Editorials Anti - U.S. Feeling **Dissolved By Dollars**

Americans apparently had little idea about the true conditions that existed in Cuba under the rule of ex-Dictator Batista.

Opposition to the Fidel Castro "blood bath" has been loud. Miss Virginia Chapman, Sanford, a Methodist missionary to Cuba, said that the hue and cry in the American press had caused a reaction in Cuba. The followers of Castro don't like the criticism, and they are developing an anti-U. S. attitude.

Miss Chapman told the Sanford Pilot Club that conditions under Batista were very bad. She cited several examples to emphasize her point.

Perhaps the average American wasn't familiar with the wrongs of Batista and his government, Perhaps many of his high-ranking officers did kill innocent people. Perhaps the revolution was justified.

It is debatable, however, whether the many "war criminals" arrested, tried, convicted and executed by Castro received justice. According to the law of the jungle, these men might have received what they had coming.

There is a strong possibility, however, that many of the officers died for very petty reasons. Cuba was in the grip of hysteria; anyone accused was convicted before his arrest. No doubt, many personal grudges were settled under the guise of justice.

Those who would defend Castro's actions might be -overlooking one important point. The one man chiefly re-"sponsible for the misdeeds of Batista's reign went unpun-"ished. That man is Batista, He was a dictator. Those who "have died in the name of Cuban "justice" were carrying out "Batista's orders. Yet, Batista remains a free man.

Castro would like to get his hands on Batista. It is doubtful that the revolutionary leader ever will realize this dream, however. Batista is basking in the sun in a palace in comfortable exile.

As for the anti-U. S. feeling on the part of Castro, we see no reason why America should try to be friendly. Everywhere else abroad, we are spending millions in an effort to buy friendship, When Castro becomes angry enough, the U.S. will float a huge loan to salve his wounds.
