City Hall Location Decided; Park Ave. Site Is Retained

Sanford, Florida 32771-Price 10 Cent

The issue of where to locate Sanford's new city hall was effectively settled Monday night after a rapid-fire series of the over-all cost of the project. motions by City Commissioner John Morris. The new structure will be placed

on the present Park Avenue site. The motions, designating the Park Avenue site for the new \$1.8 million structure, also called for closing Park Avenue from Fulton Street north to note Boulevard to create a pedestrian nall. Steps were also taken to acquire property adjoining the City Hall property. Morris' motions came after a presentation by John Krider, representing the Bankers' Committee of the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce, urging he commission to locate the new city hall at the present site.

In his presentation, Krider reminded commissioners that the Downtown Businessmen's Association, and Sanford's Interested Sarahs To Encourage Rejuvenation, the latter a group interested in preserving city historical sites, had taken positions similar to that of the Bankers' Committee, while a survey performed by the Downtown Development hall site was popular with Sanford residents



The 2.6 acres, owned by the Florida State Bank, (Flagship Bank of Sanford) will be needed to complement the cityowned 2.4 acre site in providing enough space for the new city hall, according to a report to the city commission by City Manager W.E. Knowles.

Knowles' report, drawn up earlier this year, indicates that Florida State Bank currently is asking \$110,000 for the property, although the city at one time held an option to purchase the parcel for about as a result of city assistance to the bank in obtaining that land from the Atlantic Coastline Railroad. Later the Corporation also showed the present city bank requested a release from the option. which was granted by the city com-

Florida voters went to the polls today to cast ballots in the second major match between President Ford and challenger Ronald Reagan, while three leading Democratic contenders each hoped to emerge as a frontrunner for their party's presidential nomination.

Election officials had predicted that less than half the state's 3.4 million registered voters would go to the polls, and a forecast of widespread rain and a tornado watch in north Florida could keep the turnout even







Government Spying Targets

WASHINGTON (AP) - Women's libbers, Communists, militant blacks and Jews and taxpayers protesting against taxes were among the targets of domestic surveillance by government agencies, a Senate committee

The Senate intelligence committee released nearly 1,000 pages of documents Monday, detailing domestic FBI wiretap and surveillance operations and Internal

Revenue Service undercover spying. One memo shows the FBI used informers during 1969 and 1970 to keep track of the women's liberation movement in several U.S. cities, but never turned up any evidence of revolutionary or violent activity.

Official Sought In Slayings

COLUMBIA, N.C. (AP) - A U.S. State Department official is being sought by police for questioning in the bludgeon deaths of five members of his family, whose burning bodies were found in a swampy grave near this eastern North Carolina village.

The victims were identified Monday as the family of Bradford Bishop Jr., 39, assistant chief of the special trade activities office of the State Department's economic and business section.

North Carolina Atty Gen. Rufus Edmisten said Bishop who had not reported to his office for a week, "is being sought for questioning," although Edmisten added that Bishop could be "lying dead somewhere."

Explosives Sales Charged

HARTFORD (AP) - A fireworks company owner who sold explosives to a government undercover agent posing as an agent of the Irish Republican Army has been sentenced to two years in jail.

Lawrence C. Alton, 36, of St. Petersburg, and Hughesville, Pa. pleaded guilty in December to conspiracy to transport from Pennsyivania to Connecticut 180 bricks of plastic explosives.

Moslem Army Deserters

Seize Lebanese Garrison

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Moslem army deserters took over another southern Lebanese garrison before dawn today, and President Suleiman Franjieh warned that a chain of mutinies might encourage Israel tc invade south Lebanon and trigger a new Middle East war.

Parliamentary sources said units from the rebel "Lebanese Arab Army" occupied the garrison at Rachava, a strategic town that controls supply routes from Syria to Palestinian guerrilla bases in south

The sources had no immediate information whether there was a shootout in Rachaya, the main station at the end of the so-called "Arafat Trail" on the western slopes of Mount Hermon just six miles from the Israeli border.

Russia Blocks Parts Sale

WASHINGTON (AP) - Russia has blocked India from supplying spare parts for Egypt's Soviet-built MIG21 jet fighters, U.S. intelligence sources said today.

The new Russian move, following its own cutoff maintenance support for Egypt's air force, was reported as the Ford administration was laying the groundwork for possible sales of U.S. warplanes and antitank missiles to Egypt.

India, which produces MIGs and other weapons under Russian license, was said to have asked Moscow's permission to sell spare parts to Egypt after the Cairo government appealed to India for help.



Shrouded In Secrecy, Oil Talks Continue

PANAMA CITY (AP) - The top-secret meeting between an Arabian sheik and four U.S. oil company executives entered its third day today, arousing the in-

terest of government and political figures. But the concerns of federal officials and a presidentia candidate were fueled more by the dearth of knowledge on negotiations between Saudi Arabian Oil Minister Sheik Ahmed Yamani and representatives of Exxon, Texaco, Mobil and Standard Oil of California.

As from the beginning, there was no news from inside Monday on how the talks were going or when they might end. A statement by the ArabianAmerican Oil Co., the object of the negotiations, said the meeting concerned "the transfer of ownership" of Aramco and would end shortly

Frank Zarb, director of the Federal Energy Administration, said the talks over nationalization of the firm are just one more indication we have lost influence over the control of world oil prices."

Tucker Supports Bill

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - House Speaker Donald Tucker has joined supporters of a constitutional amendment before Florida voters today on a property tax for water management.

"We must act now to recognize the magnitude of our potential future problems and act to head them off," Tucker, Tallahassee, said Mond iy.

"Perhaps none are more significant than managing, distributing and conserving our water resources," he told the Panama City chapter of the Florida Audubon Society, which has gone on record against the amendment.

Development Rules Asked

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - The Cabinet has been asked to send back development rules in the Florida Keys today for a popular vote on whether population growth should be limited in the island chain.

William Keeser, president of the Greater Key West Citizens Committee, said he would renew his request at the Cabinet meeting. The regulations, drawn up by the State Planning

Division, make no mention of limiting population. They were ordered to a public hearing in January in the Keys, but were returned without any recommended changes.

Budget Criticism Due

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Education officials have been pouring over the fine print in Gov. Reubin Askew's \$5.019 billion 1976-77 budget and they don't like what they

Zollie Maynard, co-chairman of the Florida Coalition for Responsible Funding of Education, said he would release a detailed criticism of the budget today. The \$2.48-billion general revenue portion of Askew's recommended budget would give public schools \$976.8 million, \$229 million less than the \$1 billion requested by Education Commissioner Ralph Turlington.

Wallace Chides Opponents

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Alabama Gov. George Wallace has closed the Florida presidential primary campaign by chiding his major rivals for adopting his positions on busing, big government and tax reform.


Wallace wound up his campaign here Monday at a spirited hand-clapping rally attended by a predominantly young audience of about 1,100 persons. He said earlier Monday at a Jacksonville airport news

conference that he expected to repeat his 1972 victory in today's primary, but would not speculate on whether he would match the 42 per cent of the vote he received in 1972.


Rommie Loudd Sentenced



Intelligence Reforms Needed In U.S.

Recent investigations have shown that stronger controls on the Central Intelligence Agency are needed.

President Ford's plans for reorganizing the ntelligence community are responsive to the findings of the Rockefeller commission and the House Intelligence Committee. The findings of the Senate Intelligence Committee are to be announced

But only Congress can take responsibility for the most important reform - establishing a Join Congressional Committee on Intelligence, similar to the joint committee on atomic energy.

Congressional oversight must be strengthened. In the past congressional responsibility has been scattered among four committees. Only a few members of each committee were informed. They often failed to inform the other members. Appropriations were inducen in the Pentagon budget and were known to only a few congressmen. There was no effective check and balance on the executive branch.

Committees within the executive branch, no matter how many or how organized, do not provide an independent check upon the executive. Only the Congress can do that.

President Ford has expressed support for the formation of a joint committee on intelligence, even though he did not consider it proper or necessary to include the proposal in his program of recommendations.

The responsibility now rests with Congress to organize an effective oversight committee and see that it functions effectively

Congress also should examine critically the President's proposals for strengthening the shield of secrecy around the executive branch.

We do not need an "Official Secrets Act" in any guise. More candor and public knowledge are needed to strengthen our foreign pulicy, not more secrecy.

The President's proposals to give the government new legal powers to prevent the publication of official secrets would seem to institutionalize a secrecy system that has been responsible for most of our mistakes in recent years.

Military Union

Now that military pay and benefits have been increased to attract volunteers to an all-volunteer defense force, it was predictable that the level of pay and benefits would become more important to the members of that force. The economic advantages of serving in the peacetime

military services have been stressed. It must be remembered, however, that a military job is not an ordinary job. In wartime patriotic duty must become the dominating motive, and material considerations become secondary

Therefore the introduction of labor union organizations into the ranks of our fighting men would be inappropriate. The collective bargaining and grievance procedure that is followed in private industry and, increasingly, in public employment would be out of place in the military.

And yet labor unions - the American Federation of Government Employes, the National Maritime Union and the Association of Civil Technicians - are thought to be ready to start organizing the three million men in uniform. Many career servicemen favor a union, according to a survey by the Fleet Reserve Association. They feel they need

some kind of organization to protect their benefits. Organization may be desirable, but not on the labor union model and not involving labor union organizers.

Military men are their own breed, holding their own kind of pride. Theirs is a special role in our society. They should have their own special organization, if they need one to lobby for them in Washington. Meanwhile, our representatives in Washington should go

slow whenever they are tempted to start trimming military benefits, lest they drive the troops into the arms of union organizers.

The average time between Russian successes and local disillusionment has been calculated at 10 years, give or take a year or so.

But there seems to be no doubt of Russian objectives. TOM TIEDE Corruption In Georgia Town Gone America is nostalgic. The fading away of

corruption in this tiny Southern community is instead, for the nation as well as the residents, a signal for joy and hope. Good riddance to the past in Ludowici, it was awful. The future by comparison can't be anything but good.

For as far back as anyone remembers Ludowici and surrounding Long County were twin bastions of repression in the flats of Georgia timber country. Politics were controlled by a rumpled old legal baron named Ralph Dawson and the law was in the hands of equally monarchical Brown Jones. No one held office who didn't agree with this majority of two, and woe be those who violated what passed for the rules. Rule really. Says a local: "The only thing Dawson and Jones demanded was that they ge theirs and they did get it, oh, they did."

What they got was a nationwide reputation for running one of the sleaziest counties i America. Former Georgia Gov. Lester Maddo: said it aptly enough: "The place is lousy, rotten corrupt, nasty and no good." The sentiment was echoed by an astonishing number of traveling Americans who from unhappy experience nicknamed Ludowici "The Town Without Pity."

Located southwest of Savannah at the crossroads of what used to be major highway routes 301 and 82, Ludowici became the 1940-50s the speed trap capital of the nation. "Anybody who came through got clipped," says filling station operator J. D. Futch.

Once got, the routine never varied. Police would harrass the victims, with heavy questions, this to get them properly worried, then slap them with heavy fines. Payment was immediate, of course, usually to a judge, but sometimes to the police who promptly pocketed the cash. Visitors without means were treated with special severity, normally the clink where visions of the chain gang were implanted until such time as the motorists came up with money from home.

But traffic violations were only part of the ruse. Present Sheriff Cecil Nobles, who was reared two miles outside of Ludowici, says there were unlimited ways in which the locals separated the tourists from their money. Service station attendants checking engine oil would often foul up carburetors, then direct the motorists to a swindle garage for "repairs." Some stores had different prices for tourists than for regulars. Barkeeps often flimflammed customers into paying for double the drinks. "We had dice games, whores, con artists, you name it," says Sheriff Nobles, "our reputation

Supporters Celebrate Florida Victory **Carter Win Not Peanuts**

"We Work For Peanuts" said the signs at Democratic Presidential candidate Jimmy Carter's Florida headquarters in Orlando.

The payoff wasn't peanuts Tuesday night, as the peanut farmer from Plains, Ga., plowed to victory in Florida's Presidential Preference Primary, ending Alabama Governor George Wallace's decade of dominance over the

It was one of the rare nights for relaxing and basking in victory for Carter, who dashed back from a day of elecioneering in North Carolina to watch the returns with his Florida workers.

The Carlton House Hotel campaign headquarters really wasn't the place to find out what was happening. The only people in the ballroom who knew anything about the results learned it from television - and people in the dediroont had the surreal experience of watching on TV while a reporter 50 feet away told them a large, en-

thusiastic crowd was waiting for Carter in the ballroom. No one but the inner circle knew who had carried Dade County and only reporters who were in Carter's suite when the Panhandle returns came in knew the former Georgia governor had beaten Wallace in his own backyard.

In the ballroom, the liquor was flowing, the band was playing Southern rock and the crowd was waiting for Carter.

He arrived at his suite shortly before 8 p.m. - before the polls even closed in the Florida Panhandle, where Wallace was expected to run the strongest - and found a roomful of jubilant relatives and campaign workers, including his wife, Rosalyn, sons, Chip and Jeff and their wives and 8-year-old daughter, Amy, in a ponytail. "It's hard to believe," Carter said when he was fulled in on CBS' projection of his victory. Leon County and Tallahassee, giving him 53 per cent of the vote, obviously delighted Carter. "That's unbelievable," he said.

Patrick Caddell, the pollster who engineered George McGovern's intricate victories at the 1972 Democratic convention, said CBS' projected results fit in with trends he noted in two separate polls taken in December and February. "They showed Wallace's base was slipping," he said.

In a meeting with the press later, Carter explained the polling. "A week before New Hampshire we were two or three points behind Wallace," he said. "We picked up five or six points that week and didn't lose anything through Massachusetts."

Carter was subdued in his victory - though he was more effusive than he was following the New Hampshire primary, reporters traveling with him said. He clearly seemed to believe the Florida victory was a breakthrough. "I don't see anybody ahead of me now," he

said. "But there are still almost 40 states to go." He said he expected his biggest challenge -- now that he had turned back Wallace - to come from Arizona Congressman Morris Udall, a liberal, and possibly Senator Henry (Scoop) Jackson, who ran third in Florida, well behind Carter and Wallace.

"It's hard to say a person is strong who hasn't won a single primary or caucus," Carter said of Udall, but predicted the Congressman would "almost certainly be first in Wisconsin."

Carter gave credit for the win to superior organization, good advertising and the personal campaigning he and his family conducted.

"In every state that we worked hard and where peop got to know Jimmy, we've won," said Mrs. Carter. Carter was restrained in forecasting the Florida vid
