# Resigns Neiswender Quits County Post

Seminole County Administrator Roger Neiswender, in a surprise announcement Monday night, said he will leave that post to work for a consulting firm in Orlando.

Neiswender said be will leave the \$50,400 annual position to head the Orlando office of Post, Buckley, Schuh and Jernigan Inc.

He will not leave the county payroll for several months but he made the announcement Monday because the firm's contract as a county sewer and water consultant is up for renewal this month.

"I didn't want the negotiation process to be colored by the fact I was going to work for the," Neiswender said.


Neiswender, who became county administrator when Seminole County commissioners established the position seven years ago, said he would probably leave the post in December. He has accumulated leave time which would allow him to be on the payroll through February, Neiswender said.

"When I took the job as county administrator I didn't want to stay in government," he said. "I had become convinced that government couldn't get anything done."

Neiswender said the county commissioners who have served since he was appointed to the post have given him the opportunity to provide "professional advice" with a minimum of political influence.

"I'm a little scared. Private business always has been held up as the acid test," he said.

Neiswender praised the quality of the staff the county has assembled over the past few years. He

said several of those people are probably qualified to succeed him.

Neiswender said commissioners would probably have the opportunity to consider people from around the country because of the fine working environment the county has established.

But he added the hope that staff personnel would he considered for the post as well. "I hope some of your in-house people beat the door down trying to

Commissioner Bill Kirchhoff said perhaps the county should consider asking Neiswender to sign an agreement pledging not to raid the county staff for employees. But Neiswender said he had too

much pride in the staff to destroy it. Commissioner Sandra Glenn said she was "shocked and surprised" at Neiswender's an-

"Many years ago Roger and I had a conversation out in a parking lot when I was a city official thinking of making the big step of running for county office," she said. She said his professionalism has made Neiswender a "hell of a guy to work with."

Commissioner Robert Sturm said he has mixed

emotions about Neiswender's departure. "There's pleasure that someone with his expertise is going into private industry," Sturm said. He added there is sadness because the county is losing a fine administrator.

"I'm really surprised he has stayed in the county administrator's post as long as he has," Sturm said. Private industry is the next step for someone with the management and business expertise that Neiswender has, Sturm said because there are very few government jobs which pay as well as the ad-

ministrator's job. County attorney Nikki Clayton said, "It has been a real privilege to work with him. I'm happy for the opportunity he has. I hope we can find someone with as strong a character and honest intentions as he

"There are very few good guys in the world," Ms. Clayton said. "He's one of the true good guys."

# Woman Kills Man; Workers Are Horrified

After shooting him at least twice as she faced him, she chased her victim when he turned to run. The woman, according to different evewitness accounts, continued shooting, hitting the man at least twice more, maybe several more times in the back. Afterher victim dropped to the ground, the woman looked around to see several construction workers lying face down in the dirt, and others scurrying in different directions.

The woman, witnesses said, got back intoher car and attempted to speed off, but a crewforeman, a Lake Mary Vietnam veteran, and yelled. He lied on me. He lied on me. Jumped into his pickup truck and gave chase As the woman's car neared the exit of the front-end loader, attempted to block her around the front-end loader. The foreman in pursuit, drove his pickup around the other side of the heavy equipment, and rammed the

woman's car broadside. Her victim was dead on arrival at Central Florida Regional Hospital. He has tentatively been identified as Byron Brooks, 21, of 850 W.

I had my own gun and I had it out-I figured when she got in her car, that she was going to drive over to him and start shooting hum again, and I wasn't gonna let her do that I've been in Vietnam and saw a lot of people killed, but that was legal. I can't buy killing

someone because he lied to you." King was referring to eyewitness accounts that when the woman first drove onto the construction site from First Street, she got out and fired two shots into the man

# Kidnapper Begins 30-Year Sentence

A 27-year-old Lake Mary man has begun serving a 30-year prison sentence for abducting a teen-age girl from her father's Sanford used car lot in July 1981.

Darrell Lynn Theophilus of 163 Frederick Ave. was sentenced Friday to 30 years in the state prison by Circuit Judge Kenneth M. Leffler for kidnapping Angelina Lash, now 18, from her father's used car lot - Jun Lash Blue Book Cars, at

414 S. Orlando Ave. Leffler also sentenced Theophilus to serve 30 years probation after he pleaded guilty to armed robbery charges in conjunction with the kidnapping charge on Sept. 28 1981. Theophilus will be required to serve at least three years in the

state prison before he can be considered eligible for parole Leffler said. Leffler also retained jurisdiction over him for 10 years, providing that any attempt to parole Theophilus during the next 10 years must be cleared through Leffler.

Theophilus was formally charged by police with kidnapping, armed robbery, grand theft of an automobile, carrying a concealed weapon and aggravated assault in connection with the abduction after he turned himself in to Decatur County, Ind., on July 13, 1981, about a week after the kidnapping oc-

According to police, Theophilus rode into the dealership on a bicycle at about 3:30 p.m. July 6 carrying a blanket in which he had hidden a 22 caliber semi-automatic rifle. After taking a test drive in a 1973 Oldsmobile Cutlass valued at about \$1,300,

police said he pulled the rifle and said, "I'll just take it for free."

Theophilus stole a wallet from Ray Lash, Angelina's uncle and a salesman at the car lot, forced the 17-year-old girl into the car and sped away. Nearly seven hours later, Miss Lash was released unharmed in downtown Tallahassee.

All other charges against Theophilus were dropped by

In addition, Theophilus was sentenced in June 1982 to live years in the state prison on a Seminole County burglary charge by Circuit Judge S. Joseph Davis Jr., according to court clerks. The five-year sentence will be served following the 30year prison term imposed for kidnapping by Leffler.

## Oklahoma And Alaska Hold Primaries Today

United Press International

Two big oil states are holding primaries for governor, with Oklahoma Democrats expected to renominate Gov. George Nigh for an unprecedented second term while in Alaska 12 men want the right to succeed retiring GOP Gov. Jay Hammond.

Alaska and Oklahoma, unlike most of the states which are running deficits, have huge profits from oil. and what to do with all that money is a major factor in today's voting.

Oklahoma votes will be asked to approve a trust fund to put the money away for a rainy day when oil and gas run out. In Alaska, they have to decide how to give back \$3 billion in oil revenues to residents and the proposals range from low interest loans to build homes to just giving the money away,

No governor has ever served more than one term in Oklahoma since it became a state in 1907. Nigh popular especially because of the big surpluses — is favored to break that tradition this year, sweeping past token opposition in the primary and defeating whoever the Republicans nominate to run against him.

State Auditor and Inspector Tom Daxon and House Minority Leader Neal McCaleb battled for the GOP Neal McCaleb battled for the GOP nomination for governor in campaigns that started more than a year ago. A third GOP candidate, Don House, did not

#### 'I Love E.T.' Barred

HOUSTON (UPI)-A souvenir gift manufacturing company has been barred from making coffee cups, pencil holders and other items carrying the slogan "I Love E.T."

U.S. District Judge Woodrow Seals Monday issued a temporary restraining order against Houston-based Kamar Southwest Industries after Universal City Studios of Los Angeles filed suit accusing the firm of using the logo from the successful movie "E.T." without the studio's permission.

Attorneys for Universal said Kamar produced souvenirs bearing a label reading "I Love E.T."

Lawyers for Kamar denied the allegations and said the initials E.T. stood for the word "everything" and not extraterrestrial, as in the movie.

#### FBI Stings 18 People

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (UP1)—An FBI sting operation which infiltrated a crime ring specializing in stolen property, narcotics and wire and jail fraud led to the indictment of 18 people in four states and confiscation of \$1.6 million in contraband, it was announced Mon-

Most of the suspects have made initial court appearances in Nevada, California, Ohio or Florida since the secret indictments were returned Aug. 19 in Las Vegas and Miami.

The 18-month "sting" operation was code-named "Jenelpigeon." The key figure undercover agent posed as a shady businessman who operated on both sides of the law. The agent used a Las Vegas office as a front where some of the illegal transactions were

#### Pipeline Goes Forward

A U.S.-based industrial group at the center of a showdown between Washington and Paris over the Soviet natural gas pipeline faced a French government order today to proceed with the deal.

"The best way you can put it is that we're between a rock and a hard place" Edward R. Luter a senior vice president of the Dallas based Dresser Industries Inc. was quoted today as saying by the Washington Post.

Defying Reagan administration sanctions France Monday ordered three huge gas compressers made by Dresser France a subsidiary of Dresser Industries be loaded by Wednesday on a freighter.

The freighter is set to sail for Soviet port of Riga on the Baltic Sea on Thursday.



# Residents Complain **About Road Hazard**

Closing off Lake Howell Road near the Orange County line is one solution Seminole County commissioners will consider to reduce speeding and traffic congestion on the high-

Commissioners met with about 60 residents of Tanglewood subdivision, where one child was killed and another severely injured when they were struck by a car on July 26, Monday night at the county courthouse.

The residents claim that speeding motorists and the 11,000 cars that travel the road daily make the neighborhood unsafe for their

Dana Dietrick, 7, 5244 Lake Howell Road, was killed July 26 when she was struck by a car driven by 79-year-old David Green of Winter Park, Shawn Balencie, 10, 5226 Lake Howell Road was injured in the collision. Balencie's father said Monday night, Shawn will be released from Winter Park Hospital Wednesday but will remain in a body cast for the next 12 weeks.

In a court appearance before County Judge Harold F. Johnson today, Green pleaded not guilty to careless driving charges stemming from the fatal accident July 26 and is set for a hearing before Johnson at 2:30 p.m. Oct. 6.

The group responded enthusiastically when Commissioner Bill Kirchhoff said he had been asked to look at the area several months ago for the possible creation of a cul de sac. The cul de sac would, in effect, close off the road and provide an area for neighborhood residents to turn around.

Kirchhoff emphasized the plan is not his idea but several residents seized upon it as one way to curb the dangers for residents along Lake

Howell Road, one of the most heavily traveled roads in the county.

Stu Fritz, a resident of Tanglewood for the past 26 years, said "a cul de sac is a great idea." He also suggested a right of way exists for the county to put in a short street which would allow traffic to bypass the neighborhood. The cut-through would connect Howell Branch Road with Lakemont Road and would require only about 100 feet of paving,

Paulette Lebow agreed with Fritz, "The only effective approach is to put a blockage in

Bob Mazey, a Tanglewood resident with a 19month-old son, said "I don't think there's anyone in the neighborhood who wouldn't take five more minutes to go to work or go to the store if it would keep traffic off of Lake Howell

Seminole County Sheriff John Polk put a damper on the idea.

"You people must think you're living in Utopia if you think this board is going to close that road."

He suggested the installation of four-way stops signs at the intersection of Linden Avenue and Alden Court. Crosswalks should also be installed at that point and school signs should be placed at a church in the neighborhood which has a private school.

Polk told the residents that lowering the speed limit on the road below the existing 25mile-per-hour limit is beyond the board's authority and would be unenforceable.

Commissioner Robert Sturm said the cul de sac plan might have more disadvantages than advantages and feels the residents should consider it further before they endorse it. He promised the board would take action

came over and held her until police arrived. "All she kept saying while he held her is, 'He lied on me, he lied."

Augie Ferro, 22, of Orlando, one of the workers who witnessed the shooting, said as soon as the woman fired her weapon, there were shouts of "get down, get down, she's crazy...she's gonna shoot everybody, hit the deck," Ferro said most of the hundred or so employees at the site, and inside office buildings, either ran off in different directions, or jumped face down onto the ground.

Another eyewitness said after Brooks was first shot - at least twice in the stomach, according to hsopital reports - he ran at least 200 feet before falling to the ground, the woman chasing after him firing several more

Police said today it appears Brooks was shot with a .22 caliber pistol.

Lt. Doug Bishop of the Sanford police, said one witness told him the woman chased not only Brooks after firing the first shots, but a

co-worker of Brooks. The co-worker, the was out of the car, another nearby worker witness said, hid in the bushes as the woman fired at Brooks. After the woman was apprehended, the man who hid in the bushes walked up to her and said, "That's a hell of a thing to do just because he lied to you," according to police.

# **Economy** CPI Averaging 7.3%

inflation moderated to an annual rate of 7.3 percent in July after two previous months of double digit increases, the Labor Department said today

Housing, fuel and medical care costs were the big gainers during the month while food and beverage prices, in the best performance since a March decline, held steady, the department said.

It said the Consumer Price Index rose at a monthly rate of 0.6 percent in July, compared to I percent increases in May and June that now appear to have been temporary surges primarily caused by climbing gas and housing prices.

The inflation rate since the beginning of the year through July climbed 0.3 of a point to a moderate 5.4 percent, compared to the rate for all of last year of 8.9 percent. All figures were adjusted for seasonal price

Favorable trends already developing in fuel prices and mortgage rates, combined

with steady food prices, seem to promise continued moderation in overall retail prices for at least the next several months, most analysts say.

The month's CPI, before seasonal adjustment, was 292.2, equivalent to a national average July cost of \$292.20 for the government's sample "market basket" of goods and services that cost \$100 in 1967. Lingering effects of the increase in

gasoline prices that stretched through much of July helped raise the transportation index 1.2 percent, about half of what it was in June, the department said, Gas prices began to sink this month.

Overall, energy costs in July were up 1.4 percent with fuel oil and natural gas joining gasoline increases, the department said, adding that electricity rates showed no change.

Still rising house prices offset declining mortgage interest rates to carry overall housing costs up 0.5 percent.

## Rates Cheer Home Buyers

Dropping interest rates have "thrown a life jacket" to frustrated potential homebuyers and are bringing smiles and frantic trading to Wall Street.

Both the Federal Housing Authority home mortgage loans and the Veterans Administration guaranteed housing loans drop to 14 percent today, the lowest rate in 16 months, the Department of Housing and Urban Development said.

Continuing declines in other interest rates, most notably the prime rate, rolled the stock market's summer rally into high gear Monday. The Dow Jones industrial average soared 21.88 points to an eight-

month high on 110.3 million shares, the second busiest session in Wall Street's

Acting HUD Secretary Donald Hovde said Monday the 1 percent drop in the FHA home loan rate "is good news not only for the housing industry but for many American families which have been kept out of the home-buying market. While we're not out of the woods yet, we certainly are headed in the right direction."

The government-subsidized rates, which apply to about 11 percent of mortgage loans, usually are available about 1 percentage point cheaper than commercial mortgage loans, which have dipped to 15 percent in parts of the country.

By dropping the minimum service charge, of \$4.58 for up to 5,000 gallons, customers who use 4,000 gallons of water or less per month will see a reduction in their rates, Jernigan said. "I think there are some ad-

vantages of this rate structure to what you've had in the past," he said. "For elderly folks who are living in an apartment and use 2,000 to 3,000 gallons a month, rates would go down."

Jernigan said the projected rates should carry the county through 1986

without the need for additional rate hikes.

Ken Hooper, county environmental services director, said costs for construction and operation of the Iron Bridge regional sewage treatment plant near Oviedo is the biggest factor in the rate hike.

Iron Bridge, approved and funded by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as a treatment plant for several Central Florida counties, will serve about 85 percent of the customers in Seminole County, Hooper said.

Jernigan said the costs for sewage treatment at the Iron Bridge facility are still unknown. Those costs plus the continued growth of population and inflation could affect the rate estimates. If those figures are less than projections, a new rate in-

crease might not be necessary for a longer period.

But a rate like is necessary now to keep the county water and sewer system from running a deficit. "By the middle of the coming fiscal year you will find yourself in a deficit posture," Jernigan said.

Hooper explained that the rates would apply to all county sewer and water customers, regardless of what treatment plant serves them. (County Attorney) Nikki Clayton looked at it and the bond covenants are very specific."

Commissioners approved the proposed rate increase for advertising. If approved, the new rates would go into effect Oct. 1.

Lefkowitz said he will meet with area homebuilders to get their opinions of the proposal.

## Graham: U.S. On Road To Economic Recovery

LAKE BUENA VISTA (UPI) - Gov. Bob Graham says congressional passage of the \$98.3 billion tax bill. the largest peacetime tax hike in the nation's history, is a signal America is on the road to economic recovery

"Passage of the tax bill was the the necessary thing to do," Graham said Monday following his keynote address to the 21st annual National Conference of Lieutenant Governors near Walt Disney World.

"Even with this increase, we are looking at a federal deficit in the range of \$150 billion. That's a hemorraging of federal fiscal irresponsibility that we can't tolerate.'

If Congress had not approved the tax increase, Graham said, the deficit would be "almost \$200 billion." Both the Senate and House narrowly passed the Reagan-backed bill last week. It will bring in an estimated \$98.3 billion in new revenue over the next

Graham said the recent rally on Wall Street indicates investors "feel economic times are going to get better. I don't think this would have happened if Congress had turned down this tax increase," he said.

"It is a signal that the national government is prepared to take some tough stands to begin to bring our national deficit under control."

#### Sheik Makes 'Em Happy

SOUTH PASADENA (UPI) - Sheik Mohammad Al-Fassi took his open-pocketbook policy on a tour of Florida Monday, making residents of three communities happy with donations totalling \$80,000.

The billionaire Saudi Arabian sheik was accompanied by an entourage that included Indian activist Russell Means and former world heavyweight boxing champion Muhammad Ali as he jetted from Key West to Tallahassee and South Pasadena.

His biggest donation was in Tallahassee where he gave a \$30,000 check to Turn About Inc., a program to treat teenagers with alcohol and illegal drug problems. While there, he also presented the city with a \$10,000 check for youth programs and a \$10,000 check for beautification projects.

Al-Fassi gave the city of South Pasadena two checks for \$10,000 each, one for youth programs and one for beautification, and in Key West he gave a \$10,000 check to a neighborhood improvement association of black businessmen.

#### Cuba To Offer New Investment Incentives

MIAMI (UPI) - The Cuban government has decided to make a major policy change and join a growing number of its Caribbean neighbors in seeking to attract foreign financial investment by offering tax breaks and other incentives.

The move by the Communist island-nation to aid its troubled economy is the first time since Fidel Castro came into power that such efforts to entice foreign investment have been made.

There are 20 to 30 foreign offices in Cuba, but no foreign companies are involved in manufacturing or the service industry, Antonio Villaverdes, secretary general of the Cuban Chamber of Commerce, told the Miami Herald.

#### Tears, Bacon And Eggs

LONDON (UPI) - Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher remembers Britain's Falkland Islands war against Argentina as a time of loneliness, tears and constant refueling with bacon and eggs.

"Some of the times were terrible," said Mrs. Thatcher in a magazine interview released Monday. Asked if she had ever wept during the 10-week war with Argentina in which more than 200 British soldiers died, she said, "Oh yes, you can't help it. They just come. But you pull yourself together very quickly. You

have to." Mrs. Thatcher returned to No. 10 Downing Street Monday following surgery to remove varicose veins at a private London clinic.

## **Poland Protests Radio**

WARSAW, Poland (UPI) - An official Polish newspaper accused underground Solidarity leaders of trying to incite "bloody rebellion" and the government protested Western radio broadcasts it said encourage demonstrations.

Official Polish media Monday lambasted Western Polish language radio broadcasts it said have told Poles where and when to assemble for Aug. 31 railies commemorating the founding of independent trade union Solidarity.

The official Polish news agency PAP announced the Foreign Ministry has lodged a formal protest against the radio stations with senior diplomats from the U.S. French, British and West German embassies.

### PLO Vows To Go On

Guerrilla chief Yasser Arafat urged Palestinians sailing today from Beirut to continue their struggle for a homeland and one of his top military aides defiantly vowed "to liberate Palestine" with stepped-up terrorist attacks.

A fourth group of about 1,000 guerrillas prepared to set sail from west Beirut for Yemen, one of eight Arab countries where an estimated 7,100 Palestine Liberation Organization fighters will be dispersed.

"The world will see, in the very near future, actions in the occupied territories that will make Begin's hair stand on end," said Salah Khalaf, the No. 2 man in Arafat's Al Fatah force.

## **Protectionism** Any Way It's Cut

Calls to protect the U.S automobile industry against foreign competition have had an appealing ring ever since domestic automakers went into a slump and imports began taking a full one-quarter of the domestic market.

But protectionism in any guise has always been a siren song, and so it is with the so-called local content legislation now pending in Congress.

This measure, strongly supported by the United Auto Workers union, would require that foreign cars sold in the United States include up to 90 percent U.S.-made parts and American labor.

The UAW contends that these requirements would generate 868,000 American jobs.

A joint Commerce Department-Department of Transportation study suggests the real figure would be closer to 200,000; and that even these employment gains would be offset by job losses at U.S assembly plants of foreign manufacturers, at foreign car dealerships, and at major ports of

One consequence of a local content law that is beyond dispute would be its impact upon new carprices

Independent studies by a Detroit research group and the Congressional Budget Office both show very substantial price hikes resulting from any local content law similar to that backed by the UAW.

And both studies also agree with the Reagan administration's analysis that a local content law for the automotive industry could ultimately lose more American jobs than it gained.

Of even greater significance in the long run is the damage such legislation could inflict on America's own exports.

A local content law would unquestionably violate the internationally negotiated General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT).

That, in turn, would trigger inevitable retaliation against U.S. exports that now account for one of every seven manufacturing jobs and one of every three farmland acres.

Finally, a local content law would postpone, perhaps indefinitely, the day when a revitalized American automobile industry could once again compete successfully against anyone on the world

The global economic disaster of the 1930s demonstrated conclusively that protectionism is a dead-end street.

Protectionism camouflaged as "voluntary" import quotas or local content laws is still protectionism. It bred trade wars and stagnation in the past and would do so again.

Detroit's salvation lies in finding ways to produce maximum value for money; in building automobiles that are the equal of any in the world and then selling them at a competitive price.

Nothing less, and certainly not the kind of protectionism that would touch off an ever deepening cycle of trade wars, will serve the interests of both the auto industry and the nation.

## Where He Belongs

We thought so before, but we're sure of it now: John W. Hinckley Jr. is as crazy as a loon.


That was apparent at his trial. What surfaced there — especially the readings of the psychotic poetry and letters he had written — was enough to convince the jury.

But then, it was in his own interest to act crazy, because it was his only defense. So, when the jury acquitted him, some public doubt remained as to whether his insanity was real.

No doubt remains. Had Hinckley just been playacting to win an acquittal, he would have spent the last six weeks trying to prove his sanity to psychiatrists in order to win a release from the mental hospital.

Hinckley belongs behind bars for a good long time, perhaps even longer than if he had been found sane and guilty at his trial. The bars he will be behind will be those of a mental hospital, but that is right, for insane people like Hinckley do not belong in prisons.

## Red-Ink Budgets: Who Gains?

NEW YORK (NEA)-Every now and then a controversy explodes above the political landscape like a star shell, brilliantly illuminating the murky scene below and revealing the true positions of everyone on the battlefield. That is what the debate over the budget-balancing amendment has done, and for that service alone we are eternally in its

Needless to say, all politicians favor a balanced budget, at least nominally. Even Tip O'Neil, who has arguably done more over the years to unbalance the budget than any other individual in Washington, saw instantly that Ronald Reagan could be pilloried for the huge deficit structure he inherited and became a late but noisy convert to the cause.

About 20 years ago, however, Congress discovered to its delight that a balanced budget-one in which revenues equal expenditures-isn't really necessary, even in peacetime. It is possible for the federal government to spend more than it takes in and just print extra money to cover the gap. If you or I did this it would be called counterfeiting, but since the federal government does it we call it "monetizing the deficit."

The extra money winds up in the national economic bloodstream and gets spent on the same goods and services as the money already out there. The result, of course, is inflation: Since all money in circulation is treated as having equal value, the new money is spent by the government and the purchasing power of each previously issued dollar is diminished to the necessary extent. Congress had found a way of putting its hands into the pocket of every American and removing a portion of the value of the money there, while the money itself remained untouched. (Look Ma. No taxes!)

Once Congress persuaded itself that this delightful new method of financing governmental expenditures would produce nothing more than a certain "acceptable" level of inflation, and that most voters were too damned dumb to figure out what was really happening, it was off to the races. The budget was balanced only once in the next 20 years. The politicians vied with one another to think of new ways to spend the huge sums they had discovered how to raise. Expenditures soared-and so, of course, did inflation.

But who cared about inflation? Get over the idea that everybody is equally against it. Two groups, in particular, worry very little about it: those who receive from the federal government far more than they lose through inflation (in other words, the millions on welfare and every other imaginable form of subsidy) and those who are able to increase their income briskly enough to keep pace with the dollar's downhill slide (e.g., the more powerful labor unions).

In other words, the big labor unions and the vast walfare constituency can and do systematically fleece, through the mechanism of inflation, every individual and organization in America that depends on the continued purchasing power of hard-earned

dollars. These are the groups that are threatened by the balanced-budget amendment. It would stop Congress' inflation racket dead in its tracks by requiring that expenditures be matched by revenues rather than covered by inflating the currency.

As you might expect, resistance to the amendment is intense. And just who is out there leading the resisters? You guessed itthe AFI-CIO, the welfare lobby and the overt and covert liberals in the media-

## **Anti-Viral Treatment**

MINNEAPOLIS (UPI) - Joseph Capra, a 26-year-old University of Minnesota student who had an attack of shingles last spring, says his painful illness was relieved by intravenous injections of the drug acyclovir.

Capra was one of 29 patients in a University of Minnesota study that found acute herpes zoster or shingles responds dramatically to intravenous injections of the drug, which is currently being tried for all herpes viruses.

The virus responsible for shingles is the same virus that causes chicken pox in children. After a case of chicken pox has run its course, the virus rests inside nerve cells near the spinal cord and brain and usually remains latent for many years.

Shingles is essentially a nerve disease with principle symptoms appearing on the skin in the form of blisters.

In a report published in Lancet, an international medical journal published in England, Drs. Henry Balfour and Bonnie Bean, of the university's departments of laboratory medicine and pathology and pediatrics, detailed results of the country's first clinical investigation of the use of acyclovir in shingles patients.

Patients were enrolled in the study within three days of the onset of a blister rash, Balfour said. The three-day period was set since some shingles patients heal within three to five days, he said. Each of the patients received intravenous injections three times a day for five days.

Results of the study to determine if acyclovir was a useful therapy were successful, Balfour said.

"We reached our goal. Acyclovir killed the virus and provided pain relief for patients in the early stage of shingles. This is the first time shingles patients have been shown to benefit from anti-viral therapy," he said.

The study also indicated that five days of treatment is not enough for some shingles patients, Balfour said. "Our study suggests that a longer course of treatment may be needed in some cases.'

Nineteen of those in the study group received acyclovir, Balfour said, while 10 received a placebo or harmless fluid. Pain in the acyclovir group subsided faster than in

the placebo group, he said, with the median time for pain reduction two days for acyclovinrecipients and five days for placebo recipients.

PANOTES HASTES IN SEL

Blister healing in the acyclovir group occurred on the average of two days following treatment, compared with five days in patients receiving the placebo.

The median time for clearing of the skin rash in those who received acyclovir was two days compared with five days for those in the placebo group.

Capra told a news conference he ex-

perienced shooting pain in his lower back for five days prior to the onset of the rash. The pain, which he compared to an intense toothache, stopped after the third day of treatment, he said. Shingles is a disease especially common

among those over 50, Balfour said. At least 10 percent of adults fall prey to the disease in their lifetime, he said, noting the percentage may be higher since shingles is not a "reportable" disease.

Since intravenous treatment with acyclovir is impractical for most patients, Balfour said the University of Minnesota and the University of California at San Diego have launched a new study to test an oral form of

Oral acyclovir is probably several years away from sale at pharmacies, Balfour said. but intravenous acyclovir is probably only months away.

## Teamster: Of Feast And Famine

WASHINGTON (NEA)-These are not the best of times for most of the men and women in the trucking industry, as the recession has drastically reduced the amount of goods being transported from place to place.

But times have never been better for the leaders of the Teamsters Union.

For many years the over-the-road truck driver has been the backbone of the Teamsters Union, in image if not in numbers. How is this "modern American cowboy" on his 18wheeler doing these days?

Not very well, says a trucker named Jim ("No last names please...I'm having enough trouble making it without being quoted in no newspaper"). We spoke recently over a cup of coffee at a truck stop along the New Jersey Turnpike.

Jim is one of the so-called "owneroperators" who use their own rigs to haul other people's trailers across the country.

"There's not that much freight moving these days," said Jim, "and there's a lot of guys like me willing to move it. So it's become a seller's market. "The trucking companies and freight

someone willing to drive. Most drivers are just trying to make enough to keep their rigs." Jim described his own situation: "I had to buy a new rig a couple of years ago. I paid

companies can pay what they want and find

about \$60,000 for it. By the time you add up my monthly payment, insurance and routine maintenance, I'm out about \$2,700 a month. "When I'm on the road, I pay about \$175 a day for fuel plus \$25 or so in tools and \$20 for food. So, my actual out-of-pocket is about \$220

a day on the road before I have earned anything to pay my bills-let alone earn anything for myself. "Tonight I'm on my way to Chicago, You

can figure that I will spend a day on this run, What am I being paid? \$550."

He noted that the companies are paying just \$1,200 for a four-day run from the East Coast to Los Angeles. "The way things are today, if you're lucky

and can keep rolling, which probably seven out of ten drivers are not able to do, you may make enough to make your rig payments," said Jim, "But you sure won't be feeding your family."

Recently many trucking companies have signed new contracts freezing or even cutting the pay of their hard-pressed drivers.

"For years the union stuck it to the companies," said Jim. "Now they (the companies) are using the economy to get back at us. They're sticking it to us, and we have got to go along with a smile."

But the Teamsters Union officials who are negotiating those lower contracts are feeling no financial pain.

The union has never broadcast the salaries of its officials. But the Labor Department now requires that those salaries be revealed in reports filed with the federal government.

It's still hard to figure out exactly how much the Teamsters' officials are earning because many of them hold more than one union position. Some have four or five paying jobs-at the local level, the district level, the "joint council" level and the national level.

Therefore, an investigator cannot determine the true salaries of the union's hierarchy without wading through a mountain of reports. Teamsters for a Democratic Union, an organization bitterly at odds with the union's leadership, recently spent some months doing just that.

# Reaganites Flout Law To Hire GOPers

WASHINGTON-Every president in recent memory has felt frustrated by an inability to impose his policies on the entrenched Washington bureaucracy. Ronald Reagan is no exception.

At the Environmental Protection Agency, Reagan's political myrmidons have attempted to solve this perennial problem by making loyalty to the Republican Party an indispersable condition of employment in key middle-caselon jobs. They have done this in blatant disregard of existing statutes and even, as one worried official warned, of the First Amendment to the Constitution,

It's perfectly legal and proper to name party stalwarts to jobs at the policymaking level; packing the civil-service ranks with party hacks is a different story. Even for noncompetitive jobs like staff attorneys, the law forbids consideration of a candidate's

political affiliation. Yet this is precisely what the administration has done in its determination to stop EPA's enforcement office from putting the heat on the business community. My associates Indy Badhwar and John Dillon

have obtained a confidential list of GOP faithful who were hired as EPA attorney-advisors after direct referrals from the White House and Republican stalwarts. Sources say the coordinator of the political

referral ring is Lee Atwater, a deputy assistant to the president. Here are some of the people EPA hired, and their sponsors:

-Bernard "Jay" Apperson, referred by Atwater and Sen. Paula Hawkins, R-Fla. Apperson was a member of Citizens for Reagan, and of the Committee for the Reelection of the President-the notorious CREEP of Watergate involvement-during the Nixon era.

-Robert E. Morey, referred by Ken Cribb, a deputy assistant to the president, and Sen. John East, R-N.C. Morey Is a past president of the Young Republicans and a "sustaining member" of the Republican National Com-

-Kent Holland, referred by Atwater, Rep. Lawrence Conghlin, R-Pa., and Sen. Arlen Specter, R-Pa.

-Michael Murphy, referred by Rep. Stan

Parris, R-Va., and G. William Whitehurst, R-Va. A note on the list says that Murphy's father is a "member (of) GOP Steering Committee for Virginia."

-Winston Haythe, referred by Sen. East and Rep. Gene Taylor, R-Mo. In his glowing recommendation, Taylor wrote: "Mr. Haythe is a registered Republican...members of his family are active, strong supporters of the GOP."

These politically reliable applicants were put in EPA's Office of Legal Enforcement Counsel, where decisions are made on whether to prosecute corporate polluters. The office has come under increasing congressional fire as a see-no-evil outfit.

The flouting of civil-service statutes was so flagrant that a top EPA official was moved to write a conficential protest to the recent chief of enforcement, William Sullivan. Referring to a meeting in March 1982, the official wrote: "I understood you to say that an applicant for an...attorney position may not be hired unless the individual was a Republican or an Independent." The memo noted that such practice violated both the Civil Service Reform Act of 1978 and the First Amendment. Sources said the author of the memo was EPA general counsel Robert Perry. He did not return calls for comment.

In addition to the improper politicization of the legal office, what bothers EPA insiders is that the GOP faithful were brought on board by EPA during a hiring freeze. Many were put on the payroll as temporary consultants in 1981, when more than 100 agency employees were laid off in a reduction-in-force. Then, once the RIF was over, the Republican loyalists were given permanent jobs, even though a hiring freeze was supposedly in

Footnote: Lee Atwater did not return several calls for comment. An EPA official said he did not know whether the political credentials of the attorney-advisers had been checked. But, he added, "I'm sure that the people who hired them must have considered them to be the best qualified." The official insisted there were no violations of a hiring



responsibility for an entire nation in World







## Allergies Affected By Several Factors

DEAR DR. LAMB - I have had allergic reactions for years. My inhalant reactions are primarily nasal and be controlled with many available drugs. Food reactions are more severe for me and include stomach upsets, bowel distress, blurred vision and severe headaches.

Often the inhalant symptoms disappear when I have an upset stomach with nausea that wasn't caused by an allergy. Recently simple surgery was followed by a total remission of my nasal symptoms while the wound was healing. Apparently when my body is busy healing it is too busy to bother with an allergic reaction. Has anyone come up with an nontraumatic way of diverting the attention of the system from allergic responses?

My inhalant allergies were treated with injections for a number of years, but I was told the only solution to food allergies was abstinence.

DEAR READER - There are many factors that influence a person's susceptibility to allergy. To illustrate, a person who has a food allergy that produces only mild symptoms with a modest intake of the food item. may have such a severe allergic reaction after a small amount of alcohol that he requires emergency medical treatment. Never drink alcohol and consume a food you have any tendency to be allergic to at the same time.

And the way an allergen enters your body does not always determine the symptoms you have. You can have nasal symptoms and even allergic asthma from eating a food you are allergic to. Incidentally, all those

symptoms you mentioned can be caused by food allergies. I think of allergies as the great imitators because they can produce the symptoms of almost any disease.

The symptoms depend upon where the antibody (IgE) is fixed in your tissue. If you are

allergic to milk and the mill antibody is in your lung tissue, you may have asthmi when you drink milk. The allergen from the milk gets to the lungs via your circulation


DEAR DR. LAMB -During the past year I have been having some upsetting experiences while asleep at night. I wake up in the early hours, and find myself completely paralyzed. I lie there a few minutes unable to move, although I can hear the alarm clock ticking. Eventually I can turn my head and

the rest of my body. Is this some form of palsy or brain damage? It seems to be happening more often all the time. I am a 43-year-old woman and take medication for arthritis, including gold injections, Palquenil and Clinoril

DEAR READER - That sensation normally happens on rare occasions but if you have it frequently it should be investigated. It is sleep paralysis and is commonly one of the features of narcolepsy. What is narcolepsy? A tendency to have short frequent attacks of sleep.

Tell your doctor about it. It is just possible that it could be a reaction to one of your medicines. If changing them is possible and doesn't help and you contine to have them. you might want to see a neurologist. I don't think you have palsy or brain damage

Jaime Ortiz Patino of Switzerland is not only president of the World Bridge Federation, but a player of note. However, he tends to overbid when he has special confidence in his partner. This time his partner was

Pietro Bernasconi, one of the world's greatest players who thoroughly justified Jaime's overbid.

Off hand, it looks as if the 10 of diamonds lead combined with the diamond position had doorned the slam. But Pietro was equal to the occasion. He played dummy's jack. East won and led his singleton trump to dummy's queen. A heart was ruffed, three trumps were cashed to pull West's teeth, a club was led to the queen and a second heart ruffed.

Next came the play of the club king to come down to four cards. Dummy held his two aces and the jack-nine of hearts. Declarer held his last trump, the eight-four of diamonds and jack of clubs while East held ace-10 of hearts and king-seven of diamonds.

The jack of clubs was now led to dummy's ace and East was caught in a crisscross squeeze. If he let a heart go, the nine of hearts would be led and ruffed and dummy's jack of hearts would be good. If he threw a diamond, the ace of diamonds would be played to establish the

All East could do was throw up his hands and surrender: (NEWSPAPER ENTERPRISE ASSN.)
