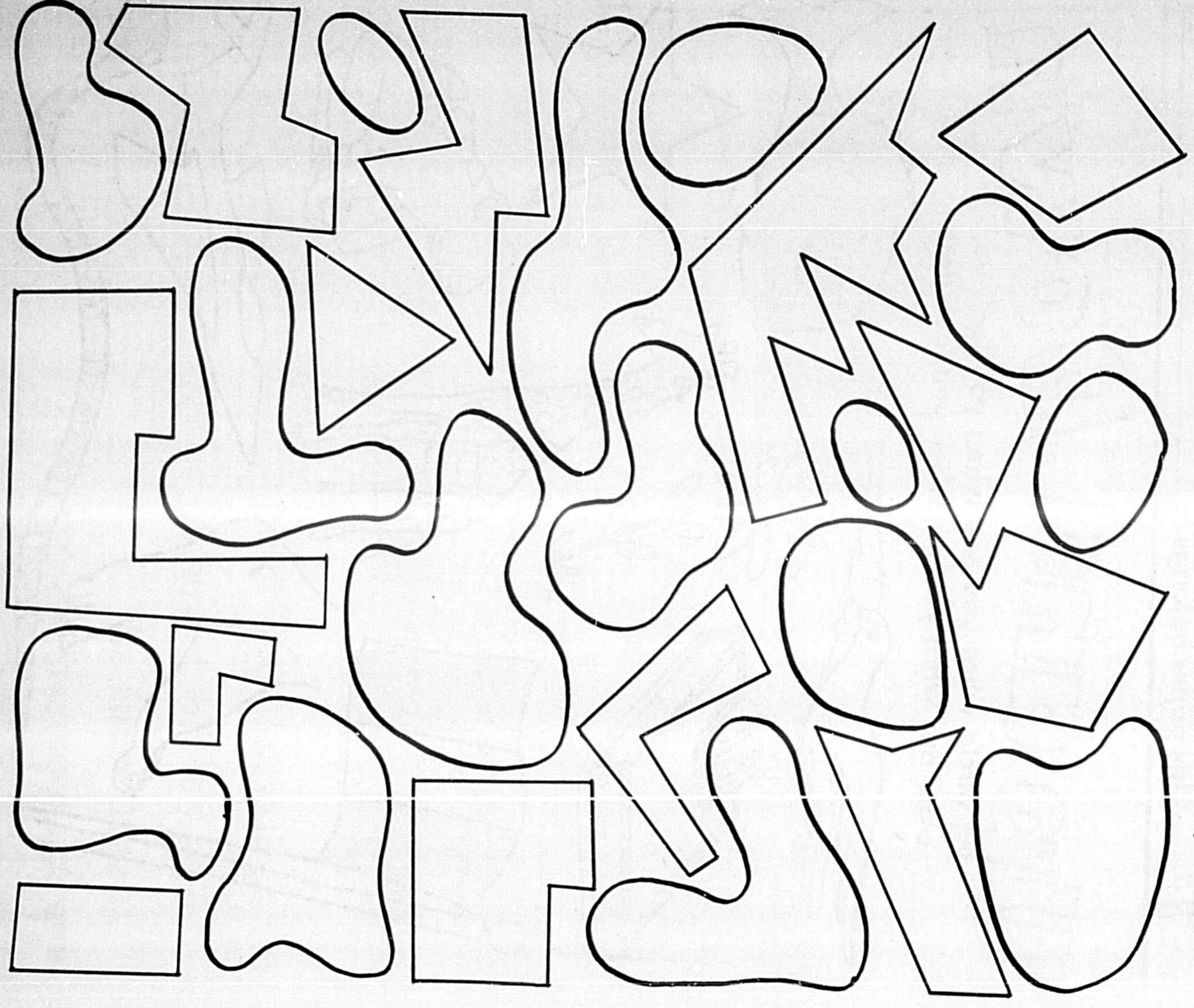
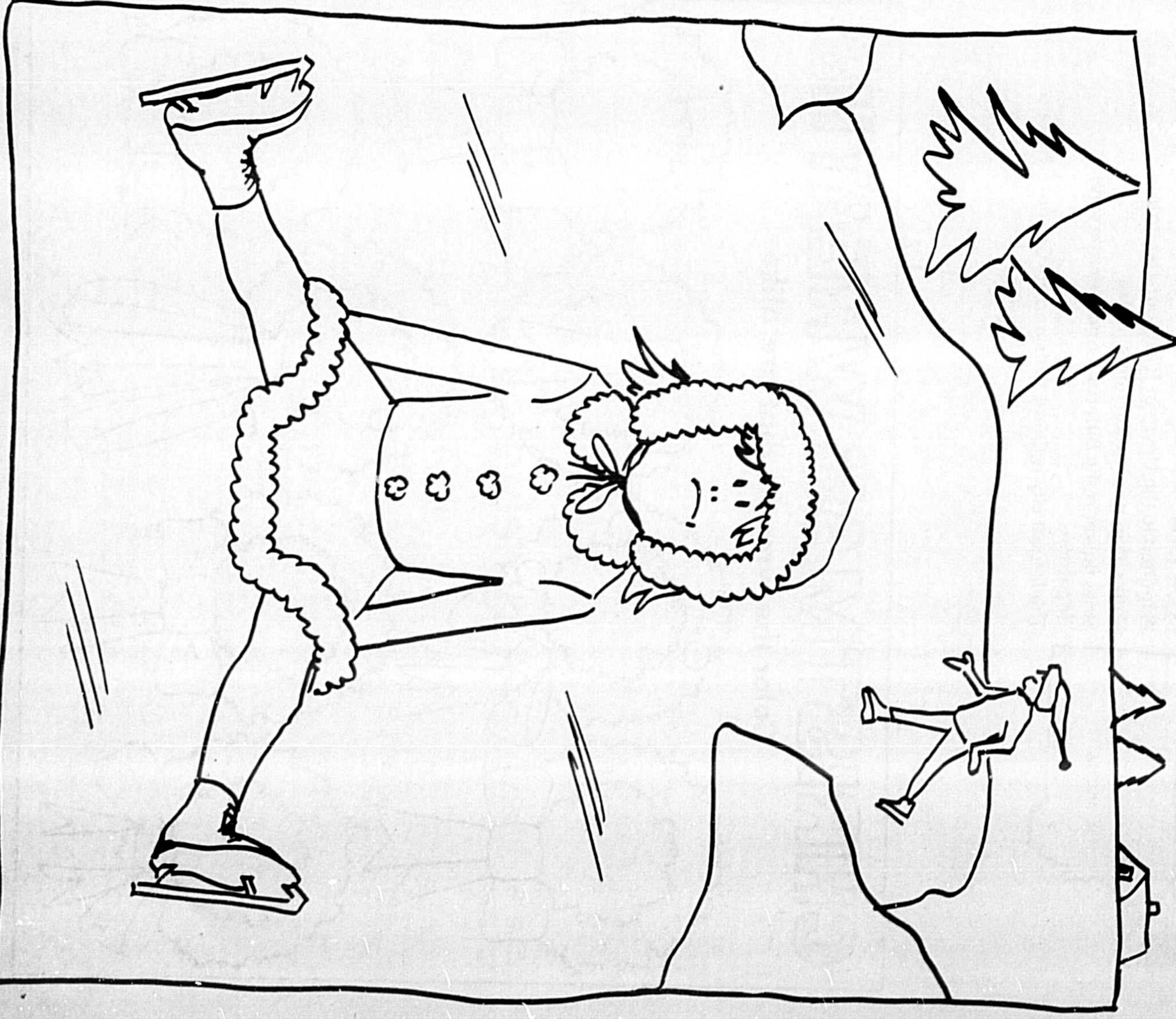

Truman Improves; Condition Serious

KANSAS CITY (AP)—Harry S. Truman was slightly improved today and spoke for the first time in more than a week, but he remained in very serious condition.

A spokesman for Research Hospital and Medical Center, where Truman was admitted Dec. 5, said that when asked how he felt early today, the 88-year-old former president, "All right."

After 12 days in Research Hospital and Medical Center, Truman's most serious problem is that his kidneys have deteriorated steadily since last Wednesday both in purifying blood and eliminating body waste, doctors said.

His heart also has been weakened, and his lungs continue to retain fluid—the ailment which led him to the hospital.

Truman's personal physician, Dr. Wallace Graham, implied Sunday that he would not risk damaging Truman's heart by the use of a renal dialysis—or artificial kidney—machine.

"We cannot jeopardize his chances for some prolongation by causing an imbalance in any one system," Graham said.

A kidney specialist who also examined the former president Sunday said it was his impression that the heart and lung situation prohibits use of the machine.

After doctors failed to note improvement in Truman's kidney output for the fourth straight day, the amount of fluid administered Truman through a nasal-gastric tube was curtailed.

A hospital spokesman said it was hoped the reduction in liquid intake would prevent overloading his body with fluids, some of which have collected in the lungs.

The nation's 33rd president was described as in very serious condition, but doctors said he was comfortable.

The spokesman said that Truman was somewhat more alert during the day Sunday. "He seemed to be aware of persons in the room," the spokesman said. Truman did not move and he remained unable to speak.

He was visited by his wife, Bess, 87; his daughter, Margaret Truman Daniel, and his sister, Miss Mary Jane Truman, who is in the hospital recovering from injuries suffered in a fall.

It wasn't too many minutes later that good friend Dr. Vincent Roberts shed a little light on the subject. "They can talk all they want to about zero population and that the birth rate is declining, but it just ain't so in Seminole County," says Roberts.

Jack Frost Brings Power Loss

MIAMI (AP) — Jack Frost spent another busy night in Florida last night, and so did Reddy Kilowatt.

Many residents of central and northern Florida turned on heaters as the mercury dropped to freezing, and citrus growers expressed thanks no harm was done to their crops.

Power was restored in parts of Pinellas, Sarasota and Brevard counties and sections of the Panhandle where blackouts Sunday were blamed on widespread use of home heating units.

A freeze warning was in effect early today in a 15-county area from Tallahassee to Lake City and Bronson, according to the National Weather Service at Miami. At the same time, a frost warning covered nine counties from Jacksonville to Gainesville and Ocala.

Forecasters said it would be warmer throughout the state tonight, with a chance of frost in extreme north portions Tuesday morning.

"We did get some freezing temperatures," Florida Citrus Mutual Assistant General Manager Dan Farmer said Sunday night in Lakeland, "but they came at daybreak and so didn't last long enough to do any damage."

"Temperatures were higher than forecast...but we'd much rather have the weather service give too many warnings instead of too few."

Some 30,000 Pinellas County homes were without power for several hours Sunday after the thermometer registered 34 degrees early in the day and thousands electrical heaters all struggled to operate at once, about 6,000 homes in Sarasota County, 1,500 homes near Kennedy Space Center and others in the northwest section of the state suffered similar blackouts as residents shivered indoors Sunday for hours.

Runnymede Half PUD For Recreation

Developers of "Runnymede" in southwest Seminole County said today that over half of the 3,224 acres purchased in a \$41 million land sale last week will not be developed for housing but as a game and recreation preserve and recreation areas.

Orlando attorney Milton H. Bevis, partner with Allan Dayton in Mid-Florida Properties, Inc., said 4,200 housing units will be built within the next 10 to 20 years only within the 1,600 acres tentatively called "Runnymede" but slated for a name change soon.

Included in the game preserve and recreation areas will be five miles frontage on the Wekiva River, according to Bevis.

Housing units to be developed on the 700 acres of the PUD will range in price from \$30,000 to \$35,000, he said, with construction on the first phase to begin within the next five months.

Included in the total of 3,224 acres sold for \$41.1 million last week by the estate of Charles E. Bloom, Maitland, and Sidney Cornblum of New York was Mid-Florida Country Club.

Bevis said Mid-Florida will be "phased out" within the next two years "to be replaced by two new golf courses elsewhere on the tract."

Bevis said the developers don't plan to seek zoning changes on the newly purchased tract since PUD zoning has already been granted for the 1,600 acres within which housing will be constructed.

"We'll have 2,500 acres of open and green space," Bevis continued. "Useful areas we call 'living-working-enjoying' areas."

Also slated for the total development is the largest tennis complex in central Florida, Bevis said.

The 1,224 acre tract, recorded as the largest monetary property transaction in Seminole County history, is bordered by the Wekiva River on the north, Wekiva Springs Road on the south and is between Sweetwater Oaks and The Springs.

Regional Sewer For Longwood

LONGWOOD — City Council in special meeting this morning adopted resolutions agreeing to participate in a "regional" sewer system with the city of Altamonte Springs.

The resolutions are to be forwarded to the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency to allow release by Dec. 31 of some \$3.4 million in grant funds to expand the Altamonte Springs sewage treatment plant. Apparently by Longwood taking the action, the Altamonte sewage treatment facility, located adjacent to Interstate 4 and the Orange County line, will be designated the regional plant for Southwest Seminole County.

Harold Radcliffe, president of the engineering firm of Glace and Radcliffe, which served both cities as consulting engineer, said additional applications for the two cities will be filed just after the first of the year.

These requests for further grants will involve money for Longwood to construct pumping stations, force mains and interceptors from the city down Douglas Road to I-4. Altamonte Springs then will apply for money to continue carrying the sewage from Douglas Road to I-4 about one mile to its treatment plant.

Radcliffe said EPA "will not buy two separate treatment plants," and cautioned city officials that they must go along with the joint plan if they desire federal money. "If Longwood refuses to go along," the engineer said, "Altamonte would get the federal money and Longwood would receive none. There is no merit going ahead on your own."

The engineer continued studies of various types of sewage treatment facilities for Orange and Seminole Counties showed the most feasible economically would be the regional concept with expansion in Altamonte Springs.

He suggested the two cities might "get together" on naming a utility commission to oversee operation of the Altamonte plant, but that "all financing will be through Altamonte Springs rather than an authority type thing."

A previous proposal had called for a governing authority composed of an equal number of representatives from the two cities. The authority would have indeed owned the joint sewer system, which is not now the case.

City Council unanimously approved the required resolutions for the Altamonte Springs plant expansion money to be received by Dec. 31.

John Angel will hold in a similar arrangement with the Orange County city of Eatonville for treating sewage at Altamonte's plant. Original federal funding for the sewage treatment plant in Altamonte was given after the all-black community joined with Altamonte in applications.

Altamonte Council Bid Opening Ready

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS — City Council, at a 4:30 p. m. meeting tomorrow, will have a bid opening upon equipment for the new fire department ambulance.

The equipment includes medical supplies for the ambulance which will be delivered to the city stripped. Among the medical supplies is a resuscitator, masks, suction units, coils, blankets, etc.

A bid opening in which the city's engineering firm, Glace and Radcliffe, invited nine bidders, will be held for site equipment for the recreational complex at the new Civic Center.

Two annexation petitions will be considered upon second and final reading.

The first is known as the Borders property, meaning 20 acres of land owned by the Orlando Catholic Diocese. The property is located at the corner of SR 434 and Montgomery Road, and R-3 multiple family dwelling zoning is requested.

The other annexation is one lot fronting Alpine Street owned by Frances Jenior. Both were approved by City Council upon first reading last week.

Two annexations have cleared certification for first reading before council and others are anticipated to clear. The two which will be presented are property owned by former Councilman Thomas Radloff, located west of Maitland Avenue, south of Spring Lake Road. Radloff is requesting R-1AA residential zoning.

The other property is that of Jack Schubert, located north of SR 436, east of Montgomery Road. Schubert is requesting C-2 commercial zoning on the property.

Board Considers Angel's Status

Board at last Tuesday's session tabled a motion to grant Angel a leave from his status as school principal in order that he can accept an associate principalship at South Seminole Middle School, where he held away as principal before the county voters elected him to the superintendency of schools four years ago.

Some Board members, including vice chairman Jean Bryant, indicated a desire to have Angel take Layer's place at Teague, in a move that would only affect two persons, but in the recommendations advanced by Angel, assistant Teague principal Gordon Hathaway was suggested for Layer's old job.

Still another transfer would have Curtis Hughes, assistant principal at South Seminole Middle School, moving to assistant principal at Teague, thus bringing to four the number of persons in a shuffle between various schools.

Preliminary indications from Mrs. Bryant, board members Dr. Stuart Culpepper and Dave Sins are Angel should not assume a job less than that he held four years ago.

Board members Bud Feather and Keeth have previously indicated a desire to accept the recommendations that Angel be shifted to the associate principal post of South Seminole Middle School.

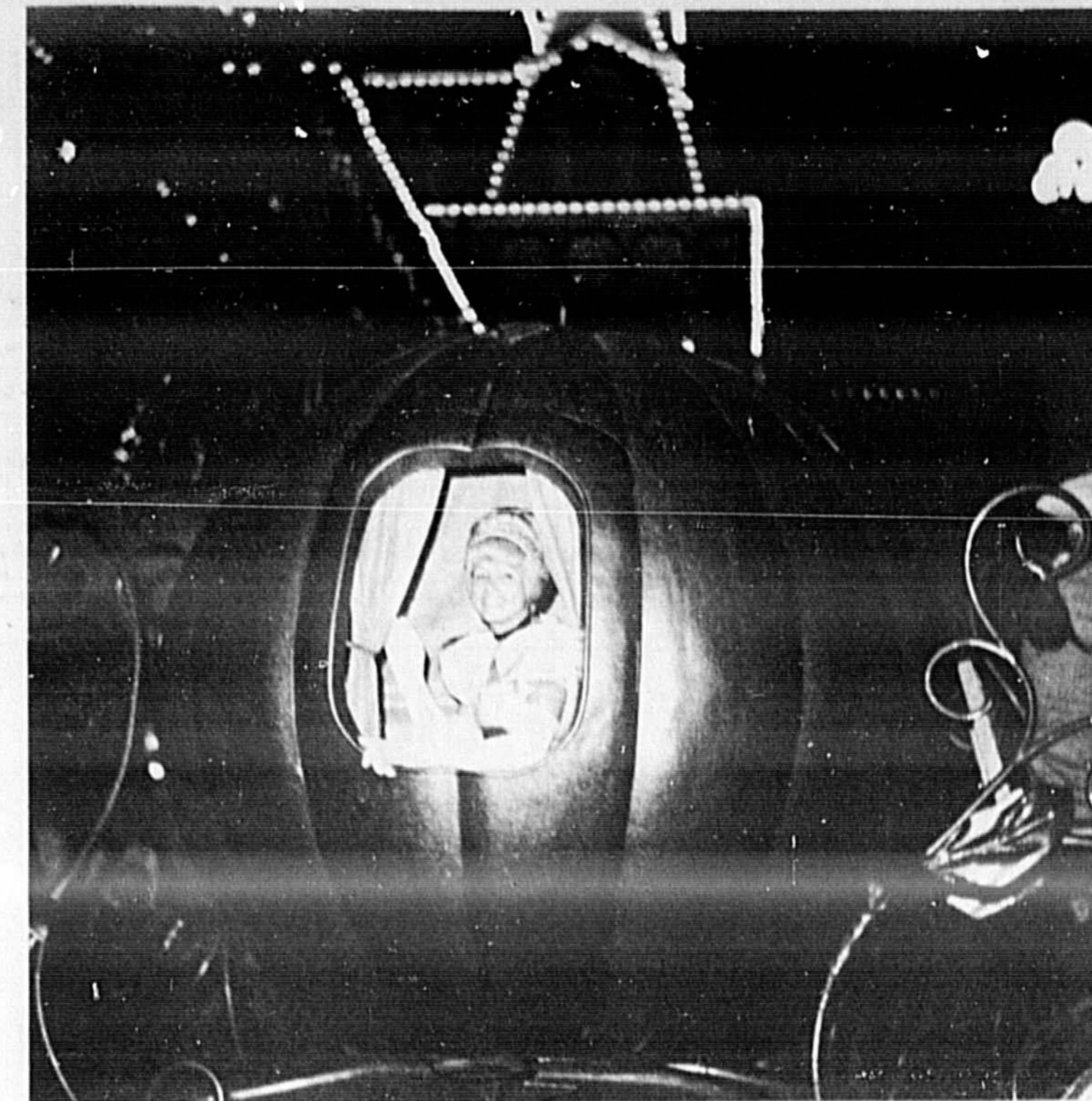
