Forecasters said it would be warmer throughout the state tonight, with a chance of frost in extreme north portions Tuesday morning.

"We did get some freezing temperatures," Florida Citrus Mutual Assistant General Manager Dan Farmer said Sunday night in Lakeland, "but they came at daybreak and so didn't last long enough to do any

Temperatures were higher than forecast...but we'd much rather have the weather service give too many warnings instead of too few."

Some 30,000 Pinellas County homes were without power for several hours Sunday after the thermometer registered 34 degrees early in the day and thousands electrical heaters all struggled to operate at once, about 6,000 homes in Sarasota County, 1,500 homes near Kennedy Space Center and others in the northwest section of the state suffered similar blackouts as residents shivered indoors Sunday for

On request of the building department, county engineer William Bush, reviewed a homerite located in the Palm Springs section of Sanlando, The Suburb Beautiful, with regard to the adequacy of planned floor height, drainage and other conditions at possible variance with the regular The reason for the request was that the building site had

been filled in order to raise the level of the ground to make it less inclined to flood. There was concern that when the proposed dwelling is completed and fill is placed on the lot, flood conditions will occur on Ridgewood Street, affecting at least four other homes, none of which are flooded at this time The first inspection by the county engineer was conducted on September 6 and he said, "These lots are in the lowest point of a land-locked depression. They have no

A second request to Bush from the Building department resulted in another inspection and his recommendations, dated November 30 were: "These lots are in the bottom of a large depression and have no outfall. They are subject to physical flooding and septic tank failure. As the area develops flooding will get worse. I cannot advise building on

### Plumbing Ordinance Hearing

A public hearing will be scheduled upon recommendation of County Attorney Howard Marsee, following review of proposed changes to the first draft of the plumbing ordinance. Some of the changes include requirements that any person seeking eligibility to take the Masters examination, produce proof sufficient to satisfy the Board that he has been a certified journeyman plumber for at least five years. To take the journeyman's examination, proof of at least four years as apprentice plumber must be furnished. The ordinance provides that all persons who are engaged

in the plumbing trade as defined within the ordinance and currently holding a plumbing license issued by any county or municipality having a plumbing board of examiners, will be entitled to a certificate of competency in Seminole County without having to take the examination provided in the ordinance, subject to the filing of required bonds and payment of renewal fees as prescribed. Violations of the ordinance shall be considered a misdemeanor and will be subject to prosecution as provided by State law.

# Apollo Joins Wonders Of The World

Breathes there an American with a soul so dead that his spirits and his heart did not lift as Apollo 17, the final and most dramatic of all of America's moon shots rose from Florida on what may be man's final mission to the moon in this

The drama of the minor contest between man and computers giving instructions to the missile and the awesome spectacle of the launch itself detracted for a moment the attention that Astronauts Eugene Cernan, Ronald Evans and Harrison Schmitt deserved - but not for long.

Even as the Americans disappeared into the voids of space the dicussion about the significance of the moon exploration, as symbolized by Apollo 17, emerged on earth. It is a discursion far removed, for the most part, from cryogeni's, relays, circuits, biology, geology or the material fallout from the expediture of 11 years and \$25 billion in treasure that has dominated earthling discussion previously. Now historians, philosophers and authors have taken over to seek the deeper meaning of the pioneering efforts in space.

Some, like Historians Arthur Schlesinger insist that "the 20th Century will be remembered when all else about it is forgotten as the century in which man first burst out of his terrestrial bonds . . ." Eric Hofer philosophizes deeper that "we might even find God out there . . .

More than a few, such as the French philosopher Dr. Claude Levi Strauss, believe

### One Man's Opinion Big Solar Energy A Long Time Away

Whenever talk turns to the "energy crisis," as it does more and more often these days, someone is certain to bring up the question of solar energy. Why don't they harness the power of sunlight? After all, it's practically limitless and nonpolluting-and free: Scientists calculate that the solar energy reaching the earth amounts to 700 quadrillion kilowatt-hours a year-30,000 times the energy consumed by all of man's may chines and devices.

We are running out of fossil fuels (which are really forms of ancient sunlight). Nuclear energy carries the danger of radioactive and thermal pollution. Geothermal energy-utilizing the interior heat of the earth-seems to have only limited promise.

Actually, attempts to harness solar energy go back at least as far as 212 B.C., when Archimedes was said to have used mirrors to set fire to the sails of a fleet invading Syracuse. In 1912, on the bank of the Nile near Cairo, a pumping engine successfully produced some 50 horsel power on steam generated by a solar boiler.

But only recently, thanks to the energy crunch but also to new technologies forged in the space age, have men seriously considered harnessing or "harvesting" sun power on a scale far beyond individual roofton heaters. For example, a husband-and-wife team of astronomers at the University of Arizona, Aden and Marjorie Meinel, propose covering the desert with arrays of solar energy

The National Science Foundation is funding a half million-dollar University of Minnesota/Honeywell Corp. project similar to the Meinels'. If a working model solar collector proves feasible, the researchers foresee huge 'solar farms" located in unused desert areas. Shade from the 40-foot by 10-foot collectors, they say, could allow the desert to bloom with grass and flowers and provide grazing land for livestock





DEAR POLLY-Recently I bought a one-size-fitsall nylon body suit. After several washings the zipper puckered and got so stiff that it has ruined the clinging shape of the suit. I would appreciate some advice as to what I can do with this -ALICE

DEAR POLLY-Like June's boys, mine are profusely sweaty sleepers and plastic mattress covers under the cotton sheets will protect the mattress but aggravate the sweating. When changing the boys' beds I spray the mattresses with an aerosol disinfectant and then let them air for a few hours. The foam rubber pillows can be washed in cold water at a gentle speed or by hand and bleach can be added to the first rinse to disinfect and deodorize. They will need a couple of rinsings. Sun will do as well as the

bleach if they are air-dried.-HOLLY DEAR GIRLS-The Cleanliness Bureau says when washing foam rubber pillows the machine should run only five minutes and also

PILLOW

ONLY five minutes for each rinsing. To wash by hand, put the foam pillow FOAM RUBBER (in a case, of course) in a deep tub full of warm water and enough detergent so suds stand up. Press pillow down and let spring back. Do this time and time again to push the suds

through the pillow or use a plumber's plunger. When water gets dirty, remove the pillow. Repeat process Rinse with plenty of clean water and squeeze out well with an up and down motion. Put between two bath towels and press down to blot out as much water as possible. DO NOT put foam rubber pillows in the dryer. Dry by fastening pillowcases with clothespins to an outside line in a breezy spot. This takes time DO not expect to use pillows that night.-POLLY







Board

Paint for striping county roads has been authorized by the Board of County Commissioners. A total of 3300 gallons at a cost of \$7,000 will be required for the next six months. Commissioner Dick Williams said that he would recommend that road superintendent, J. C. Lavender be

authorized the full amount of paint, since "we won't save money by delay or bid. There is some emergency for this paint now. "The Board established a bid policy. I recommend bid purchase except in bonafide emergencies, or at least the

contact of two bidders on price. Lavender told the Board that he had 200 gallons of paint on hand, and that his program would be hurt by a shortage.

He said that paint for one week would cost about \$1500. "In the interests of public health and safety," Commissioner Sid Vihlen said, "and based on the recom-Lendations of Commissioner Williams and Mr. Lavender, and the emergency which appears to be in existence, and the cost of purchasing in smaller amounts, I feel the bid should be waived, and that we should award the contract in the amount of \$7,282 to Armstrong Paint in Atlanta." Commissioner John Kimbrough cast the one dissenting

vote. Lavender was also aughorized to seek bids for the remaining six months supply of paint.

Traffic Signal Modifications The design for two proposed traffic signal modifications for left turn movements on 17-92 and SR 434 has been completed, according to a report by county engineer, Bill Bush. He said that the State Department of Transportation will request the manner in which to handle the signals. Bush also

reported that the intersection at Lake Mary Boulevard and

17-92 has been surveyed and that a need for a signal has been found justifiable. This signal is being designed. LAKELAND, Fla. (AP) - An edict restricting news coverage of a murder trial in Fort Myers was tossed out by a state appellate court here Monday but the judge who imposed the restriction said "I don't give a damn" about being overruled.

"I've got a murder trial to run down here," Judge William Lamar Rose said when informed his order had been overturned by the 2nd District Court of Appeal. "I don't give a damn what they do in Lakeland." The trial began last Monday and continues

The Miami Herald Publishing Co. had asked the three-judge appeals panel to enjoin Rose from enforcing a week-old order that limited coverage of the trial solely to what has been said in the courtroom.

"To the extent that the order operates as a prior restraint upon constitutionally privileged publication or communication, it is invalid," the appellate court held. "The trial judge has ample power to insure a fair trial.. without suppressing the press' First Amend-

Rose issued his order at the beginning of the trial of David S. Hedden, 47, an Alva High School science teacher. He is accused of first degree murder in the death of a neighbor, Ray Crawford, 58, of Olga. Crawford was found floating face down in

the Caloosahatche River June 29, four days after he was reported missing. Police said he had been shot four times and a cement block was tied to one of his legs. When the trial began, Judge Rose barred newsmen from reporting anything except testimony delivered in the presence of the

defendant anywhere in the courthouse area. Saturday, in partial response to arguments of Herald attorney John Alley of Miami, the judge decided to allow coverage of testimony heard outside the presence of the jury and to permit pictures everywhere except in the courtroom and adjoining corridors.


