Sanford's Underground Water

In spite of the immense amount of publicity which has already been given the subject, there still remains considerable doubt, particularly in the minds of those who are blinded by local self interest or who have not taken the trouble to look into the matter, as to how the construction of a cross state sea level canal would possibly affect the underground water supplies of a section such as Sanford located more than eighty miles away.

It is a well known fact that a well, drilled almost anywhere in the Sanford area will produce a constant flow of artesian water. What may not be so well known, particularly outside of Seminole County, is that these flowing wells are vitally necessary to the growing of celery and to the production of most of the fruits and vegetables which raise here. If these wells were contaminated with salt water or otherwise destroyed, agricultural activity in the county would be terminated forever.

The source of the waters, which underlie most of Seminole County and which are used to flood our farms has not until recently become a matter of any concern. Most of us knew that the water was there but never took the trouble to consider where it came from. If it could be shown that the origin of Sanford's artesian wells is in the vicinity of Tampa and that the proposed canal would cut across the underground streams which feed our wells, it is letting in the salt water of the ocean it seems fairly certain that they would not be long in feeling the effect of it here.

Fortunately, we have in Tallahassee a State Geological Department which has been at work for some time in determining the location and depth of the artesian wells in the state. 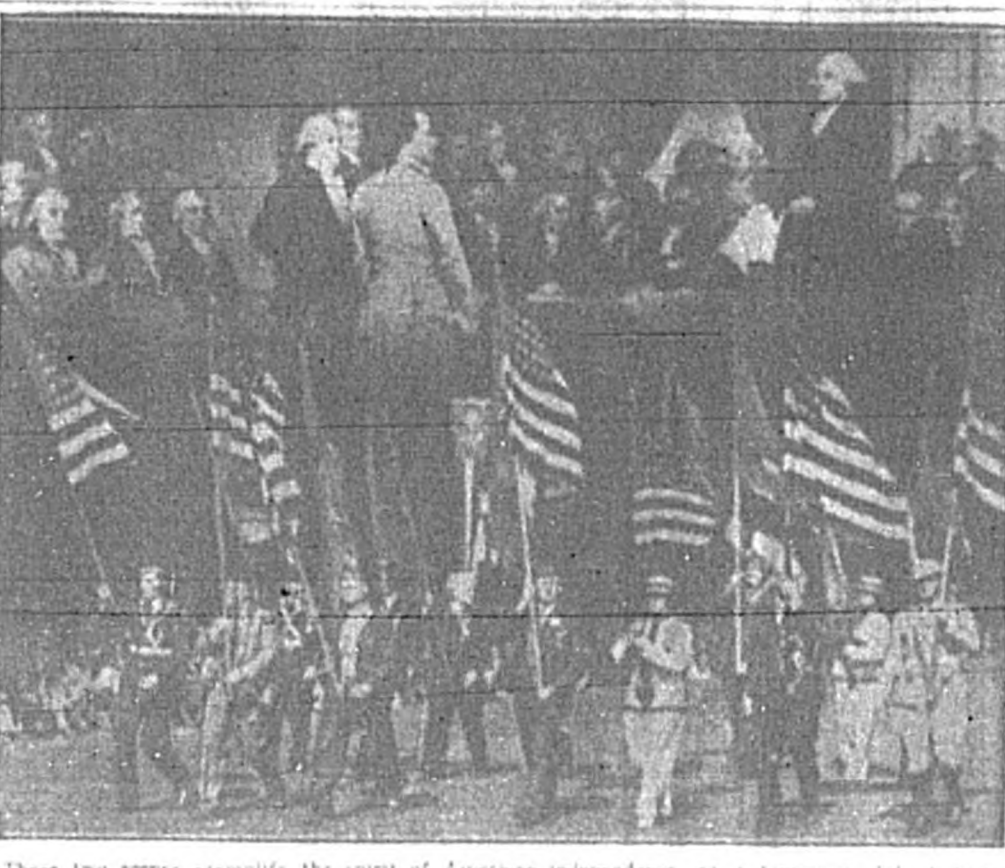
