLANTA, Ga., Jan. 14.—For the first half of 1926 economic conditions seem to warrant belief in a continued broad production and distribution in most lines, with railway traffic probably at least upon a parity with the traffic of 1925, it was pointed out here today by railway executives.

It is difficult to see beyond the middle of the year, it was shown, because of the importance which crops will have, not alone in traffic offered for transportation, but in replenishing and continuing the purchasing power of the great farming population 1926 crops being reasonably large in price, railway men say the year 1926 may slightly surpass 1925 in amount and fairly adequate in the volume of traffic handled.

The roads, it is expected, will add to food times by perhaps large purchases of cars and locomotives than in 1925 and by a continuance of important work on their track and structures, it was believed here. It would seem, one executive suggested, that total expenditures by the roads during the year will probably at least equal the 750 million dollars of last year.

Effect on Public Opinion
The attitude of public opinion toward the improved earning power of the railroads will probably have a critical effect upon future developments, executives point out. On the basis of a fair return to be looked upon merely as a theoretical high water mark, to be attained only occasionally and to be instantly followed by increased charges of reduced rates, or both? is a question some of the executives ask. If so, they say, then after all the roads will have made little progress in understanding the state of modern society in adequate and prosperous railroads.

If on the other hand, Atlanta railway executives claim, the great body of shipper and public opinion remains favorable to the main 1926 may well be considered the start of a new era.

Investment in railroad securities should, as a result, become much more attractive. Popular participation in such investment may be expected upon a scale never before seen in this country. This would enable the railroads greatly to increase the number of citizens who become partners in the business and to increase the stability of railroad investment by more nearly balancing their capital as between stocks and bonds, it was asserted here.

Taylor's Selection To Commerce Body Gets Senate Okey

WASHINGTON, Jan. 14.—(AP)—The battlefront over President Coolidge's nominations to the Interstate Commerce Commission was reduced by half Wednesday with the confirmation by the senate of the appointment of Richard V. Taylor of Alabama.

Senator Blewett (D.), South Carolina, alone held out against Mr. Taylor, but the nomination of Thomas F. Woodlock, of New York who is serving under a recess appointment, continued to face much stiffer opposition.

Mr. Woodlock appeared before the Senate Interstate Commerce Commission committee meeting for questioning by Senator Wheeler (D.), Montana, and will appear again tomorrow. Some members of the committee predicted that the fight over his nomination, which

the senate refused to act upon at the last session, would be a long one.

Coming before the senate with the unanimous endorsement of the Interstate Commerce Commission, the Taylor nomination was confirmed without a roll call and after only a brief address by Senator Blewett. It was stated that this senator was the only one to vote in the negative on the viva voce vote.

NORTH CAROLINA CITY ONCE HOME OF BIG SHIPYARD

Fire Discloses Fact That Civil War Period Saw Many Great Confederate Plans Worked In Old Navy Yard

CHARLOTTE, N. C., Jan. 14.—(AP)—This inland city was once the possessor of an extensive navy yard.

Down in the railroad section, a few blocks off Tryon Street, a thoroughfare named after General Tryon, one-time governor of His Majesty's colony of North Carolina, a heap of blackened ashes marks the spot where 60 years ago the Confederate government rushed the Norfolk navy yard supplies to save them from capture by the Northern army.

Thus came about the erection of what has been claimed here as "the far inland navy yard in modern history."

The incident that is credited with having thrown the Southern executives into flight over the safety of their Norfolk station, was the battle in Hampton Roads between the Monitor and Merrimack. Tools and machinery from the Virginia yards were hastily loaded aboard flat cars and sent southward to Charlotte.

Frame structures were hurriedly constructed on acquired property and included a gun carriage shop, a laboratory, and a torpedo shop. Next a forge shop was built, in which was made the largest steam hammer turned out in the South up to that period. Here also shafting was forged for all the Confederate "iron clads." Rifles, solid shot, shells and torpedoes were manufactured, as well as batteries for all vessels.

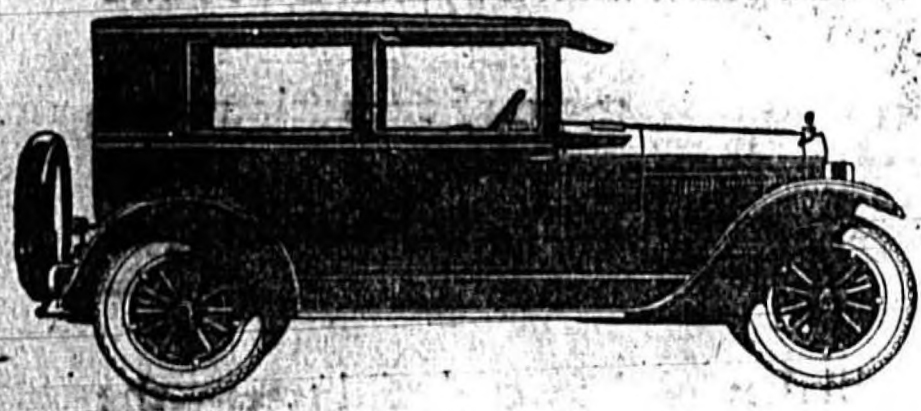

Mark Twain's Old Print Shop Is Being Made Into Souvenir Library In Iowa

KEOKUK, Ia., Jan. 14.—(AP)—A rare piece of Americana—a copy of the Keokuk city directory of 1856, part of which was hand set by Mark Twain and in which he listed himself as an "antiquarian"—recently was found and subsequently lost in a curious manner. The Iowa State Insurance Company acquired and incorporated in its office building an adjoining structure in which Orion Clemens, brother of the humorist, conducted a printing establishment in Keokuk in the late '50s. In making alterations a copy of the directory was found beneath the floor of the room in which the youthful Samuel Clemens worked. The find was made by a workman, who, not knowing of the book's sentimental and bibliophilic value, examined it casually, and then tossed it aside in a pile of rubbish. Later, news of the discovery became known, but by that time the book had disappeared. The only other known copy of the directory is in the Keokuk Public Library. Although the building that housed the old Clemens printing shop virtually has been rebuilt, the room in which Mark Twain worked has been left untouched. It has been set aside as a museum and library for the display of his souvenirs, one of the most interesting being the old printing case. Other objects include an oil painting of the writer at twenty-one, a later portrait, first editions and autographed copies of Twain's books. The Mark Twain tradition thrives lustily in this Mississippi river town, where he made his first after-dinner speech and received pay for his first newspaper writing. In addition to the printing shop, the old Twain homestead still stands. While still in his teens, Mark left Hannibal, Mo., where he had

ATTEMPT MADE TO SAVE ANCIENT KENTUCKY FALLS

Nine States Join In Protest Against Establishment Of Hydro-Electric Plant On The Cumberland River

CUMBERLAND FALLS, Ky., Jan. 14 (AP)—Nine states are joining Governor Fields' protest to save Cumberland Falls, Kentucky's largest waterfall, from impairment by commercial development. Mrs. W. L. Atkeson of Artesia, New Mexico, calls the Falls in Whitley and McCreary counties, "a gift of God," in a wild and picturesque region where the Cumberland River comes down from Pine and Cumberland mountains flanked by forested hills and plunges in falls below a narrow, tortuous gorge. Wyoming, Kansas and West Virginia, through their State Federations of Women's Clubs, have sent copies of their protests to the Federal Power Commission at Washington. Chairmen of the conservation departments of the Federation of Women's Clubs in other states have filed protests to the Kentucky State Park Commission against the application of hydro-electric power companies for permit to operate a power project in this region. Acknowledging the letters of protest, O. C. Merrill, executive secretary of the federal power commission, comprising the secretaries of war, interior and agriculture at Washington, said that careful consideration will be given to the "possible effect the construction of this project would have on the scenic beauty of Cumberland Falls." The main objection is to the power dams that would be built.
