





The American Army in Europe fired a billion rounds of small arms ammunition after arriving in Normandy, not to mention 48, 322,539 artillery shells, and threw 4,853,888 hand grenades. The American soldier is one of the best shots in the world, but nobody, even the worst shot, could fire that much ammunition without hitting something.

Elliott Roosevelt who owns dogs that like to fly was one of America's most successful young businessmen before the war start-ed. If your father was President of the United States and you could borrow \$200,000 from the head of a big chain organization, In fact, most of the New Dealers in Washington seem to have been quite successful lately.

Big Ships

When this war ends, we shall have not only the bigest and most effective navy in human history, but the reatest individual ships. Of these, the queen is the S.S. America, built in an American shippard and intended for passenger-service, but used as a transport. With a new name, the West Point, the great giant traveling in solitary ride carried more than 350,000 men to Europe without single loss. She is truly a "whale of a ship," with 93 ret beam and 723 feet length, and she carries a crew of 800 nen and 7,700 passengers.

That makes her the queen of transports. It raises he natural question, how far ships of any-kind can pro-itably go in the matter of combined size and speed. Prohecies along this line seem always to be getting broken, and it seems likely that we shall yet have ships 1,000 feet long, or more.

Cut still more effective, perhaps, is the growing realization hat the colored races are needed in the general scheme of hings-that they possess better qualities and abilities than they have usually been credited with. And if they themselves have wise leadership, the end of the present century may find them much fartner advanced than they are now, in the general scheme of life on this globe.

Their progress, however, depends largely on wise leadership among their own people. The most effective line of progress among them is education and the cultivation of mutual tolerance and good will.
