## Production In County Ranks 3rd In Florida

Fruit And Vegetable Shipments Total 6,573 Carlots For Season Of 1935-36

## Seminole First In Celery Rank

Green Value Of Crop In State Advances By Ten Millions

Seminole County ranked first in straight carlot shipments of fruit and vegetables made in the 1935-36 season, according to an annual report of the Florida State Marketing Bureau received here today by the Seminole County Chamber of Commerce.

During the period between Aug. 1, 1935 and July 31, 1936, this county exported 6,573 carlots of fruit and vegetables, the report reveals. The record was exceeded only by Polk county, with 10,941, and by Orange county, with 7,068.

Rail and boat shipments of the two commodities for the season were 18.6 percent below the average volume for the last ten seasons, however, the gross value of the past crop was approximately \$26,000,000 more than for the previous year, it was reported.

In vegetables alone, this county shipped 5,233 carlots, valued at \$2,500,000, compared only to Palm Beach county, which recorded a total of 4,233 carlots.

## Loyal Troops Rain Shells Into Alcazar

Government Estimates 1,200 Royalists Slain As 2 Mines Shatter Building

TOLEDO, Sept. 19.—Socialist shells crunched viciously into blood-spattered Alcazar today as Government gunners sought to demolish fragments of the Fascist refuge where 1,200 insurgents were estimated to have met a mutilating death by explosion yesterday.

Government cannon rained steel into the battered fortress as the militia awaited arrival of new supplies before making an infantry assault over heaps of crushed masonry.

The soldiers, who charged into the wreck which once was the royal palace, declared 1,200 of 1700 Fascists—men, women and children—who voluntarily imprisoned themselves inside the Alcazar, died when two mines were touched off by the Government.

Rebels continued to return Government fire, blasting away from cellars where they took refuge when loyal forces blew up ground structures.

Government leaders said it is only a matter of time until they killed the remaining Rebels or took them prisoners.

## Sanfordites Hear Democratic Heads At Orlando Rally

Re-Election Of Roosevelt Advocated By Party Leaders

Fred Coss, Democratic nominee for governor, yesterday reiterated his pledge to call a special session of the legislature in January "to keep out compensation in Florida."

He spoke before a huge Democratic rally in Orlando attended by scores of Sanford citizens.

The entire list of speakers, which included Senate Nominees Claude Pepper and C. O. Andrews, asserted their unified intentions of standing behind President Roosevelt. The statements were widely applauded.

In advocating the President's re-election, Judge Andrews cited percentages of increase in business of every line for the past three years.

Coss asserted that the "Roosevelt Administration has brought back prosperity to the United States."

Pepper's sentiments were summed up in a plea for "Democratic freedom and the re-election of President Roosevelt."

A parade through the center of Orlando preceded yesterday's rally. Coss was entertained at luncheon at noon.

In a brief address at the noon-day rally, he declared his intention of certain improvements to roads and highways.

Degrading into another line of thought, he declared that Florida is going to seek much from the Roosevelt Administration within the next four years.

The nominee for governor reiterated a campaign statement that sectionalism should be abolished once and for all in the state.

## Municipal Police To Take Offices In City Prison

Shift From Old Location Is Made In Move For Economy

City Commissioners last night authorized the re-establishment of the municipal police in the City Jail Building where municipal court is now held.

For several years, Chief Roy Williams and his officers have been quartered in a small office in the rear of the fire station. The move was originally made to foster efficiency.

In last night's discussion of the new move, it was brought out that conditions now existing, which were not present some years ago, made it more economical to re-habilitate the City Jail.

Municipal prisoners, in the past, have been confined in the County Prison. It was understood that the City's Prison will be used for that purpose after the move is made.

Chief Williams today was preparing to shift his office equipment from the old location to the new. It was believed the present police headquarters will have been abandoned by Oct. 1.

Last night's Commission session was called for further study of the 1936-37 budget, and Mayor Shinholser reported considerable progress.

While the body apparently has agreed upon the allocation of funds to certain departments, proposed expenditures for other branches of government have not been settled, and the Commission expressed a desire not to make public any figures until the entire budget is adopted.

Another session is scheduled for Monday night when Commissioners will devote the time principally to budget work.

The City's fiscal year begins Oct. 1, and the tax roll and budget is expected to have been completed by that time.

## New York Flayed By Strong Winds

## High Pressure Area Shoves Storm Into East Over Ocean

NEW YORK, Sept. 19.—One of the worst hurricanes in history swung out to sea northeast of here today with all vessels warned to get out of the way.

Despite its violence over 1,000 miles of Atlantic coastline, only seven persons were known killed. Twenty-three more were missing.

The death toll estimated at 40 was drastically revised when 34 men, feared lost from the steamer Long Island in Delaware Bay, were found alive on a coal barge two miles off shore. Four of the crew still are missing. Three are believed to be dead.

Disrupted communications prevented an accurate estimate of property damage although preliminary reports indicated millions were lost.

As the great storm, with winds as high as 100 miles per hour, circled northeastward, Connecticut apparently escaped damage. Winds and rains which swept that state through the night abated. Elsewhere in New England the coast was whipped by heavy rains and gales but damage was reported light.

### Stamp It Out

The National Crime Prevention League's report that the underworld "has well matured plans to exploit the public" in Florida is not unexpected. Every year the criminal gentry of the country concentrates on this state during the winter season when the great influx of wealthy tourists takes place. All resort centers the world over have had to face the problem of combating vicious elements which center their activities where people of means gather to play.

In the early days of Florida's prominence as a tourist center, the chief means used to separate winter guests from their money was the "confidence game." This was a highly refined method in which finance was the predominant characteristic, and in which violence had no part whatever. It was a game of gentleman criminals, who wore kid gloves and spoke with a broad "A." The victim was relieved so easily of his money that he didn't have the heart or face to report the matter to the police.

Now things are different. The "smoothies" of yesterday have been supplanted by a breed of criminal which appears to have gotten his training in Chicago. Fine talk and fine manners have given way to "guts" and brass knuckles as the modus of robbing tourists. "Stick-up" men are as prevalent in the state in the winter time as card sharks are on an ocean liner.

This is the condition which should arouse every law enforcement agency in Florida into action. As long as the seasonal crime wave was limited to confidence men and sharpers, the menace to our public was not so dangerous, but when gangsters begin to use violence, then every means possible to eradicate the evil should be adopted.

### Brand Them

In some European countries, motorists who flagrantly violate traffic rules get their cars painted with a brightly colored emblem so that the public can know who it is that makes the highways and roads unsafe. Commenting on this system, the Lake County Citizen says:

"It is said that this practice, newly started, has caused an appreciable decline in dangerous driving, as motorists naturally want to avoid the embarrassment and publicity the emblem gives them."

"A great many thousand American motorists should have their cars so branded."

"The worst class of offenders consists of those who push the throttle to the floorboard as soon as they get out of sight of a traffic officer. Excessive speed—and there are times when 15 miles per hour is excessive—is responsible for more deaths than any other driving violation."

"Passing on hills and curves and 'meandering' through traffic are also potent causes of death, injury and destruction. On a myriad tragic occasions, a driver has tried to save a needless minute—at the cost of a life."

"Driving on the wrong side of the road, jumping traffic lights, passing at intersections—are practices dear to the heart of the Dark Angel. They help keep our morgues full to capacity."

"Yes, it might be a good idea to adopt the branding practice in this country. A suitable emblem would be a skull and cross-bones."

### SANFORD TWENTY YEARS AGO

**MIAMI, Sept. 18.**—Two posse men were killed and two injured in an encounter early today in the Everglades with four bandits sought for robbery of \$4,000 from the State Bank of Homestead last Friday. Four shots were heard, followed quickly by another. Al Anderson and W. C. Anderson, members of the posse, fell dead, while Charles R. Williams received five buckshot wounds in his left side and arm and William Anderson was shot through the thigh. Reorganizing his forces, Sheriff Dan Hardie, leader of the pursuers, started after the bandits and the last report was that the bandits had been surrounded in a dense swamp.

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Sept. 18.**—Six witnesses were examined yesterday morning in the matter of the case against the state canvassing board to show cause why it should not re-canvass the votes on governor. The morning was given over to the question of whether the ballot boxes had been tampered with in Madison county.

### Court Says Change Common Law Rules

**TALLAHASSEE, Sept. 19.**—(AP)—Changes in rules governing common law procedure in trial courts of the state were ordered by the Florida Supreme Court yesterday. They go into effect October 1.

The court adopted several amendments to new rules recently drafted, and provided for continued study of the rules in practice as an aid to the practical administration of justice and as a cure for any imperfections that may be found therein.

Certain objections and suggested changes to the drafted rules were rejected in the court's order today, without prejudice to their future consideration after the new rules are tested.

### State Crime Target, Avers Crime League

**TALLAHASSEE, Sept. 19.**—(AP)—The National Crime Prevention League's report that "the underworld" has "well matured plans to exploit the public" in Florida will be referred to state attorneys and other officers for investigation.

Governor Sholtz's office acknowledged receipt yesterday of a letter from G. Rowland Monroe of New York, attorney for the league, and advised him his letter would be referred to local authorities.

Monroe said the league "has definite and dependable reports of the well matured plans of the underworld to exploit the public, which they did last season."

### Citrus Is Assessed Ten Cents Per Box

**TAMPA, Sept. 19.**—(AP)—Directors of the Florida Citrus Exchange, meeting for the first time in the current shipping season, voted a grover assessment of 10 cents per box of fruit for sales and advertising expenses. This assessment, known to growers as the "retain," is the same as last year. Efforts to increase it one cent were unsuccessful.

"Lace pages stained with cream and eggs and butter, Swept and highly scented with memories."

"Aunt Mary's Gingerbread," "The Line's Frolics," "Bring back old parties and festivities!"

Cranberries that Emma always made for pie, Unbalanced menus rich in calories. Who would consider such a sentimental? But what were hoopoes can recall like these?"

Someone has said that the history of a people is written in its architecture, but it is equally true that it is written in its food—not only the history of a people—but also the biography of a person. If you don't believe that a cookbook has any romantic possibilities, get out your own recipe some day, and you'll find a record of your past as revealing and exciting as any biographical book.

That little battered, dog-eared, brown book with its descriptive title, "Recipes A Child Can Cook" with the candy pages stained with smudges of chocolate—doesn't that bring back a happy kitchen out of the long ago when you were very young? It was on of those rainy "let's make fudge" days. Doesn't it bring back your mother, who was so understanding and seemed to realize how tremendously important it was to you to measure the sugar all by yourself and shave the chocolate in to fascinating little curly pieces?

And that recipe for Lady Baltimore cake in Mrs. Dall's cookbook—doesn't that make you think of the teen age, when you made your first cake and father was so proud he took pieces of it down to everybody at the office and boasted, "My daughter made this for my birthday."

Doesn't the very smell of Mexican pecan candy cooking recreate a whole scene when you were off at school—domestic science "lab" kitchen after class, hours just before the Christmas holidays and the rage for making home made candy for presents stimulated by memories of Mary Ware's prowess in this enterprise when she went off to school? And there's the recipe for ravioli that brings back a restaurant in old Mexico as Spanish as Spain—and the one for chicken chow mein written in mid-Pacific on the fly leaf of John Maseloff's "Taking of Heien" by the nice young man on the boat who had been out teaching at Yale in China, and the one for smalls on the back of a menu from the Esplanade in Paris—this one obtained from an amused waiter and valuable only as a souvenir of a happy day that began with a walk in the Bois and ended with an evening at La Comedie Francaise.

And then—even the recipes know that Romance has arrived, for here in the blessed book Aunt Sally gave you when you were married—with the favorite recipe of each of your friends bearing a tag line—there they are like greetings from the past—"Frosty's Cheese Souffle," "Frances's Pecan Waffles," "Dede's Date Nut Bars," "Great Aunt Dona's New Orleans Gumbo," "Mother's Tipsey Charlotte," and dear old black "Mammy Phyllis's Spoon Bread!"

Then there's Ida Bailey Allen's excellent "Bride's Cook Book," with its pages stained with tears as well as icing!
